

AIA LAS VEGAS PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE MARK HOBAICA, AIA

In Case of Emergency.....are we prepared?

If you ask anyone the question, "Where were you on September 11th when the twin towers collapsed?" They'll probably tell you exactly where they were and will most likely relive that awful feeling again as though it just happened yesterday. For me, that vivid and horrific memory is without a doubt tattooed on my mind, as I'm sure on yours as well. I'm still somewhat in disbelief that those skyscrapers actually fell and that so many innocent people died that

day. At that time, I believed I was somewhat of a building expert and, with confidence, I knew that those one hundred story buildings just could not collapse. I remember my wife fearing the unthinkable and asking me if I thought that the buildings could fall. I recall very confidently telling her "no way," and I tried to comfort and reassure her that this couldn't happen solely because of all the architecture knowledge and engineering brilliance that went into the designs. As that tragedy played out, I remember leaving my home headed for the office and receiving the call from my wife as I drove west on Flamingo Road. She told me the unimaginable...the first tower had collapsed. I was in disbelief and utter amazement. To say the least, that day changed my life and my view of what devastation a sick terrorist group was actually capable of causing. I am, unfortunately, no longer able to view our massive and highly engineered steel or concrete buildings as "invincible".

I really don't like reliving that day or rekindling those feelings, but even today in Las Vegas, we still have so many potential disastrous scenarios that could play out in a heartbeat. Just a few months ago, we witnessed the Monte Carlo blaze, and I know everyone was thinking here goes 9-11 all over again. So, we need to ask ourselves the question, "Are we ready and prepared if that horrific day were to occur in our city today?"

What if a natural or "Act-of-God" disaster occurred? Did you know that the golden state to our west is the #2 ranked state when it comes to the number of federally-declared natural disasters since the 1950's? You'll be glad to know that Nevada is ranked only #45 in this category. I've heard some say, "Disasters don't ever happen here. That's something I only read about in the papers". Let's analyze what is possible here in southern Nevada...earthquakes, severe rains, flash floods, landslides, high winds, lightning, tornadoes, fires, heat waves, drought, power outages, engineering failures, mining failures, hazardous air pollution, hazmat spills, groundwater contamination...industrial, chemical, biological or nuclear disasters.

Last month, I attended the AIA National Conference in Boston and had the opportunity to sit in on a half-day seminar titled, "The Architect's Role in Disaster Preparedness and Assistance". You'll be glad to know that we are currently forming our own AIA Nevada Disaster Assistance Coordination Team. Did you know that Nevada does not have in place a "Good Samaritan Law" which could better define our roles, protect us from blame and liability, and hopefully reduce our hesitation to assist for fear of being sued or prosecuted for unintentional injury or cause? I'm happy to say that your AIA Chapter is also currently pursuing this issue with our state representatives, and we will continue to lobby to help push the establishment of this law. When you think of whom the public should turn to in times of crisis, you would probably say -- first the government, the Red Cross, and then the insurance companies. Those are my thoughts as well, but what about you and me? We are skillfully trained and educated and can help in recovery through damage assessment, community design, planning, and rebuilding. We can surely apply our skills to the efforts of government agencies and relief organizations that provide disaster recovery assistance. We are great at analyzing failure, assessing damage to structures, determining cause of loss, making recommendations concerning scope, and estimating costs of repair. When the AIA offered to help out this past year after the floods in northern Nevada, it was unfortunate that our suggestion was ignored and discounted. It's sad, but true, that it's probably easier for us to provide assistance in a foreign country than in our own state.

An act of terrorism to our tourism industry is always a top concern on my mind. Face it, we are a prime target. Just peruse the front page of the newspaper on any given day, and you'll read about a tornado, hurricane, earthquake, fire, flood or terrorism event that killed thousands of people with billions of dollars in devastation.

This month at our membership meeting, we'll take a closer look at the issue of Homeland Security in Las Vegas with guest speaker Ernest Chambers, Jr. Mr. Chambers is the Program Manager and Technical Lead of the Nevada Critical Infrastructure Program, and he'll be here to further discuss the subject of "In Case of Emergency...????" So, if that calamitous event ever happens in our own city, years later I don't want to only recall where I was when it happened, but rather what I did as an architect and leader to help our city pull through that tragedy. So, get educated and get involved today so we're better prepared if the unthinkable does happen. I hope to see all of you at the June 18th membership meeting.





# MESSAGE FROM AIA LV COTE JARGON: GROUND SOURCE HEAT PUMP PAUL CLINE, AIA

According to the International Ground Source Heat Pump Association a "ground source heat pump (GSHP) is an electrically

powered system that taps the stored energy of the greatest solar collector in existence: the earth. These systems use the earth's relatively constant temperature to provide heating, cooling, and hot water for homes and commercial buildings."

In Las Vegas for example, to cool a space a standard heat pump must take heat from the interior spaces and move it to a heat sink. The heat sink is typically the air outside, and the higher the temperature of the heat sink the more energy is required to operate the heat pump. With ground source heat pumps the heat sink is the cool earth starting about 5'-8' below grade. Other sources of heat sinks include domestic water, ground water,

ponds or lakes, and even sewer systems. I can imagine a system that uses a pool as a heat sink thereby saving heating costs for the pool.

More often this would be achieved by drilling an array of dry wells into a site and installing closed loop piping (often copper) packed in a heat conductive slurry (often bentonite) connected back to

the heat pump by a system of valves and pumps. In Geothermal Heat Pumps Provide Sustainable Alternative for Architects, Russell Boniface explains energy costs for heating and cooling can be reduced by 40-70% with a properly design GSHP system. While this provides significant savings to an owner it may still be difficult to justify the added up front costs of the system. Lenders, developers, and commercial real estate agents are just beginning to take into account these energy and operational savings when evaluating the cost of these systems. When energy savings are converted into higher lease rates and higher commercial valuations these higher initial costs do pencil out. We need to be able to educate them on the financial benefits of our designs.

In their book Geothermal Heat Pumps, Oschner and Curtis provide an overview of design and installation of GSHPs. They demonstrate that GSHPs generate 20-25% less CO2 than standard heat pumps and obtain their energy saving from a truly renewable and secure source. A properly designed GSHP system may actually provide construction cost savings by down sizing emergency power requirements of projects like data centers and medical facilities. So you can save up front cost by going green!

Keep in mind that the phrase used to identify this technology varies in different markets; Wikipedia redirects you to geothermal heat pump, some builders use geoexchange, and others geothermal exchange or simply gx. Also, as this technology is often new to many designers and contractors, so you should seek out experienced professionals for advice.

## INTERNATIONAL SUSTAINABILITY ORGANIZATION HONORS LAS VEGAS

CITY OF LAS VEGAS HAS NUMEROUS 'GREEN' PROGRAMS

The city of Las Vegas was honored as a "Key City for CAPPA," by ICLEI – Local Governments for Sustainability at the Local Action Summit North America held in Albuquerque yesterday. Deputy Director Tom Perrigo, AICP of the city's Planning & Development Department, accepted the recognition on behalf of the city.

The recognition was based on information the city submitted about ten programs including the Alternative Fuels Program, CELEBRATE program, turf conversions and the Methane Recovery Project at the Water Treatment Facility. The city has been a member of ICLEI since 2007.



ICLEI – Local Governments for Sustainability will launch its Climate and Air Pollution Planning Assistant tool (CAPPA) this year to assist local government leaders in developing customized plans for reducing climate and local air pollution based


on the collective advice of local governments throughout the organization's network.

The city of Las Vegas has a number of sustainability programs. Sustainability is defined by the city as meeting the needs of the present without compromising the needs of future generations. This includes numerous "green" efforts such as constructing new buildings to Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) standards, water conservation, recycling and greater energy efficiency, just to name a few.

In fact, Las Vegas was named the American City of the Year by the World Leadership Forum in December, largely due to its leadership in sustainability. Specifically, the city was honored for operating 90 percent the city fleet on alternative fuels and sustainability concepts built into the Centennial Hills master-planned recreational campus. The World Leadership Forum is an international competition among hundreds of cities from around the globe.

The name of the organization was changed to ICLEI – Local Governments from the International Council for Local Environmental Initiatives in 2003. It is an international association of local governments and national and regional local government organizations that have made a commitment to sustainable development. More than 815 cities, towns, counties, and their associations worldwide comprise ICLEI's growing membership.

ICLEI provides technical consulting, training, and information services to build capacity, share knowledge, and support local government in the implementation of sustainable development at the local level. Its basic premise is that locally designed initiatives can provide an effective and cost-efficient way to achieve local, national, and global sustainability objectives.

There is no charge for AIA Members who RSVP (RSVP two days in advance is required); Non-members and Guests are \$40 each. If you RSVP and then don't show up, you will be invoiced \$40; If you don't RSVP and just walk in you will be required to pay \$40.

#### AIA Las Vegas Board of Directors

#### GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. The AIA Las Vegas Board of Directors is responsible to the members of the Chapter for the proper management and effective handling of the business of the Chapter and must represent the best interests of the members and the Institute at all times. Service on the Board requires a commitment of time and resources. Each Director, in accepting their position on the Board, has made this commitment and accepts the requirements of service as a priority.
- 2. Directors attend and participate in each monthly Board Meeting. Every effort should be made to be in attendance and to be on time. Board Meetings are normally held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of each month, unless otherwise notified. Meetings are usually 1-2 hours in length.
- 3. Directors must read, review and be prepared to discuss all items on the meeting agendas, minutes of meetings, financial reports, calendars, special reports and all information provided prior to the meeting so that they can act in the best interest of the membership.
- 4. Each Director is responsible for helping to generate income for the Chapter through sponsorships, event participation, advertising, promotion and other sources.
- 5. Directors are expected to attend all AIA Las Vegas functions including membership meetings, special events and social functions and to support the Chapter's efforts in all programs.
- 6. Directors are expected to read and understand the by-laws of the Chapter and the Public Policies of the Institute, and to act in accordance with these governances. Directors are responsible for seeking information and utilizing resources (AIA websites, publications, etc.) and for keeping themselves informed and updated so that they can best represent the members of the Chapter at all times.
- 7. As representatives and leaders of the Chapter, Directors are expected to be informed regarding AIA membership benefits, dues structure, programs, sponsorship opportunities, scholarships and procedures and should be active ambassadors for the Chapter in recruiting new members, sponsors and supporters for the Chapter.
- 8. IN accordance with our Strategic Plan -- Each Director is responsible for a specific Core Value area. Each Director is the board contact person for all committees and activities that are aligned with that Core Value area, and the reports to the board regarding the progress and activities in that area.
- 9. Directors must work closely with the Executive Director regarding their committee activities and progress in order to coordinate budgets, calendars and logistics.
- 10. New Board Members are required to provide a photograph of themselves and a brief bio, which may be used in AIA publications and/or programs. The photo and bio must be provided by December 1, 2008.

AIA NEVADA PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE RIC LICATA, AIA

#### If Not Now, When? "The Urgency of Transformation"

"When faced with a radical crisis, when the old way of being in the world, of interacting with each other and with the realm of nature doesn't work anymore, when survival is threatened by seemingly insurmountable problems, an individual life-form or a species- will either die or become extinct or rise up above the limitations of its condition through an evolutionary leap." Eckhart Tolle, A New Earth.

Having just returned from the AIA National Convention I find myself renewed and inspired. Beyond the countless classes, the product Expo, and the fellowship found with our fellow AIA professionals, the elements that have stayed with me the most is the theme of the convention, We the People, ...and the messages delivered by key note speakers MILLARD FULLER, founder of Habitat for Humanity, and AMBASSADOR ANDREW YOUNG, civil rights leader and former congressman. Their messages were significant in that they were both based on the common fundamental premise that we, architects and our profession, are uniquely qualified and knowledgeable in solving many ills of mankind, and particularly in regard to the build environment as it relates to the human condition.

A common theme in their messages was that in many, if not most, instances our talents have rarely been available to those who need them the most. This has compelled me to think long and hard as to how relevant our profession is to those in need. **ANDREW YOUNG** referred to the 3 billion of the earth's people who are in poverty and in need.

What comes to my mind is that we will become relevant to all people when we transform our profession and use our leadership skills to effect and initiate change. As an educator and practicing architect, I too fall prey to the pretty illusionary qualities of "centerfold" pictures in our trade magazines, sharing them and holding them up as the unique artistic image our profession possesses. Beyond those very few who have their designs published there are many who can do a greater good; many who have the vision of what can be, and who possess the leadership skills to empower that change. We must utilize our leadership skills to make our communities more livable, our environment cleaner, and to help provide for the needs of those less privileged. We must encourage, and yes even insist, that all our fellow professionals become engaged. As AIA architects we hold ourselves to a higher standard.

This brings me full circle to our efforts in AIA Nevada and the "evolutionary leap" that is necessary to preserve our environment and create more livable communities. As many of you are aware, through your participation, the "Blueprint for Nevada" is now published and we are entering the implementation phase of this process. As I've stated in past writings the Blueprint is a statewide sustainability, visioning document. It endorses sustainable community development and reinvestment, as well as promoting environmental design and thinking in creating more livable communities. The "Blueprint" is a tool that outlines sustainable approaches to constructing the built environment and assists policy makers in support of these practices. This is where you come in! You, the leaders of our institute and profession will be called upon to share this mantle as we move it forward. We need advocates and spokespersons to present the Blueprint to state and community leaders for their consideration and endorsement.

We cannot falter in our efforts to move the Blueprint forward. It will take the help of every AIA member to assure that our vision does not stop here. You will be asked to contact those leaders, and call in those markers, to make sure this document and its vision becomes part and parcel to the future decisions made in our state and local communities. The urgency of this message is truly for the transformation of our state, its environment, and its economic future. Your time to lead is now.
