I am a member of AIA because...I am passionate for the profession.

Practicing Architecture fulfills a childhood dream, and allows me to pursue my passion of finding green solutions that are cohesive environmentally and workable professionally. My commitment to sustainable design, community wellness, and leadership has been the driving force of my career.

What is the most important thing you've learned?

As a fresh 20-year old arrival to the United States pursuing higher education in Las Vegas I have faced considerable challenges adapting to a different culture and language. These challenges helped to establish a solid base in architectural concepts, theories, practices, and ultimately earn a Bachelor and Master Degree in Architecture. With hard work and dedication I graduated from UNLV with the highest honors, and have managed to become a LEED accredited professional, and complete the Architecture Licensing Exams, and the Architecture Experience Program within two years of my graduation. I have learned not to fear change, but to embrace it

What person, living or dead, would you most like to talk with?

I have always been fascinated by Antonio Gaudi's design ingenuity and early forms of sustainability even when climate change was not a well-known concern.

How do you think the profession will evolve in the next 5-10 years?

The profession in my opinion is moving towards a more technologically savvy future. We are constantly learning new software, and trends in design and construction. There will be a huge change in terms of how we design and document projects, and how we communicate them to clients with the use of virtual and augmented reality. I have been collaborating with other Gensler fellows to find the most suitable applications of this technologies to our profession. I have witnessed great client satisfaction as they are able to experience their buildings before they get built.

How can AIA lead reform and innovation?

Architects are natural innovators and problem solvers, and everything we do in our profession has a great impact on the world around us. I believe that we should not limit our membership to fields allied to architecture, but to open our doors to professionals that love architecture and are willing to help make a greater impact on our communities, and the world.

AIA Las Vegas President's Message Jon Sparer, AIA

It is with great pride and humility that I accept the mantle of leading our local AIALV Chapter in 2017. I take this responsibility seriously and know that I have some big shoes to fill from our past Presidents. Brett Ewing did an amazing job as our 2016 Chapter President, leading us through a reflective year as we celebrated our 60th year anniversary. It was a year full of great stories, starting with personal perspectives of some of our pioneer architects from the early years when the town was a 'real small town', culminating with more personal stories highlighting the building boom years we all remember so fondly and wistfully. Thank you Brett for a job well done.

Last year's celebration of our past 60 years culminated at our present day. This is the perfect segway for the focus I am proposing for 2016.....our future. The theme for 2017 will be:

"The Next Generation of Architects"

Igniting Interest, Education & Passion for Architecture

I think we can all agree that we are successfully rising out of the ashes of the devastating recession of 2008-2011. During this black times in our recent history, Las Vegas was one of the hardest hit communities, and our design community was deeply affected, with 87% of NV architects unemployed. Many left the profession entirely, and in addition, many students left the profession, and many were discouraged and never became licensed at all. This circumstance is made worse by the anticipated retirement of 27,000 baby boomer architects over the next decade. The total deficit of qualified architects over the next 10-15 years is anticipated to be in the neighborhood of 40,000 to 50,000 architects due to these major factors.

That is the bad news.

Now here's the good. There has never been a better time to become an architect. The whole world needs problem solvers and that is exactly what architects are trained to do - solve problems through design. Young people are seeing a world that challenges them to make a difference and to contribute their knowledge, ideas and creativity. The generation that has grown up with rapidly changing advances in technology is eager to meet that challenge....and Architecture offers the way. The AIA Las Vegas Chapter will make it our mission in 2017 to ignite the interest, education and passion for architecture in the next generation of architects, and to facilitate, guide and mentor them toward licensure. Our goal is to reach out to students of all ages and raise their awareness of the importance of design and quality architecture not only as a career but as a way to change and improve the world.

In 2017 the AIA Las Vegas Chapter will provide "Programs and Education" that engage, excite and educate our current members, non-members and the emerging professionals who will be our future members.

This year we will continue our successful Programs from our past, as well as introducing new Programs that will expand our outreach to the students, from the Architectural Students at the SOA at UNLV, to High School & Middle School Students in the Clark County School District as well as Private Schools throughout the Las Vegas Valley.

- AIA/AIAS Mentoring Program Designing the Future
 - *A 2-year mentoring program for 3rd & 4th year AIAS members, pairing newly licensed architects with upper classman of our architectural school.
- AIA Las Vegas High School Design Awards
 - *We have already met with the CC School District and begun conversations as to increase participation from High Schools, even those that do not have any design programs.
- AIA Las Vegas Principal Shadow Program
 - *This is a new program that we are initiating, pairing 6th year graduate students with Firm Principals or other high level employees for an afternoon(s) and/or day(s), allowing the students to sit in on meetings, including client, consultant and design. This will give the students a chance to see what a firm principal does and experience projects in all different stages.
- High School & Middle School Outreach
 - *Another new program, working with Glenn Nowak and Dominic Armendariz from the UNLV SOA, we will meet with high school and middle school students and teachers throughout the valley to discuss what an architect does, talk about the SOA and answer questions. This can be at architects' offices, at their school or even at a project. This initial meeting can be followed by a subsequent tour of the UNLV SOA.
- Art, Architecture & Design Month
 - *CANstruction, partnering with Three Square

 - *High School Design Awards
 *Celebrating the 20th Anniversary of the School of Architecture Paul B. Sogg Building

This is an ambitious program that we are embarking and we are calling on you to help us make this a successful year. How can you do that, you are asking yourselves, let me tell you:





THE MARYLAND PARKWAY CORRIDOR

A lot has been said over the years about a corridor to connect Downtown Las Vegas with the McCarran International Airport, a transit oriented development that could facilitate the commute of more than 35,000 valley residents.

But its fruition may be closer than ever, as the Southern Nevada Strong, a collaborative regional planning effort funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, and the Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada (RTC) have continued to seek strong partnerships to move this project forward. A primary element of the development would be an 8.7-mile high-capacity transit system to link various activity centers along the major arterial. The corridor will be enhanced with new landscaping, public art, and aesthetic treatments to create a sense of place, and aid the revitalization of the area. The plan has an integrated vison for land use, transportation and economic development.




