


SAVED! Thanks to community resistance, a developer poised to destroy the immaculate **Jack Boyte**-designed Solomon Levine House, 2300 Cloister Drive, in Charlotte NC backed out and a new preservation-minded couple is under contract. This 1956 house is one of Charlotte's finest examples of midcentury modern. Many thanks to the sellers and the Historic Landmarks Commission.



Architect **Barbara Neski** died last week. She received her undergraduate degree from Bennington College in 1949. In 1951 Neski worked for **Victor Gruen** and in 1952 **José Lluis Sert** where she met, and later married, **Julian Neski**. They moved to **Marcel Breuer's** office in 1953 where she designed plans for a factory in Canada, the Gagarin House in Connecticut, and a library for Hunter College. Barbara and Julian started their own firm around 1957 and designed over 35 houses, 25 of which were in the Hamptons. Listen

From Architecture Digest: The new nonprofit Case Study: Adapt is Leo Seigal and Dustin Bramell's alternative to developer-driven models for recovery from the LA fires. Inspired by the legendary Case Study program that galvanized architecture in the quest for efficient, experimental modern housing iafter World War II, CSA aims to explore and implement bold new ideas in housing by matching leading architects with clients looking to rebuild in the Pacific Palisades and Altadena, the two communities hardest hit by the conflagration. CSA enlisted ten of LA's leading residential architecture firms and challenged each to design a distinctive house predicated on the principles of modesty in scale, energy and construction efficiency, and climate resiliency: Assembledge+, Bestor Architecture, EYRC Architects, Geoffrey von Oeyen Design, Johnston Marklee, Marmol Radziner, Montalba Architects, Standard Architecture|Design, Walker Workshop, and Woods + Dangaran. Joining the group were **Jaime Rummerfield**, executive director of the preservation and advocacy organization Save Iconic Architecture, and photographer Roger Davies, who will document CSA's efforts

From the LA Times: The Tadao Ando Malibu house infamously once owned (and almost destroyed) by **Kanye West** is for sale again at \$39 million. New owner Bo Belmont says it needs \$6.5M more to restore it to its former glory, after already spending \$2M. Architects **Marmol Radziner**, a design-build company, worked on the initial construction of the house and now is working to restore the home to its original look.

The Béton Brut Cocktail

Hopeful news: The bank that holds the mortgage on the deteriorating 1903 Walser House by Frank Lloyd Wright in in Chicago told a judge it would begin work to correct code violations.



Endangered: The Alice Ball House in New Canaan CT, designed by Philip Johnson, is up for auction April 22 due to around \$163000 in unpaid property taxes. There is no minimum bid. CTtaxsales.com explains the process. Bidding begins at 11am at the New Canaan Town Hall, 77 Main Street, New Canaan CT.



The Village of Southampton Architectural Review Board (ARB), continues to relentlessly pursue forced landmarking of five Modernist houses, three by **Norman Jaffe** (like the Bliss house at left), and one each by **Myron Goldfinger** and **Ward Bennett.**

At the last **epic six-hour meeting**,

preservation experts representing the town and owners gave reports about whether the houses qualified for landmarking, then the owner attorneys tore into the ARB's aggressive lack of transparency, violation of town and national policies, disregard for homeowner rights, and absence of a public ARB vote to pursue this landmarking effort to begin with.

We're all in favor of Modernist preservation, but this is absolutely not the right way to go about it. Yet again, a meeting to make a final decision has been kicked many months down the road, this time to **Monday, September 22, 6pm ET**. Watch it over Zoom.

A 1994 design by **Ed Niles** in Topanga CA **has come onto the market for \$2.5M**.



In Stamford CT, a 1951 house by architect **Lester Tichy,** featured in *Interiors Magazine* in December 1953, **is for sale at \$2.9M**.



The original owner of a 1963 Berkeley CA house designed by Bay Area architect **John Hans Ostwald** sold it for \$1.6M, **201 percent of the asking price.**

To quickly find anything in the **USModernist** archives, just type in the name of the architect, then USModernist, into **Google**. For example: Gropius USModernist.


The USModernist Architecture Media Library is so large, that stacking the pages would reach a


