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Chicken feathers

Why did the chicken cross the bridge?

To get to the design conference in Duluth, of course. The AIA Minnesota's annual midwinter design retreat brought together a host of dynamic speakers, from a car designer to sailboat racer and urban planner. But the star of the show turned out to be a big chicken.

In an open competition, participants were asked to design a footbridge for the Temperance River in Minnesota's Temperance River State Park. Design criteria were wide open—anyone could enter—and the outlandish was encouraged. The bridge could be functional, historical, practical, structural, playful, artistic, affordable or ridiculous. The only requirement: Find a way to get the chicken across the river without getting his little feet wet. The first-place entry (pictured) by Tom Wasmoen and Bart Nelson of KKE Architects envisioned a chicken carrier, the U.S.S. Poulette, being propelled across the river along a cable. Chickens can load their luggage of eggs in the lower level and sit in relative comfort in the passenger compartment. Runners-up included submissions by John Gould of KKE, Ron Halgerson and Paul Boerboom of Group II Architects, and Michael A. Fischer of LHB Engineers and Architects.



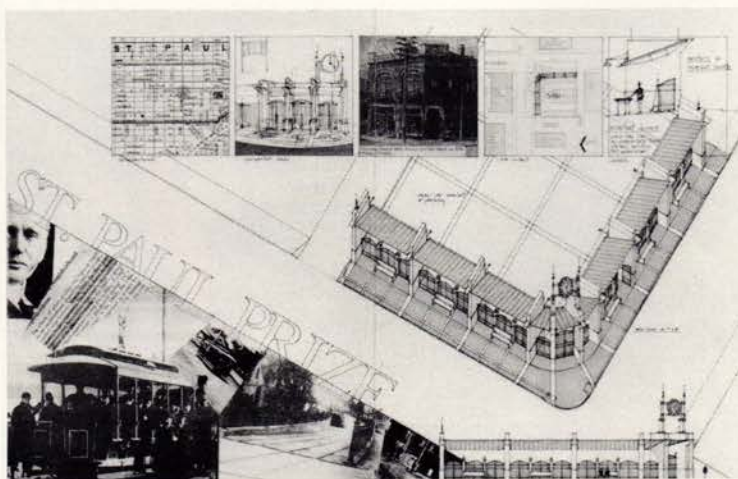
St. Paul Prize

David Engleson of Winsor/Faricy Architects is this year's winner of the St. Paul Prize, sponsored by AIA St. Paul.

The program asked participants to design a "community symbol and shared public space" for the corner of Selby Avenue and Dale Street in St. Paul. The public space is intended to be multifunctional, used primarily as daytime parking for adjacent businesses and evening-and-weekend public activities, including open-air markets, festivals, block parties and socializing. Engleson responded with a wall of bays that defines the urban edge of the lot and shields the parking from the

street. Each of the six bays accommodates three market booths for vendors. At the corner, entry gates and a clock offer a neighborhood landmark. Engleson pulled imagery from the area's long-gone trolley system and incorporated such turn-of-the-century building materials as masonry, copper roofs and wrought iron.

The program awards a \$1,250 cash prize to younger, nonregistered architects working in St. Paul firms. Last year's winner, Ken Potts, traveled to Seaside, Fla., to study the strengths and weaknesses of planned-community design. Engleson says that he intends to invest in his studio, Gargoyle.



David Engleson's winning entry creates a series of bays that defines the urban edge of an empty lot in St. Paul's Selby-Dale neighborhood.

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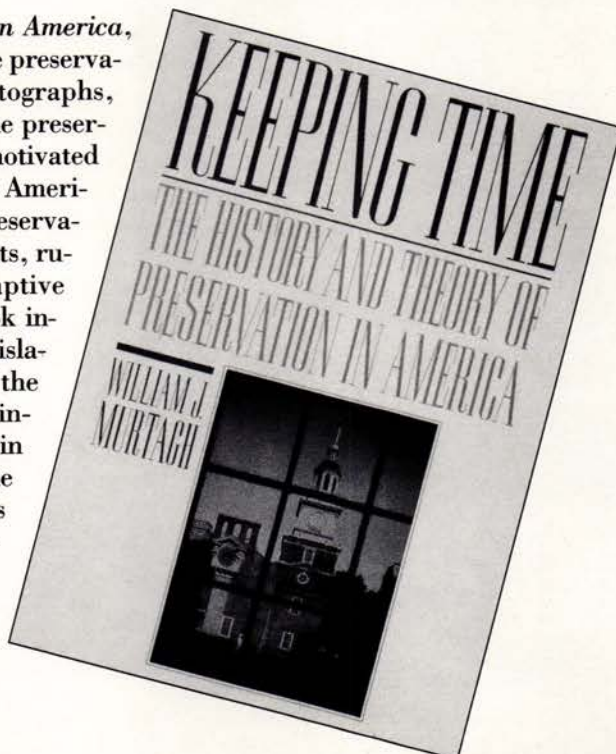


The Guild 7: The Architect's Source of Artists and Artisans features 166 artists and artisans specializing in architectural installations. The artists work with glass, metal, ceramics, mosaics, painted finishes, murals, sculpture and public art. Each artist is listed by name, address and phone number, along with general information about his work and major commissions. In addition to being a primary source for architects, the *Guild 7* stands as a high-end art book with 415 full-color photographs printed on glossy stock. The book proves an excellent

overview of the most important and best artisans working today. *The*

Keeping Time: The History and Theory of Preservation in America, by William J. Murtagh, traces the origin and progress of the preservation movement. Illustrated with 75 black-and-white photographs, this short but thorough history critiques every aspect of the preservation movement. At first, the movement was patriotically motivated as concerned citizens sought to save the homes of heroic Americans. But as the original grass-roots efforts matured, the preservation movement's breadth expanded to include entire districts, rural-and-landscape preservation, rehabilitation, and adaptive reuse. In addition to giving a historic perspective, the book includes three appendixes that highlight pertinent federal legislation, the National Register's criteria for evaluation, and the Department of Interior's standards and guidelines. Also included is a chronology that underscores important dates in the movement, beginning in the 18th century. Murtagh, the first Keeper of the National Register of Historic Places, is directing the development of graduate preservation-training programs at the University of Maryland and the University of Hawaii. *Keeping Time* is published by Sterling Publishing Co., Inc.

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Designs for the poor

Since the mid-1980s, the annual Search for Shelter design charettes have sent rallying calls throughout the design industries to find viable solutions for housing the homeless and poor. This year's Twin Cities charrette had 52 architects, landscape architects, designers, related professionals and students breaking into teams to review 11 projects submitted by nine non-profit housing agencies. The agencies had diverse needs. Habitat for Humanity, for instance, asked their team to create five three-bedroom houses

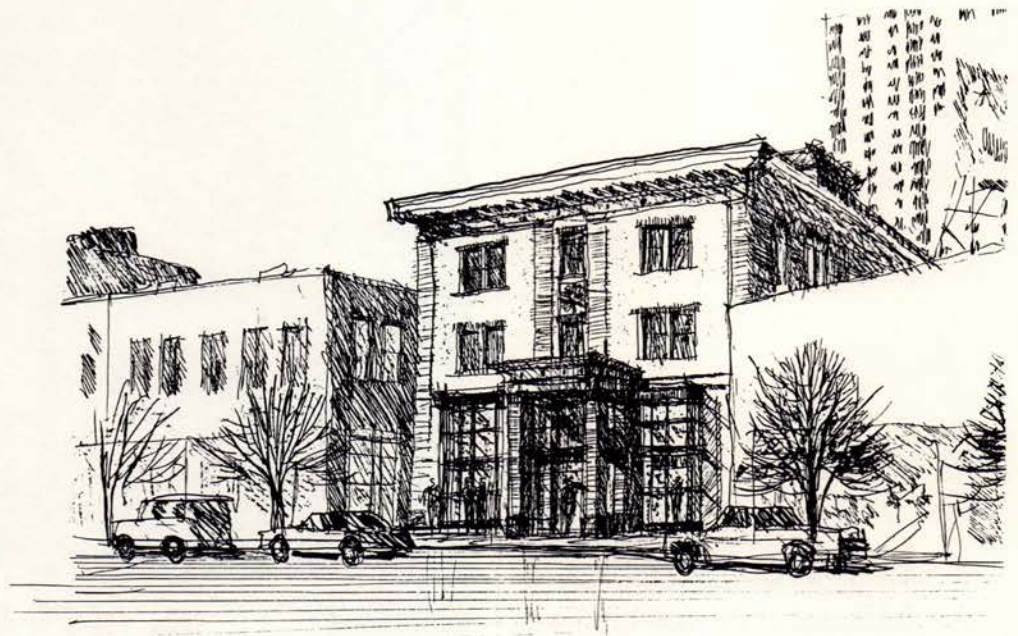
at the corner of Xerxes and Golden Valley roads for low-income families. The Veteran's Incentive Program sought to revitalize a group of abandoned houses and other buildings at Fort Snelling for veterans and their families who have become homeless. The West Central Wisconsin Community Action Program

enlisted architects to strengthen the aesthetic environment of a mobile-home park in western Wisconsin. And the Central Community Housing Project looked for ways to convert a vacant Minneapolis building on Harmon Place into safe shelter for runaway youths. In all, the charrette demonstrated that poverty

and homelessness are democratic social illnesses, affecting men, women, children, youths, elderly and families with equal vengeance. The annual design charettes remain important venues for architects to seek solutions for homelessness and raise consciousness throughout the profession for the need to conquer poverty. The next step, and perhaps the most difficult, is to secure funding for the projects. Fortunately, many supplying agencies successfully have financed their shelters in the past.

The Search for Shelter design charrette was sponsored by AIA Minnesota and the Minneapolis and St. Paul chapters of the AIA.

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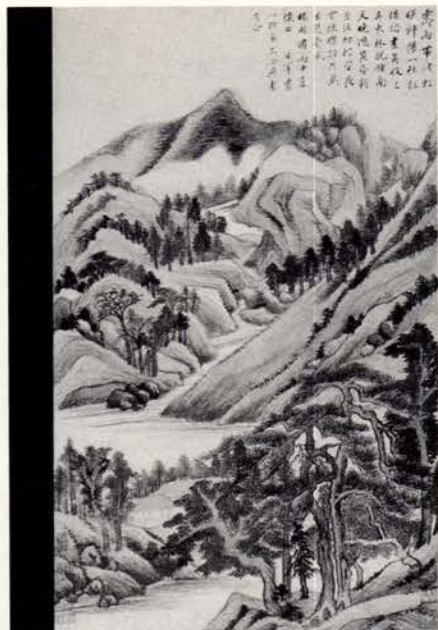
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An Eastern landscape by Tung Ch'i-ch'ang.

This exhibit, one of the largest of Chinese art ever organized in the United States, features 171 paintings and calligraphies by the preeminent Ming-dynasty painter Tung Ch'i-ch'ang and his contemporaries. Tung Ch'i-ch'ang is credited with having set the aesthetic course and development of 17th-century Chinese painting and art. Among the featured pieces are handscrolls, hanging scrolls and album leaves, including 97 works by major 17th-century Chinese painters and 74 pieces by Tung Ch'i-ch'ang. Other exhibited works include national objects that have never before left China. Japan, Europe, Australia, Hong Kong, Taiwan and the United States all have contributed to the exhibit.

The exhibit is organized by the Nelson-Atkins Museum and co-sponsored by the Beijing Palace Museum and the Shanghai Museum. After leaving the Nelson-Atkins, the show will travel to the

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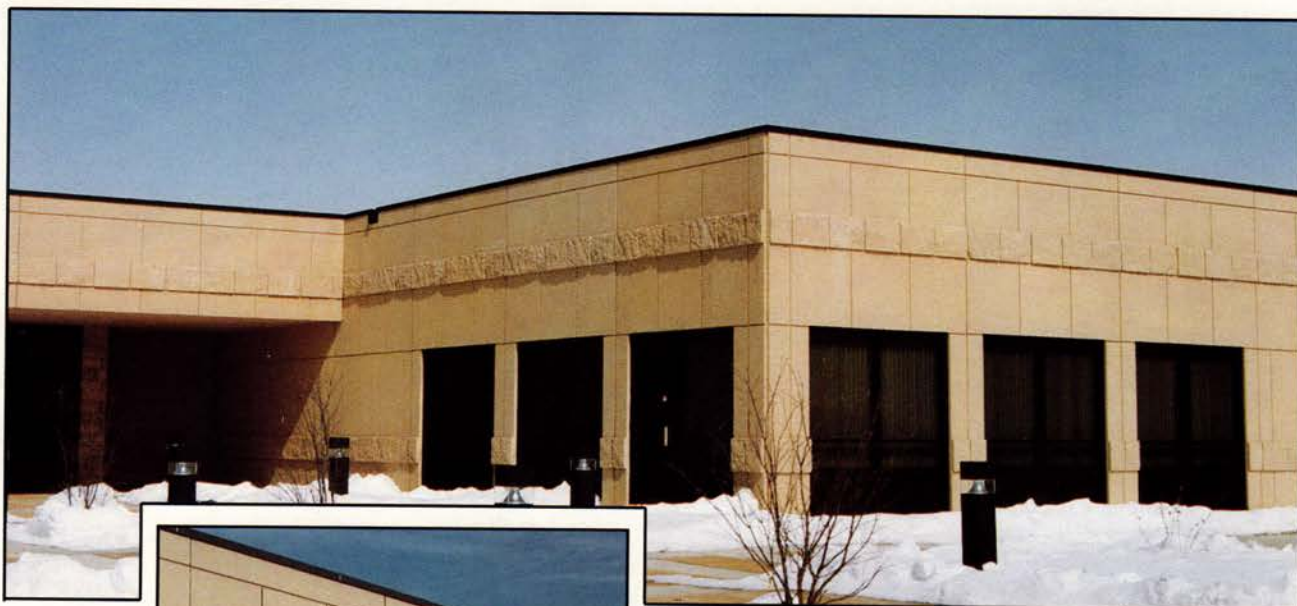
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Joseph Selvaggio: Taking pride in housing the poor

In 1972, Joseph Selvaggio, a former priest turned social advocate, looked out over Minneapolis's Phillips and Central neighborhoods and saw block after block of dilapidated houses. In these formerly stable, middle-class neighborhoods—now ripped open by freeways, depressed by declining property values and fast becoming enclaves of poverty and crime—the vacant houses symbolized the strength and vitality draining quickly out of the inner city.

The need for adequate housing, Selvaggio thought, is something everyone, regardless of income, can understand. So he organized two dozen volunteers wielding donated paint brushes, hammers and saws to transform a vacant house at 3214

Fourth Ave. South in Minneapolis into a livable home. The dwelling was Project for Pride in Living's first undertaking. Under Selvaggio's direction, PPL had one goal: to provide low-income, inner-city people with housing, and thereby stabilize their lives and their neighborhoods. But the fledgling non-profit organization had little funding, less cash

and almost no knowledge of the building trades.

Twenty years and 700 houses later, PPL has a net worth of more than \$1 million and manages more than \$5 million a year in income and expenses. The organization has diversified from renovation into development, construction, property management and social services, and in so doing has increased the Twin Cities tax base by \$21 million. "And we've got hundreds of success stories from people who bought houses from us that anchored them

PPL enacted this philosophy by giving low-income people the opportunity to buy safe, decent houses. Home ownership is one way to install families and instill pride in inner-city neighborhoods. But soon other needs—for conscientious landlords, livable rental property and do-it-yourself resources—became obvious, as well.

PPL branched out to meet these challenges. PPL Development acquires run-down houses, often from absentee landlords, and draws neighborhood groups, public agencies and volun-

teers together to renovate them. Architects are always part of the workforce (many volunteer, others work on spec, some bill at vastly reduced rates). "Good design is an integral part of our bricks-and-mortar programs," Selvaggio says, "so architects are involved from the outset." The rehabilitated houses are sold or rented through PPL

Property Management, "an enlightened landlord for Twin Cities' inner-city neighborhoods."

Housing also is built and renovated by PPL Construction, a union shop that enlists and trains minority workers. PPL families remodeling their homes receive assistance from



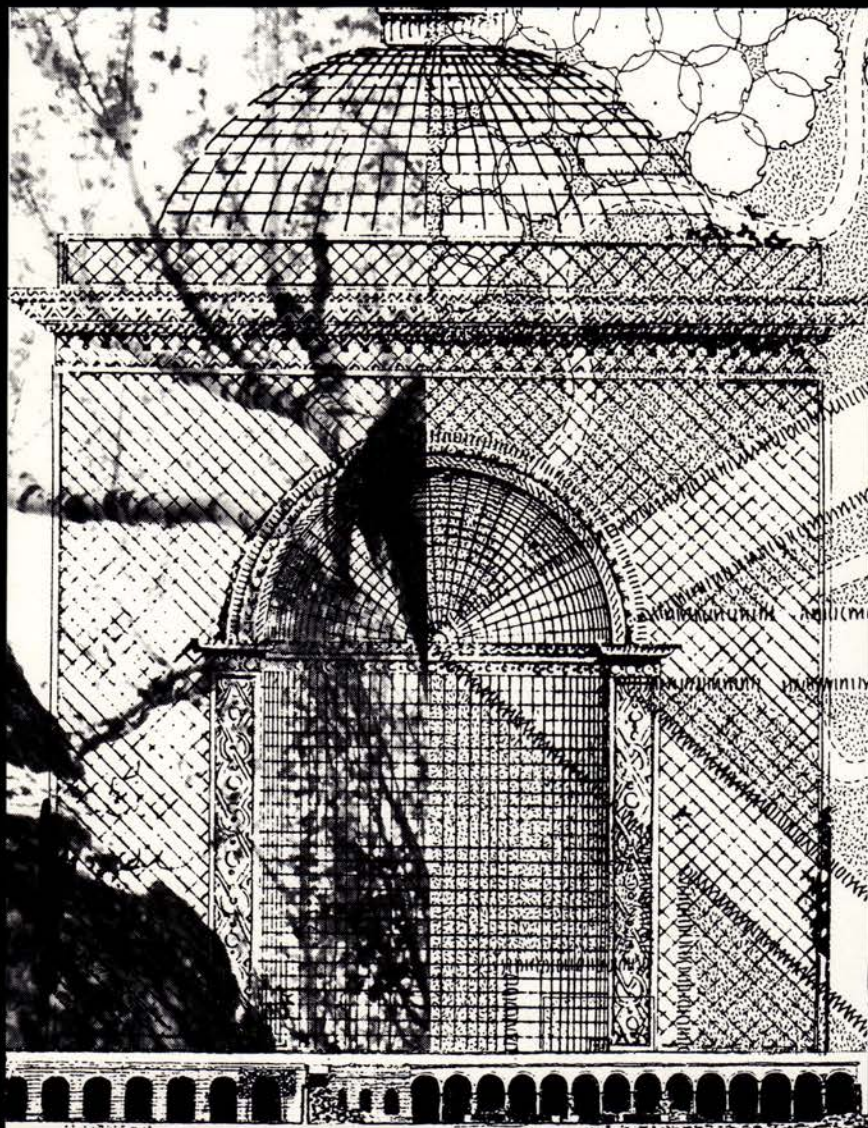

and were a very good influence on their lives," adds Selvaggio, PPL's executive director.

Giving people a hand up—rather than a handout—has been PPL's strategy since inception. The age-old truth, "Give me a fish and I eat for a day; teach me to fish and I eat for a lifetime," scrolls across every piece of PPL literature. Initially,

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University Grove: A 60-year-old neighborhood remains a living museum of Minnesota's architectural heritage

Once upon a time, William Middlebrook, comptroller of the University of Minnesota, decided that an academic housing village near the University's two Twin Cities campuses would attract and maintain faculty. As property owners, the University would lease the land to the faculty, requiring only that the residents hire architects to design their homes rather than select plans from a builder's catalog. Hence, University Grove was born in the late-1920s. The results are so aesthetically pleasing that a curator looking to stage a retrospective of Minnesota's planned-housing communities from the mid-20th century need only schedule a walking tour of the neighborhood.

Neither suburb nor city, "the Grove"—as residents affectionately call the borough—defies categorization. Tucked off on a narrow wedge of land bordering St. Paul's St. Anthony Park and Falcon Heights, approximately midway between the

University's Minneapolis and St. Paul campuses, the Grove is reminiscent of an enlightened New England hamlet—a company town, academia style.

University Grove expanded incrementally over six decades, following master-plan guidelines set out by the architectural team of Morell and Nichols and landscape architects Nichols, Mason, and Cornell in 1928. Approximately two-thirds of the neighborhood's 63 houses were built between the 1950s and the 1970s. The first home was built in 1929, and the last two in 1970. Northern University Grove

mix of styles. For example, there are romantic Tudors by Edwin Lundie, cool flat-tops by Ralph Rapson, and subtle inverted roofs by Close Associates. The list also includes such other distinguished Twin Cities practitioners as Robert Cerny, Graffunder and Nagle, Progressive Design Associates and Richard Hammel (who only designed homes for family members).

By midcentury, designers enthusiastically embraced modern architecture, gradually breaking the hegemony of styles typically preferred by upper-middle-class clients, such as Italianate palazzi,

Spanish casas, and American neo-Georgians. Thus, the pastiche of traditional and modern homes, sometimes side by side, makes University Grove an architectural mosaic.

"As soon as the avant-garde was accepted, it was seen here," says Tom Martinson, co-author of *A Guide to the Architecture of Minnesota*. "It's not a gracious neighborhood or a tract neighborhood. In University Grove

you have a case study of unrestrained regional modernism."

While the neighborhood has garnered national recognition, the Grove remains remarkably unknown at home. Instead, architecture vultures flock to elegant Summit Avenue and opulent Lake of the

was fully developed by the early 1950s. Later, Quonset huts used for World War II housing were removed to make way for a southern expansion.

Throughout the neighborhood are homes designed by Minnesota's leading architects in an impressive

Isles. Certainly, residents would cringe at the thought of tour buses trudging through the neighborhood, but it is worthy of praise and preservation.

"As a collection of houses, the Grove is significant," contends Winston Close, who with his design partner and wife Elizabeth designed 13 Grove homes from 1939 to 1967.

"There certainly is nothing else like this here, and I suspect that there are few communities like this in the country."

Certainly the Grove is uniquely Minnesotan. Both traditional and progressive, the neighborhood is nonetheless unpretentious. Shared connections to the University, fireplaces and bookshelves transcend various aesthetic tastes.

"It was really a unique program, where a person didn't have to spend much money for land and low financing was available," recalls Ralph Rapson, former dean of the University's architecture school and designer of six Grove homes. "It was a great program for the University,

if for no other reason than it was a good recruiting tool."

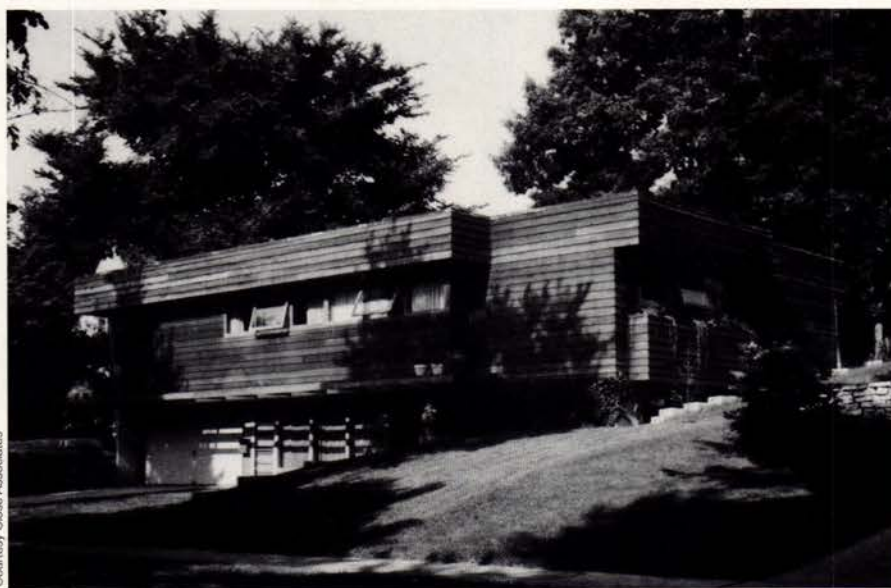
At first, scandalously low mortgage rates of three percent were offered, but all home owners had to abide by a ceiling on costs. Price limits (including architects' fees) in the 1920s and 1930s were set at

\$10,000. From the 1940s to 1960s, the prices ranged from \$18,000 to \$27,000, and in the 1970s was \$40,000. The University leases the individual lots to the homeowners at rates that now vary from \$75 to \$200 a year.

Even though architects are considered by many to be the reserve of the wealthy, these pricing stipulations forced architects to exercise fiscal restraint. The results were practical yet innovative homes, Rapson says.

The landscaping, too, demonstrated practicality. Unlike many housing developments that leveled the original topography, University Grove nurtured the landscape. Inspired by English gar-

dens, common spaces separate the homes, which look out toward a central garden. There are no fences, only hedges and plenty of robust oaks, hardy pines, tender birches, mature elms, and roving ivies. Also, homes respond to the natural environment. Even tradi-

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tional designs boast larger windows. Contemporary homes often blend into the scene, as in the Closes' organically toned homes, or contrast dramatically, as in Rapson's white homes.

The street plan employs both suburban and city traditions. On the one hand, the Grove rejected the city-identified grid, but on the other hand it did not fully embrace the curvilinear street plan that is the signature of planned upscale communities, Martinson says. So, the north-south streets are straight lines, while the east-west streets provide for sloped lanes, brief streets and warm closes that deter traffic.

Grove planners installed citylike sidewalks and many lampposts to engender walking. "There is a sense of community here that you don't find elsewhere," says Connie McGeorge, a Grove neighborhood activist. "People walk here, there are streetlights, open spaces and inviting landscapes."

Yet Morell and Nichols neither anticipated nor embraced the inevitable automobile age. While suburban migration was driven by and organized around the car, the Grove was attentive to other concerns. Regulations and narrow lots meant that homes could be built with only a single-car garage. Cars

were driven, not seen. Hence, when Frank Lloyd Wright proposed to design a house with a carport, he was rebuffed. The project was built elsewhere.

In the early days, professors on the Minneapolis campus rode the streetcar and St. Paul faculty walked to work. By the time of the Grove's mid-'50s expansion, automobile dependence had grown and the character of the American family was changing. The influx of new families brought two working people who needed more than one car, says Sue Gehrz, who lives in the

Idyllic as the Grove may appear, there have been controversies. The Closes sought to build row houses, but the University thought it slumlike. Recently, many Grove residents resisted the development of a nearby apartment complex for retired University faculty and staff.

But nothing prepared the Grove for the 1989 vote. The regents of the University of Minnesota sought to divest University Grove and allow the existing home owners to purchase the land. The Grove

housing market would be open to anyone, not just associates of the University. Sides were taken. A vote was set. By a count of 52 to 48 the Grove rejected the divestment plan. The status quo was championed.

Conversations with residents inevitably veer toward the vote. Bad feelings persist. They share a certain uneasiness that a scheme, which was once considered so modern

and visionary, can now be viewed as antique and exclusive. Regardless of their divestment position, University Grove home owners also share a respect for this quiet and innovative place.

So the regulation was altered to provide for two-car garages. The latter presented design problems, Rapson recalls. Given the slim lots, many homes appear to be "all garage," he says. To create an optical illusion on one house in 1967,

Visual preference What do we want our neighborhoods to be? Or our cities to look like? In this day of massive urban sprawl and suburbanization—a time when megamalls become our new cultural icons—we seem to have dwindling control over our own environment. Tony Nelessen, an urban planner and architect from Rutgers University, addressed the issue of neighborhood design at the recent Lake Superior Design Retreat in Duluth. He has developed a “visual-preference” survey that helps residents and designers identify positive design elements within an urban or town setting. Nelessen’s slide presentation asks people to evaluate the aesthetic impact of such urban and residential sites as apartment complexes, parks, streetscapes, strip malls, town squares and downtowns. Not surprisingly, what we like and what we actually get are often completely opposite.

Instead of charming avenues with shops that come flush with the street, we get concrete-block strip malls fronted by parking lots. Instead of distinctive residential design, we get rows of anonymous houses in which the garages are the most salient design feature. And instead of urban parks, we get asphalt parking lots that drain the city of its soul.

Take a look around your own neighborhood and note the visual elements that please you and the ones that give you angst. Is that generic hamburger joint on the corner what you ordered? What about that new town-house development with its expanse of garage-door fronts? The address on the door is the only clue to any individuality. In my own neighborhood, three strip malls and a discount drugstore—of the concrete-block, parking-lot variety—have gone up in the last several years. Within five years at the current development rate, Hennepin Avenue between Franklin Avenue and Lake Street will resemble a suburban strip rather than an urban street.

Last fall I toured a new residential complex that manages to defy the typical homogenization of today’s developments. Lyton Park Place in St. Paul (featured this issue) is an unlikely candidate for good design. After all, two developers and several parties were involved in creating this full-block complex of single-family homes. And to top it off, Lyton Park Place is low-cost housing designed for low-income families. A decade or two ago, low-cost housing spelled disaster—both from an urban-design and sociological perspective.

But Lyton is different. Here, traditional, well-scaled houses meet the street in classic fashion. Garages aren’t slapped onto the house fronts; they’re in the alley—where they belong. Each home has a front porch and lawn, and each is architecturally distinct. Walking around the site, you develop a sense of neighborhood and community involvement, a sense of belonging—elements woefully lacking in many pricier developments.

Successful neighborhood planning is not necessarily new to Minnesota (note University Grove in this issue’s *Insight* column). But here, as with the rest of the nation, it frequently is the exception, not the rule. In the past several years we’ve heard a lot about urban planners Andres Duany and Elizabeth Plater-Zyberk, who have been designing neighborhoods that call on traditional town-design values to create a sense of place. From communities like Seaside in Florida to the Kentlands in Maryland, Duany and Plater-Zyberk have succeeded because they know the elements necessary to make a place feel like home.

We see the same sound, urban planning in Lyton Park Place and University Grove. In the future, we need to make this kind of development the rule, not the exception.

Cabin fever

An award-winning cabin stakes ground on the North Shore

The Pruitt retreat, designed by Cheryl Fosdick of Salmela Fosdick Ltd. in Duluth, is a powerful response to Minnesota's North Shore landscape. From the spare, Scandinavian-inspired living room, the prime northern ingredients are visible: Lake Superior, its jagged, ripped-away shoreline, stands of pine, birch and fir trees, and the endless sky. It's that connectedness with the land, both inside and out, that makes the house extraordinary.

"The house is about appearing small on the enormous landscape," Fosdick says. "Because it is a single statement on the land, it had to be tactile." That singular statement converted into an eclectic design that is, nonetheless, strongly rooted in midwestern architecture.

One of 12 winners at the 1991 AIA Minnesota Honor Awards competition, the cabin was praised by the jurors for going beyond the vernacular to become something "inventive and adventuresome."

A good deal of the credit must go not only to a first-rate architect but to an open-minded client who gave the designer the freedom to exercise her skills. Fosdick had known the Pruitts only tangentially through

her sister-in-law, the Pruitts' daughter, before beginning the project. The Pruitts, a retired Minneapolis couple who often spent their summer vacations up north when the children were growing up, wanted to build a weekend retreat that could eventually become their permanent, year-round retirement home. They also needed enough room to accommodate up to 12 people for those occasional weekends that brought all the children and grandchildren together. Though they didn't necessarily have strong preconceptions about how the house should look, they did "have strong opinions about who the house was for and how it should feel," Fosdick says.

As one of her first steps in creating that "feel" for the house, Fosdick helped in site selection, settling on a lot some 50 feet above the rocky shoreline. And though the views were great, the grounds themselves needed infill work, requiring truckloads of dirt brought in to create proper site drainage. Once the groundwork was done, Fosdick could get down to the business of architecture. "Architecture comes from the site," says Fosdick, who sees the surrounding land as

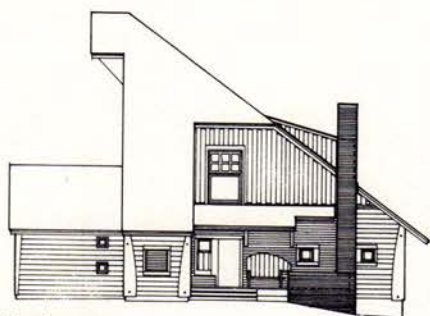

unique—the North Shore prairie. “The visual continuity of lake, land, sky and . . . light provides a unified landscape,” she says.

The house's four main exterior profiles are sharply different from each other, hinting at agrarian, Scandinavian and shingle-style influences. Depending on which side you approach first, you would hardly recognize the other side as being part of the same house. But as you walk around the cabin, the different pieces and scales come into play, revealing a coherent aesthetic statement.

From the northwest and southeast, the house rises to a dramatic peak and then drops off suddenly, as if the other half has been torn away. Mrs. Pruitt herself says that friends and family often jokingly ask when they intend to build the other half of the house. The northeast elevation, the side that apparently lacks its other half, is a 2 1/2-story wall of redwood siding with white-framed windows of varying sizes. At the peak of this wall, Fosdick fastened a bellcove, “an agrarian reference that is a response to the scale of the wall and the peak of the roof,” she says. The lakeside, southwest elevation seemingly finds inspiration not in the prairie setting but in shingle-style, beachfront houses of the eastern seacoast. Windows along the southern exposures

are large to take advantage of lake views.

Fosdick says that the exterior elevations are an expression of the interior layout and placement of the rooms. The house follows a linear floor plan that runs from the main entrance to the kitchen, which is surrounded on three sides by windows. Perpendicular to the core of the house are two wings, one housing two “sleeping rooms,” and the other a sunken living room. Detailing is spare, with aspen floors and pine trim. A bank of bunk beds in the sleeping wing and another bank dividing the living room from the kitchen efficiently add extra sleeping space within the confines of the 1,900-square-foot cabin.

The soul of the house is the 2 1/2-story-high stairwell, which leads to the master suite. Surrounded by a hand-crafted, cherry railing, bookshelves, benches and two sides of windows, the stairwell is a room in itself, and one of the family's favorite spots in the house. The stairwell also serves the quite utilitarian function of gathering solar heat. The master suite, while private, still has the advantage of overlooking the stairwell, increasing spaciousness and light.

Rounding out the edges

A midwestern house finds inspiration in southwestern forms

The Stillwater, Minn., countryside is a mix of rolling landscapes, working farms and encroaching suburban development. In another 10 years, split levels and ramblers surely will outnumber cornstalks. For now, though, enough open land remains to retain the bucolic environment, although downtown Minneapolis is a mere 25 minutes away.

McMonigal responded with a circular floor plan that, in fact, has as much in common with the Prairie School as the Navajo-inspired architecture of New Mexico.

The front of the house is fairly traditional and horizontally scaled to reflect the expanse of the midwestern landscape. Yet the quiet front is enriched by natural materials. A golden stone base, recalling the base of a nearby barn, wraps around the house. Above are contrasting bands of gray and gold cedar shingles. A gray hipped roof, wide overhangs and white, horizontal trim reinforce the front's rectangular massing; the curving entry portico is the only hint of the house's circular form. Around back, the facade becomes more animated. The central living-room core curves outward, emphasizing the circular plan. A 2½-story-high stone fireplace wall slices through the house, creating a visual link between the interior and exterior. From the lower yard, a stone stairway links with an upper terrace, which leads to a screened porch.

Inside, the house reveals itself gradually. The couple, who also had lived in California, fondly remember their West Coast house as having rooms and spaces that "slowly unfolded as you progressed through." Liz says that a house shouldn't be all-revealing at the front door, leaving nothing to surprise or the imagination. Their Minnesota house offers similar spatial progression. A wedge-shaped foyer veers toward the living room, offering just a peek into the room. An interior art-glass window in the foyer glimpses opaquely into the dining room. At the end of the foyer is another art-glass window that looks into the living room, the view of the room and outdoor vista fractured by the patterned glass.

Tom and Liz Rieser capitalized on the country scenery by setting their new house on a 70-acre lot surrounded by cornfields (which they hire out to farm), a lake, woodland and a ravine. Wanting to avoid the standard fare offered by builders, they approached Rosemary McMonigal of Minneapolis to design their new home.

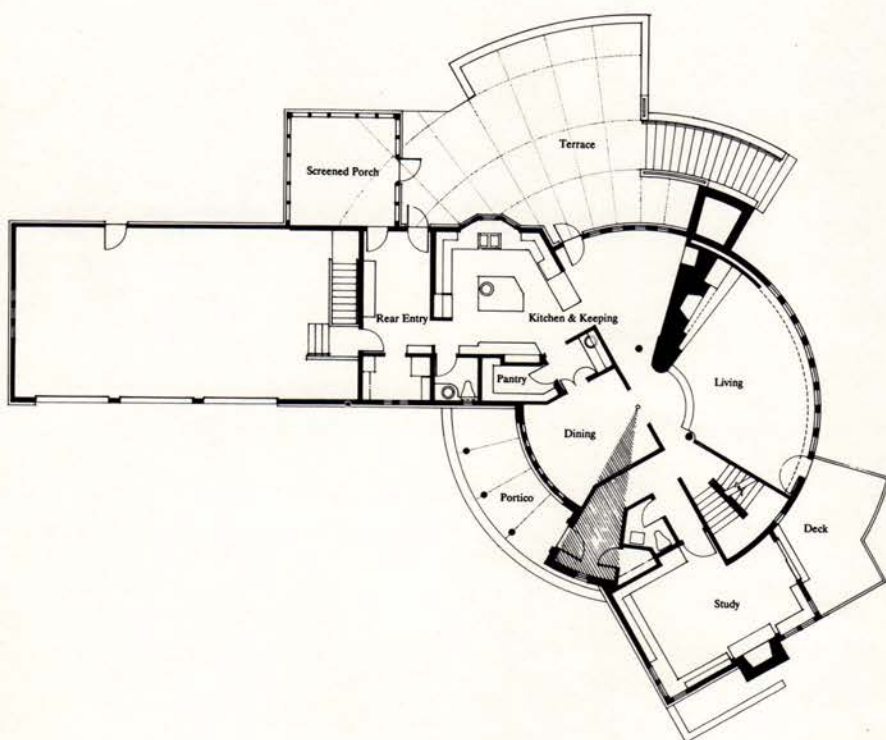
"We wanted the house to be unique but functional," Liz says. Having lived in New Mexico for several years, the couple developed an affinity with vernacular Navajo architecture, marked by daylit rooms, softened corners and circular motifs.

Beyond the foyer, the house opens to the 2-story-high living room. "We wanted the living room to have a feeling of height and openness," says the couple, who lived in the cramped quarters of a town house before moving in. A wall of windows following the curve of the room overlooks the prairie, further increasing the spaciousness.

Detailing is the house's strong suit. The living room is anchored by the wedge-shaped, stone fireplace wall. The wall's curved corners are hand chiseled. Bands of contrasting light-and-dark oak trim heighten the Prairie influences. "There is a bit of [Frank Lloyd] Wright in here," Liz says. The two-toned dining room is lit by custom fixtures and sconces by artist Mike Mealey, who designed all the

house's art-glass features based on wildflower imagery. Upstairs, an open hallway and balcony overlook the living room. To add a playful touch (this is a family with three small children), McMonigal included a flight of stairs leading to a lookout, giving the children a bird's-eye view of the landscape. On the lower level, which walks out on grade with the backyard, another fireplace trimmed in terra cotta and stucco recall the couple's New Mexico days.

For the Riesers, a bit of Californian and New Mexican architecture adds up to a house that is uniquely midwestern.

Do the Wright thing

A concrete-block house takes an unconventional spin on the Prairie School

The Johnsons were intrigued by the prospects of building a house that reflected both Prairie influences and extensively incorporated concrete. The fireplace is a wall of concrete block (above) and the entry hall features an aggregate-concrete floor (below). The house's most striking feature is the concrete-block front wall (opposite top) that rises to a pyramidal peak. The house follows a linear floor plan (opposite bottom).

Situated on a wooded bluff above the Minnesota River Valley south of LeSueur, Minn., Wayne and Donna Johnson's house presents a new interpretation of the Prairie School tradition. That interpretation finds much of its expression in the bold concrete-block wall (or "spline") that is both the home's axis and its facade. Solid and textural, it is at once linear and geometric. Certainly it is challenging, especially to the conventional. "That in itself is in the best Wright tradition," says architect Kelly Davis of McGuire/Engler/Davis of Stillwater. It also is in the home owner's tradition.

The Johnsons always have admired Frank Lloyd Wright. For Donna, especially, it has been a lifelong dream to someday build a house in the Wright tradition. This house is the culmination of that dream, and when she speaks of it, she says, "I finally feel at home."

The Johnsons knew from the start that they wanted an unconventional house whose style had its roots in the Prairie School. Beyond style, they wanted a small house, about 2,000 square feet, with an open, informal floor plan contained on one level, and they wanted a view of the woods. Most im-

portant, they wanted the house to be partly constructed of concrete.

"We didn't know just how much concrete or whether it would be blocks or poured, but we did know concrete was a must. We like the way concrete

looks, and it was our way of saying 'concrete works'," Donna says.

Admittedly, the Johnsons had a vested interest here. They own an aggregate company that mines and washes gravel for the concrete industry. However, that does not minimize their sincerity when they say that they like the use of natural materials, including concrete, that is characteristic of the Prairie School, and they knew that it would work in their house.

"The challenge was to use standard concrete block in such a way that people might see beauty they haven't seen before," Davis says. "That's risky in a residential building, but with careful attention to detail and respect for the material's integrity it can be done. You also need a good mason."

It was the availability of skilled masons that led them to use concrete block rather than poured concrete. Block also provided the flexibility needed to use different shapes to create a variety of textures in the structure.

Concrete block constitutes half of the home's interior and exterior surfaces, including all of the dramatic front wall. Glimpses of this facade appear through the trees as you drive down the lane to the house. Then you break the tree line, and the bold structure unfolds in front of you, an organic form that seems to rise from the very earth on which it stands. Constructed with a high, clerestory center section flanked by two sloping walls that drop almost to grade, the spline seems to merge with the ground plane in a way that provides the home with privacy and protection.

Behind this facade is an open, flowing interior that centers on a





living room with a vaulted ceiling and clerestory windows. All the rooms line up to one side of the spline, their varied shed roofs butting against it. Only the hall that runs the length of the house, from the front door to the window in the master bedroom at the opposite end, occupies the other side of the axis.

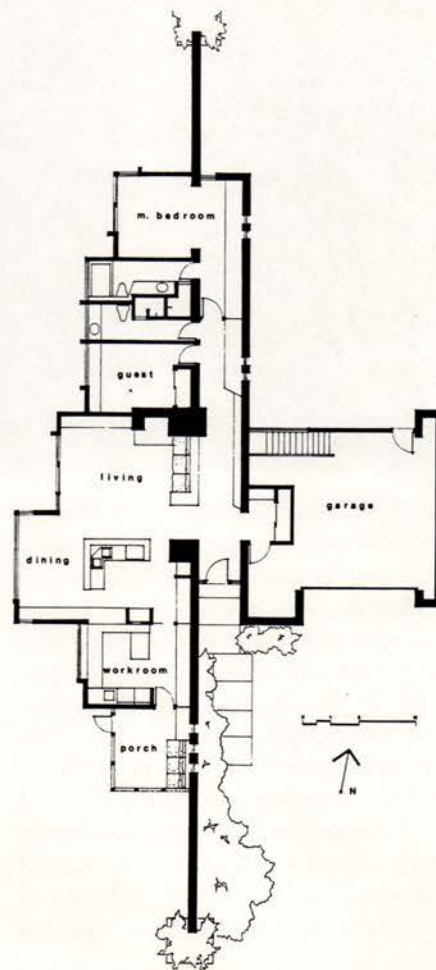
"Everything inside emphasizes the home's length," Davis says. "We intentionally kept the entry and hall ceilings low so it forces your view down through the house and out the bedroom window to the space beyond." At every juncture, windows present the Johnsons with multiple views of their forest, while the living-room clerestory floods the center of the house with soft light. Just as Davis consciously used light and views to draw the eye through the house, he manipulated ceiling heights to give the home spaciousness and intimacy as needed. In the dining area, for example, the ceiling drops to 6 feet high at the window wall. This low ceiling creates a sense

of intimacy in a space where people are seated and focused on one another. It also turns the window wall into a frame for the view of the woods.

The concept of the house grew out of thorough discussions with the Johnsons, whom Davis describes as being ideal clients because while they had clear ideas about what they wanted, they also were flexible and receptive. He did one design scheme and it was exactly what the Johnsons wanted. "We were amazed and pleased," Donna says. Davis's goal had been to design a house that would nurture its owners, that would provide them with warm, comfortable spaces in which to live. The Johnsons say he succeeded.

"When I'm here, I feel calm, peace and repose," Donna says. "It's wonderful."

Victorian antecedents

A Ramsey Hill couple looks to a past era in building their new house



St. Paul's historic Ramsey Hill area is a colorful display of turn-of-the-century Victorians, Georgians and Colonials. The neighborhood values antique charm, and that appealed to a recently transplanted couple. First settling in an Irvine Park condo, the couple toured nearly 200 houses throughout the Twin Cities before deciding to build new—but in the spirit of the Victorian houses they admired. Thus, they could have old-world grace, plenty of modern conveniences—and no

weekend or year-long fix-up projects.

After finding a vacant corner lot (the last remaining parcel of a subdivided estate), the couple thumbed through a book of “modern-historic” house plans that their contractor gave them. They flagged five plans that appealed to them, yet none would fit within the 75-by-78-foot lot. They then enlisted Carlsen & Frank Architects to update their Victorian dreams.

Architects Peter Carlsen and

Sylvia Frank reviewed the couple's “wish list,” which included decks, hardwood floors, oak woodwork, fireplaces, porches, verandas, granite countertops, casement windows, and six-burner commercial stove. The list also presented a sketch of their ideal floor plan, which placed the kitchen at the center of the house and the other main-level rooms encircling.

Carlsen says capturing the flavor of the Victorian period is fairly straightforward, calling Victorian

houses "simple, decorated boxes." Yet Carlsen is the first to admit that the new house is not a Victorian in the strictest sense. The rake of the roof, he says, is slightly Japanese. Horizontal beams projecting from the bay recall the Prairie School detailing of the Hoyt house in Redwing, Minn. In addition, casement windows replace traditional double-hung windows, and modern posts are decorated with reworked Victorian trim and brackets. But combined, the different parts enhance the house's period-piece aesthetic. As Carlsen points out, "The Victorian period was a mishmash of styles playfully piled up one on top of the other."

Inside, high ceilings and extensive millwork follow the Victorian tradition, as do self-contained rooms. "We wanted a house that had discreet rooms that didn't flow into each other," the couple says. "We wanted to be able to close off rooms with doors."

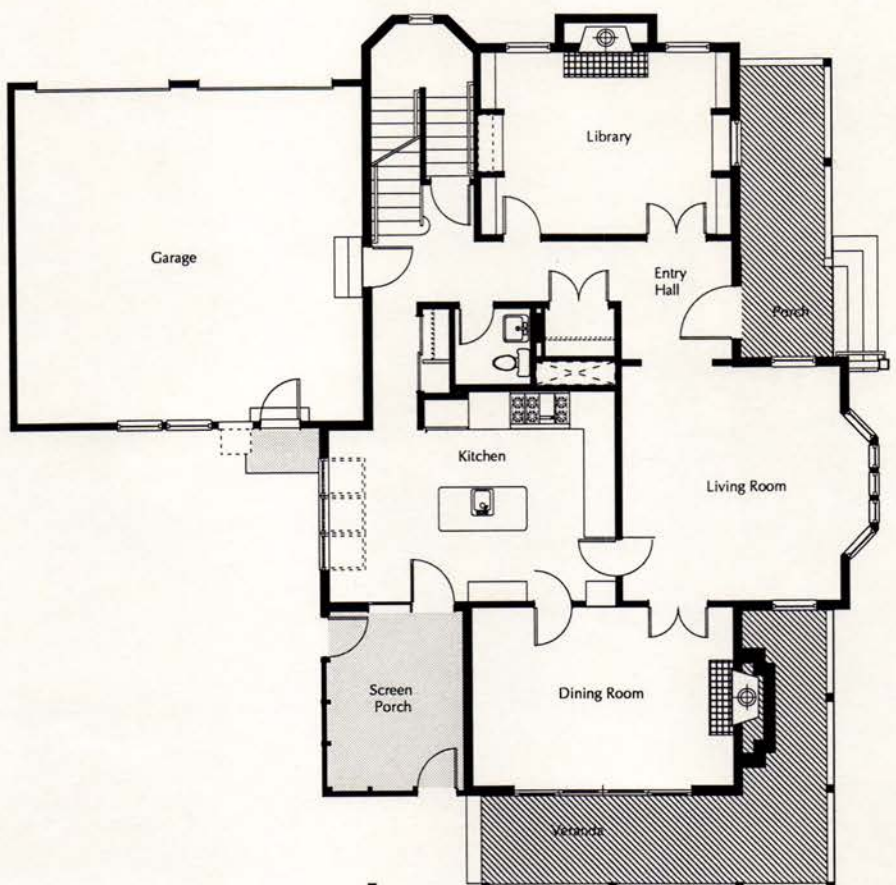
Perhaps because the rooms are more self-contained than is typically found in free-flowing spaces of modern homes, the house has a cozy, lived-in feel, enhanced by fireplaces in the dining room, paneled library and vaulted master suite with balcony. Yet the "discreet" rooms did not substitute for an efficient floor plan. With the kitchen at the center of the house, traffic easily flows out to the hallway, past the library, through the living room, into the dining room, and back again to the kitchen. The layout is ideal for entertaining.

For the home owners, designing a house in the style of yesteryear gave them the best of both worlds. Hiring Carlsen & Frank Architects proved a wise choice, too. The couple concede, "Because the architects live in the neighborhood, they have a vested interest in the house." And that paid off in a house that sits comfortably in its 100-year-old neighborhood.

Spare elegance

A home owner finds comfort in sculptural forms

When Peter and Anett Grant set out to look for a house, they discovered they didn't like much of what they saw being built. They were turned off by the faux-traditional French and English exteriors and the oversized rooms that seemed to be big for the sake of being big. Peter, in particular, disliked the cathedral ceilings, which he saw as an ostentatious waste of space that succeeded only in dwarfing you.

International in their outlook, avid collectors of contemporary and folk art, the Grants say they think in terms of shapes and spaces. Both of them see a house as a sculptural form, a total shape where all the design comes from the space, not from detail. They also feel a house should nurture its owners by providing an environment that is conducive to their lifestyle. Some might call this "functionalism." The Grants call it "comfort."

The Grants selected Sarah Susanka of Mulfinger, Susanka & Mahady to design their new home because of shared design philosophies. Still, Susanka admits that their concepts were a challenge to her. At first meeting, Anett forthrightly told Susanka, "I love the sculptural quality of your work, but I'm not a fan of wood-trim framing around windows and doors." Anett and Peter went on to explain they wanted their house to provide a backdrop for their art. It would be the home's trim.

"I realized 'here's my challenge'," Susanka says. "I have always used trim to help define inner space. Without it this house made me think about how and what I design."

The house's site was a challenge, too. Located on a cul-de-sac, the pie-shaped lot looks large, but it has setbacks that dramatically reduced the buildable area. Not only is it oddly shaped, but it is bordered with big trees—trees the Grants wanted to save.

With these givens, Susanka faced both a logistical and a design problem as she sought a way to fit a

large house onto a difficult lot while providing privacy, views of the trees, southern exposures and a driveway. Her solution was to eschew conventional siting and literally turn the house sideways on the lot so it faces south—away from the street. So situated, it is an incredibly private dwelling sheltered by and focused on the trees.

Once the home's site was determined and its basic rectangular shape defined, Susanka focused on



giving the house sculptural form.

To achieve this goal, Susanka designed an asymmetrical exterior with smooth, broad walls that advance and recede, curve and straighten with an invigorating rhythm. Absent decorative trim, the windows and doors are set flush with the outer walls so they heighten the exterior's rhythmic, almost graphic feel.

Inside, the sculptural form is expressed in the split levels that unfold around the central foyer. These levels, made possible by the tuck-under garage, create two internal realms on the main floor—a lower family or informal area and an upper adult or formal space. While these realms are distinctively separate, they also flow together naturally along two sight lines,

front and back, that parallel one another as they run the length of the house.

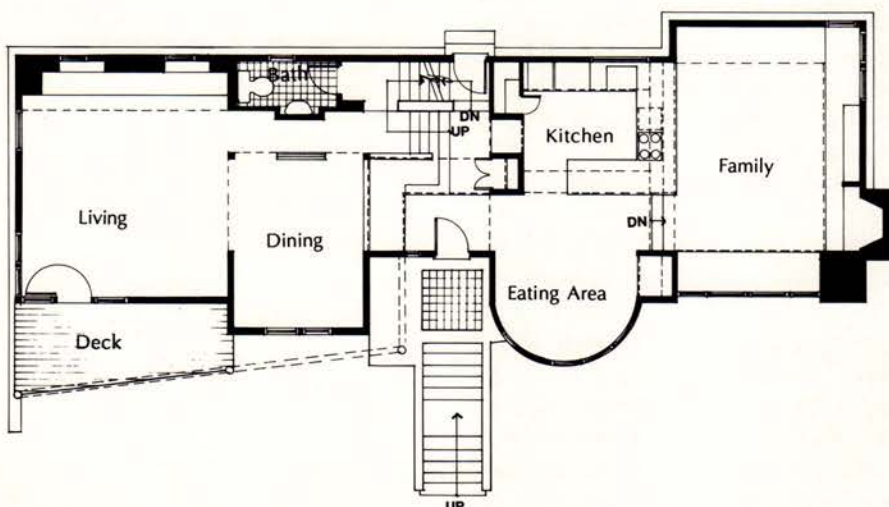
With all decorative elements, even at doors and windows, discarded, Susanka concentrated on sculpting each room to fit its function. She used several techniques to accomplish the task. One was to make some of the ceilings high, but not cathedral height, and then use soffits to introduce a cozy, intimate feeling in the sitting areas. Another was to move walls in and out in dramatic planes to create inviting niches like the huge arched window seat in the family room. Still another was to design such functional features as the family-room media center and the kitchen cabinetry as sculptural elements that fit into a total composition.

However, the most important technique was to use windows to define the space in each room. She extended the windows up to the ceiling and into the corners of walls so their light washed across these planes, emphasizing the home's sculptural quality and defining each room's parameters. In key areas where windows were not possible, such as beside the family-room fireplace, she used recessed downlights to wash the adjacent wall with light.

Because the windows are placed where they are needed inside the house without regard to their arrangement on the outside, they create broad exterior expanses of bare wall that further accent the home's minimalist character.

This may be an ascetic house, but it is not a cold or unfriendly house. It is an intelligent architectural form, a house that captures the relationship of the house to the land and to the people who live in it.

Lyton Park Place

A low-cost housing development brings home the American dream

Lyton Park Place is a full-block, low-cost housing development in St. Paul that proved a successful collaboration between the architects, developers and city. As far as urban design goes, the project skillfully creates a comfortable neighborhood environment, and goes one step beyond by reintroducing a lost American tradition, the back alley (model right). Garages are tucked around back.

Home ownership: It's the American dream. A dream that's becoming more elusive for low- and moderate-income Americans. The problem? Income isn't keeping pace with inflation and rising home prices. But Lyton Park Place, designed by LHB Engineers & Architects, proves that affordable, high-quality, low- and moderate-income housing can still be constructed.

Built just north of the State Capitol on an entire block, the 21 single-family homes use traditional St. Paul house styles. The two-, three-, and four-bedroom homes sit easily among their surrounding turn-of-the-century neighbors. Their old-fashioned front porches, projecting bay windows, landscaped lawns, and complementary color schemes combine to produce a comfortable feeling. Looking at Lyton, visitors can envision happy kids riding their bikes on warm summer evenings,

men mowing lawns and women sipping lemonade.

Lyton was developed by for-profit Justin Properties working cooperatively with not-for-profit Habitat for Humanity and other organizations. A June 1991 photo shows more than a dozen representatives from the participating organizations literally getting Lyton off the ground by cooperatively hefting the first wall beam into place. From the time ground was broken until all 21 homes were finished, landscaped and occupied, less than one year elapsed. "Through a lot of coordination, time and effort, everything worked well," says developer David Van Landschoot, Justin president. Van Landschoot and his wife, Terri Ann, also were responsible for the project's financing and built 13 of the 21 homes. Habitat built the other eight.

All 21 houses are equally well-

built. Habitat and Justin shared floor plans, making it impossible to distinguish between the finished structures intermixed throughout the block. All the homes are master planned and designed with predictability and style, and all had the same extra features: handicap accessibility, sprinkler systems and oversized garages.

Funding for Lyton came from an infusion of nearly \$5 million in federal, state and city money. The funds were used to acquire the site, allow the city of St. Paul to own and transfer the land at no cost to the Justin team (which included Habitat), pay residents' relocation expenses and prepare the site. The block's 42 rundown, pre-World War I structures were demolished, the swampy, shifting soil that resulted in the original homes' deterioration scooped out, and the holes refilled with sturdy soil. New sidewalks and

alleys were laid, street improvements made, and lights and site utilities installed.

Stephen Seidell, executive director of the Twin Cities chapter of Habitat, says that true to financial policy, his organization took no government money directly for its eight homes. The Habitat homes were built with private, monetary gifts from individuals, foundations, cor-

porations and churches. Several churches also provided in-kind sponsorships and many for-profit businesses, like Sears, Alcoa and Edina Realty, reduced the costs of their goods or services.

Habitat is internationally praised for its efforts to eliminate poverty housing around the world. It uses old-fashioned, American solutions to solving housing problems. A house raising is held with lots of eager volunteers doing the work. The volunteers and the future homeowners, who must give 350 hours of sweat equity, share in the construction process. Buyers purchase the homes on an interest-free, 20-year contract for deed held by Habitat.

Habitat's most visible volunteers are former President Jimmy Carter and his wife, Rosalynn. The Carters do everything from swinging hammers at building sites to shaking hands at fund-raising events. In her January 24th talk at the University of Minnesota's Humphrey Institute, Rosalynn Carter's voice cracked with emotion when she talked about Habitat. "It changes their [poor people's] lives when they know somebody cares

for them." Jimmy Carter has said volunteering on Habitat projects "is one of the most exciting and gratifying experiences we have had."

Local volunteers are equally eloquent. Tim Smith, project coordinator of a Habitat home, says "We put a lot in, but we also got a lot out of it. It's rewarding knowing we built a house for a family who really needs it."

Worldwide, Habitat volun-



teers now assist more than 100 projects in 33 countries. North America alone has 650 affiliates. Minnesota affiliates are in Bemidji, Brainerd, Duluth, Faribault, Fergus Falls, Mankato, Rochester, St. Cloud and the Twin Cities.

To recognize Justin, Habitat and LHB's achievement, the AIA Minnesota presented them with a 1991 Honor Award in November. The jury praised the project for providing "moderate-income housing that fulfills the American dream of owning a single-family home." The jury also lauded the project "for its attention to urban scale, creating an appropriate street presence while reviving that great American tradition, the alley."

To qualify for one of the 13 Justin homes, priced between \$55,000 and \$70,000, buyers needed annual incomes between \$23,000 and \$36,000. For one of the eight, \$35,000 to \$40,000 Habitat homes, qualified buyers needed annual incomes between \$12,000 and \$16,000. Why the difference? Union workers built the Justin homes receiving union-wage-scale pay; Habitat's 1,500 volunteers worked 80,000 hours entirely for free. "Gap financing" enabled Justin and Habitat to sell the homes for approximately half the actual building cost. To cover this expense, each home owner signed a \$30,000 lien, forgiven over five years at a rate of \$6,000 per year.

Was it worth it?

Last year Governor Carlson vetoed continued funding for projects like this, and there's little likelihood the funds will be restored. Many heavily taxed Minnesotans support Carlson's action. The savings to the taxpayers, however, should be weighed against the loss. "Lytton represents a great model of how affordable housing can do more than just serve low-income families: It can dramatically revitalize communities," Seidell stresses.

And it was definitely worth it for first-time homeowners Rene and Mike Lewis. For them, the American dream of home ownership has now become a reality. Mike says,



"Buying a home never seemed possible before. Having a home like this is a real blessing. Our kids have their own rooms to expand and grow. We're really happy here."

When the Minnesota Chapter of the AIA was first chartered in 1892, Edward P. Bassford was the mentor and elder statesman of Minnesota's architectural community. Born in Maine in 1837, he was one of the first trained architects to practice in St. Paul. He arrived in 1866 and started his own firm by 1872.

Unfortunately, most of his prominent work is now gone, including the old St. Paul City Hall and Court House, the Ryan Hotel in Minneapolis, the St. Paul Workhouse in Como Park, the Old Custom House and Post Office in St. Paul, and many other public buildings of a workmanlike and often anonymous quality.

Only a few of his buildings survive, among them the Merchant's National Bank Building (now the McColl Building at Galtier Plaza), a few buildings in St. Peter, Minn., some houses in the Crocus Hill area of St. Paul and the George Washington Armstrong House.

The Armstrong House is the finest of Bassford's residential designs still existing and an excellent and rare example of a large, double house. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the house was built in 1886 as a real-estate

speculation for the family of George Washington Armstrong. Combining elements of both the Queen Anne and Romanesque styles, it was conceived as a single composition rather than two connected houses. Still on its original site at 233-235

West Fifth St., it reminds us of the lost residential character that prevailed in downtown St. Paul a century ago.

The Armstrong House presently exists in a bureaucratic limbo. It is in the middle of a prime development site just across West Seventh Street from the St. Paul Civic Center. The State of Minnesota owns the property and had hoped to build the State Arts High School there, but allocating \$30 million to build the Arata Isozaki design for a

ey to move it anyway.

There is no pending decision awaiting judgement, nor is there a deadline. The St. Paul Heritage Preservation Commission does have jurisdiction over it and is watching carefully, but there is no discernible movement.

Let's hope that a sudden rush of decisions doesn't jeopardize this important connection to St. Paul's quieter past and first prominent architect.

University of Minnesota students through the PPL/U. of M. Housing Design Program. The PPL Tool Lending Library and Emergency Repair Program provide tools, supplies and expertise inner-city people need to repair and maintain their homes. And homeless families contributing sweat equity to rehab a house that the PPL Housing Opportunity Program has leased from HUD for \$1 a year receive PPL's help in purchasing the house.

"PPL's ultimate goal is to increase home ownership among low-income people, which is vital to preserving neighborhoods," Selvaggio says. But managing a \$50,000 asset that requires upkeep and a monthly mortgage payment is more than some low-income people can handle, he adds. So PPL broadened its scope once again and designed a number

of social-service programs that increased participants' self sufficiency through job training, apprenticeships and team building—often while working on PPL houses.

The erosion of self sufficiency among inner-city residents due to increasing poverty, crime, drug use and single parenting has become a more prevalent problem than a lack of housing in the last 20 years, Selvaggio points out. Middle-income people who settled into neighborhoods during the "back-to-the-city" movement in the 1970s, some of whom were qualified to buy PPL houses, reversed themselves in a mass exodus to the suburbs in the 1980s.

Still, Selvaggio, a long-time resident of south Minneapolis, insists "it's not that bad. This is not Detroit or Chicago. There are a lot of decent neighborhoods here, and I'm hoping that the pendulum will swing back. There are a lot of good bargains in single-family homes on

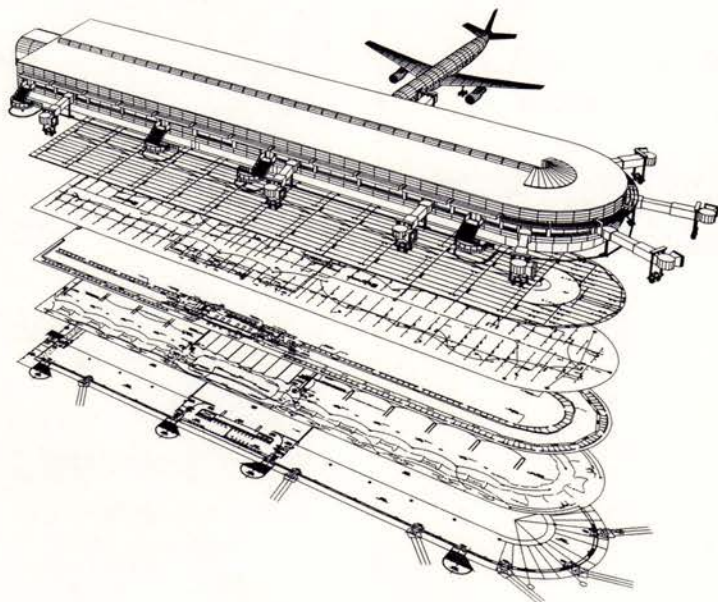
the market in the inner cities. And inner-city people welcome the stability middle-class home owners bring to these neighborhoods."

In a similar fashion, government and big business in the Twin Cities have helped PPL endure, with donations of money, goods and materials.

But PPL itself is largely self sufficient: The people who buy or rent PPL properties contribute up to 80 percent of the organization's working capital, with 10 percent to 20 percent supplied by foundations and corporations, and public tax dollars.

The way in which business and government could truly revitalize the inner city, Selvaggio says, would be through demonstrating real commitment to these areas. "We've seen what happened with the downtown community after they really put their muscle behind it. The same thing can happen in neighborhoods. The architects of public policy are

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very important and PPL needs to focus on them more in the future."

This year, however, PPL is celebrating 20 years of growth and service to the Twin Cities's urban communities by undertaking several new projects. PPL will break ground for a \$1.6 million shopping mall at the northwest corner of Chicago and Franklin avenues; the anchor tenant is the 6-year-old PPL General Store. A bid has been submitted for a 200-unit building on the east side of St. Paul in need of renovation. And plans are in the works to build 80 units in downtown Minneapolis to house the homeless.

"We're opportunists in that we take advantage of any opportunity—as long as it's related to poor people, inner-city neighborhoods and housing—and build it into our program," Selvaggio says. "We have a Tom Sawyer mentality, getting middle-class volunteers to help 'paint the fence'. We use a tough-love approach by having people

work to improve their lives. We have a little bit of a Robin Hood philosophy: We don't steal from the rich, but we certainly put a little pressure on them to help the less fortunate in our society.

"And we have an entrepreneurial spirit, in that volunteers, financial backers and neighborhood residents like to see that their investment is paying off. It's a great advantage to be able to see beautiful PPL houses either renovated or built new, or walk into a new PPL social-service agency. These are real, tangible products that impact people's lives. And they count for a lot of the energy behind PPL. If people want to help us work on these inner-city problems—whether it involves housing, jobs or neighborhoods—we'll find a place for them to plug in."

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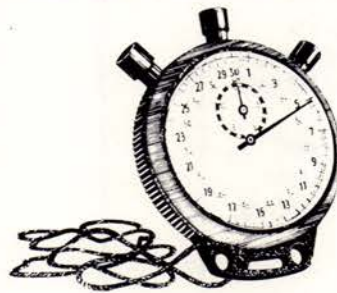

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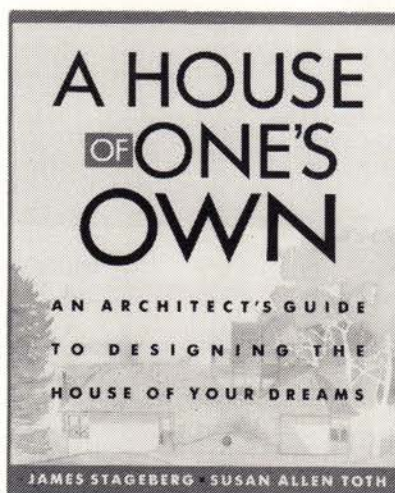

In Memorium

C. Clair Armstrong, 81, founder of Armstong Torseth Skold and Rydeen, February 15 at his home in Escondido, Calif.

E.A. Jyring, 86, founder of Architectural Resources in Duluth, February 10 in Virginia, Minn.

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The inner courtyard of the Gates Mansion, 1914-1933.

In 1932, Fred Raake, caretaker of the largest residence in Minneapolis, learned that the building was going to be demolished. "Well, if that's true," Raake told a reporter, "it makes me feel rather like a sea captain whose ship is going to the bottom. For the past three years or so, I've felt like a captain without any passengers anyway."

In fact, the Gates Mansion on Lake of the Isles was perhaps Minneapolis's least lived-in residence. Charles Gates, the spendthrift son of an enormously wealthy speculator, had died during the building's construction, and his widow and children lived in the finished house only a few years before moving to

Connecticut. The next owner, a St. Paul lumberman named Dwight F. Brooks, preferred to live in his more modest Summit Avenue abode. For most of its existence, the Gates Mansion housed only its caretakers.

Such was not the original plan when construction began in 1913. Designed by Marshall & Fox of Chicago, the \$1 million house was intended as a status symbol of Gates and his family. With Antonio San Gallo's 16th-century Pollazzo Farnese marble fireplace mantles (including a 9-footer carved from Michelangelo's medium of choice, Carrara marble), a 300-pipe Aeolian organ, and a kitchen that mea-

sured 27 feet by 22 feet, the E-shaped house was rumored to contain more cubic space than the White House. And its technological features rivaled its architectural wonders. With an "air washing" system designed by climate-control pioneer Willis H. Carrier, the mansion was perhaps the first residence in America to boast air conditioning.

After Brook's death in 1929, his heirs found the maintenance costs too taxing. The family briefly opened the house for public tours before beginning demolition in the spring of 1933. Most of the marble and costly wood was salvaged for reuse in other structures.

Jack El-Hai
