









Third Sketch showing proposal for Building 125 ft. to wallhead, with two floors in the roof.



Adelaide House: Elevation to Adelaide Place.










Adelaide House; Elevation to River Thames.




Detail. First Premiated Design.










Design for the Bank of Chile, Santiago: Ground Floor Plan.




Longitudinal and Cross Section through Vestibule.

THE ROYAL FREE HOSPITAL (OUT-PATIENTS' DEPARTMENT)

HESE Buildings were completed just prior to the outbreak of the War; the site at the back of the present Hospital and without any frontage, so to say, demanded that the Buildings thereon should be treated in the simplest manner possible and not one penny spent on Architectural Features as such, or on materials other than would ensure lasting quality and structurally sound—hence, in external treatment, plain brick buildings are evolved with many essential windows—and the only chance of obtaining any character is by judicious spacing of voids and solids, with some emphasis on the Entrances and the choice of different kinds of bricks, London stocks with Luton and multi-coloured red dressings, and a salt glazed dado being used—the Buildings generally are fire-resisting throughout.

The accommodation provided was somewhat unusual, since the Hospital required space for many departments, which, because more "beds" were required, had to vacate the Hospital proper; thus there are the following Departments:—Out-Patients', Casualty, X-Ray and Electrical Massage, Dental, and in addition, Nurses' Bedrooms, Students' Common Rooms, etc., Maternity Wards and Operating Theatre, and Maternity Students' Living-in-Quarters—accommodation for Ward Maids and Workshops in the Basement. The plans show how these varied requirements were obtained.

The Out-Patients' Department contains the usual Waiting Hall with Medical and Surgical Consulting Rooms, Examination Rooms and Dressing Cubicles suitably arranged; Operating Theatre with Dispensary and Dispensary Waiting Hall adjoining—the Casualty Department has its own Entrance and Waiting Hall with Men's and Women's Treatment Rooms, Operating Theatre and Observation Wards; on the First Floor, South and West sides, are the special Departments, and on the Second Floor over, the Maternity Department and Operating Suite; the First and Second Floors on the North Side are given over to the Nurses' Bedrooms, and on the Floor over Casualty, to the Ward Maids' Bedrooms with separate entrance.

The Maternity Department is complete with Labour and other Wards, Operating Theatre, Babies' Bathroom and other adjuncts; recently an extension to the Wards has been carried out on this Floor, and the Royal Free Hospital has a Gynæcological Unit with Professor attached thereto, necessitating special Laboratories and the like.

The whole of the Buildings were taken over by the War Office in 1914, and were used, with eminent success, as an Officers' Hospital for the duration of the War.

On the completion of these Buildings the Pathological Block was taken in hand and completely remodelled, involving the building of a large top-lighted P.M. Room, Mortuary and Museum, with Students' Laboratories and Research Rooms.

Much further work is in contemplation as funds permit, as this is the great Teaching Hospital for Women, the London School of Medicine for Women being allied to it, and plans for further Buildings to accommodate some 250 beds are under consideration.






Moore Close: Garden Lay-out Sections.






Glasgow Housing Competition: Lay-out for Sites at Moss Park, J. COUTTS, Architect. Second Premiated Design.




Glasgow Housing Competition: Plan of House, with Fittings and Equipment. M. STARK, Architect. First Premiated Design.






