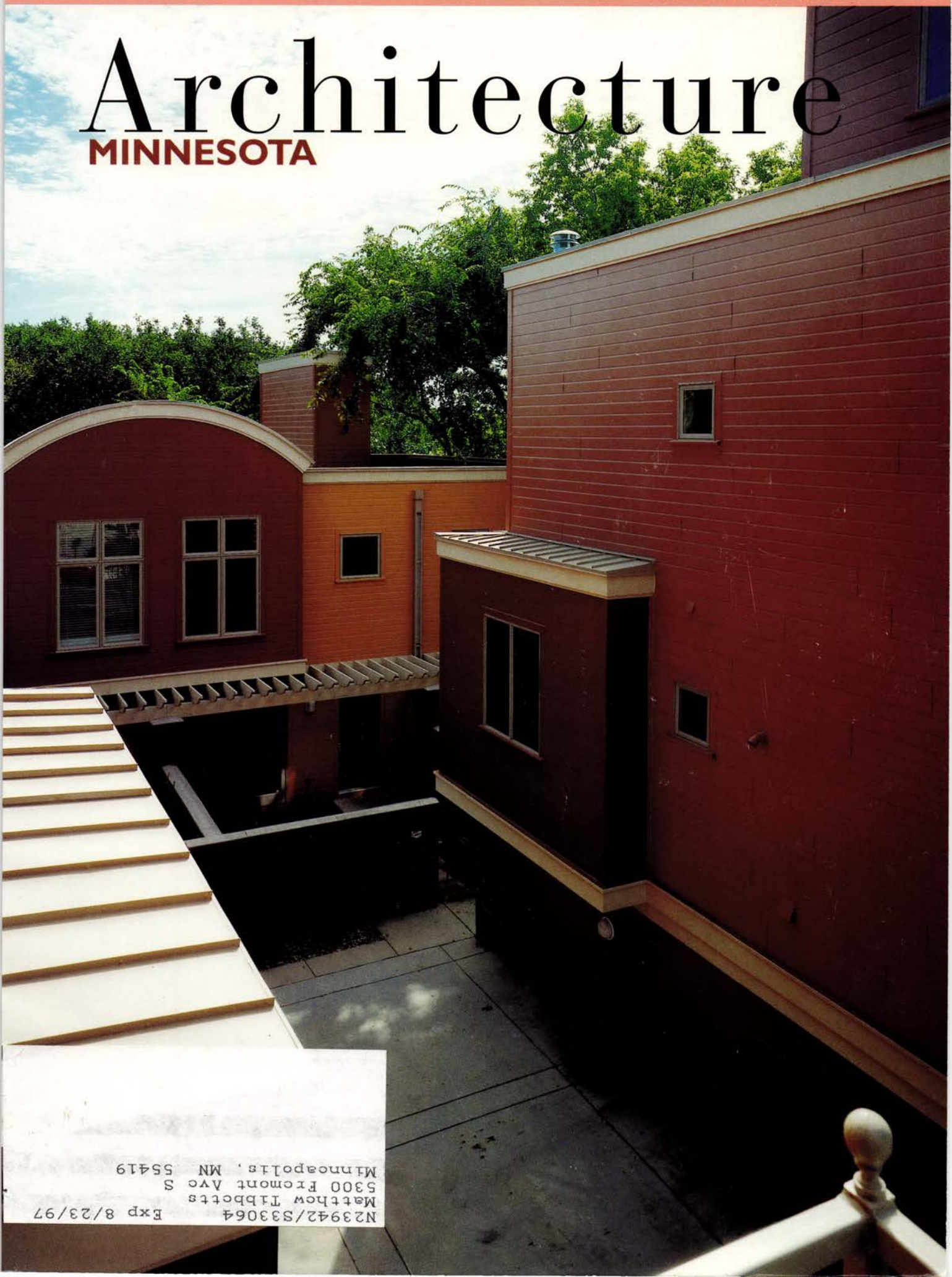

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House sans toxins

LHB Engineers & Architects, developing a specialty in designing environmentally sound, toxin-free structures, recently completed this house in suburban Minneapolis for an individual with Multiple Chemical Sensitivity. Built in a rural setting away from urban air pollution, the house sits on an elevated site to avoid standing water and potential mold buildup. In addition, the site is free of prior farm-chemical use or mosquito spraying. Evergreens, which prove an irritant to the client's health, are also missing from the lot.



All interior and exterior materials were tested for chemical sensitivity by the client and her doctor. Selected materials include glazed, ceramic-tile floors and bathroom walls, plaster applied over sheet-rock walls, low volatile organic compounds (VOC) paints, solid-surface counter tops, and cabinets made of glass or low VOC fiberboard. The exterior is sided with aluminum.

Team efforts



Each team proposed solutions for improving the projects during the weekend-long charette, held January 12-14.

One team, for instance, looked at Science House child-care facility on Dayton's Bluff in St. Paul. The day-care center occupies an addition to an existing house along a historic street. The design team presented a series of interior and exterior alterations that enhances the house as both a private residence and day-care facility while respecting the neighborhood's historic residential character.

With design proposals in hand, the participating agency's then seek funding to implement the changes. Primary charette sponsors include the AIA Minnesota Search for Shelter Committee, as well as the St. Paul and Minneapolis chapters of AIA.

The Ninth Annual Twin Cities Search for Shelter design charette brought some 49 architects, designers, students and associates to the drawing boards to devise plans for housing the homeless and needy. The architects examined seven projects presented by various Twin Cities agencies.

Architects convene

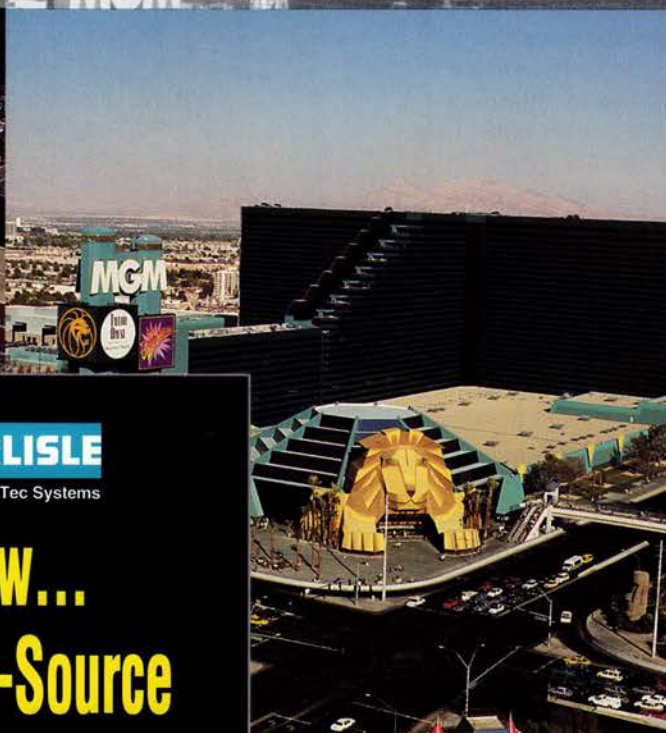

The national AIA comes to the Twin Cities May 10-13 for its annual convention and products exposition at the Minneapolis Convention Center. Among the highlights will be seminars, lectures, keynote speakers, special exhibits and architectural tours of the Twin Cities. *Value: Minnesota96* will include theme presentations by Milwaukee mayor John Norquist, who has spearheaded a major revitalization program for his city; New York architect John Belle, whose firm is the 1995 recipient of the AIA Firm Award; and AIA chief economist Kermit Baker and senior fellow at the Brookings Institute Anthony Downs, who will peer into the crystal ball to determine what's ahead for the design and construction industries in the coming century.

The last time the national AIA Convention came to town was 1981. The Twin Cities has grown since then. Fifteen years ago IDS stood prominently—and alone—on the skyline. The convention will be an opportunity to show a national design audience that the Twin Cities area, indeed, has come of age. 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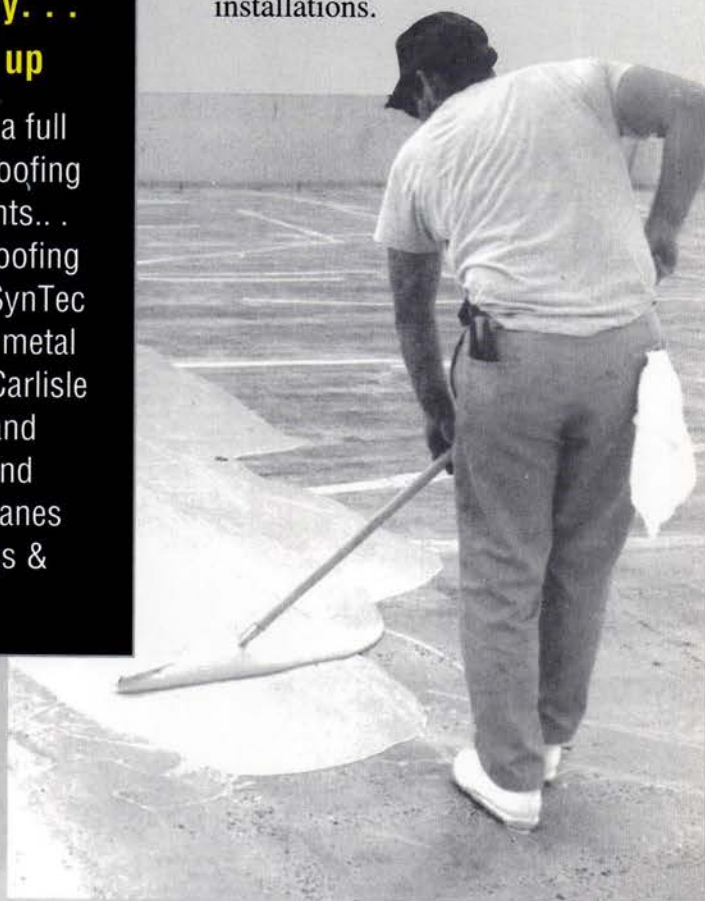

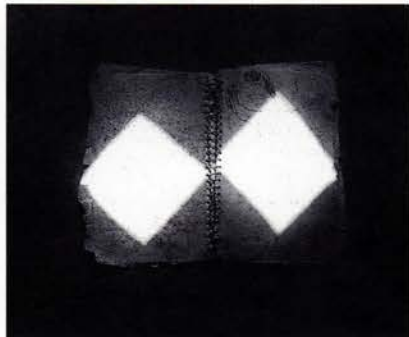

The art of
handmade books
thrives under
Johnson's
artistic guide

The art of handmade books may be nearly lost, but it is gracefully and eloquently found in the hands of book artist Robert Johnson and the Minnesota Center for Book Arts. Johnson, who by trade is a visual artist and teacher, literally stumbled upon the art of bookmaking.

"Six years ago I walked into the Center and just started working," says Johnson. "I

started taking classes, worked as a janitor, and just bugged the master printers and learned as much as possible about printing."

An artist/painter whose work has been exhibited throughout the country for the past 20 years, Johnson, a native of St. Cloud, has a bachelor's degree in studio art and a master's degree in fine arts from the University of Minnesota. He has published four major collaborative books of poetry and art including *Seeking the Way* in 1991, with poet William Stafford; *Tickletoes*, a collection of 14 children's poems by Haiku poet John Wills in 1993; and in 1995, *A Private Fall*, a book of poetry by Robert Bly.

Each of these art books, created at the Minnesota Center for the Book Arts, is as unique, remarkable and multifaceted as Johnson himself. Aside from his talents as a book artist, Johnson is a skilled carpenter and stained-glass worker, has studied finger-picking blues guitar, and has trained and raced sled dogs for five years throughout Montana, British Columbia, Oregon and Minnesota.

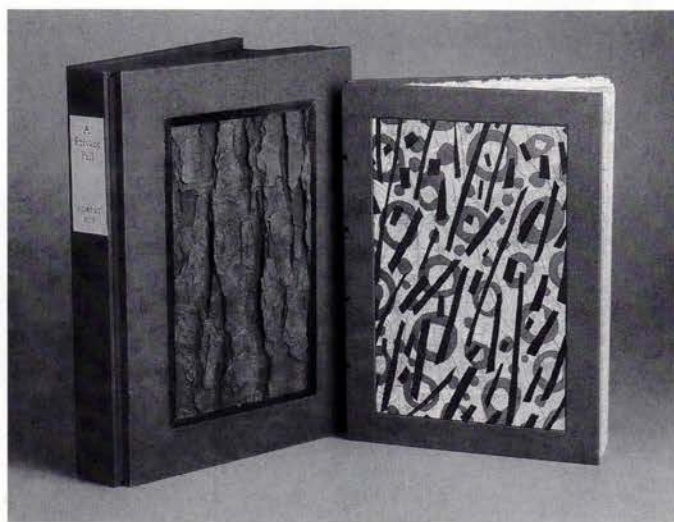
With a pride reserved usually by parents for their off-

springs, Johnson praises the resources of the Minnesota Center for Book Arts, which is celebrating its 10th anniversary. MCBA, located in downtown Minneapolis on the edge of the Warehouse District, is just one of a handful of institutions in the country that has as its mission the preservation of bookmaking. The presses that Johnson used to create his works are anywhere from 70 to 100 years old. Type trays, housing tiny elements of movable type, line the Center's walls; the paper-making chamber, where reeds, cotton, and other natural materials are pounded to create the mushy, but viable paper pulp, is modestly situated in one corner.

and produced in a limited edition of 40, measures 14 inches by 19 inches. It's housed in a bright blue, fabric-covered box, and features Johnson's imaginative, abstract and playful images, which he describes as "muscular" and "kinetic."

Tickletoes has been with Johnson since the 1970s when he and Wills were colleagues at Georgia Southern University. Wills read his poem "Afternoon Snack"—a poem about the pleasures of peanut butter—to Johnson who was inspired many years later to create a book using Wills's poems.

The subject matter—scary movies on TV, bluejays, bath time, bickering brothers—gave Johnson the opportunity to

Johnson's limited-edition books, in the collections of the New York Public Library, the Minnesota History Center, the University of Minnesota Public Library and the Minnesota Historical Society, can also be found in the MCBA library near the exhibition space at the Center's entrance. *Tickletoes*, one of Johnson's most impressive books

create brilliantly imaginative and playful images. For inspiration, he visited the Minneapolis Public Library and checked out a book featuring Henri Matisse's *Jazz* series. "I saw his work and I thought, yeah, now I know what I need to do," Johnson recalls.

The book, which consumed a year of work for Johnson and his assistant Krista Sulkowski,

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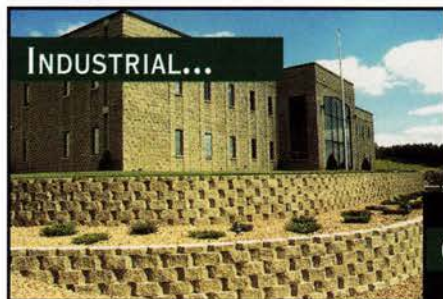
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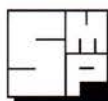
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Computing design

Technology-based design has catapulted architecture in new directions

“In

the early 15th century the great Renaissance architect, Filippo Brunelleschi, invented perspective drawing in order to help him convey his conception of space to his client, the Catholic Church. Today, 3D visualization techniques on the computer are allowing architects the same liberating possibilities as



of architects who've made efforts to improve the client-architect relationship through better pictures.

From sophisticated two- and three-point perspective renderings to scribbled marks on paper napkins, architects have always used drawings to convey their ideas, sometimes in concert with three-dimensional models. Unfortunately, the simplest design often appears incomprehensible to most clients. The search for new ways to communicate complex building designs has led to the recent use of computer modeling programs and animation.

As software programs become more refined and their representation of objects and spaces more realistic, architects find themselves using computers as an intrinsic way of doing business. "It's changing the look of our designs and increasing the opportunity to create new ways of doing things," Berry says. By adding the element of time, drawings made with computer-aided drafting programs (CAD) begin to express the more experi-

ential aspects of a design, thus communicating to clients in a more effective way what the designer sees with their mind's eye.

Architects have used computers for word processing, CAD, cost estimating and record keeping for more than 10 years now. But the complete transfer of the design process onto computer has only occurred within the last four or five years, and primarily in architectural firms that have the resources and the inclination to make the switch. It is, however, still rare to see the daily use of computers to design buildings from scratch. Most firms tend to begin the traditional way, on paper, transferring the designs to computer at a mid-point when it seems to make sense and speed is of the essence. This practice is rapidly changing, as younger architects who've received special computer training in school begin to enter design firms and take on increased responsibilities. These young

during Brunelleschi's time," says Scott Berry, vice president of the Minneapolis office of Ellerbe Becket, the largest architecture and engineering firm in the Twin Cities. Berry is only the latest in a long line

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Architects and designers are in a unique position to create lasting memorials to human achievement and human failure. From the Statue of Liberty, welcoming the world's immigrants to American shores, to the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Plaza, commemorating the fallen soldiers of war, monuments have assumed formidable places in our nation's psyche.

Millennium approaches

When the Pharaohs framed the great pyramids in ancient Egypt, they built temples to their own glory and to the hope of a majestic afterlife. Today the pyramids stand as symbols of a once-mighty empire. When Daniel Burnham set plans for the White City to celebrate the World's Columbian Exposition of 1893, he fashioned a classical urban showplace on a once-swampy tract to highlight advances in civilization and technology. When architects began stretching structures higher and higher, they built soaring symbols of commerce and technology.

Architecture often is more than just shelter. Civilization expresses its values through architecture. Look no further than the nation's Capital to see the embodiment of equality in the Capitol building and the specter of evil in the Holocaust Museum.

The approaching millennium presents another opportunity for architects and designers to envision human achievement through architecture. With another 1,000 years behind us and another 1,000 ahead, here is an occasion for reflection and creativity.

Andrew Leicester, an artist living in Minneapolis, is planning for the millennium. Known for large-scale, community-based projects, Leicester is proposing a series of Millennium town houses, schools and civic centers that will emphasize cultural diversity, celebrate heritage and history, and reinforce a sense of community. For the town houses, he's designing façades in which textile patterns from different cultures create distinctive fronts. For the schools, Leicester suggests that pupils, parents, grandparents and teachers attend workshops in which they work with an artist to help create these fanciful, textile-inspired façades.

Leicester's scheme is one example of how architects and designers can greet the millennium. Surprisingly, few American cities—if any—are generating architectural commemorations for the millennium. Britain, in contrast, is spending billions of dollars on new building projects in honor of this milestone, from new opera houses in Cardiff and Salford to an Olympic-class stadium in Manchester, a revived Crystal Palace in south London, and many smaller projects throughout the country. At the last millennium in 1000 A.D., Europeans ran screaming from their homes, believing a wrathful God would smite the world. Wisely, Britain is taking a different approach this time around.

America deserves a millennium plan—aside from the expected fireworks or mayhem at an alleged Armageddon. Architects must pool their talents to create architectural legacies acknowledging another 1,000 years of civilization. Four years and counting, the millennium approaches. Now is the time to build for the future while honoring the past.



Lakesideviews

In the movie *Safe*, the protagonist, played by Julianne Moore, becomes violently allergic to virtually every pollutant imaginable—aerosols, exhaust fumes, perfumes, cleaning fluids, fabric dyes. Her only recourse is to escape the toxic world by retreating into an environmentally controlled, igloo-style cabin on a rural retreat. Here she finds toxin-free safety and indigenous North American architecture to boot.

Well, Moore's character may have found safety—temporarily so, anyway—but

her architectural surroundings left something to be desired, Arctic vernacularism aside. Had she hired architect David Salmela of Duluth, she would have gotten a toxin-free house and some dazzling architecture for her time and money.

This 1,100-square-foot, year-round house on Pike Lake in Duluth was designed for Paul and Dorothy Lutz with environmental safety in mind. Dorothy, a pianist and teacher, suffers from allergies. She and Paul, a Lutheran minister

and potter, originally lived in another cabin on the lakeside site, which they acquired from her parents. But mold buildup in the leaky stone basement caused health problems. They decided the best solution was to tear down the old and build new.

Salmela, whose award-winning houses and cabins are scattered throughout Duluth and northern Minnesota, embraced the challenge of designing a toxin-free house on a tight budget. The architect tested all materials, varnishes, paints and finishes

for toxicity before applying them to his design palette. He chose exterior birch plywood for interior finishes—floors, ceilings, stairwell, cabinetry—because it is economically priced and manufactured with nontoxic glue. The house sits on piers to protect it from the damp earth. Heat radiates from clean electric units.

While the toxic-free design is laudable—and necessary for Dorothy's well-being—the house itself is a playful ornament on a heavily wooded site of pine, maple and birch trees. The clients retained the original foundation and fireplace as a ruin, and built the new house just behind the existing footprint. Set approximately 400 feet from the road, the house bursts from its site with a display of colors, forms and textures.

Salmela systematically organized the house into three distinct components. Two bedrooms are stacked in a cube at one end, which connects to a wedge-shaped "friendship" room, and then to the exterior deck that serves as a third room. Footpaths from the deck connect to the lake or to another deck facing the lake.

Rather than creating a uniform façade, Salmela opted for variety. The plywood-clad bedroom component is painted a

checkerboard pattern, while stained cedar with a blue-painted plywood base defines the multipurpose friendship room. For the canopy protecting the front deck entrance, Salmela left the cedar untreated for contrast. Windows, trimmed in a nectarine tone along the lake façade, rise and fall along the wall plain as if musical notes on a staff.

Being inside the multipurpose friendship room almost feels like being in a tree house. Here the kitchen, living room, dining area and music room are combined. The plywood, a familiar material in many of Salmela's houses, lends a casual, outdoor feel. The house, long and narrow, actually feels much bigger than its petite size because of the high ceiling that slopes upward to the second bedroom and Dorothy's office loft. Such built-in items as a sofa and

kitchen table help to maximize limited space by eliminating the need for bulky furniture. Windows, large and small—some touching the floor, others slanted along the rise of the ceiling—further open the room. Light is everywhere. The outdoors feels indoors, just like in a tree house.

Despite its eclectic forms and colors, the house fits comfortably into its wooded site, a perfect addition to northern Minnesota's unpretentious, rustic architectural tradition. The house's small size doesn't overwhelm the site,

the materials are traditionally used throughout the region, and the craftsmanship is impeccable. Yet the Lutz house dares to be different by using tradition in new and surprising ways.

Merging architecture

Land and nature often provide powerful inspiration for architects. After all, if you buy property on an ideal site—lakes, trees, wildlife—you want to take full advantage of that site. Of course, you don't need to be in the woods to capitalize on nature. A 40th-floor apartment on Chicago's Lake Shore Drive fetches a pretty price if expansive windows frame Lake Michigan. There's something about a body of water or a grove of trees that makes us want to stand back and take note.

In the case of this house in Menomonie, Wis., for Claudia Smith, the views are of a nearby pond and Red Cedar Lake through the trees along sloping land. Smith, an art-history professor at the University of Wisconsin-Stout, knows a good thing when she sees it. She specializes in Roman mosaics in the classroom. Outside the classroom, she's a member of the Wisconsin State Historical Society and holds particular interest in the state's vernacular rural architecture.

For many years she lived in a two-bedroom apartment, filled with her various collections, including rugs. When it came time to buy a house, she looked at existing structures in town before settling on a plot of land and an agenda for new construction.

Land and structure find common ground in this Wisconsin house

Smith's property is surprisingly deceptive. Though it looks quite rugged and rural when you're in the thick of it, the land is actually in the middle of a housing development. Builder's homes—the big-roof, big-garage variety—surround Smith's land. Yet there's enough untouched nature left to inspire those of the bucolic mindset.

When Dale Mulfinger of Mulfinger, Susanka, Mahady & Partners in Minneapolis began to explore options with Smith, he presented two possible design directions. Houses, based on renowned architect Charles Moore's theory, are either "claiming" the land or "merging" with the land. Claiming and merging are the difference between living "on" the land and living "in" it. Mulfinger dubbed his claiming scheme "Waiting for Hansel," to connote the vernacular house in the woods. He called his merging scheme "Light of My

Life," to indicate a house attuned with nature and sunlight.

Though she didn't necessarily have a set vision of what the house should look like, Smith knew how it should feel. She wanted to be absorbed by the surroundings, blur the line between inside and outside. After so many years in a small apartment, she wanted to spread out.

For Mulfinger, this meant creating a house that would merge with the land, yet also respect the red vernacular buildings of the rural Midwest that struck a cord with the architectural preservationist in Smith and the farm-boy upbringing in Mulfinger. What emerged was a house hunkered into the hillside, yet open to the southeast light and views to the pond and lake.

Smith's house combines modern architectural concepts of large windows, free-flowing rooms and plenty of sunlight with traditional forms of rural architecture. Painted barn red with white trim and vertical board-and-batten cedar siding, the house has a distinctive rural appearance, reminiscent of a chicken coop. That in itself is not such an unlikely architectural reference for a house. After all, this is Wisconsin with its 20-below January nights, and a chicken coop is warm and protective.

Yet this is not just a hybrid of a rural antecedent. This is modern architecture that does indeed merge with the land. Mulfinger positioned the house away from the road. The main façade faces the pond and wooded lot, shielded from the street. When visitors approach, all they see is the diminutive garage door. To enter, they follow a path along the side that overlooks the site, and once inside—boom—more landscape pours into full view.

Living spaces are on two levels. The kitchen, dining, living room and guest bedroom are on the main floor, and another bedroom and multipurpose room are on the lower level. To bring in more light, Mulfinger peeled away the main-level floor from the southeast corner, opening the lower level to the upper. Windows span the two levels, filtering light deeper into the lower level where the house faces into a hill.

No matter where you stand in the house, you are aware of the outdoors, visually connected to the landscape. In the summer, lush foliage shields the interior from the sun. In the winter, views open to distant vistas. Smith notes that even on winter nights the house is bright, especially during full moons. **E.K.**

A new town-house development
builds on existing urban character

A few years back, the media, architects, designers and environmentalists were abuzz with issues of sustainable design and the importance of creating energy-efficient architecture that minimizes its negative environmental impact. Sustainable

amidst the amorphous sprawl.

New Urbanism doesn't wish to do away with cars, but looks for means of building neighborhoods in which driving isn't always a necessity just to buy a loaf of bread.

In small ways, New Urbanism thinking has made its way

design hasn't vanished from designers' lexicon; it's just taken new shape and form.

Today the media blitz is on New Urbanism, a symbiotic link in sustainable-design thinking.

New Urbanism seeks to rope in urban sprawl by returning to traditional town planning.

Rather than wasting land, natural resources and energy by building farther and farther from the city center, New Urbanism seeks to maintain a dense urban fabric. With New Urbanism, a variety of shops, businesses, commercial enterprises and housing exist within walking distance of each other, or are at least accessible by public transportation. In today's post-World War II suburban developments, single-family housing is zoned to one area, multifamily housing to another, retail and commercial to yet another district, and industrial somewhere else. The car, by necessity, is about the only means of transportation

to the Twin Cities, where a suburban-development mentality permeates. Minneapolis's bulldozer approach to urban redevelopment often has replaced buildings with parking lots. In various neighborhoods, commercial storefronts built to the sidewalk have been replaced with strip malls fronted by parking lots.

Yet a few bright spots exist in the Twin Cities. Laurel Village, fronting three blocks along Hennepin Avenue in downtown Minneapolis, is laudable for reestablishing the urban grid. The variety of high- and low-rise buildings combines housing with street-level commercial establishments. The buildings are built to the sidewalk, confirming the urban context. Trinity town houses and apartments near the University of Minnesota also successfully build upon the neighborhood's urban character by

facing the town houses toward the street and respecting existing architecture.

Another bright spot is 3529 Hennepin Court, a six-home, urban in-fill development in Minneapolis's Uptown district. Unlike many recent town-house developments in Minneapolis, this project, designed by Michael

Lander of Town Planning Collaborative of Minneapolis with Dovolis Johnson & Rugieri of Minneapolis as architects-of-record, feels part of the neighborhood. Walking past it, you might not even notice it because it unobtrusively slips into the urban context.

Too many recent town-

house projects in Minneapolis turn their backs on the city. Rather than reinforcing the existing street grid, they shun the street to create insular internal courts. It's as though they want nothing to do with the city, even though they are in the city.

Not at 3529 Hennepin Court. Lander, a native of North Dakota, spent 15 years working in San Francisco before moving to Minneapolis in the early '90s. A proponent of the New Urbanism, he has strong ideas about what cities should be, and he's manifesting these concepts into his numerous housing and urban-studies projects. Across the street from Hennepin Court is an old fire station, which he converted to town houses several years back. The fire station, a historic neighborhood site, is now reclaimed, a living part of the neighborhood.

Lander believes in density, building within the existing urban framework and nurturing the neighborhood with proper development.

3529 Hennepin Court makes all the proper moves. Taking his cue from famed San Francisco architect Daniel Solomon and his urban-housing developments, Lander positioned three separate buildings to create a U-shaped "walk-in court." Two carriage houses flank the entry court, while a single building with four row houses complete the U formation. Each carriage house, sitting atop a bank of five garages, comes flush with the sidewalk. Residents enter the carriage houses from Hennepin Avenue, while residents of the row houses enter through individual, gated courtyards. By turning the garages toward the main court, Lander avoids the overpowering image of 10 garage doors facing the street. Pedestrians can peer into a pleasant

court, and residents have a common outdoor space with the entry driveway.

Lander designed the buildings as straightforward boxes sheathed with hardboard siding and rock-faced block, but he augmented them with such items as window bays with metal roofs, wooden trellises, private gates and metal balconies. The multichromatic salmon/yellow tones refer to the area's many commercial buildings.

Judging from your average town-house project, you might expect the interiors to be fairly

materials that have integrity and aesthetic value. The stairs, for instance, are made of steel with maple treads and cable railings. Floors are spruce planks, and fir doors have frosted glass to increase interior light between rooms.

The town houses have attracted a young crowd, mostly singles or young married couples with no children in their late-20s or 30s. The benefit

for the owners is finding new construction in a setting that feels like an established part of the neighborhood.

If we had more housing developments like this, we wouldn't have to talk about the New Urbanism. We would be living it as it always should be **E.K.**

generic. This, of course, isn't your average town-house development.

The units, for one, are filled with light. The two carriage houses have four walls of windows. The two end units of the row houses have three walls of windows. Only the two center units get by with two walls of windows. Yet skylights and tall windows certainly help bring light into the two middle units.

The loft-style interiors are spacious, helped by the 9-foot ceilings. Living, kitchen, dining and family rooms and half bath are on the main level, with traditional private rooms on the upper level. Rather than simply covering surfaces in sheet rock and wall-to-wall carpeting, Lander chose mate-

Julie and Dick Edstrom had no intention of selling their house in Stillwater—until someone made them an offer. A real-estate agent and an investment banker, respectively, both are accustomed to sudden financial transactions. The trick was to find a new house.

They decided to go to the source. Architects Mike McGuire and Kelly Davis had designed the Edstroms' original house. So they enlisted Davis to design the new abode. They even had the property. The site, located on the north end of Stillwater, a few blocks from their original house, posed some challenges. In fact, the narrow lot had been carved out of an old limestone quarry. Scarred earth with exposed rock defines one side, and St. Croix River set-backs demarcate the other. To get to the site, one must drive down into it.

The site, however, wasn't particularly daunting to Davis, now a partner with Mulfinger, Susanka, Mahady & Partners in Minneapolis. He saw this as an opportunity to create a house that hunkers into the land but is open to the water. The tight, restrictive site meant that he had to build up, not out. Driving up to the 2,700-square-foot house, one would hardly guess that it rises four levels.

The Edstroms are empty nesters with grown children. The two-bedroom house is designed for them sans children, which means that customary privacy requirements aren't an overriding design consideration. The house, thus, is quite open. While the prominent, A-frame roof shields the house from the quarry and elements, the interior opens your senses to the river. Walls of windows on all four levels capture river views. Except for the lower level, which has a private guest bedroom, the standard divisions between spaces are absent.

R i v e r v i e w s

Although the lower level is separate from the rest of the house, the upper three levels are visible to each other. The house is easily divided between primary living spaces. The kitchen, as well as living and dining rooms, are on the main level, with the master suite on the upper two levels. The master suite, in fact, is the most prominent space in the house. It bridges over the living room and creates a dropped ceiling for a seating area by the fireplace.

Because the master suite is a bridge that extends to a full wall of windows and a balcony overlooking the river, the room feels quite open. You can spend the whole day in bed and never feel confined to one room. If you get bored with the room and views, then you can walk up another flight to a small loft-like office with a bird's-eye view of the surrounding landscape. The master suite actually has several small extensions. In addition to the upper office loft, there's a small reading nook and library on the landing leading into the bedroom. Off from there is a sewing room, in addition to dressing rooms.

For the Edstroms, that unexpected offer to sell proved a prime opportunity to take advantage of architecture and land.

ARTful LIVING

For Don McNeil and Emily Galusha art is part of daily life. He curates General Mills's extensive corporate-art collection and she manages the Northern Clay Center in St. Paul. Their professional lives extend to their home life, as well. Over the years, they have nurtured an extensive personal collection of modern art, creating a living, evolving museum at home. The setting for that art was always a bit lacking, though—until they built a new house in Minneapolis.

Originally McNeil and Galusha lived in a town house. Although they made some modifications, the house lacked interior flow and openness. They felt confined by existing structural parameters as they recognized a need to have more control over their space. They began scouting for a new home and were particularly drawn to old warehouses and loft spaces in downtown Minneapolis. They liked the concept of high ceilings, free and open spaces, and an industrial-warehouse aesthetic.

After consulting with Garth Rockcastle of Meyer, Scherer & Rockcastle about warehouse spaces, however, they soon decided to build new. But new did not mean forfeiting the character of the downtown loft spaces that appealed to them.

Rockcastle says that art did not specifically drive the design of the house. The site, however, played a role. The house sits at the end of a cul-de-sac. The narrow lot backing into a hill necessitated a vertical house rather a long, rambling one. As such, the house is as much about structure and materials as it is about the art it contains. And the structure is an ideal setting for art.

Rockcastle says that the house was designed from the inside out, meaning interior spaces and flow were more important in early design phases than exterior detailing. The exterior, in fact, seems to grow from utilitarian considerations. It's that utility, though, that gives the house its raw, sculptural beauty. Look at the foundation, for example. Because the

house abuts the hill, the foundation serves as a partial retaining wall on the backside. This left a 2-story-high portion of the foundation visible from the front. Rockcastle and the homeowners chose a poured-concrete foundation over concrete block because they preferred the aesthetic quality of concrete.

The site itself did not lend to spectacular views from inside—the steeply dropping hill is the vista on one side, and a sports field and highway are on the other side. So panoramic windows were not a strong design consideration. Rockcastle, instead, designed the largest windows at the corners and scattered a series of smaller windows across the façade, allowing plenty of wall space for art. From the street, the house appears austere yet sculptural, with its concrete base giving rise to a stucco façade and a scattering of punched openings.

Inside, the house functions, in many ways, like a traditional East-Coast row house, in which different living spaces

are stacked on several levels. In this case, the ground level with the main entry leads to the garage and workshop. Up one flight are the bedrooms, bathrooms and laundry area. Another flight up finds the kitchen, living and dining areas, and screened porch. A flight up

from there is the home office, which leads to a rooftop deck.

You might think that stacking the rooms would lead to a boxy, claustrophobic interior. Instead, the interior is quite open, enhanced with high ceilings and open floor plans on the different levels that lend a loftlike feel. Such industrial materials as concrete, steel, plywood and glass block further establish the warehouse sensibility that originally appealed to the couple.

The overriding design element—and perhaps one of the most significant pieces of art in the house—is the staircase. The steel structure rises four floors, from the entrance at ground level to the office and rooftop deck. The staircase is the house's visual focus as it evolves along the levels. At the entrance, the staircase is all concrete; then it becomes steel with concrete treads. On the 2nd-level, the treads become wood with steel kickers. Another level up, the treads change to grated steel. One's perception of rooms and heights shift with each new level. At the top level you can look through the grated pattern down all four levels.

Light filters through the stairs, splaying into the rooms. Perception changes with each level. McNeil and Galusha sought a home in which they had control over their environment. Here their senses are engaged. **E.K.**

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EUROPE REBUILDS

As the new century approaches, we begin to think about the future while reflecting on the past. Today, architects in eastern and central Europe are facing the challenge

of a new social and economic system with the fall of communism, and they are surveying the damage inflicted on the region's architectural legacy under communism. Architects today are looking to the dawn of this century for inspiration in rebuilding the new eastern and central Europe. They are acknowledging that the last great creative burst in the region's architectural history occurred during the late-19th and early 20th centuries.

At that time, several main strains of architecture were developing in the urban centers of eastern and central Europe. While France, Belgium and surrounding countries embraced the curving, organic forms of Art Nouveau, countries in central Europe had already begun to transcend pure Art Nouveau with more stable, rectilinear forms. In Budapest, Hungary, architects began to develop a style based partially upon folk idioms. Two contemporary Hungarian architects, Imre Makovecz and Janos

Gerlewit, have termed the style—appropriately enough—"Turn-of-the-Century" architecture. Makovecz and Gerle state that the era "contained values relevant to more than just the turn of the century, but in fact to the whole 20th century."

In Vienna, in the former Hapsburg Austro-Hungarian Empire, architects were developing a "Turn-of-the-Century" secessionist brand of architecture. Secessionist architecture, a transitional element to the International Style, began to avoid the trappings of ornamentation. And in Prague in the former Bohemia—now the Czech Republic—architects modified the Viennese Secession to become the Czech Secese.

These parallel movements began to develop their own language in the design of residential buildings. An unprecedented flurry of architectural experimentation explored new ways of living. Consequently, these movements provided diverse architectural forms.

Unfortunately for eastern and central Europe, this productive period was slowed by World War I, halted by World War II and stymied by the communist economic system. With one exception. Experimental housing programs were constructed between the World Wars. One example is Karl Marx Hof by C. Ehn in Vienna. This multiuse block consists of residential dwellings, retail space and public offices.

In the wake of communism, however, the late-20th century has found much of eastern/central European housing infected with high levels of toxic building materials and with structures in general disrepair. Stark, monotonous prefab housing districts are common sights on the urban landscape today.

Jizni Mesto 1, designed by J. Krasny, J. Lavosky and M. Rihosek, located on the eastern side of Prague, is typical. This residential area consists of four-, eight- and 12-story monotonous residential unit blocks with a centrally located group of 20- to 24-story housing blocks. Here, as in other socialist housing blocks, the construction material was prefabricated panels.

Fortunately, this is no longer the image that the region is projecting—or wishes to project. The collapse of communism has stimulated architects in eastern and central Europe to scrutinize existing construction methods and abandon the current housing paradigms, which were forced upon the population during the Cold War era. And new technologies are helping architects achieve their goals.

Facing this challenge, architects are generally adopting a pluralistic, contextual approach to design, drawn from the region's rich and diverse cultures and architectural heritage existing in close proximity. The emerging pluralistic, contextual approach acknowledges that historic context is integral in the evolution of architecture. This pluralism reveals itself in several new projects, as well as in remodelings.

The current revitalization of the Wekerle Settlement, a turn-of-the-century housing estate that had been built on the outskirts of Budapest, Hungary, is one example. A well-known, turn-of-the-century Hungarian architect, writer and proponent of Hungarian contextual design, Károly Kós, established the master plan that provided guidelines for various architects in the design of individual buildings throughout the settlement.

Had information pertaining to the Wekerle Settlement been available to the West prior to the fall of the Iron Curtain it may have served as a valuable residential-design precedent. Indeed, this settlement exhibits residential-design concepts that are seen in the well-known, late-20th-century projects of Andres Duany and Elizabeth Plater-Zyberk, proponents of the New Urbanism.

The Wekerle settlement is based upon the concept of a central urban park surrounded by mixed-use, residential/commercial/retail buildings surrounded by individual residential buildings. Residents can easily walk to the urban square to shop or ride public transportation to Budapest's center.

Kos maintains a comfortable scale by limiting the building heights to three stories and integrating them into the urban fabric. New construction around the perimeter of the urban square acknowledges the immediate context by adapting forms and building materials rich in regional context.

Multifamily housing is the norm for the majority of families in eastern/central Europe, but single-family housing also will provide opportunities for architects in

this region, although limited. A few of the economically successful are building single-family homes. Sited mainly on the outskirts of town or in the countryside, the single-family house in eastern/central Europe is built of full-masonry construction utilizing poured-concrete floor slabs and often poured-concrete, structural-roof systems. This traditional construction method in the region is expensive, and thus prohibitive for most people.

New technologies, however, are creating opportunities for Western-style stick construction utilizing standard wood structural framing—prevalent in much of the United States. Wood construction is often much less expensive than concrete construction, thus making it more accessible to a wider market. As the 21st





century progresses, more people, perhaps, will be able to afford individual homes. Yet single-family home developments—common sights in America's suburbia—are a long way off in eastern and central Europe. The primary opportunity for architects is in multifamily housing blocks that mitigate the blow of the communist era.

Contextualism is vital to the renovation and growth of the city. The theoretician Jonathan Culler states in his *Textural Theory* that context(s) are boundless and function as indicators of an openness that welcomes an initial inclusion of all ideas and information.

The challenge for eastern and central Europe will be to rebuild its housing in a way that respects the past while looking to the future.

ONE would have to search far and wide to find mention of the word “bungalow” in the standard architectural-history books of the last 50 years. This ubiquitous building style, so popular in the first quarter of this century, has either been overlooked or casually dismissed. All the usual suspects of high art versus low art, and the “great man versus every-man” theory of his-

tory can be offered as explanation for this omission. Within the architectural community, there may have been an additional prejudice, because the bungalow originated and was popularized without much support from the architectural profession. But to overlook a style that represented the largest part of residential construction during the greatest expansion in our country’s history is a critical loss requiring correction.

PERHAPS the underlying lesson learned from this shortcoming is that architectural history, generally, is far too focused on stylistic details and variations to the exclusion of other influences that ultimately have a more profound impact on how our buildings are shaped. A study of the bungalow style would reveal the extent to which these cultural and social influences contributed both to its form and popularity.

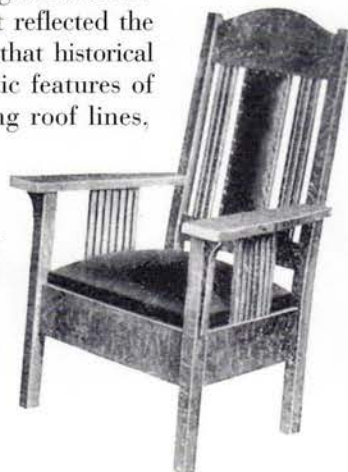
A NUMBER of interdependent forces led to the bungalow revolution at the beginning of this century. These included the extraordinary economic, technological and cultural changes that were occurring; a pent-up housing demand, population shifts, and expansionist and progressive policies of the period; development of the modern real-estate, housing and financial industries; incredible advancements in construction tech-

nology and the manufacturing process; and the creation of completely new marketing and merchandising techniques. The extent and range of these forces create quite a challenge to the architectural historian; but the alternative is to risk not understanding the true significance of the style—or worse, to completely overlook it.

THE bungalow style, with its modest and unpretentious character, was a decided rejection of the gingerbread excesses of the late-Victorian era. It represented a turn to a more open and casual lifestyle, and became the first style that truly could be called national. The bungalow evolved into an original and new form of architecture that reflected the special circumstances of that historical period. The characteristic features of bungalows are low-slung roof lines, overhanging eaves, bracketed and exposed roof rafters, harmony with nature, use of porches, pergolas and verandahs, expansive and open floor plan, and rustic simplicity. The term “bungalow”

is sometimes used to describe a building type, that is, a one-story cottage. But the broader application of the term is as a style, which can be applied to buildings of more than one story, as it was during the first quarter of this century.

A **STYLISTIC** name or label is usually coined as a convenient way for critics or historians to group practitioners who share a similar design philosophy, often after the style has run its course. In the case of the bungalow style, the term was broadly used by its practitioners and the general public even during the height of its popularity, as a means of promoting this new fashion. Perhaps for the first time in history, a building style was packaged and marketed in the same manner as other consumer products or items from a mail-order catalog. It is no coincidence that the bungalow revolution coincided with the

Plans and the influential *Western Architect* magazine were published in Minneapolis. The Twin Cities became a key connecting point between the east- and west-coast bungalow movements.

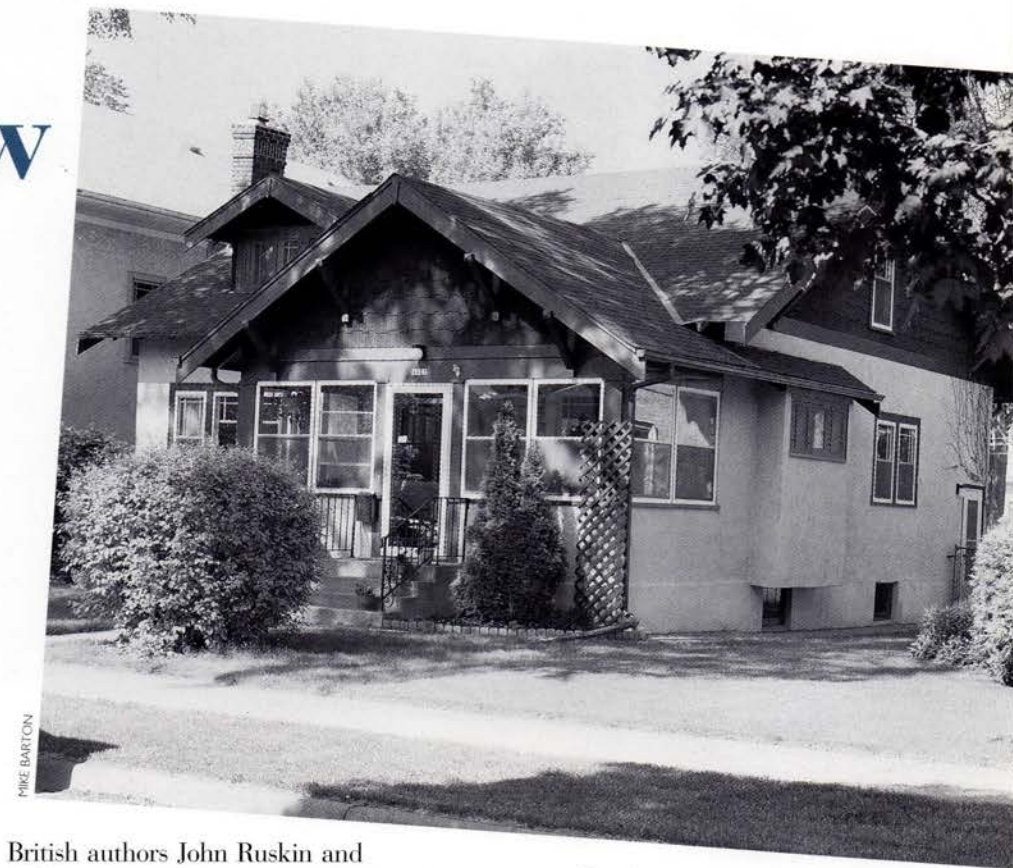
THE philosophical underpinnings of the bungalow style are based in the Arts-and-Crafts movement, which originated in England in the late-19th century. This movement preached simplicity, the value of handicrafts versus machine production, and the role of the individual in the work process.

rise of the automobile industry with its innovative marketing and manufacturing techniques. The style became the product. Bungalow magazines, plan services and mail-order houses sprung up all over the country. Among other large department stores, Sears, Roebuck and Co., created a home catalog that it updated every year or two, which ultimately sold more than 100,000 prefabricated houses, many of them bungalows.

THE bungalow style achieved great popularity in Minnesota, as it did throughout the country. The Twin Cities also played an important national role in the popularization of the style. Many local companies had a vested interest in promoting the construction trades generally, and were actively engaged in new-product development. A number of new energy-conservation materials and other labor-saving construction products were developed here. Weyerhaeuser Lumber created national publications promoting the benefits of new-home construction. The local architectural community created the nationally sanctioned AIA Small House Bureau. A number of nationally prominent publications including *Keith's*

British authors John Ruskin and William Morris promoted the idea of reuniting designer and craftsman, and advocated the return to a system similar to the medieval crafts guilds. These ideas were popularized in this country by Gustav Stickley, a successful furniture designer and manufacturer, who published *The Craftsman* magazine. A number of Arts-and-Crafts organizations were established in this country.

Bungalows came in many shapes and sizes during the heyday of their construction in the Twin Cities, as seen in the two different styles on these pages. Inspired by the Arts-and-Crafts movement, bungalows were a decided turn away from the excesses of the Victorian era. Many leaders of the Arts-and-Crafts movement designed furniture, as seen with the chair, buffet, lamp and hall clock (these pages and following), and eventually turned to house design to create a fully integrated home environment.

including The Handicraft Guild of Minneapolis, founded in 1914. Many of these early leaders in the Arts-and-Crafts movement designed furniture, which was commonly (but erroneously) described in this country as Mission style. Eventually, many of these designers felt compelled to design houses in order to provide a more compatible and harmonious backdrop for their furniture. They were seeking to create a totally integrated environment where architecture, furnishings and fixtures were part of a whole and complete design. There was an increased use of built-in furniture, further blurring the lines be-

tween furniture and building. The architectural profession also was realizing the need for designing a complete environment and turned its attention to interior components, including furnishings and fixtures. Charles Rennie Mackintosh, Frank Lloyd Wright, and William Purcell and George Grant Elmslie were successful at integrating all designed elements.

ARCHITECTS designed furniture. And furniture designers designed architecture. The resultant cross-fertilization of ideas from the two previously distinct disciplines generated a

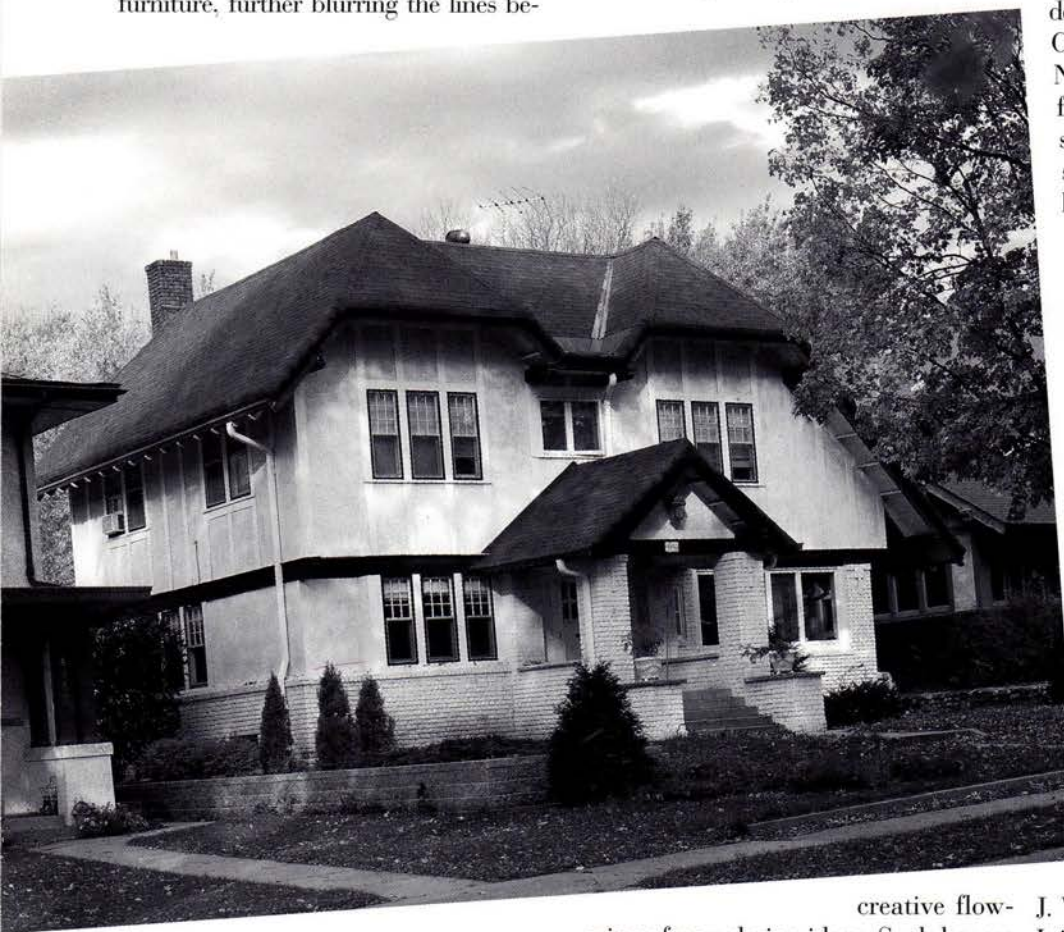


started out as a furniture designer, designed stair railings for the Charles B. Evans House, Douglaston, N.Y., he utilized a standard detail found in Mission-style furniture—a simple geometric pattern incised into a slat or plank. (Backs of chairs had to be flat for comfort.)

WITH a bungalow on Selby Avenue in St. Paul, the incised pattern is seen in the porch railings. But on the cornice above the porch there is an applied molding, which appears to have no classical antecedent. A review of the furniture catalogs of the period, however, reveals a design for a chair back manufactured by the Brooks Furniture Company, which seems to be the unlikely inspiration for this architectural detail.

THE Twin Cities played an interesting part in this chapter of cross-fertilization between architect and furniture designer. Harvey Ellis, a talented architect from Rochester, N.Y., moved to Minnesota in 1886 where he worked successively for

J. Walter Stevens and LeRoy Buffington. It is widely believed that Ellis was the actual designer of a number of major buildings produced by the Buffington office, including Pillsbury and Nicholson Halls on the University of Minnesota campus, and the St. Paul Building. Ellis was a free spirit, a self-acknowledged alcoholic, and probably unstable. But his talents were legendary. Elmslie noted that "No American artist had a more perfect technical language for architectural rendering.... His name was well known to everyone who read an architectural magazine from 1880 to well past 1900."

creative flowering of new design ideas. Such houses as the Gamble House in California by architects Greene and Greene in 1908 appeared to be elaborate pieces of furniture writ large. Chairs and tables from the period, including many Frank Lloyd Wright pieces, and later the Rietveld chairs of the De Stijl period in 1918, had the look of architectural models.

NEW design motifs evolved. Curved architectural moldings were replaced with a more boxed or squared look. The use of turned railings on stairs

ELLIS apparently grew frustrated with architecture. He moved back East where he connected up with Stickley. Ellis designed a number of extraordinary houses that were published in *The Craftsman*. He also made a major contribution as a furniture designer for the Stickley Company. His design for an inlaid armchair of 1903 set a new standard of accomplishment for the company and a new direction. Stickley furniture prior to that piece was henceforth dubbed "pre-Ellis Stickley." Although Ellis only spent seven months with Stickley, his impact on the company and on the development of American design was profound. He died in 1904 at the age of 52.

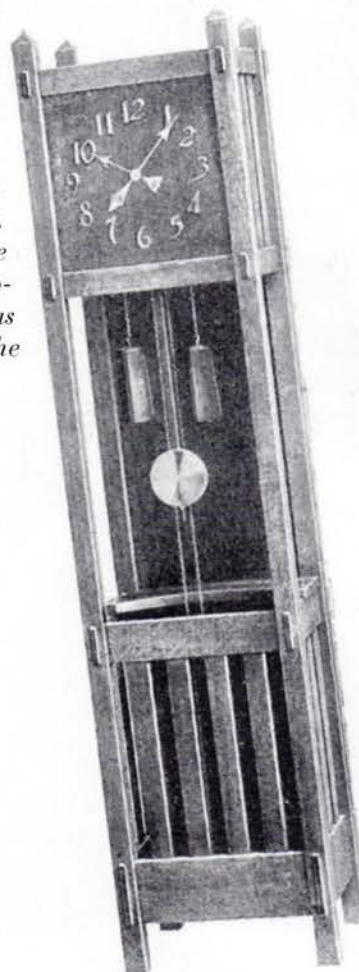
IRA Keer, a contemporary architect who also creates furniture, recently noted in this magazine [*Architecture Minnesota*, November/December 1993] that "Designing furniture is a means to explore big ideas on a small scale, to become intimately engaged with materials, to make aesthetic statements, and actually just to have fun." Those same sentiments applied a

century ago, and were a compelling reason for the origin, development, and success of the bungalow style.

Brian McMahon recently directed The Bungalow Project, a year-long educational and promotional effort that culminated in an exhibit, lecture series and trade exposition at the Landmark Center in St. Paul. As project manager for the Northeast Neighborhoods Development Corporation in St. Paul he has rehabilitated a bungalow in the Hazel Park section of St. Paul.

Mackinac Island

Few Americans remember a time when automobiles did not monopolize our time, money and land. The statistics are staggering: Parents who drive 30 minutes to work each way will waste six solid months of their lives commuting before their child is 18 years old. Urban freeways cost millions to build per mile. In a post-industrial city like Los Angeles, autos gobble up to 25 percent of the land area. Parking lots, freeways, driveways, service stations, auto dealerships and junkyards also devour land at a terrifying rate.

But the most precious resource we've squandered on the automobile is our quality of life. We idle away our lives waiting for green lights; we accept disembodied conversations with robotic clerks at fast-food drive-up windows; we scuttle through dimly lit, exhaust-fume-filled,

Dantesque subterranean parking ramps; we breathe blue smog without complaining; we take our lives into our hands every time we step out of our auto-cocoons and try to cross the road.

There's no question that automobiles and highways have given Americans unparalleled mobility and independence. But too rarely do we ask this question: What is the true cost of America's obsession with the automobile?

You can't properly answer this question, of course, until you visit Mackinac Island, Mich. Mackinac (pronounced "MACKInaw") is a resort island set in the narrows separating the Upper Peninsula of Michigan from the lower, and Lake Michigan from Lake Huron. In 1896 (or 1898, depending on your source), Mackinac Island's city fathers voted to ban automobiles from its pristine shores after a rather nasty encounter between an automobile and a horse-drawn carriage.

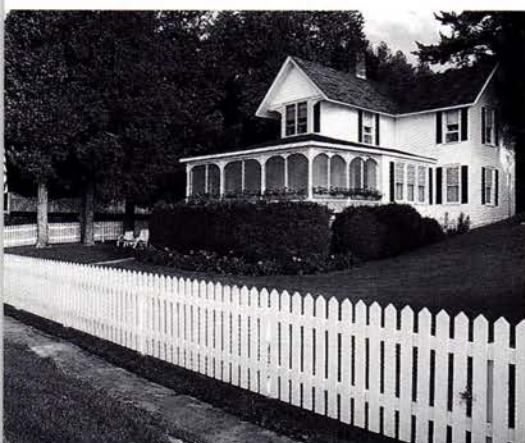
There are no yellow taxis, no little red sports cars, no minivans, no lumbering RVs, no diesel-belching 18-wheeler semis, no police cruisers, no brown UPS trucks.

People and goods move either by bicycle or by a bewildering variety of horse-drawn wagons.

To meander Mackinac's shady streets is to enter a parallel reality. It is unbelievably... pleasant. The air is fresh and clean. The streets are quiet. What you hear is the quiet whir of bicycles and the gentle clip-clop of horses. The atmosphere is relaxed and low-stress: crossing the street isn't a life-threatening experience.

With hundreds of horses on the island (even the resident Michigan state trooper rides a horse), you can quickly begin to distinguish among varying qualities of horse-flesh, eyeing horses as you eye cars, judging line and estimating quality.

You also learn a whole new vocabulary—landau and sociable, opera bus and vis-a-vis, gig, trap, surrey and omnibus, cutter and dray—all specific types of horse-drawn carriages that our everyday language has forgotten. *Continued on page 72*

is a testament to Johnson's love of the written word, to art, the art of bookmaking and to eloquent simplicity. One poem, "Tub Fun," is indicative of the playfulness of Wills's subject matter: "I like to sit down/in the tub/with all my boats/before I scrub."

Johnson hand mixed the more than 180 colors used for the book and created textures by dragging a comb through the ink or laying string on the ink's surface. "It was like having a big box of crayons to play with," Johnson says of the process.

Johnson's most recent work, *A Private Fall*, features 10 poems set in rural Minnesota, by native writer Bly. For his palette, Johnson looked to the western Minnesota prairie landscape, selecting subtle hues and high contrasts to capture the season between fall and spring. "I wanted the book to capture the shifting light and emotional bearing of these 10 poems in a way that suggests the smells, moods, textures, and other natural elements and perceptions that the poems evoke," Johnson says. He also created expressionistic prints—"illuminations" he calls them—to reflect the moods and feelings inspired by the poems.

The book was a result of a request Johnson made to Bly more than 10 years ago to create such a work. *A Private Fall* comes in a leather-bound box with an inset print and a cast elm-bark panel on its cover. The pages of the book are delicately made from flax and cotton, and resemble the graveled sandiness of country roads. "In his poems, Bly seems to always go from something small and make it big," Johnson says, "and this is what I tried to achieve with the book."

A Private Fall, like all of Johnson's books, is curiously alive—it invites you to touch it, to feel its heft and to run your fingers through its pages. Johnson has succeeded, with his careful use of space, tone, texture and color, to create large, somewhat unwieldy books that, despite their size, are remarkably intimate and delicate.

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designers—"hot pencils" in industry argot—are changing the way buildings are being created.

"Electronic technology is more than a new pencil," Berry says, "it is changing the way we think about architecture." Computers—with the ability to quickly make an infinite number of iterations—have expanded the process of design exploration and testing by giving designers more opportunity to ask "what if." Jim Davy, a lead designer/ animator with BWBR Architects in St. Paul finds the computer helpful in the early stages of a project. "We use it primarily to build 3D 'sketches' of ideas we're currently working on," he says. "This way, we can quickly visualize a design based on the two-dimensional data that builds up as we progress." Mark Westman, associate marketing manager for BWBR, says it's been four or five years since they've done anything "on the boards" [on traditional drafting boards]. New programs, like 3D animation and modeling, help our clients and it helps us get a better sense of how a particular design might be realized in the real world."

Computers have the capacity to keep track of a great quantity of numbers simultaneously. For this reason, architects can easily create a data base of building information from the plans, sections and materials used in a particular project, which allows them more time for analyzing and testing many variations on the design forms, the fun stuff that excites architects. This is the reason that many new buildings in recent years appear to be more lively—pulsating with sculptural qualities. "I think technology has allowed more curves in contemporary architecture because of the ease with which a drawing can be made on the computer," says Bruce Eckfeldt, a young designer with BWBR. "You find almost every building these days being designed with curves because it's so easy to do."

"The use of 3D modeling has made a big impact on our practice," says Steve Kleinman, principal of SKD Architects, Plymouth. "Computers help the architect better understand the shapes, forms and spaces they are creating. It's also made a big difference with clients because it has helped them understand what they're going to get from the architect. We use

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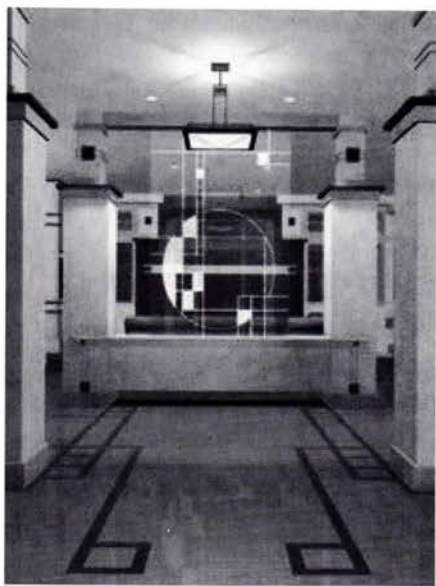
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A computer-generated image of the entry hall (above) by SKD Architects helped convince the clients to add the etched-glass medallions as a focal point (below).



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[computer modeling] mostly to help our clients prioritize spaces and help them understand the spaces of their new home."

A case in point is the Kohler house, recently completed and designed by SKD Architects. Kleinman began the house on the computer, actively involving the client in the design decisions from the start. The result is a satisfying work of residential design in the Prairie School style that could not have been done as efficiently—or as quickly—without the aid of a computer. Kleinman attributes the use of modeling software in part to the success of the project. "Part of what makes a successful project for an architect is being able to sell good ideas," he says. "With [these software programs]

we are now able to respond to a client's needs in a convincing way." New computer modeling and rendering programs (such as form•Z, Sculpt 3D, MicroStation Modeler or AutoCAD Release 13) can add material textures and colors to a drawing to give clients a realistic impression of the designs. These sophisticated programs help both client and architect understand three-dimensional forms in ways never before imagined.

Still photographs of a building site can be scanned into the computer and rough model forms can be superimposed to create composite illustrations of a proposed building. Because many site topographic maps are in digital form, it is also possible to simply "drop" a house design onto the site data and have an accurate representation of how the house fits the site. "We can now just give a disk to the survey crew and they can place the points on site for beginning excavation and construction," Kleinman says.

The next level of computer capabilities is animation, a process that requires massive memory capacity and huge chunks of time in the output. Nevertheless, the payback in terms of client response and ultimate satisfaction can be worth the effort. But it also can be expensive. A typical three- to five-minute animation—involving fully rendered building surfaces and lighting sources—can cost anywhere from \$2,600 to more than \$3,000. For this reason, most architects pick and choose the projects they apply this to with care. Ellerbe Becket uses animation for design competitions and marketing efforts, primarily as a presentation vehicle to portray the three-dimensional experience of a building.

SKD Architects finds animation quite useful in the design process with a number of their house clients. "When you get into [designing for] the upper bracket of housing, people are willing to spend money for this process because it helps them visualize the end product," Kleinman says. "This gives both the client and the builder a good idea of how the house will look, and it saves money in the long run because costly mistakes can be avoided in the designing stages."

The Kohler house is the first project SKD Architects designed using 3D Studio, a software program that interfaces with AutoCAD to produce a fully rendered animated presentation. "We did a midday exterior walk-around and one

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night shot with the lights on, and then we studied the sun angles throughout the day to determine where the shadows were and how the sunlight hit the windows," Kleineman says. As a bonus, SKD Architects often gives the client a Hi-8 or superVHS tape with the animation of their project after it's completed. The completed houses surprisingly often match the animations in detail and feel.

"Because architects are what I call 'object oriented,'" Berry says, "an actual model of a building (made of wood or whatever) cannot simulate a space as realistically as a computer-generated 3D model, nor at the correct scale."

Berry believes that computers can help clients and designers overcome the problem of experiencing an imagined space or building more accurately than any carefully crafted model, because our eyes cannot shrink to the proper scale to view a model. Moreover, animations are familiar to clients because they are like television imagery. "Animation, when used as a process tool, enhances overall quality and cost effectiveness of a design," Berry says, "and it leads to discovering the best possible solutions."

All this combines to reveal a startlingly different quality of life.

Sitting on the porch of your bed-and-breakfast or hotel, you can watch the ebb and flow of everyday life. Construction workers, rather than driving to job sites alone in individual pick-ups, pedal their bicycles together, discussing the coming day's work. Pedestrians stop and chat in the middle of the street, stepping casually aside for the occasional passing carriage carting saucer-eyed tourists to the Grand Hotel. Tourists careen by on rental bicycles, rediscovering lost physical skills and laughing with strangers over the joy of rediscovering lost childhood skills. The UPS man huffs and puffs by on his loaded-down delivery bicycle, routing computer in hand.

Just how quickly you adjust to this quiet new reality becomes apparent

when the island's only ambulance roars by, looking and sounding like a visitor from another planet.

Of course, enjoying the auto-free atmosphere isn't why tourists descend on Mackinac Island. There is also the fudge, and the familiar sight of tourists sucking down great slabs of the stuff has led to "fudgies," the local derogatory term for tourists.

There is historic Fort Mackinac, founded by the British in 1780 and fought over during the War of 1812, and the 8.2-mile bicycle path that circumnavigates the island. There are the turn-of-the-century Queen Anne "cottages" of Hubbard's Annex, built and owned by families like the Chicago meat-packing Cudahys.

There is the Governor's Summer House, a 1901 Gothic Revival masterpiece overlooking the harbor, and the warehouse of The American Fur Company, first owned by John Jay Astor, who made his fortune supplying beaver pelts to London hatters. This is a tourist town after all, so there is a mall's worth of tacky-tacky souvenir stores along State Street, and a mile-long boardwalk along Lake Huron.

But mostly there is The Grand Hotel, a 324-room white-pine behemoth built by railroad barons in 1887 to attract the Midwest's wealthiest vacationers. Painted white and surrounded by hundreds of acres of manicured grounds, The Grand Hotel is a pristine, classical jewel, one of the few 19th-century wooden resort hotels that fire hasn't consumed.

And the grandest feature of The Grand Hotel is its porch: 600 feet of verandah lined with 48 Tuscan columns rising 3 stories, and lots of comfy chairs.

Imagine sitting on this verandah then, comfortably tired after a day biking around the island, sipping ice tea, breathing pure air and admiring the view across Mackinac Narrows. Visible as distant dots are the cars, trucks and buses hurtling along the suspension bridge at breakneck speed; but you are here, enjoying a peace broken only by the whirl of bicycles and the clip-clop of horse's hooves.

Only in this setting can you truly ask the question: What is the true cost of America's obsession with the automobile?

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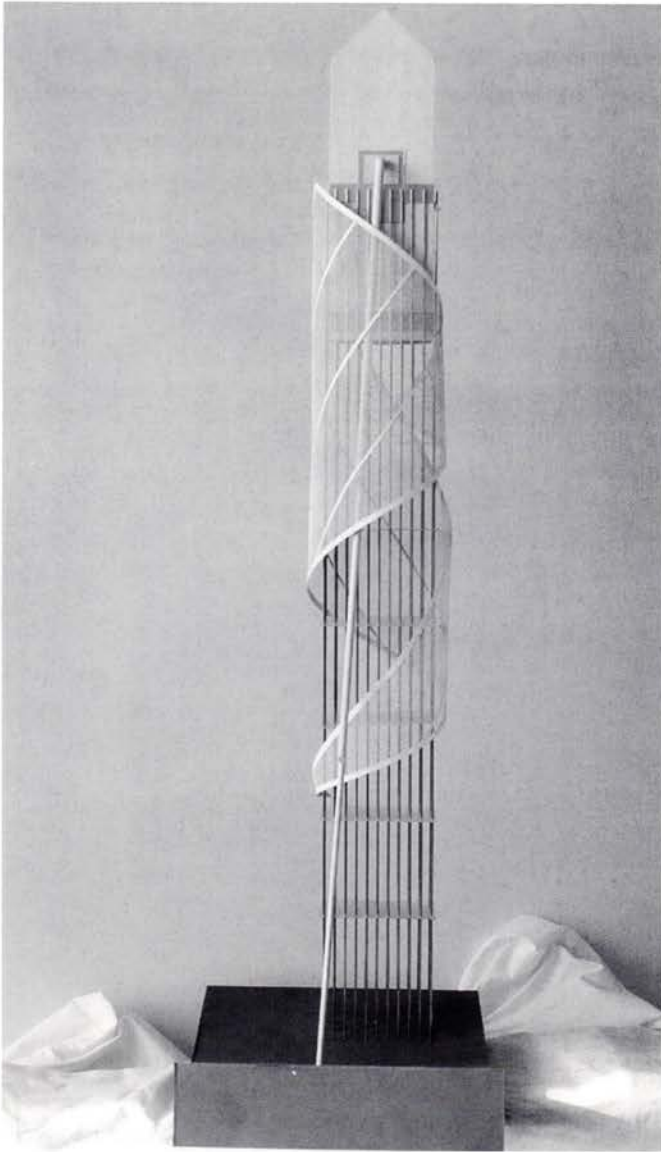
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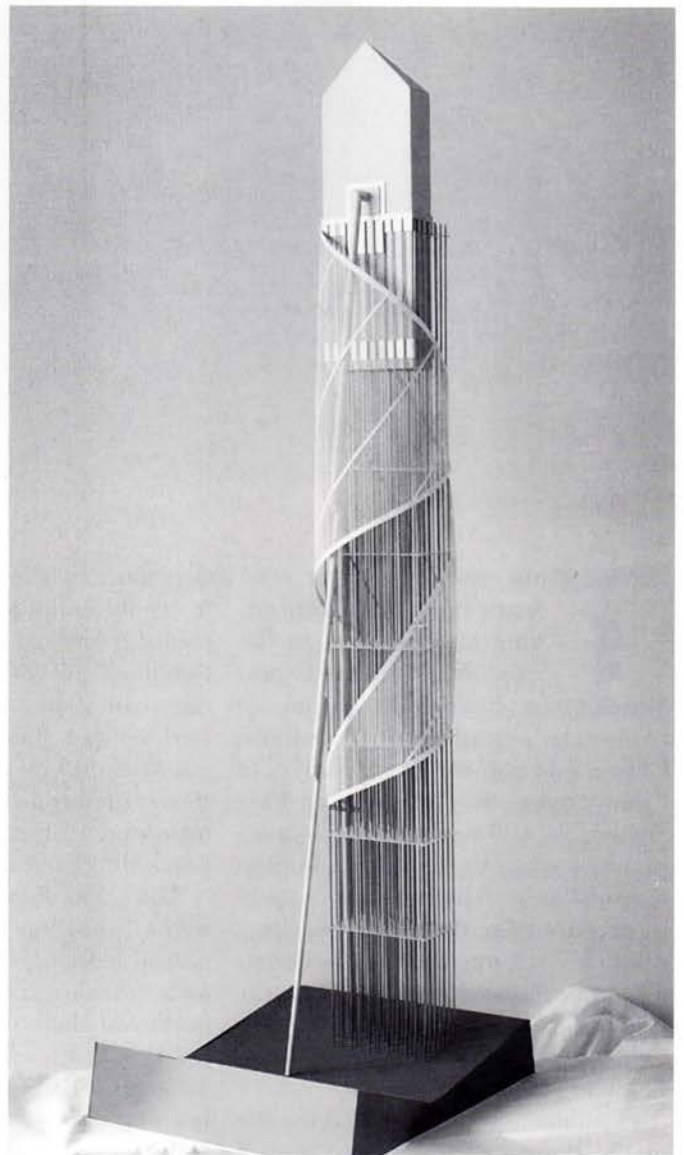
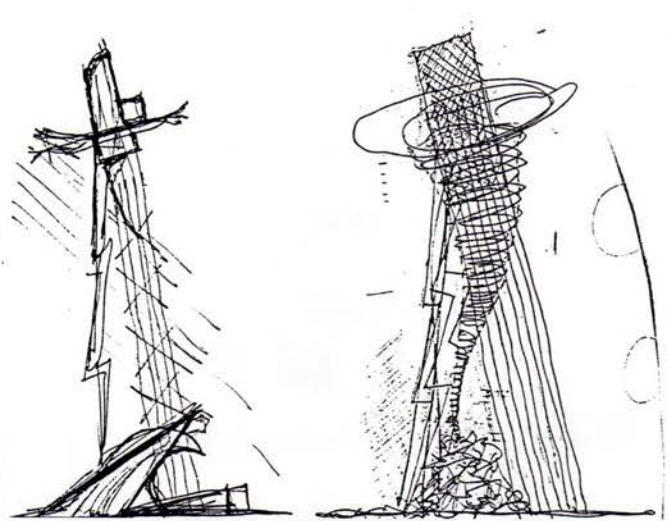
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Watertower
Tad Gloeckler, Architect

Located adjacent to a lake, this watertower employs metaphor while serving a quite utilitarian function. The tower, standing peacefully beside the lake as a beacon to those enjoying the water, tells the story of a sailing vessel lost in the swirling rains, winds and lightning of a tornado. The wooden water-storage unit at the top resembles a boat, while the ship's sail, made of perforated metal, twists along the stem of the tower to symbolize a tornado. Steel structural-support tubes represent the driving rain, and the broken mast doubles as a lightning bolt. The entire tower sits on a wavelike metal base.





The Pond Brothers Cabin, 1834-1836

This cabin, the first residence built by European-American settlers in the lakes area of what is now Minneapolis, belonged to a pair of zealously evangelistic brothers, Gideon and Samuel Pond. Natives of Connecticut, they traveled to Fort Snelling in 1834 in search of opportunities to convert the Dakota Indians to Christianity. The Ponds were poorly prepared for their task—lacking religious ordination, experience as missionaries and knowledge of the Dakota language—but Chief Cloudman at the Indian village by Lake Calhoun welcomed them.

Cloudman, in fact, selected the site of the Pond's cabin: a spot atop a glacial moraine on Lake Calhoun's

east shore, where the two missionaries could enjoy a view of the lake's plentiful loons. Using poles from the tamarack groves on the lake's west edge, tree bark, split logs and recycled wooden slabs from an old government mill at the Falls of St. Anthony, the brothers built a cabin that measured 12 feet by 16 feet, with 8-foot ceilings and a cellar.

The cabin did not last long as their home. Soon an ordained minister named Jedediah D. Stevens set up his own missionary activities at the northwest shore of Lake Harriet, and the Ponds abandoned their home in 1836 in order to help Stevens with his work. Later that year, when the Dakotas fell into a series of battles against the neighboring Ojibwes,

Cloudman's people dismantled the cabin to use its materials to fortify their village.

The site subsequently was home to a diverse series of buildings. In 1877, land developer William S. King built the Lake Calhoun Pavilion, a large hotel later known as the Lyndale. After a fire destroyed this structure in 1888, the next building to occupy the site was the Forman Mansion, a classic revival house built around 1900. The Forman Mansion lent its southern-plantation looks to the land until its demolition in 1955. Finally, in 1957, the congregation of Saint Mary's Greek Orthodox church raised a new church on the site, a building designed by Thorshov and Cerny that still stands.
