They said that it couldn't be done. "Build a wheelchair house!" my horrified friends exclaimed. "You must be crazy." After I had written to the authorized sources for technical information on how such a house should be built, I was inclined to agree with them. Some sent plans which did not fit my needs, while others refused plans. There was one big thing that they all had in common. The estimated price was so high that no ordinary family, much less a lone woman, could afford to build. All my ambitions and dreams went tumbling until my Yankee stubbornness took over. Then I began reading books by authorities to find out what the actual requirements were. In my research I might pick out one whole chapter from one book and just several paragraphs from others. Every building material could be bought in any good supply house. I asked myself why these simple ideas could not be gathered into the building of one small house. My enthusiasm began to return for I was beginning to create and starting to live an independent life.

The vice-president of the bank was of great help. He found John C. Smith, an understanding contractor who helped me cut financial corners. In these days of high prices it was difficult to keep within a budget. I did it, but not without Mr. Smith's kindly advice and help.

About two months later I moved into the shell of a home. As we drove up I was

delighted to see that the terrain made it possible for the foundations to be low in the ground. I had heat, water and electricity but no finished kitchen. I asked to have it that way. I wanted to be in on as much of the building as possible.

My son put up a rickety old card table in one corner of the living room and when my furniture came I managed to find a little electric teakettle and a small stove. I had set up housekeeping.

My bed was put up in the bedroom alcove, but the rest of the furniture, boxes, books and cartons were stacked in the middle of the living room. My refrigerator came with the furniture and was the only piece of equipment that I had for many a week. I could hardly wait to actually see all the wheelchair requirements which I had read about and ordered but never seen, so the first thing that I did was to wheel myself between ladders, workmen and paint cans to the casement windows. I was fascinated by the ease with which I could wind them open and shut; no more stuck windows, high beyond my reach. I looked at the wide doorways or no doors at all and could still remember the sting of scraped knuckles as I had bounced over door sills and through ordinary doorways for seven years. An electric light plug

Brad and Ann Crawford and their two youngsters moved into a new home with all the enthusiasm of children given a shiny new toy. Here was a house of their choosing, in a lovely neighborhood, near good schools. The bank had granted a mortgage that made possible one of the most important purchases of a lifetime. The Crawford home was protected against fire, hail, windstorm and other hazards, and as long as Brad met the mortgage payments the house would be theirs. Here was everything they had hoped, struggled and saved for.
But this happy family had overlooked one important thing in its enthusiasm. They depended completely on Brad's salary to take care of the mortgage payments. And as fate would have it, Brad Crawford died soon after they bought their house. Although he had left some insurance, bonds, and had a little savings after the down payment on the house, Ann Crawford and the two children could not afford to keep up the mortgage payments. They had to move to other quarters in a much less desirable location to make ends meet. Had the Crawfords known about mortgage protection insurance, Ann would now own her home free and clear. Such insurance would have provided the money needed to pay off the balance owed on the house.

Acting as their own contractors, Jim and Muriel got as many estimates as possible and had some of the work done by local people. This included tearing off the porch, building the chimney, the front steps, installing the plumbing and electrical lines and building storage cabinets. Jim did the painting and redecorating inside and out; together they removed the wallpaper, built kitchen cabinets, put up shutters and planted trees.

Getting rid of the debris of remodeling was a job, too. Barrels of brick, lath, wood and plaster were carried out of the house as partitions were torn down and moved. One thing that made their work easier and life pleasanter during the time of the remodeling was the fact that their old house was just four miles away from the new one, so they were spared a lot of the mess. As Mrs. DeFulio remarked, "We spent nearly seven days a week working on our new house so that when the time came to move we felt as though we were coming home, rather than moving away from home. The interior of the house was completely finished before we moved in."

AMERICANS are sheep. When a perfectly sensible invention such as the chafing dish comes along, combining both decorative and practical functions at our tables, we abandon it after a few years to the dust of cellar or attic. True, it was a gracefully shaped, gleaming brass object, keeping food warm with a minimum of fuss, thereby saving many a hostess from a jumping-jack performance. But it had to go; it was decreed. Fashion no longer smiled upon the chafing dish, so we, the possessors of same, guiltily hid them, or what was even worse, threw them out. They disappeared completely from the American scenebut disappeared only until some bright girl on a magazine decided to give them a pictorial revival, whereupon we all went dashing to the attic to drag the thing reverently down and repolish it for a reappearance in the dining area. Or, if we had been foolish enough to throw the chafing dish out, we became the very mournful tellers of that oft-repeated tale, "and to think my grandmother sold hers to the junk man!" The fact that the chafing dish had been a darn good idea all along was entirely overlooked. It was again chic, and therefore we were using it again.

The same pitiful cycles of rejection and revival can be observed with many other accompaniments of our daily living, marble-top tables, record players, and toss
pillows, to mention a few. All have come and gone and come again. It's not entirely inconceivable that one of these days claw-foot bathtubs will again become incredibly smart. But with all the various cycles, rejections and revivals, the most fatal discontinuance, the one that elicits an anguished cry from my very depths, is the Passing of the Porch. What, I ask of you, oh capricious arbiters of fashion, is the matter with the front porch?

I suppose you will say that heavy automobile traffic past our houses throws so much dust upon the front porches that it is no longer feasible to sit on them, and therefore they are a useless appendage. To which I reply, nonsense, sheer and utter nonsense, and merely in the realm of an excuse, for if we were so afraid of automobile dust, we would certainly not get ourselves bathed in clouds of it as often as we do. No, this is merely an excuse to cover up the fact that since it is no longer fashionable for people to sit on porches, you would not be caught dead indulging in such an old-fashioned sport. And I can just hear the same sort of excuses being made for not using the barbecue when that device becomes a part of the past scene, and no longer a fashionable must. For just as soon as said barbecue departs, there will be a long string of excuses for its abandonment, none of which are so much

## Fun and Fancy-Work


here's a dust ruffle that won't WILT, even after washing. To duplicate it, make a full-scale pattern from the sketch above. Cut as many sections of fabric and Pellon lining as needed to go across sides and foot of bed. Measure from TOP of pattern. Baste fabric and Pellon together, seaming together in 3 parts, for sides and foot. Hem bottoms and sew double $3^{\prime \prime}$-band across tops and snap-on tape on bands; baste other side of tape onto the box spring.


SOMETHING NEW IN MOSAICS-seed mosaics! Arpad Rosti, who did this one, used only the dried seeds and peas found on most kitchen shelves. Background is poppy seed; cactus stems are of dried yellow split peas and the spines are of dark mustard seed and white rice, making a most effective textured surface. Any simple design can be adapted by tracing or drawing it onto a piece of plywood and following this procedure. Using tweezers, glue on design details first and dry. Then brush glue on small sections of the background and while still wet sprinkle poppy seed on evenly. Repeat until background is finished.

APPLY GLUE with a paint brush. Place seeds on design detail carefully with tweezers. Sprinkle the background seeds on evenly.

## SUMMER HOUSE YOU CAN



Maynard Krueger of Merrillville, Indiana is a most handy fella. And the evidence to prove it is a summer house he built in his own backyard. The total bill-about $\$ 1000$. We say summer house because it's not only storage for garden tools and barbecue equipment but it's everything to all members of the family. During the day it performs as an out-fromunderfoot playhouse for the kids. During the evening it becomes a cool, bug-free living room for family dining or adult entertaining.

The first step in construction was laying out the dimensions and position. After removing sod and leveling the excavation for the slab, the bottom of the slab area was covered with sand and lined with a plastic vapor barrier to prevent ground moisture seepage. Reinforcing wire $6 \times 6^{\prime \prime}$ was used to strengthen the poured-concrete slab. Next, electric and plumbing lines were installed. After the concrete forms were stripped from the slab, $2 \times 4^{\prime \prime}$ fir framework for the walls was erected and the sheathing and siding applied. Doors, trim, paint, screens and louvers were installed last. The hardboard louvers are an interesting innovation: 55" long by $7^{\prime \prime}$ wide, they work on pivots, can be turned to provide the desired amount of sun and air.


DISHES, BARBECUE EQUIPMENT have ample storage. Additional shelves can also be added to pegboard walls.

## BUILD YOURSELF



MR. AND MRS. KRUEGER find their garden house a wonderful place to entertain, it's so light, bright and cheerful. And because it's open on three sides, it gets full ventilation on hot summer evenings. BELOW: Garden house is an ideal place for children to play. It's like having a house all their own, and they don't have to be so careful when playing because mother's best possessions aren't around to be broken.



ONE OF THE FIRST STEPS in building the garden house is the erection of the $2 \times 4^{\prime \prime}$ frame walls. Horizontal plate is nailed to vertical studs. Bottom ends of the studs are nailed to sill which in turn is bolted to the concrete slab. A large beam spans screen opening.


LARGE BOARDS OF GYPSUM SHEATHING go up next over the completed frame walls. Sheathing serves to strengthen as well as insulate the structure. Waterrepellent building paper surface on sheathing keeps rainwater out of the walls, yet permits water vapor within the wall to pass to the outside. These large-size sheets are quick and easy to apply and require a minimum of cutting and nailing. One important thing about gypsum is that it won't burn. BELOW : sketch of floor plan shows layout of the summer house and its overall dimensions. The tool storage closet opening to the outside of the building provides an adequate place for the Krueger garden tools.

As you get older and your children leave the family roost, the general opinion seems to be that it's good common sense to shed bur-dens-to sell the old home and live, perhaps, in an apartment. Having performed your parental mission, you may once again be foot-loose and fancy-free, or so the notion goes.

Mr. and Mrs. Cook know all about this. After their sons married, they sold the house and moved into an apartment. At first it was really nice-no family responsibilities, no home maintenance problems. Victuals for you. I am completely enthusiastic about the project. Being a 'pinch-of-this' type cook who started out in the back garden over a charcoal grill, it may be hard for you to convert my recipes into cook-book language, but I shall try to be lucid . . ." So wrote Dean Bacon, advertising agency V.P. and V.G.C. of G.V. (very good cook of Good Victuals) . . . Lucid his recipes and articulate the man, as our camera and tape recorder moved in on him in his own Chicago kitchen. Tiny though the kitchen was, it was nonetheless equipped with all the utensils and tools a good cook needs to ply his hobby, and in this confined area, our V.G.C. proceeded calmly and efficiently to cook our dinner, while good-naturedly keeping up a running patter on his progress.

Shall we join them in the kitchen . . .



Well, I guess the most important thing to do first is to brown the chicken. Quickly... That sputtering sound? The moisture in the chicken, popping in the sizzling hot oil...there's nothing like oil for browning. Good for the digestive system, too...NO, no breading. Just flour, salt and pepper-grinder pepper, the peppercorns you grind yourself... NO, no other spices now. Not at this point. Shake well in a brown paper bag before using. The chicken, that is. Ha, ha...Always in a deep heavy pan or chicken fryer, to keep the juices in...It's filling the house with smoke? Of course! You realize the whole kitchen has to be cleaned when I'm through...Stabbing the chicken as it were to brown it nicely on the other side...WORK AND SLAVE OVER A HOT STOVE. A few pieces at a time...now reduce heat, start layering. Once over lightly with more salt and pepper, a sprinkling of paprika, some crushed oregano and tarragon. Gives just a little whisp of flavor, a fine color ...OH, IT SMELLS GOOD. Spices, good ones, make a tremendous difference, specially freshly ground pepper...keep layering and keep repeating the seasoning...Add a bit of water...this is going to sizzle...the
 cover's on, the heat's down, the asbestos pad under... 45 minutes of blessed forgetfullness while she steams to a delicate beautiful tenderness...Now is the time to AIR OUT THE HOUSE...what? you ran out of film? Good timing, Rudy. It's cook's break too... All set now? Very nice looking, these zucchini, HOPE I can get them all in that skillet. Ask Richard if he can't get you a set of matched Ekcoware...Now, the oil. YES, Green side down...into the broiler later, you know, with cheese and herbs. Just to get out the flavor and crisp a little now. Romano, cheddar and basil do the job later...Having carrots, glazed in butter and honey. Being a sweet vegetable, carrots respond to a honey or brown sugar glaze...Having wild rice, too, with slivered almonds... Yes, they're all in work. COOKING IS LIKE A THREE-RING CIRCUS. Carrots this time of year don't have to be scraped. Baby carrots, much the best. Rolled in chervil. AN ENGLISH HERB, somewhat like chopped parsley and oregano...Rice seems cooked, now I'll sauté the almonds. Do them in butter until they're toasted brown....MEANWHILE WATCHING the...It takes practice to
 get everything to come out on time, believe me...MEANWHILE WATCHING the carrots...The smell is pure elegance, says Mrs. A....pure elegance... Chicken is now waiting for a double sauterne, please... FUNNY THING, I don't like to taste things... will somebody wash that pan, please...Can tell pretty well what I'm doing by the aroma. Don't like tasting...N please, not a knife. You break lettuce, not carve lettuce. The greens? In a towel in the refrigerator...Sure. Only way to have them crisp. Make the dressing cling to the greens instead of the salad bowl...HOPE the avocado is ripe. Ah, couldn't be more beautiful. Isn't this a beautiful avocado? Difficult thing, buying avocados...Shake the dressing. NO, not a garlic dressing. Mine. And d...good, too...what kind of cheese? I don't know. COMES FROM THE ARGENTINE. Darker than provolone. Can't identify it. Good cheese... Set the table anyone?

# Good lictuals 

- Select servings for six, of young tender chicken legs and breasts. Disjoint legs into thighs and drumsticks. Have breasts split in 2 portions through center. Remove skin. Put $1 / 2$ teaspoon salt, $1 / 2$ teaspoon pepper (freshly ground) and 2 tablespoons flour in brown paper bag. Place a few portions of chicken in bag at a time, close and shake vigorously until chicken is well floured.
Bring to frying heat in deep heavy iron skillet or chicken fryer, 3 to 4 tablespoons olive oil. Brown chicken to golden brown, adding I tablespoon lemon juice.
- After all chicken pieces have been browned, reduce heat to simmer level and place first layer of chicken pieces in bottom of fryer. Salt and pepper lightly, sprinkle with paprika, crushed oregano and crushed tarragon. (One teaspoon oregano and 1/2 teaspoon tarragon should be sufficient for whole cooking. This may vary with individual taste.) Add balance of chicken in layers and repeat seasoning to each layer. Add two tablespoons water and cover skillet with glass or iron cover and let gently steam for $3 / 4$ hour to hour until delicately tender. Be certain flame remains at simmer level or lower, so that chicken steams but does not burn.
- After chicken is cooked and ready for serving, turn off flame and add two ounces of sauterne or chablis wine. Replace cover and let wine steam through for about three minutes. Remove chicken to warming pan and prepare sauce with slight thickening and water. Milk can be used if desired.
- ZUCCHINI ITALIENNE
- CARROTS GLACÉ
- Wash and scrape about twelve whole medium to small carrots and cook in $1 / 2$ cup water, covered, lightly salted. Cook until just underdone-to preserve flavor and texture-do not overcook. Let water cook away and immediately add 2 tablespoons butter, two tablespoons strained honey, and $3 / 4$ teaspoon chervil. Cook gently, rolling carrots continuously until glazed in a thick rich coating.
- Select servings for six of small tender zucchini not larger than 4 inches long. Chill to crisp and slice lengthwise into halves. Place in skillet, cut side up, in two tablespoons olive oil. Cook without turning, over moderate heat for about 5 minutes or until only partly cooked, or still slightly crisp.
Remove with spatula to baking dish. Pour remaining olive oil from skillet over zucchini. Salt and pepper lightly. Cover tops of each zucchini lightly with a sprinkling of both grated Romano and Cheddar cheese; over this sprinkle lightly with crushed basil. Place under broiler at high heat for three to five minutes (or until toasted a light brown and tender), remove and serve at once.

By the way, history has provided this fact about the spelling of this seasoned tomato puree. Although the first English word for it (in 1690) was "catsup," today's spellings are as varied as its uses. Catchup, catsup or ketchup-take your choice.

IF YOU ARE A dEvOTEE of chicken livers, here's a variation on the main theme-deviled chicken livers (above) that will make a delicious main dish. Using either fresh or frozen chicken livers, give them a quick sauté and stir in seasonings with chili sauce or catsup. Serve right from the electric frying pan or chafing dish over toast points or cooked rice. You'll find the tomatoey sauce modifies the flavor of the livers and spices up the rice to make a perfect blend.

A FRANKFURTER-MACARONI BAKE isn't exactly new and may sound a bit plebeian, but even a "commoner" like this can be simply and gloriously transformed with some judicious seasoning and one of those magic ingredients-either catsup or chili sauce. And often it's these little additions which may tempt the family into trying and enjoying some of the less expensive dishes. Any of the six recipes we've pictured on these pages merely serves as a starting point for ideas to try on your own.

FOR THE ONE WHO LOVES TO COOK, there is hardly a greater satisfaction than putting together combinations that result in such delicious flavor they soon become topics of conversation. One good idea-a super "supper," is tomato meat sauce on onion bread. It's almost a meal in itself; a biscuit base baked with an original onion topping and served piping hot with a barbecued meat sauce. Perfect go-alongs include salad and frozen Fruit Delight crowned with fresh strawberries.

ROOF BEAMS COME NEXT. The outside walls are braced and $2 \times 8^{\prime \prime}$ roof beams are toe-nailed to the wall plates and secured with $1 \times 4^{\prime \prime}$ angle irons. Notice that along the bottom edges of the beams, $1 \times 22^{\prime \prime}$ wood strips have been nailed. The strips have been slotted to receive the edges of the tempered hardboard ceiling panels. Roof beams run from the front to the back of the garden house. Proper pitch for roof is achieved by installing a plate which consists of three $2 \times 4$ 's across the front of the garden house.


TEMPERED HARDBOARD PANELS that make up the sections of the roof are four feet wide and ten feet long. Tempering makes the panels impervious to rain. To prepare the panels for insertion between the roof beams they are flexed and held in a special frame made out of a board with a block of wood at each end. This frame curves panel to fit between beams.

ROOF PANELS of $3 / 16^{\prime \prime}$-thick tempered hardboard are inserted between the beams and slid along in the slots on the wood strips that are nailed to the beams. The special flexing frame keeps the hardboard panel in line so that it's easy to handle and insert into the slotted strips. Metal strapping along bottom edge of the beams keeps them aligned. A 1x12" board fascia is nailed to the outside edge of the roof and all joints are filled with water-resistant calking compound.


JOINTS BETWEEN END OF ROOF PANELS are covered with $5^{\prime \prime}$-wide strips of $3 / 16^{\prime \prime}$-thick tempered hardboard. Strips are fastened to end of panels with nuts and bolts. Roof is then coated with aluminum paint.


ONE OF THE LAST STEPS in finishing the garden house is application of the primed hardboard, clapboard siding. An aluminum mounting strip nailed to the framing holds each course of siding in place. There are no exposed nail holes. Siding received two coats of paint.

is not the usual thing to get excited over, but I was thrilled with mine. They were two feet up the wall. I could plug in any appliance without the fear of falling out of my chair. The mail slot in my front door made an outside box unnecessary.

It had been decided that asphalt tile should be used for the floor. It gives a firm base for the house and it is much easier for the owner of the wheelchair. Scatter rugs are impossible and wall-to-wall carpeting is just about as bad. I have a braided rug in front of the fireplace and that seems to be all that is needed.

C hortly after I arrived, the work in the kitchen began. $\int$ The real test of careful measuring and building skill had to be shown here, as everything was lowered. All cabinets, counters and stove top were set $32^{\prime \prime}$ from the floor rather than the regular $36^{\prime \prime}$. My stove was of a sectional variety and put on a corner. In that way I could reach the burners from two sides and the oven and broiler unit was put up beside the burners so that I could easily reach it. I had a single sink, open underneath. My cupboard had sliding shelves so that I could
 easily store provisions.

Besides the house itself, one of my greatest pleasures is a small kitchen garden. It is enclosed with a $5^{\prime}$ cedar fence and there are flower beds both inside and out where I can garden to my heart's content.

Five rooms and two bathrooms is the way my house would probably be described, but for me it is an independent way of life. I cannot give a panacea for happy wheelchair living. Everyone has to figure that out for himself. Keeping busy and interested helps greatly. Above it all is the great power of faith. That can move mountains. Why not the occupant of a wheel chair?

You get aches and pains from two things: working too much and working the wrong way. And when it comes to gardening, neither makes sense!

So don't work too fast or too long, and don't do a job a hard way if you can do it an easy way.

Most of us know when we're working too fast or when we've been working too long. But many people should learn how to use their muscles more efficiently and how to avoid using them in ways that result in aches and pains.

For instance, don't bend from the waist. Work on your hands and knees, with a cushion or with strap-on knee pads.

When digging, keep knees bent, not straight and stiff.

When raking, use "knee action." Keep knees relaxed, feet apart; move weight rhythmically from one leg to the other.

not the only way in which the housewives' chores were lessened by the porch. Ever heard the modern mother's rainy day lament? The breezeway's too crowded, the garage too damp, the cellar means running up and down the stairs. No doubt about it, the porch provided the ideal place for the smaller children to play on rainy days-high and dry and easily in sight.

Ad have you ever stopped to A think of the hazards of a goodnight kiss in front of the modern split level manse, its bare pristine front lit, no doubt, by ye olde colonial lamp, which never graced the front of homes in the colonies, but lit only the uncommon carriages of the rich. Pity the couple who can no longer retire into the friendly shadows of the porch, which even if lit by the round overhead lamp, still had deeper shadows on the side porch or behind the wisteria vine. Luckier couples might even have been blessed with a glider. Oh, pity modern youth!

One of the nicest things about the old front porch was that it served as a friendly unofficial signal for visiting hours. Your neighbor, who had finished her chores, could retire to the porch in plain sight of all, and you knew that she had the leisure to visit. Nowadays she is apt to be lurking on the back terrace, and you take your chances on whether or not you are intruding. In fact, the art of the casual drop-in seems to be vanishing, and it may well be that the decline of the porch has played a small part in fostering its loss of popularity.

True, we are social enough, and women get together perhaps more than ever during the course of a day that gives them much more leisure than ever before, but they are apt to gather in clubs where, alas, many acquaintances are made, but few friends. We seem to have grown self-conscious about getting together merely to be friendly, and a good many of our contacts and phone calls are committee pleas and community projects. In this alarming trend toward horde living, we seem to be unable to grow flowers, hook rugs, read great books, paint pictures, talk to our teachers or drive sport cars unless we do it en masse.
So along with today's overdose of clubs, the modern woman gives herself an overdose of home privacy on the terrace or porch-at the back of the house. Of course, people still

sit on porches, but said porch, usually screened, creeps gradually into being another room, full of living-room accompaniments, such as rugs and furniture, and hardly a carefree porch at all. It might even graduate to the "easy to care for" tile floor, which the overburdened housewife is expected to keep gleaming, a far cry indeed from the casual sweep required of the old front porch.

No , all in all, there were reallv too many advantages in the old front porch, and it has not deserved such callous abandonment. You will probably justify this cruel turn of events by remarking that the old front porch was ugly. But by gleefully ripping off that "old horror of a gingerbread porch," the eager remodelers have overlooked the back-breaking labor it took and its many advantages. What these misguided souls have forgotten is the gracious tradition of porches on some of our very fine old homes dating back to the early colonies.

Mount Vernon and Monticello both boasted porches. Philip Livingston, one of our illustrious signers of the Declaration of Independence, had an imposing country home in Brooklyn Heights, which was also adorned with a gracious full-length porch. Although a great many of our early homes had sparse and unadorned beauty, relying on their lines only for effect, still many others used the device of a front porch in an effective manner.

And if you think that front porches have left the hearts and minds of the American public, you have only to visit Sagamore Hill, Theodore Roosevelt's home at Oyster Bay, Long Island. Here, on the spacious porch of the old red-brick mansion, you can overhear the beatific sighs as the visitors settle themselves for a sit in the once fashionable "rustic" chairs of a bygone era, or experimentally try a rock in the slat-seat highback rockers. In a few moments you can just see them settling back and musing to themselves, "This is how it must have been." The porch is broad and high, and somehow there is a subtly calming effect in observation from a height. We could still have this same effect observing the sweep of the street from our own front porch if we hadn't abandoned it for an on-the-flat view of the sweep of the back fence-erected, of course, for privacy from those ogres, the neighbors.
The neighbors aren't ogres at all, but we don't have much of

2. BRUSH A LAYER of glue over smooth side of hardboard squares. Allow glue to set for a moment.

5. WHEN PRINTS are dry, cut away excess borders with a sharp mat knife. Don't cut into painted edges.

3. APPLY PRINT over glue. Run brayer over face of print, pressing firmly. Bray the edges thoroughly.

6. TO PROTECT surface, spray on 2 coats of clear plastic or lacquer, allowing 24 hours between coats.

Water, in the form of rain, mist, snow or sleet, is constantly trying to find its way through your roof, and by one stratagem or another, it often succeeds. The trick is to locate the source of the leak. This can best be done during a rain by tracing water to its origin on the underside of the roof and running a wire through the hole so you can locate it on the outside. If the roof has a solid decking, drill a hole for wire. If the attic space can't be inspected, go over the top of the roof inch by inch, casting a suspicious glance at anything vaguely resembling a hole or crack.

Asphalt roofs. Small holes are quickly plugged with asphalt roofing cement. Lift the shingle (continued)

carefully and put a dab of cement on the hole underneath. If the holes appear around nails which have loosened and popped up, drive down the nails and smear them liberally with cement. Nails that are very loose should be pulled and replaced with longer nails. If the shingle tabs are warped and floppy so that hard-driving rain can get

under them, put a blob of asphalt cement on the underside and press down tight. In exposed locations, cementing of all the tabs on the windy side of the house is advisable. Torn shingles should be replaced. Cut out the damaged part, being careful not to cut the shingles underneath. Trim a new shingle to size and anchor in place with a liberal application of asphalt cement. If you find that an entire strip has to be removed, then the new shingle should also be nailed in place.

W ood shingle roofs. If there's just a small hole, force asphalt cement into it with a matchstick. If a shingle is cracked, cut a piece of galvanized or copper sheet metal or asphalt roofing to the size of the shingle and insert it under the crack. Make sure it is driven up under the butt of the next shingle above. A dab of cement will hold it in place if it seems loose. Shingles which are rotten or broken off should be replaced completely. Loosen the overlapping shingles, insert a cold chisel or nail ripper under the defective shingle and cut the nails holding it. Slip a new shingle in place. Then, unless you can somehow nail the newcomer so that the nails are covered by the overlapping shingles, anchor it in position with asphalt cement. (Nails should never be driven through the exposed side of any

type of roofing or flashing, because they might rust or loosen and start a leak.)

If a whole roof is rotten, recover it. The new shingles, either wood or asphalt, can be installed right on top of the old.

Asbestos shingle and tile roofs are repaired very much like wood shingle roofs. New shingles must, however, be nailed because they are heavy and will probably slide out otherwise.

Roof flashing not only protects the most vulnerable parts of the roof, but for this very reason is also most vulnerable to the destructive onslaughts of the weather. Examine it regularly, therefore, especially if it happens to be made of anything other than copper.
$H$ oles that appear are easily sealed with asphalt cement; and in a pinch, if an entire strip of flashing has corroded, you can paint it from top to bottom with cement. Large holes or tears need additional protection, however. Cut a piece of metal (use the same metal as the flashing) to overlap the hole amply on all sides, and embed it over the hole in asphalt cement. (Copper flashing can also be soldered, of course. It makes for a much neater repair. But there's a hazard in using a blow torch on a roof.) Chimney flashing is a common cause of trouble. If the metal seams have buckled and spread apart, force them back together and resolder. If the flashing has pulled loose from the mortar joints into which it's inserted (or if the mortar has crumbled away around the metal), clean out the joints. Wet the bricks or stones with water. Then pack new mortar (1 part cement to 2 parts sand) into the cracks. If flashing is beyond hope of patching, get a professional roofer to replace it.

〔 utters are something else $G$ again．The minute a gutter becomes dammed up by leaves and twigs，the resulting torrent may find a way in through your outside walls．If a gutter does develop holes，smear trough with asphalt cement，smooth aluminum freezer foil into it， and then apply another coat of cement．

Large holes in metal gutters should be covered with a patch made of the same metal as the gutter．Ideally，this should be soldered into place，but if shaped to the exact contour of the trough，it will hold with asphalt cement．

In the case of exceptionally large holes，your best bet is to cut out the defective section and install a new length of gut－ ter．This is held in place with metal sleeves available at your roofing supply dealer．

Splits in wood gutters are also fixed with metal．First coat the wood with asphalt cement． Then press the metal patch into the trough and tack it every inch along the edges．Finally，seal edges with asphalt cement．

If a gutter sags at any point． it can usually be straightened by adjusting the hangers or by installing new ones．However there are times when nothing you do has the desired effect． In that event，take down the gutter，straighten it on the ground and then rehang it． Test the effectiveness of your repair by flooding the gutter．

0ne of the worst gutter prob－ lems is not strictly attribut－ able to them．Frequently，in cold climates，snow and ice build up in gutters and on the edges of the roof so that a dam is formed．This，in turn，prevents the melting water from running off the roof．Instead，having no place better to go，it backs up under the shingles and works its way down through the walls and ceilings below．

In new construction，this can be prevented by covering the roof deck along the eaves line with smooth－surfaced roll roof－ ing which extends from the edge of the roof up to a point 12 inches inside the inside wall line．Over this go the shingles．

building half of the house over the land, rather than on it. There is plenty of space for parking cars, a gently sloping driveway to the street below and plenty of room for outdoor living on the balcony and terrace.

## HOW TO GET THE MOST FROM YOUR LOT

1. Preserve the character of your land. Avoid unnecessary grading and keep as many of the original trees and bushes as possible. Landscape the house so it will look as if it "grew" out of the land and wasn't built on top of it.
2. Your house should make sense on its site. Make your house cling to the ground; plan a private outdoor area. Keep driveways and walks as short as possible and avoid step-
climbing entrances. Don't build a tall house on a high lot and keep basement walls low.
3. Orient house to the weather. In general, protect your house from the summer sun, but plan to capture the sun in the winter. Trap cooling breezes in the summertime; block those winter winds.
4. Make good use of all your land. Divide and conquer it. Separate service area from private outdoor living area and public frontage area.
5. Open your house to the pretty, private part of your property; close it to the ugly and public sides.
6. Economize on site utilities. Keep utility piping lines as short as possible between house and street.

 mending before tossing things into the washing machine, but an ideal place to catch up on other sewing or letter writing while the laundry is being done.

In the sketch above we have illustrated an idea for creating a compact, convenient sewing center of built-in storage that any handy home carpenter can duplicate.

To determine exactly how much room you'll need, start off by making a list of all the supplies and equipment you'd like to have. If you sew a lot, you'll naturally want a larger sewing area if you can find room for it. In making your list, remember to include open shelves for magazines and boxes, a file for patterns, shallow drawers for needles, thread, etc., and an adequate working light. Large drawers can hold fabric, material being worked on and scraps. Small tools such as scissors and shears can be hung on pegboard above the work table.

## TRY TANBARK ON YOUR GARDEN

Homeowners on the lookout for inexpensive landscaping ideas will find a good one in-of all placesthe Leather Industry. Few people would connect tanning hides with gardening, but a by-product of the tanning process may be as serviceable to home landscape artists for path-making as flagstone or brick.

Called tanbark, a rich brown material with a soft, springy texture, it can make a handsome garden path that feels like a deep pile rug underfoot and can be laid in a short time with nothing like the labor required for concrete or flagstone. To make a garden path, we advise making one at least 3 feet wide for comfortable walking. Begin by constructing guide lines with cord or garden hose so that the path will be reasonably straight, grading the surface with a rake so that it's as level as possible and free from large stones, grass and weeds. Then, rake on tanbark to a depth of about 2 inches. That's all there is to it, unless you want to add a decorative border of colored stones.
