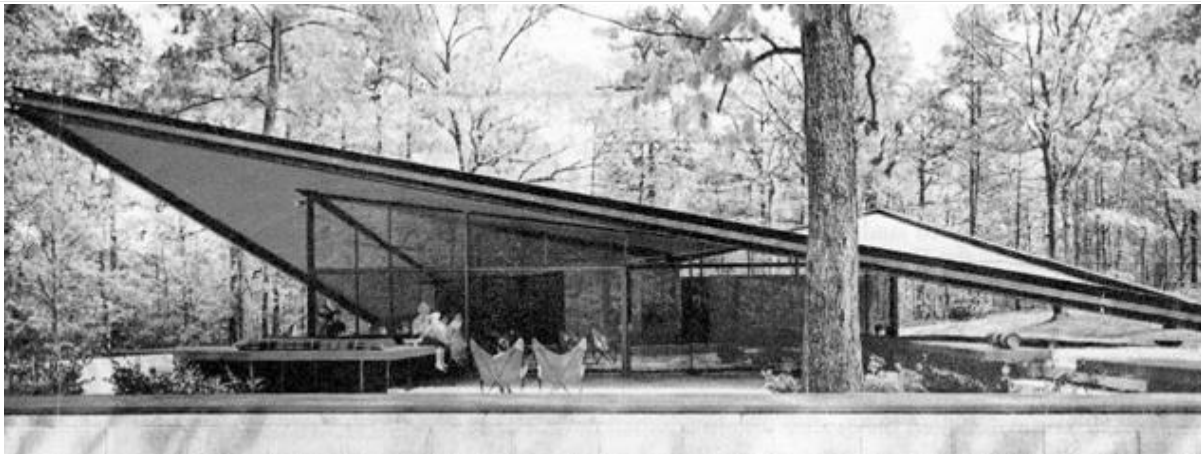

Zaha Hadid, the groundbreaking Iraqi-British architect who was the first woman to win the Pritzker Prize, is dead at 65. Her curving, elongated structures left a mark on skylines around the world. She was the first woman to win the Pritzker Prize, her profession's highest honor. Ms. Hadid "contracted bronchitis earlier this week and suffered a sudden heart attack while being treated in hospital," her office, Zaha Hadid Architects in London, said in a statement.
