eggs for beaks. Cut webbed feet about 2" long for largest cone (graduate sizes for other two), using contrasting colored gummed crepe.

Make fancy neck feathers for largest cone by cutting two semi-circles of gummed crepe (one slightly larger than the other, cutting rounded sides into deep points. Moisten sides of semi-circles and attach to cone. For tail feathers, cut several long narrow strips of gummed crepe, curling slightly and attaching to base of cone.


For top hat, form a strip of black gummed crepe 1½" wide by 2¾" long, into a cylinder and paste down seam. Slip on a brim made from a circle of black gummed crepe with the center cut out. Moisten underside of brim and paste to egg. Cap for baby egghead is bright blue gummed crepe paper. Band is 1" wide and 4" long. Slash along top and bottom. Overlap ends to form a circle, and bend tabs in at top and bottom. Paste a 2" diam, circle of blue crepe to top and affix to egg.

portle bunny has tight pompon tail made of fringed crepe paper strip 24" long x 3" wide and cemented to bottle back. Smaller pompon makes ruff around neck. Head is hardboiled egg with pink and blue gummed crepe cut to make face and whiskers. Stand egg head on fringed white crepe pompon and then attach to bottle cap.

DECORATED EGGS in a modern montage fashion are made by covering hard-boiled eggs with various gummed seals. For an unusual touch, try some of the commercial seals such as reinforcements and notarial or signal dots. Reinforcements are available in both black and white. Use as polka dots or in halves to form spirals or scallops.

PLANNING TO MOVE?

It can be a nightmare or accomplished with a maximum of ease

oving prices have skyrocketed, but people keep moving just the same. With the do-it-yourself age have come ways to help cut costs. Usually there's a 30-day period for preparation, so GET ORGANIZED to allow yourself more time to attend to details with less rush and more ease.

WAYS TO MOVE ACCORDING TO YOUR OWN CIRCUMSTANCES AND TIME

1. Professional movers (complete job). They will call, look over contents of your home and discuss details. A reliable mover's trained eye enables him to judge weights and quantities. His approximate estimate is fairly close to final costs. His packers prepare your household belongings prior to moving date. They dismantle and pack everything, then unpack and even place furniture and hang draperies in your new home if you so desire, removing all packing material from the premises. Rates for local moves are usually by the hour and for longer distances by weight and mileage. If moving between states, you are protected by the Interstate Commerce Commission which sets rates for distance and weight. If moving out of state, I.C.C. rules state cash, money order or certified check has to be received before your possessions are delivered! 2. Pack what you can. Estimates are lower this way based on mover's share of work including charges for packing material he supplies. For relatively long hauls, it's wiser to permit mover to pack, crate or put in barrels such articles as heavy mirrors, lamp bases, shades, delicate or fragile articles such as china, crystal, and decorative accessories. These he will unpack at your destination. It is also visable to have him supply the wardr containers.

3. Your car, station wagon or trailer is cheaper, g for short hauls. Use professional mover cumbersome furniture and heavy equipme You can move in advance small furnishing wearing apparel, and cartons. Cartons can unpacked and reused, kitchen cabinets clothes closets put in order. The more move yourself, the less time it will t movers. As local movers generally charge the hour and not by weight, you pay for ev minute of their time-even their coffee bro and time out to enjoy a cigarette!

4. Truck Rental is the cheapest, albeit the hard If you don't own a car or can't afford a prosional mover, you can rent a truck. Selec company with an established reputation. can have more confidence in their reliabi and the cleanliness of packing materials. best trucks are steam-cleaned. For short moderately long hauls, this is the m economical way. It's

necessary, though, to supply the manpower. Ordinary operator's license is sufficient—"chauffeur's license" not required. A driver can be hired, if necessary, but it raises the cost. Trucks come in a variety of sizes. A 14-foot (2½ ton) truck can handle approximately five to six rooms of furniture. National average cost for this type truck is \$10.30 for a 24-hour day, plus 12¢ a mile. Certain localities have trucks with hydraulic tailgates which drop to ground level. Heavy furniture or appliance

is placed on it and gate raised to truck body level. Rent one dolly (\$1.25) and sufficient pads (12about 20¢ each) to prevent scratching. Truck rental rates include gas, oil, and proper insurance coverage on public liability and property damage. However, a trucking company is not permitted to sell insurance on cargo carried in its trucks.

It is advisable to check your insurance company or broker to verify your furniture coverage against damage in transit. Reserve truck well in advance. Your credit rating must be established when you sign rental agreement. Cash deposit is required if you do not have credit or charge account cards. Truck must be returned to original rental office except for long distance hauls, whereby one-way rentals are handled on an individual basis and the truck may be returned to rental office at the destination point. Final cost depends on distance and time you have truck service.



TIPS (TO MAKE YOUR MOVING EASIER)

- 1. Do comparison shopping for estimates.
- 2. Get a reliable mover. If in doubt, consult your Better Business Bureau.
- 3. Insist on direct move without transfer.
- 4. Try to keep load to one van full.
- 5. Check rail rates for long distances. Prices may be cheaper for less-than-a-carload.
- 6. Be sure to include and make arrangements for everything in connection with moving your belongings. Notify mover at once of any changes. "Extras" as well as "stopovers" after estimate is given imposes an added service which can be costly. It not only involves the mover's time, but may require extra men or a larger van.
- 7. Discuss insurance with mover, insurance company.
- 8. Send soiled clothing to your regular cleaner in time to get them back. If you are renting wardrobes from your mover, you won't have to worry about them getting messed up, and it will give you a chance after moving to inquire about a good cleaning establishment in your new location. Shoes could be repaired, too.
- **9.** Destroy old receipted bills you won't need for income tax purposes. It's best to save until the statute of limitations has expired, those for which you claimed a deduction just in case a few years hence the government chooses your return for examination.
- 10. Be sure to place very important papers or documents in a safety deposit box at the bank.
- 11. Give your mover a plan if you wish him to place furniture, cartons, etc. in proper positions and rooms. Use the alphabet system, lettering the (continued on page 104)

BUYING TIPS

To help you avoid the trial-and-error method of picking a house, here's a list of things you should consider before making a choice.

here's an old saying to the effect that you have to own three houses before you stop making mistakes and get exactly the house you and your family want. Now this isn't exactly true. There is no earthly reason for you to make mistakes if you will learn from the mistakes others have made. To help you in your search, we've jotted down a lot of useful tips on this and the following pages that will help insure your getting the "perfect" house the first time.

- 1. PROVIDE FOR FUTURE EXPANSION: Remodeling is always more expensive than new building. If you know that one day you are going to have to enlarge the house, you'll save money by having as much of this work done as possible during the construction of the house. Have the builder put in dormers in the expansion attic, for example. Heating and plumbing lines should also be installed where additional living space will be added.
- 2. PROVIDE EXTRA HEATING CAPACITY: There's a tendency among some builders to figure furnace and boiler sizes very close to actual requirements.

The result is that if you add extra living space to the house, the heating plant is no longer adequate. If you plan on expansion in the near future, get the proper size heater now.

- 3. FUTURE CENTRAL AIR CONDITIONING: You may decide that you can't afford to install central air conditioning at the present time, but it's wise, if you do plan for it in the future, to have the necessary pipes and ducts installed when the heating system goes in. The actual installation of the air conditioning will be at a minimum.
- 4. DON'T UNDERESTIMATE YOUR NEED FOR SPACE: Get as much space as you can afford for it is less now than it will be if you must add on later.
- 5. CHECK STORAGE FACILITIES: The chances are that you won't be able to add to existing closet space but you may be able to get a large storage closet in the attic, basement, or even the recreation room.
- 6. DON'T SKIMP ON PERMANENT FEATURES: You'll always regret your failure to put in, or at least (continued on page 115)







oo busy to fuss with flower arrangements? Here are three examples that look as though they could walk off with blue ribbons at a show, yet they can be put together in minutes. Give them a try. You'll find that most of the materials are available in gardens or in florists' shops.

Here's a very easy one as a start. Beginning with a white hobnail glass vase, secure in a pin holder a single flower stalk of Lily-of-the-Nile. Officially called Agapanthus, these bright blue flowers grow in clusters of 25-30 with each single cluster measuring 6-8" across, so one will be enough for a small vase. Foliage are the large leaves of the Plantain Lily.







Like their neighbors, the Jennings' know how to enjoy "the things that truly last in Pennsylvania."







or something bright and different in a paved terrace, try experimenting with colored concrete. The variety of colors and combinations possible can achieve a highly original and decorative effect, often like a modern painting in concrete.

In order to build a high-quality, permanent terrace, start by laying out the dimensions and excavating for footings. Those around the edge of the terrace should be 18 inches deep and 6 to 8 inches thick. The terrace floor consists of a 6-inch gravel base, 4 inches of concrete slab and 11/2 inches of concrete topping. Forms for footings of lumber or plywood are placed in excavation and held in place with stakes. (Poured concrete or block footings are suggested for cold climates.) Next, shovel in 6 inches of gravel base for floor and tamp down. To keep the slab from cracking, lay 1/2-inch reinforcing rods about ten inches apart. If you're building next to your home, drill holes in your concrete foundation and lay the rods in these and across the terrace. If the terrace is away from the house, you can simply lay the rods on top of the gravel base. You can drill holes in the forms and lay the rods through these, but this isn't absolutely necessary. Now pour the footings, using a gravel-mix concrete or a mixture of 1 bag cement to 2 cubic ft. of sand, to 5 cubic ft. of gravel. Let footings cure for about a week by covering with wet burlap. Now pour 1/2 of your 4-inch slab, tamp level, lay in wire reinforcing mesh and pour second half of slab. Tamp until compact. Let concrete cure for a week and start on floor design. Lay out 11/2-inch-thick redwood strips in the design you want and nail them together. Brush bonding slush coat of water and cement on slab. Fill wood frames with sand-mix concrete: level and smooth. When concrete has completely cured

and dried (3 to 4 weeks), brush on a coating of fiberglass plastic resin and let dry. Now mix one part titanium dioxide, three parts fiber-glass plastic resin and enough mineral oxide coloring pigment to give the desired color. Brush on mixture and let dry. Colors are lasting, highly resistant to weathering and fading.

OTHER WAYS TO COLOR CONCRETE

Integral Color. One of the old standbys for coloring concrete are manufactured mineral pigments that are mixed in with the cement powder and aggregate before adding water. The three ingredients should be mixed together thoroughly. Full coloring value of the pigments is best obtained with white cement, the strength of the color depending on the amount of pigment you use in proportion to the cement. Manufacturers recommend amounts to be used in terms of weight.

Dusting in Color. After pouring a new concrete floor, level and smooth it with screed and float tools. When concrete has set just hard enough to support knee boards and surface water has disappeared, sprinkle pigment uniformly over the surface. Allow pigment to absorb moisture from the concrete and work it into the surface with a float. A second coat is applied and also floated in. Follow the manufacturer's directions. When surface becomes firm, smooth with a steel trowel. Concrete should be covered with waterproof paper and cured for about seven days.

Painting Concrete. For this type of job, the concrete should be clean, dry and thoroughly cured (about six months, if possible). To prepare a dense, smooth concrete surface to hold paint, etch it with one part muriatic acid to three parts water. You should wear rubber gloves when working with the acid and use extreme care. Suggested paints for concrete are those that contain the following vehicles: Polyurethane, chlorinated rubber, alkyd or phenolic. You can find the name of the vehicle along with the ingredients on the label of the can.


Color



THE ROBERTSON TERRACE in Portland, Oregon is an example of how planning can cut costs. They built an unusual and interesting terrace floor out of pieces of salvaged broken concrete. The striated surface and different shapes of the concrete pieces form a contrast for the light green Arenaria ground cover. Arenaria is good for terraces; low growing, it can take traffic.

THE CRUIKSHANK TERRACE in Pebble Beach, Cal. is really a beautiful example of pattern, color and texture. Large rectangles of concrete are set in frames of 2x4-inch redwood. Pebbles of several colors are sprinkled on top of the concrete just before it hardens. The pebble topping takes the roadway look from the concrete, adding color and texture to the surface. Complementing the geometric form of the terrace is a large, curving planting area. Arenaria, succulents and rock plants provide life and color, need little care or weeding.

TEXTURE Serves as Color, too






HERE ARE A NUMBER of brick patterns which you might consider for your walk or terrace. Brick is attractive and easy to use; comes in many colors and finishes: red, brown, buff, pink and yellow—smooth or rough. You can lay bricks with mortar joints or you can fill the crevices with sand or sod for a real rustic effect. Sand base under a mortarless terrace should be at least an inch thick. If you roll the sand base before laying brick you'll have a neater result.

THE EDEN FAMILY in Winnetka, Ill. has a lovely brick terrace that's laid out in squares in a running bond pattern. The rich red of the bricks and the alternating pattern of each square give a pleasing visual effect. Bricks are laid without concrete on a sand base. White pebble border surrounds the terrace proper. If you're a do-it-yourselfer, this block pattern is well suited to your needs if you want to do part of the job one summer and finish it up the next.






WINDOW DRESSING

Too many picture windows don't live up to their name. Not only do they fail to have a view, but more often than not they face a busy street or other picture windows. The result is they need curtains for privacy. And since big windows need lots of fabric which may cost lots of money, we worked out some solutions which aren't budget-breaking.

In John and Jane's house above, the ten-foot stretch of window was "dressed" with a wide plastic coated window shade and semi-sheer Fortisan café curtains neatly pleated and pointed at top and bottom—Pattern #1735, 35¢. Even if you have never sewn a stitch, you can make these curtains for slanting high windows (see below) IF you follow instructions in Pattern #1736, 25¢. Pattern #1737, 40¢, at far right has two "toppers" over sheer curtains. And note the window shade "dressing" and sheeting curtains with easy-to-make French pleats.



THIS IS THE OUTSIDE of a wonderful split-level house with one of the so-hard-to-curtain small, high slanted series of windows. But they can be "dressed" well and cleverly, too, at little cost.








Nor can Randy, my husband, have a workshop eating up a lot of costly footage (naturally, he secretly yearns for just this) because in the past five years he has made only one small desk.

For my money, a perfect example of a house is one that has been stripped down to essentials. It's devoid of many expensive extras, but there isn't a square foot of it that's lacking in comfort. It's small, easy-to-care-for, tailored to the owner's needs and way of life, built and finished in the simplest, most economical way. You might prefer something more elaborate or in a different taste. But everyone has to decide, somewhere along the line, what he can live without. Let's analyze some of the things that are currently considered essential, measured in terms of value received in dollars and cents.

've decided that most of us are pushovers in our homes for gadgets, tricks and pet ideas which don't bring an adequate return for their cost. In planning a house, most of us want more than we can afford! But if we have an eye on the budget—and who doesn't?—we must learn to determine what is essential, what non-essential for a good house and good living.

Before speaking up on the subject, let me say that after having been in and out of hundreds of houses for twenty years as a writer for home magazines and as the wife of an architect, I am daily subjected to the trials and tribulations of budget-juggling. Frequently, as a business woman who spends most of her day out of her house, I need, as well as the next woman, labor-saving devices in abundance. Also, due maybe to Norwegian ancestry, I'm a fussy housekeeper wanting a place for everything and everything in its place.

But I've learned—the hard way—what separates the frosting from the cake. Though it looks pretty, it doesn't buy much! What comes under the heading of frosting? Dove cotes, mud rooms, concealed TV's, complicated casework, fort-like barbecues, elegant sewing areas, home workshops, et cetera. Don't scream until you've heard me out! Remember, we're still talking about good houses and good living within a cost that you can afford!

First, a bit of personal history. The first two houses we built (both shown in the American HOME) had certain confusions concerning what was essential. To begin with, our first house was really more than a young architect's income could afford. Also, we had

The NEW Life of "Riley"


A few years ago we featured the Beverly Hills home of Bill Bendix and his family . . . a big white house, clearly the kind for family ease and good company. It brought from us a big 21-gun salute. Consensus was that it was the right house for "The Life of Riley." But we (including the Bill Bendix') were all wrong . . . it was not the right house at all!

Don't misunderstand. The Bendix' had a wonderful time living there. Everything moved along for them on greased wheels. Bill started his "Life of Riley" show on television soon after we photographed the house and with his movie work he had been bowling along, top down and throttle open, ever since.

No, there was nothing wrong with their "White House" . . . nothing, that is, except it was not right for them. It takes time and considerable living in a house to find this out.

Here you see the San Fernando Valley house which Bill Bendix and his wife bought after they parted with their beautiful, big white house in Beverly Hills. It took wisdom and courage to leave the big house, but the compensations have been great and you don't need radar to find out why. For a family of three, the little house is perfect. For a wife who is a fine cook, loves keeping her own little house, Mrs. Bendix is in her element. For a down-to-earth man like Bill, to whom surface trappings mean little, it's a happy size, a perfect home.

This house and the big one, although both alike in their atmosphere of irresistible comfort, are quite different in appearance. There was a polite (continued)



BILL BENDIX is a time-dominated man. Evidently, though, he too became aware of the fact the old house was too large for them. Busy or not, Bill is a thoroughly home-minded man. His wife is what he calls a cracker-jack cook. It is entirely possible during the years they lived in the big house that Bill's mind returned to earlier days when he came home to a fire burning and dinner en casserole. As soon as he realized Mrs. Bendix was not entirely happy, it was enough for him. They sold the big house and bought a smaller one completely to their pattern.

MRS. BENDIX is a sincere, unspoiled woman, and it was she, probably because she was at home more than Bill—and because her self-knowledge is sharp as curry—who came to realize the mistake first. There was more to it than the fact you walk your legs off in a big house. A large home naturally requires servants, and that, she finally



analyzed, was the crux of her side of the situation. The reason? She likes housekeeping, likes being busy. In the big, well-staffed house, she found herself waking many mornings with nothing to do. She's not a club woman, nor does she enjoy playing bridge hours on end. Her older daughter, Lorraine, was happily married in her own home. To Mrs. Bendix it was like waking up in a hotel, seeing Stephanie off to school and Bill off to work, then wondering what to do until they returned. (Here, Mrs. Bendix holds a button picture, made especially for her by a 97-year-old lady. It is fashioned out of buttons used in her family and dating back many years.)


nside, they made only one change. The living room ended at the wide opening. The space beyond was an open, covered porch with doors leading into it from the living room. They enclosed this porch with a glass wall at the end, with pine-paneled side walls. We have learned that an outlook through glass walls, an architectural concept of our own times, not only gives an illusion of space, but an outdoor view is a powerful element in the inside decoration. But by experience we have also learned that any glass walls, to be truly successful, should have protection from strong sun. Here the glass wall faces north and a north exposure tames sun into cool comfort. Having then enclosed the former covered porch to add more actual depth to the living room, as well as visual space via the new glass end wall, they next added a wide paved terrace to replace the shade area of the former covered porch, they roofed over the terrace area just beyond the new glass wall. Notice how the inside and outside are further knitted together by keeping the floors of the room and terrace at the same level, and how the protective terrace roof, a continuation of the roof plane, draws the eye outward and on. The living room now not only merges with the outdoors but actually seems to borrow space from the far reach of the site. What you see is flowing, uninterrupted space of vast dimensions. Remember, the house is only three-bedroom size, and the living room, although of pleasant size, is not a huge room. Instead the spacious size is pure illusion, a legitimate fake.

To grasp how important Mr. and Mrs. Bendix felt it was

informality about the big house—snowy crisscross tie-back curtains, and soft color schemes. This one is warm and inviting, with an almost rugged simplicity and homespun vitality. There are signs of good living and informal friendliness that tap out a message to the subconscious in every room. Inside or outside, there are peace and contentment, running like light waves through the air around you. When someone said something similar to Bill, his answer was, "You can bank on it, a small house makes more of a unit of a family," and the way he said "You can bank on it," Bill wasn't spoofing. Those were his words, the key words of his sentence, and he said them as if they were launched from a springboard so deep inside himself that they carried jet-propelled approval.

he new house is a three-bedroom house which had been built by two young men who were more cabinet men than contractors and who had taken great pains in building and selecting their finish woods. The house had just been completed, but the landscaping was yet to be done. Bill had a vacation coming, and he took over. When Bill bought the house, the far back end of the lot was still a slope. He liked the two-level yard idea and wanted to preserve its natural quality. Instead of leveling it off to make the site conform to the conventional idea of a house on a full flat lot, he bought a bulldozer, graded the slope to a second level, and added the steps and retaining wall. Ground space, between the wall and low, open guard rail, serves as a planting box. Platform terrace was broad enough for a swimming pool with a walkaround and seating area at far side. This makes the noisier activity center on the second level, with both sun and shade sitting areas on lower terrace. If Mr. and Mrs. Bendix are visiting with friends below, daughter Stephanie and her teenage group can have the pool to themselves. Or the whole arrangement can be reversed.

This expert bit of landscape planning was Mr. Bendix' own doing from the beginning. He planned it and supervised all of the work and planting. The far back embank-



to follow through on the illusion of space, notice how wall-to-wall carpet is used to give a feeling of greater floor area, and by the same token, see how the floor is kept as free as possible to stress room size. There is plenty of furniture in the room, but it is wisely and pleasantly arranged to leave open center floor space. Color is also enlisted as a handmaiden to space. The background color for walls and carpet is sandy-beige—a hint of a tint that makes the room appear larger



for the reason that a neutral shade does not delay eye travel as a stronger color does. Oh, there is color here—lovely muted, contralto tones of rich colors in fabrics and natural woods, augmented by the sheen of polished brass and bowls of garden flowers. The intriguing part is the flexible thinking on the part of the traditionally minded Bendix family. For the big areas, they follow the modern theory of understating color, realizing this is the effective solution to visually enlarging the room, but when it comes to furniture coverings and accessories, the less sizable but very important adjuncts to decoration scheme, they see to it—color comes into its mellowest best to give the traditional warmth that makes a room protective and cozy.

The gratifying news point is that it all seems to be integrated, and Mr. and Mrs. Bendix have a home of their own individual style. Their maturity of taste (and that of their professional counselors) was certain enough of its own judgment to pick and choose what they wanted from the whole pageant of artistic home achievements.






"I claim that what's true in Texas is also true right here

"And now to get on with the business of barbecue entertaining. I like the idea of gathering my friends around me under these most pleasant of circumstances. I hand out jobs right and left. Some prepare the appetizers, some turn the meat, others baste. The more jobs I can think up the more they like it. I'll tell you one thing though . . . nobody but nobody ever gets to tampering with my barbecue sauce. That's mine, all mine.

n addition to our built-in kitchen fireplace grill in Litchfield, we have a large permanent outdoor grill to prolong the pleasure of the open grill. Selfishly speaking, however, the fact that everyone isn't so well equipped indoors and outdoors, makes our family entertaining more fun. But grills are not beyond the means of any man or family. There are all kinds of portables on the market that will give the same final cooking results. For that matter, what's wrong with grilling in your fireplace? I've even heard that Edith Ramsay, one of your American HOME editors, uses a pitchfork for grilling in her fireplace.

"S peaking of fuels, everyone personal preference about products. I happen to feel my best cooking results have been done over charcoal briquettes.' But friends of mine will swear by plain charcoal, kennel coal, hickory oak or some other hard wood.

"As soon as you become a real barbecue enthusiast you'll find yourself shopping for all kinds of accessories. And there are plenty to spend your money on. (That's always the way with a hobby!) Firestarters galore, hickory chips and pellets that would make even newspaper knots give food a hickorysmoked taste. There are wonderful liquid and powdered hickory smokes to rub into meats, and some of the most handsome tools you can imagine. But don't worry, once you've won a reputation as an open-grill chef you will have solved your gift problem for friends and family.

"And now a few words on the subject of sauces. Let me say that I rarely use the same one twice, mainly because I seldom cook the same meat twice. There are many foods more to my liking than grilled steak and chops. I hope you will enjoy my favorite sauce recipe for spareribs. A good vegetable combination, a salad and ice cream with a choice of sauces completes the meal. And think of it-no one has slaved alone in the kitchen and family and guests alike have had hours of pleasure together. That's what I call Family Food as it should be." THE END

Hot Fudge Sauce: Combine 2 (6 oz.) pkgs. semi-sweet chocolate chips, 1½ c. light cream or evaporated milk and 4 tbs. butter or margarine in saucepan. Cook and stir until smooth and well blended. Add 1 tsp. vanilla.

Serve warm. Makes 3 cups. Caramel Sauce: Heat 1½ c. sugar in heavy skillet, stirring constantly until melted and light brown. Remove from heat and carefully stir in 1 c. hot water. Return to heat and simmer until completely dissolved. Add 1 tbs. butter, dash of salt and ½ tsp. vanilla. Cool. Makes ¾ cup.







In buying, allow 1/3 lb. bone-in roast per person; buy a roast weighing at least 4 lbs., or having at least 2 ribs. The roast may be seasoned before or after cooking as desired.

Place meat fat side up in shallow open roasting pan. Rib bones will keep roast

off bottom of pan.* With the fat on top, the roast will do its own basting.

Insert roast meat thermometer through outside fat into center of thickest part of meat, being certain that it does not touch bone or fat. Use of a meat thermometer prevents overcooking or undercooking. Follow roasting schedule below as a time guide for starting to roast meat. Roast at 325° F. uncovered without added water.

KITCHEN WITH A

FRENCH ACCENT

W hen Marian Quinlan, noted Chicago decorator, decided to remodel her own kitchen, one of her friends suggested, "Why not make it a street in Paris?"

To the average homeowner, the idea at first might seem a bit fantastic, but not to Marian Quinlan. Not only had our decorator friend always liked things French, but the suggestion offered an appropriate solution. The kitchen was a small, corridor type, with a high ceiling, tall windows. Usually, with this kind of situation the first step would be to bring the ceiling down, entailing a costly construction job. But something equally interesting could be designed that would save the expense of remodeling construction and take full advantage of the extra spaciousness offered by a high ceiling.

Now let's put our imaginations to work as these designers did. Here was a small, narrow kitchen with long windows—not too unlike a small street in Paris. Now imagine the fronts of buildings along the street, top them with slate-like roofs, and presto! You have a camouflaged cuisine!

How did they do it? Tempered hardboard, cut with a scroll saw, was used to simulate the slate roofs. To carry out the Paris street idea a continuation of the street scene was painted on one end wall. In this corner went a French café table and over it a light, reminiscent of a street lamp. Lots of French chic? Yes. But as functional as a good cook could plan it. (continued on page 88)



ADJUST BLADES of reel mower to cut newspaper cleanly across entire width. If you can't correct unevenness, take machine to expert for grinding and resetting.



ELECTRIC MOWERS usually need only a routine cleaning, oiling and a check-up of the cable, connections and switch -plus, of course, the blade-sharpening job.



IT'S EASY to remove a rotary blade for sharpening. An electric machine can be turned upside-down, but a gasoline one should simply be tilted on its side. Be sure you tighten the blades securely after replacing.



IF THE TIRES on your mower have worn smooth with several years' service, or if damaged, you'll get better traction and more even mowing if you replace them. You'll find tires will slip off after you've removed the plate.

In a recent survey of what women want in a house, I was startled to read that young mothers wanted *three* storage bins in the laundry to hold white, colored and very dirty clothes like blue jeans, so they wouldn't have to be sorted before washing. Three built-in hampers certainly couldn't cost less than a hundred dollars, as well as eating up valuable floor and wall space. Personally, I'd settle for a dryer instead.

Barbecues with warming ovens, dish storage, et cetera, are another item that's dear to the hearts of the homeowners. These aren't built for nothing! A portable barbecue, even a luxurious job of stainless steel with an electric spit, can be bought for a fraction of the masonry one. But if you still want a permanent type and have one eye on the budget, better to build it yourself if you possibly can—considering the present wages of masons.

Concealed TV arrangements are also now popular. There are literally dozens of ways of concealing the fact that TV is anywhere in the room. What's wrong with considering a TV set as a piece of furniture? The well-designed TV's on the market are far from ugly. And it's possible you may want to change from your old model to a new one that may not fit your tricky casework.

What about those wonderful, built-in sewing units? I saw one where the machine was attached to a vanishing shelf. There was a drop-down cutting, board, a rack holding 75 spools of thread, an adjoining Formica counter and copious storage for material and work-in-progress. It was a real beauty! A perfect Rube Goldberg. And a very expensive piece of casework. There are more economical ways of finding an efficient spot for a sewing machine if you merely do family mending a few times a month. If you are in the class of a French couturiere or make all the family clothes, then by all means you deserve the fancy deal—if you can afford it!

I'm asking for trouble when I mention home workshops. For a man or his sons who live to make things a good work shop is an essential. But I've seen such rooms with expensive casework-divided drawers holding each nut and bolt—in houses where the man considers himself a master craftsman when he puts in a screw or planes a sticking door. If your production of furniture is high; if you can make things that enhance your home, then you're the man to have a home workshop and pay for it. But it's still surprising what a real handyman can turn out and how much space for power tools is available in a portion of the garage or basement!

Another thing women want is a mud room—a place easily hosed down, where children could take off rain or snow wear. On a ranch where hired help use it, a mud room makes sense. In a family home, wouldn't a shelf or case for rubbers and dirty shoes at the service door suffice? Another bit of "frosting" the mothers wanted was a raised bathtub in which to bathe the baby. Dandy, but costly. Is it possible to get these "essentials" in a well built, three-bedroom, two-bath house which the women thought should not cost over \$15,000?

Here's another bit for those who love the unusual. Recently I passed a house where there was a dovecote, complete with perches for the birds to sit on, at the gable end of a fresh white paint job. All I could think of was what that ridiculous "frosting" had cost and if an unwary pigeon settled there, how fast the owner could be out with a sling shot! (continued)

Now I come to what may be considered heresy! Family rooms. Currently, for a family with children, this room is considered essential. It means you have *two* living rooms, a front parlor for adults, an informal room for children. From my observation

I find that the front parlor isn't used enough to warrant its cost. Furthermore, both rooms frequently have fireplaces. Not cheap. Yet a goodly number of homeowners tell me that the proper living room is seldom used by the children or the adults. Everyone likes the family room better. Is it possible to take rock 'n roll in the family room and have a game of cards in the living room simultaneously? Maybe I'm old-fashioned, but it seems possible that teenagers and parents could take turns using the family room for parties. In the best sense, this room could be an informal pleasant place for everyone to enjoy, and the front parlor could be eliminated—unless you must have a carpeted area for antiques or prized possessions definitely marked "no children allowed." Cut the cloth to fit the pattern! To avoid the cost of two living rooms, two fireplaces, two sets of furnishings and draperies, a compromise solution is to expand the eating end of the kitchen to provide a modest area for family activities, homework and sewing. The master bedroom could be increased in size to provide a relaxing spot for parents when the children are entertaining. A wider bedroom hall or bedrooms divided into sleep and play areas can give small children a place to play. Such added footage is not costly, won't really damage that budget so stubbornly inelastic in spite of our desire to stretch it.



I, like you, will have to cut my cloth to fit the budget, but without worry about meeting bank payments as I had when we went "overboard" in our first house and with resulting pleasure in a home we can afford. Isn't that about all any of us wants?

So I raise my voice, like Chanticleer, if only to wake my neighbors up! THE END



an you remember that special morning when you screamed, "Oh, that range!" or "Why can't I rinse out all those suds, this soap is awful." A normal reaction . . . but wait a minute . . . let's back up and say, "Please don't blame that range or that soap or whatever else it is you are blaming." More times than not it's because some simple direction has been overlooked.

We've written about warranties . . . we've written about service calls . . . and now we write about another very important part of this business of operating appliances and using all sorts of products you find very necessary in your busy day of homemaking. (1) The Instruction Book (2) The Directions on the Package. They are not just written by the manufacturer to pass idle time away. Just as important as a good service department to back up an appliance is the instruction book, and whether you read it or not may mean the difference between safety and hazard. Or it may be the difference between a bright wash and one with a tattletale gray. It's really just as simple as that. So, let's take a look at an instruction book and at a package's instructions. These

hints now may save lots of headaches later . . . when you have guests waiting or you can't spare the time for an interruption.

These are the things your instruction books do:

- 1. Show you how to use and care for the particular model appliance you own.
- 2. Give you features of other models in the line as well as companion pieces.
- 3. Supply operating instructions.
- 4. If it's a food appliance it gives sample recipes, often suggests menus. If it's a laundry appliance there are all sorts of laundering instructions, plus stain-removal and tinting directions.
- 5. Some instruction books include appliance warranties. Be sure to look for them. Here are some instances: (Continued)

A. When you know how to operate a certain type mixer, for example, it doesn't mean that you can operate them all. Read the book first. Nine times out of ten

there is some helpful hint or direction in the book you didn't know.

B. Suppose you buy a new model of the same brand appliance you have owned for the last five years. Remember, features change. Don't guess about its operation. It may be entirely different from your present model.

C. Know related products. Your instruction book helps you do this. For instance, some washing machines can take a sudsing detergent, some cannot. Your book will explain that and why.

About package instructions

Food:

1. Specific and step-by-step instructions tell you how to make the particular product whose directions are on the box. If you have a failure, check back; chances are there may have been a one-step slip-up.

2. Check if altitude alters directions in any way.


3. Did you substitute water when milk was directed? No wonder there's a slight difference. Slight, yes. But different!

4. Take the same product made by two different manufacturers, for example. Each manufacturer's formula is different. They have their own secret recipes with directions to match. One manufacturer's directions will not always work for the other. Follow the directions on each box!

Laundry and Household Cleansers:

1. In most cases, quantity is important here. The directions on the package will tell you how much to use in specific cases. No need to waste these little helpers—don't use one cup of detergent when ½ cup will do a better job.

2. The package will tell you exactly what types of





cleaning your product does best. If it's a detergent designed for fine lingerie, it probably won't get greasy work clothes as clean as you would like.

3. Your package instructions will also tell you *when* to use the product. Some waxes and lacquers should not be used on




especially humid days. Another case in point: some laundry detergents are added to the washer tub before the clothes, some after, and even some more after the water has filled the tub. Only by reading the directions will you know what is best for your machine and your product.

And here's just one general word of advice that will reduce the whole Operation Directions to a painless pleasantry. Don't immediately plunge into action and keep referring to the directions. Read them *first* and until you have them firmly fixed in your mind. If in doubt, or if your neighbor confuses you because her appliance works differently, refer to them again. You're ready when you have the directions in mind! THE END





rooms A, B, C, etc. ("A" attic; "B" bathroom; "C" cellar, etc.) Tag furniture, letter and number cartons accordingly. Mark cartons of breakable items FRAGILE.

12. Notify Police Dept. of day you are moving and vacating house, and length of time you expect house to be vacated. Also inquire if permit is needed for you to move. Some towns require this as a precaution against people jumping town without paying taxes or other debts. Get acquainted with neighbors in new location as soon as possible and let them know when you will be moving household furnishings in. This will help prevent robbery or vandalism.

13. Any heavy duty gas or electrical equipment should be disconnected by professional people. It's also best to consolidate anything within the house needing servicing or cleaning and have them sent to proper service organizations with instructions to deliver at the new location and install, if necessary.

Thus, the responsibility of its being in good, workable condition rests with the repairman. This can include upholstered pieces and rugs.

14. Notice of a change of address should be sent to the Post Office, Bureau of Motor Vehicles -and Social Security if you have applied for or are receiving benefits. If moving out of state, notify your Dept. of Taxation and Finance, Income Tax Bureau as well: also, stores with whom you have charge ac-counts, loan companies, gas, electric, water and telephone companies, banks, investment concerns, insurance companies. Publishers of periodicals should be notified from four to six weeks in advance so that you receive all copies without delay. 15. Be sure to have the address changed on important documents such as a will, insurance policies, stocks and bonds.


AS CONCRETE IS POURED into footing forms it should be agitated and tamped into place so no voids or air spaces are left that would weaken the wall strength.

SIX-INCH GRAVEL BASE under main floor of terrace is tamped firm and level. Gravel keeps movement of frozen earth from cracking the concrete terrace floor.



NOW MIX AND POUR the first 2-inch layer of your 4-inch slab. Be sure to work the concrete in thoroughly around the reinforcing rods, and then tamp until it is level.

WHEN FIRST LAYER OF CONCRETE is compact and smooth, lay on wire reinforcing mesh. Like reinforcing rods, mesh will strengthen concrete, prevent it from cracking. (continued)



REDWOOD STRIPS, 11/2" deep, random width, make frames for sand-mix concrete topping. Level concrete with strike board.

provide for, features that often are optional, such as a fireplace, additional bathroom in the basement, etc. If you have to save money, cut out the frills but get as many of these permanent items as possible.

- INVEST IN GOOD ELECTRICAL SERVICE: Be sure you get at least a three-wire 100 amperes service with sufficient branch circuits to last for a few years.
- WATERPROOF YOUR BASEMENT PROPERLY: If there seems to be any question as to whether or not the basement will be dry, pay a little more for added waterproofing and drainage.
- SOUNDPROOF PARTITIONS AND FLOORS: Have partitions in the sleeping area, between sleeping and living area, and bathrooms constructed so that there will be a minimum amount of sound to be transmitted through
- 10. BUILD A TWO-CAR GARAGE OR CARPORT: Even if you only have one car, get plenty of garage space for the storage of bulkier possessions.
- 11. DON'T PUT IN MORE LAWNS THAN YOU'RE WILLING TO CARE FOR: A good lawn requires both time and money, so unless you're willing to put these into it keep the lawn to a minimum.
- 12. HAVE A GOOD DRIVEWAY: Be sure the drive is at least four feet wider than the car, a total of about eight feet. If the drive is concrete and used by heavy trucks-fuel trucks for example, metal reinforcement will help to prevent cracking.
- 13. PARKING FACILITIES: Get as much off-street parking space as your lot will provide. Also have the drive and parking area planned so that cars won't have to back out onto a busy street.
- 14. GET TOP QUALITY HARDWARE Pay a little extra to get top quality, longer-wearing hardware and lighting fixtures.
- 15. BE SURE OF YOUR PROPERTY LINES: Get a copy of the survey that shows your exact property lines. This will prevent your being put in the embarrassing position of having built a fence, a garage or planted trees on your neighbor's prop-

- 16. HAVE GYPSUM BOARD WALLS VARNISHED: If the house is built with interior walls of gypsum board and you plan on wallpapering, size walls with a varnish before the paper goes
- 17. GET GOOD DRAINAGE: Leaders from roof gutters should be connected into a line running to a storm sewer or dry well and not allowed to discharge onto ground in the immediate vicinity of the house.
- 18. FIND OUT WHAT KIND OF PAINT WAS USED: There are many new kinds of interior paints on the market and sometimes they don't get along with each other. Ask the builder what sort of paint was used on surfaces so that when you repaint, you can use the same kind and avoid trouble.
- 19. GET MATERIALS FOR PATCHING: Paint gets damaged and so does wallpaper. Ask the builder to let you have a small quantity of each for future patching.
- GET A SET OF WORKING DRAW-20. INGS: When you buy, ask for a set of working drawings of the house. These will be a great help for future expansions and other improvements.
- GET OUTSIDE ACCESS TO BASE-MENTS: If the house has a basement, get outside access to it so that it can be reached from outside without having to go through the house.
- 22. FIND OUT ABOUT MAINTE-NANCE: Go over the house with the builder and have him explain the mechanical functions and what will be required for proper maintenance.
- 23. SEND IN GUARANTEES AND WARRANTIES: Much of the mechanical equipment in a new house has a warranty or guarantee from the manufacturer but these aren't effective unless you sign them and send them in.
- 24. GET OUTDOOR ELECTRIC OUTneed outdoor electrical outlets for power equipment and hydrants for washing car, watering lawn and even filling the swimming pool.
- HAVE WIRING DONE FOR TELE-25. PHONES DURING CONSTRUC-TION: Decide where you want phones and have wiring and outlets for them installed. THE END

DON'T HIT THE CEILING ABOUT

he life and looks of your resilient floor coverings depend almost entirely on the care with which they're installed and kept. Contrary to much backvard gossip, the materials themselves-whether linoleum, asphalt, rubber, plastic or cork, have little bearing on the problems vou may encounter. Barring the unknown bargain material, they are as tough and long-lasting as they are beautiful. But if you don't treat them right or lav them right-or see to it that the installer lays them right-you can almost certainly count on problems that defy all solution.

Let's consider the ways in which a resilient floor covering can cause trouble because it's improperly laid:

"I PUT LINOLEUM TILE IN MY BASEMENT TWO YEARS AGO, AND IT'S WEARING OUT."

This is one of the complaints most frequently made about linoleum tile and several other types of floor covering which are laid on a concrete slab that is in contact with the ground. The difficulty stems from moisture under the slab. The moisture is sucked up into the concrete and dissolves some of the minerals in it. Then the corrosive mixture goes to work on the floor covering above. What happens is sad to behold. Your once lovely floor literally rots away before your eyes. Since you can't patch the floor successfully (because the new tiles will be eaten away too), there's only one thing to do: Tear up the entire floor covering and put down a new one. But this time, you must be sure to use the kind of resilient flooring material which is designed for this kind of installation.

Asphalt tile is the old standby: but some-not all-of the plastic tiles will also do as well. Minerals in damp concrete don't faze them a bit. However, in laying these flooring materials a clean, smooth, dry base is essential. Sweep and vacuum the concrete floor thoroughly

to get up dust and dirt. Scrape off old paint. Scrub out oil stains. Level the floor as necessary. Then check to make sure the floor is dry. One way to do this is to leave a rubber mat on the floor for a couple of days. If a dark, dampish spot appears underneath, the concrete is still too damp to be tiled. A more accurate test is made by spreading the special floor primer supplied by resilient flooring manufacturers on several sections of the floor. If it peels off easily after 24 hours, the floor isn't ready.

To get the concrete dry enough for surfacing, circulate air freely through the room. Turn on the furnace, or wait until the weather turns dry—and stays dry—for several weeks. Then test again and again until you're sure no moisture remains. Once you've reached this stage, you're ready to put down the floor. Clean the concrete again. Then cover the entire surface with floor primer and let it set for a full day. Then get on with the tiling in normal fashion.

Such elaborate precautions are not necessary if you're covering a concrete floor which is above grade. Here you can use any type of resilient flooring material you like. The only extra precaution you must take is to coat the concrete first with primer. This not only seals in the dust, but fills the pores in the concrete and thus assures better adhesion of the floorcovering cement.

"MY KITCHEN FLOOR'S LAID ON WOOD. WHAT CAN I DO ABOUT CRACKS THAT HAVE OPENED BETWEEN TILES?"

The cracks are caused by the expansion and contraction of the wood subfloor, and you can't fill them successfully. Resilient tiles should be laid on a base of two layers of wood. A single layer expands and contracts, affecting the position of the tiles. There are several ways to build a crack-proof subfloor: Lay two layers of boards at a 45-degree angle to each other. Cover a single layer of boards with 1/8- or 1/4-inch hardboard or with 5-ply plywood. For floor covering jobs in old houses with single-thick floors, the second of these construction methods is recommended. THE END





NEW FACE FOR AN OLD FIREPLACE



How many families are burdened with an old-fashioned living room like this and wonder how it can be modernized? Mr. and Mrs. Haig Ouzounian of Los Angeles, Cal. were faced with this problem so common to many home-owners—windows that meet the eye-level gaze of neighbors almost within handshaking distance, in a room that is dull and outdated. Here's one method of solving the problem that the owners found to be both handsome and comfortable. Since Mr. Ouzounian's brother is an architect, the design for the remodeling was a professional job. However, all the work was done by the owners.

For economy's sake, insulating cork was used across the upper area of the fireplace wall after one window at right was sealed over. Aluminum channels separate the cork panels. One panel at right has acoustical mesh over the TV speaker. The fireplace itself was given a raised hearth and the facing covered with tile in dark and light shades of charcoal. The window at left was unchanged, but space below the window now has TV and a record player in a custom-designed cabinet. To improve sound control and provide better enjoyment of music, other changes included acoustical tile to the ceiling and adding cotton carpeting. Wall behind sofa is covered with burlap. Note how the new design helps to simplify and unify area in a corner that invites conversation or listening to music.

Total remodeling cost was moderate. Cork is inexpensive, comes in panels one-inch thick by 14 inches wide. Both cork and 3/4-inch aluminum channels are available at building supply firms.
