



Measure for measure

We are compelled to measure everything. We are driven ever forward, instructed to craft measurable goals so that we may mark progress. Mostly we measure our lives in dollars. If something can't be conveniently expressed in bottom-line bucks, it loses value.

This pervasive value system hit home last October when I read an article in *Atlantic Monthly* titled, "If the GDP is Up, Why is America Down?" Authors Clifford Cobb, Ted Halstead and Jonathon Rowe took on the baseline measurement device of global economics—the Gross Domestic Product (GDP)—and asked troubling questions. They defined the GDP as a tally of how much money changes hands in any economy.

Insidiously simple. But this universal measuring convention counts as progress all the money we spend on things we wish we didn't have to buy, like pollution cleanups, divorce, dieting, security systems, lawyers and prisons. It came as no wonder when they noted that sales of the wonder drug Prozac add more than \$1 billion a year to the GDP. Onward and upward! The authors went on to describe the more perverse effects of this measuring system:

"Something similar happens with the natural habitat. The more the nation depletes its natural resources, the more the GDP increases. This violates basic accounting principles, in that it portrays depletion of capital as current income....When the United States fishes its cod populations down to remnants, this appears on the national books as an economic boom—until the fisheries collapse.

As the former World Bank economist Herbert Daly puts it, the current national accounting system treats the earth as a business in liquidation."

The article gave ugly form to that unformed uneasiness looming just out of sight over my horizon—the feeling that the world is going to hell in a hand basket. The bottom line

is that our national system of measuring progress values only the bottom line, while taking no notice of the natural environment, the social aspects of community or the aesthetic quality of the built environment. This should have us all shaking in our boots, but we are all so anaesthetized by the mumbo-jumbo of global economics that nobody seems to care.

An-aesthetic. No feeling. Senseless. Which leads me to beauty. What does a beautiful building or place do for people? It attracts them to somewhere they might not have gone. It comforts, making the time spent inside pleasant and enjoyable. It shelters from the unwanted and admits the wanted. It defines a particular order and spirit that cannot exist anywhere else in the cosmos. Yet we have devised no accepted way to measure its value, save individual personal certainty.

It's no wonder that architects have a hard time selling the notion that a building has an obligation to community, that a beautiful environment is a good thing, that our historic buildings should be preserved, even when they are not obviously historic superstars. The current lack of angst over clearing a city block for the new Target store on Nicollet Mall drives home the bottom-line notion that perfectly sound, nicely scaled background buildings are essentially worthless.

Beauty has become unfashionable. Some would argue that the arts establishment has evolved into an arbiter of the arcane, and that the general public has reacted predictably by preferring a velvet Elvis to anything labeled "art with a capital A." Bauhaus-baiter Tom Wolfe once painted the rarefied intellectual trajectory of big-A art as, "disappearing up its own fundamental aperture," a bottom line of a different sort.

Minnesota architects are licensed to safeguard life, health and property, and to promote the public welfare. Most professional regulatory boards and even the AIA have leaned toward the easily measurable in their regulation activities. Their definitions of health, safety and welfare are heavy on the nuts-and-bolts of building technology and codes, and skeptical of the merely aesthetic. The continuing quest for a more beautiful world apparently fails to measure up. In the Carnegie Foundation report "Building Community," Ernest Boyer and Lee Mitgang lament the recent devaluation of beauty in our society, but also quote a 1954 U.S. Supreme Court ruling which stated:

"The concept of public welfare is broad and inclusive....The values it represents are spiritual as well as physical, aesthetic as well as monetary. It is within the power of the legislature to determine that the community should be beautiful as well as healthy, spacious as well as clean, well-balanced as well as carefully patrolled...."

We need to design new systems of measurement, balancing beauty and the bucks. That should be our new bottom line.

In world in which money is the bottom line, how do we measure beauty?

WHEN IT CAME TO RENOVATING THIS HISTORIC COURTHOUSE, EVEN THE

In 1964, The Parker County Courthouse in Weatherford, Texas was designated a Texas Historic Landmark. And thus began the slow, methodical process of restoring it. First to receive attention was the structure's limestone stonework. Later, the roof was replaced. Then came the windows, which proved to be one of the most challenging aspects of the project.

The Historical Survey Committee mandates that if nothing remains of a historic

building's original windows, the new ones must be faithful reproductions, right down to the last detail. Since the courthouse's original wood windows had been replaced by aluminum


ones some years back, that meant that all 105 of the new windows had to be virtually identical to those made and installed over a century ago.

Bids were sought, but only two manufacturers felt qualified to respond. One of them, Marvin Windows & Doors, had actually been recommended by a company that was asked to bid but declined.

Though underbid by the other finalist, Marvin's figures were based on building the largest windows with structural muntin bars to withstand the winds that buffeted the building's hilltop site. Intrigued, the architect asked each company to build a sample window. One look at the prototypes and the job was immediately awarded to Marvin.

For the next several weeks, Marvin's architectural department busied itself recreating the past. Working from turn-of-the-century photographs



owntown Minneapolis will have two new educational buildings with the opening of a K-12 magnet school, for nine Minneapolis-area school districts, and Opus Hall, for the University of St. Thomas School of Education, by September 1998. The cooperative project, to be constructed on the south half of the block bounded by LaSalle and Hennepin avenues and 10th and Ninth streets, will be directly

across the street from St. Thomas's existing neo-Gothic downtown campus. An underground, 640-stall parking garage and skyway lobby will connect the two buildings, enabling St. Thomas faculty and students to participate in programs, practice teaching, and conduct research and assessment with the K-12 school. Opus Hall for St. Thomas is designed by Opus Architects & Engineers, and the K-12 School is designed by Cuningham Group. Opus is also doing the underground ramp.





huck Enestvedt considers himself a sort of modernday Herb Philbrick—albeit with a post-Cold War difference. Philbrick was the main character in a popular television docu-drama of the 1950s called "I Led Three Lives," in which he juggled his identities as average citizen, Communist spy and counterspy for the FBI. Enestvedt's responsibilities as a family man and as Charles R. Enestvedt the ar-

disaster-recovery centers, assisting families whose homes have been damaged or destroyed by a force of nature. After a homeowner applies to FEMA, an inspection is conducted by an employee such as Enestvedt, who lists repairs on a menu that includes more than 800 line items.

"Our criteria are that a home be safe, sanitary and secure, and we provide assistance to ensure that essential living spaces in the home meet those criteria," Enestvedt says. "We don't replace Aunt Emma's antiques. Our main goal is to provide grant money for repairs to help minimize the time that individuals or families are displaced from their homes."

The owners of a house that was submerged and battered during a flood, for example, may need grant money to replace all electrical devices, to remove and replace carpet and Sheetrock™, and to repair siding where holes have been punched into walls. Housing grants of up to \$10,000 provided through FEMA, together with Small Business Association disaster home loans or state-administered personalproperty grants, are often enough for a family to recover their home. Enestvedt says. When structures are termed "not repairable" or are literally destroyed, families are given grants to cover rental housing for 30 to 90 days, and they may reapply

when the term is up. Mortgage and rental assistance also may go to individuals who have lost their income or employment, cannot afford to pay rent or mortgage, and are facing eviction or foreclosure as a result.

In addition to Human Services, FEMA's disaster assistance includes Infrastructure Support and Mitigation. Infrastructure Support helps municipalities repair public buildings, roadways and structures; remove debris; and receive grants for long-term improvement projects. Mitigation varies from elevating heating and air-conditioning units to avoid future flood damage, to relocating an entire community out of a floodplain area.

In his six years since joining FEMA, Enestvedt has assessed sites in the paths of floods and tornadoes throughout Minnesota, Wisconsin, Michigan, Illinois, Indiana and Ohio-collectively known as Region V (FEMA is divided into 10 regions). When not tied up in their own region, reservists often are called upon to help out elsewhere. Enestvedt was working on flooddisaster relief in Ohio when Hurricane Andrew hit Florida in 1992. He was still inspecting houses in the path of the great midwestern floods of 1993 when earthquakes shook Northridge, Calif., in 1994. In 1995, however, Enestvedt shipped out to California to help with houses affected by mud slides.

When he first arrives at a federally declared disaster area, Enestvedt says, "the magnitude of the damage really puts you in your place. And seeing people's livelihood destroyed takes its toll on you. But I love this work, because I'm always impressed with and refreshed by the resilience of the people. You see such destruction and people bounce back. I'm in awe of that."

chitect (specializing in private residences), are hardly covert or inflammatory. But neither is his third life—although it does involve working for the federal government.

Since 1991, Enestvedt has been a reservist for the Human Services division of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The program, created in 1979, coordinates federal, state and local efforts when a federal disaster is declared—at the urging of a state government—by the President of the United States. Human Services, one of three types of disaster assistance provided by FEMA, helps people recover through various means. The division coordinates such emergency needs as food, shelter, transportation and medical care: loans for business and home; grants for families; consumer, legal and elderly services; crisis

counseling; and assistance with tax, veterans, unemployment and social-security benefits.

Housing is also a major part of Human Services. Enestvedt has worked in this area as a housing inspector and manager of





Built to deteriorate

Improved health care is enabling people to live well into their 80s and beyond, yet with our sophisticated construction industry, the average house is barely making it to middle age without needing a major overhaul

his book How Buildings Learn, Stewart Brand writes. "Every building is potentially immortal, but very few last the life of a human.'

Without getting into the root causes of why buildings and houses are not built or maintained to last at least the life of a human, let's skip directly to the question of what happens when they don't. Begin by imagining what we're left with when a house dies. Imagine the pile of rubble generated by the demolition of one singlefamily home. Assuming personal furnishings and artifacts have been removed. we're left with...what? Wood, plaster, drywall, metals, masonry, insulating materials. In other words, all the ingredients of home construction end up in the destruction pile, too.

Now multiply that pile by up to 150,000, which is the number of dwelling units demolished in this country every year. Do you ever wonder where all the rubble goes? And why there is so much of it?

"Do we have a history in this country of building houses that our families will live in for 300 years? No," says Peter Yost, project manager at Home Builders (NAHB) Re-

Whatever drives our culture to its have-it-all-now. worry-about-it-all-later attitude is a fascinating topic, but while we talk the rubbish is piling up. And it's not just piling up in the form of demolished houses; the building of new homes, and the remodeling of existing homes, creates trash in volumes that are simply staggering. According to NAHB Research Center statistics, new-home construction generates three to four pounds of waste per square foot (and at least one study has estimated that number closer to seven pounds per square foot). Remodeling waste is generated in even larger amounts because of the destruction that generally accompanies a remodel and in 1995 alone, homeowners spent \$115 billion on remodeling projects.

Fact is, most elements of the modern American home are not built to last, and even when they are, Americans get sick of them, rip them out and put in something new. Fact is, the resulting waste stream is more accurately a torrent.

"We don't tion, we need to dispose of build with the long view, we that waste properly," says Cathy Latham, a pollutioncontrol specialist with the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency. She points to elements like fluorescent tubes, mercury-containing switches and treated wood as just a few of the elements of construction waste that need to be separated from the pile. "Unfortunately, most builders use one roll-off container for all the trash," she says.

Some of that trash can be deadly if not disposed of properly. Take the case of the St. Cloud, Minn., farmer who found 22 of his cows mysteriously dead in the field. Baffled investigators ultimately traced the deaths to the presence of fireplace ash in the field. The farmer, it turns out. was a part-time construction worker, and he regularly brought home loads of scrap lumber from residential construction sites for burning in his fireplace. He dumped the ash in the field where the cows grazed. What the farmer didn't know was that CCAtreated wood—wood treated with an inorganic preservative called chromated copper arsenate and used commonly in residential building projects—is potentially hazardous if burned: the copper and chromium (toxic-heavy metals) become concentrated in the ash, while the arsenic vaporizes into the air. When



built great monuments and burials tombs to carry them into eternity. But as stated by Peter Yost, project manager at the National Association of Home Builders (NAHB) Research Cen-

ter, "We don't build with the long view, we don't plan to pass on houses to our children here. Maybe that's why we have this extraordinary number of houses destroyed each year" (Insight, page 21).

In this annual housing issue, we look at a range of housing styles and building techniques. In "Timber!" (page 44) we review the age-old craft of timber-frame construction, which is regaining popularity as an expressive art form. "Timber framing is a very honest way to build, and it is very celebratory of wood," says timber framer Phil Bjork. "The super structure, which is totally exposed on the inside, is pleasing to the eye."

Not only is timber framing aesthetically pleasing, but it can be an environmentally sound way to build. True, fresh trees often are destroyed, but timber also is gathered from the forest floor or recycled from old warehouses. When properly maintained, timber-frame houses will stand for centuries. That's harnessing the most from limited natural resources.

In "Straw Stories" (page 42), we look at an unusual construction method for Minnesota: straw-bale insulated houses. Long popular on the treeless Great Plains, straw-bale construction is somewhat untried in Minnesota because of the state's harsh climate. Nasty weather aside, Laura Corbin and Ken Geisen recently completed the first code-approved, straw-bale insulated house in Minnesota. Straw is a crop residue that often is burned, causing pollution; but when stacked as bales into walls, this waste product insulates against heat, cold and noise.

Whatever the building material, houses are still subject to the whims of nature. That brings us to Charles Enestvedt, who comes to the rescue with the assistance of FEMA when storms and natural disasters lash at the homestead (Up Close, page 17). Enestvedt recalls recently touring a tornado-disaster site and being amazed at the construction quality of an old farmhouse, which had been tossed upside down. "The house had stayed in one piece, like a rubic's cube rolled down a hill," Enestvedt says. "There was an obvious reason why the tornado picked it up—there were no anchor bolts on one end of the building [holding it to the foundation]. With complete structural integrity, that house may have made it. But it was still a reminder that when you build things right, they endure."


Although certainly built right, the Philip Pillsbury house (page 46) didn't endure.

Razed this winter to make way for a new owner's updated home, the Pillsbury house was a landmark of Minnesota residential design from the early 1960s. Ralph Rapson's most renowned house won national and local architectural awards, but its modernist aesthetic did not convert to a late-1990s sensibility. This was a singular, client-specific architectural expression, and the Pillsbury heirs' search for a new owner who expressed similar design tastes proved fruitless.

A mere 35 years after its completion, the Pillsbury house is gone, preserved in memory and photos only. We can only hope that the new houses featured in this issue will last longer.

Modernist Challenger



rchitecture has the power to surprise, and certainly the Type/Variant House by Vincent James Associates of Minneapolis has proved a surprising addition to the North Woods of the Upper Midwest. In fact, this copper-clad house already has raised an eyebrow or two. Passersby and weekend vacationers find the copper façade of the boxlike forms so curious that they can't help but stop and gawk. Because the house is hidden at the end of a narrow private driveway deep into a heavily wooded lot, the curious must go to great lengths to peek. A next-door neighbor reports that motorists will sneak onto their property to catch a closer look. Boaters on the adjacent lake will drop anchor in front of the property to snatch an eye full.

People find the house curious and intriguing because it looks like nothing ever-before seen in these parts. The North Woods prides itself on rustic-style architecture, a place where such local architects of mythic status as Edwin Lundie borrowed from the Scandinavian vernacular to design beautifully detailed lodges and cabins carved from heavy timber in the mid-20th century. The North Woods also boasts of its rustic "parkitecture," sturdy timber-and-stone structures built by the Civilian Conservation Corps during the Great Depression.

Architects both great and small have attempted to remain faithful to the North Woods' rustic architectural tradition, sometimes to the embarrassment of the region's authentic In seeming contrast to


character. A nearby restaurant, decked out with antler-style light fixtures and carved bears, seems a parody of North Woods architecture, although tourists apparently like it if the packed dining hall is any indication.


Vincent James's modernist house, an assemblage of rectilinear volumes and towers clad in copper panels, seems incongruous with this rugged landscape. The owners, with five young-adult children, wanted a vacation house to accommodate large family gatherings. While the owners say that they remained open minded about the house's design direction, they nonetheless were resolute about what the house should express. "From the beginning, we were clear that we wanted a house that reflected the times in which it was designed and built," they state. "We had no interest in participating in the design of a house that looked backward rather than ahead. As alluring as the past may occasionally appear, we realized that time moves forward only, and

that to build a house in the mid-1990s that tried to recapture the spirit of a bygone era would be incongruous."

Bypassing the warm fuzzies of traditional rustic architecture, James scanned other sources for inspiration.

"We looked to industrial structures because there is a clear, straightforward quality to their construction; in such structures as granaries, truss bridges and iron-ore docks there also is a







clear relationship between their use and their form," James says. Following the straight-forward precedent of these industrial structures, James designed the house as a collection of orthogonally placed, boxlike volumes. The "Type," according to James, is the clearly defined volumes, and the "Variant" is the placement of the volumes and the different perspectives each offers from within.

The architect arranged the 8,000-square-foot house on a 4.7-acre wooded lot to readily reveal interior spaces and functions. An open floor plan within the house's primary volume places the dining and living room along one half of the first floor facing a lake to the east, with the kitchen placed on the other side. The first-floor master bedroom, perpendicular to the main floor as it reaches toward the lake from the house's northeast corner, offers southern and eastern perspectives of lake and woods. Four bedrooms with separate baths are on the second floor of the primary volume, and a studio with rooftop deck occupies the third floor. A separate 24-foot-high guest tower stands just to the south, and another 35-foot-high guest

tower forms the terminus of an attached garage at the south-west corner.

As with the main house, the towers' interiors readily reveal their function: A small, open lounge on the first level of each leads, up a ladder, to a sleeping loft. The two towers face opposite directions, with the shorter of the two facing the woods and the taller looking toward the clearing above the inland lake.

James chose such materials as Douglas fir for the interior because of its traditional connection with rural architecture, and he applied the wood in such a way to create "tubular" spaces that steer your perspective toward windows. For example, the second-floor hallway, which runs the entire length of the second floor, is a single tubular corridor in which floor, ceiling and walls are sheathed in Douglas fir. Because the wood is applied in such a straightforward manner with no variation in material to distract your view, the hall naturally pulls your vision toward a window at either end of the hall.

The owners note that the extensive use of wood is the house's unifying element. "There are dramatic visual changes,

both of the interior and exterior, as one moves through the house," they explain. "But the unity of the material creates a cohesive whole. Douglas fir glows in the natural and artificial light. It creates a warm and welcoming environment."

By far the house's best interior space is the open, first-floor living and dining room, because here James employs a rich contrast of materials and textures in a bluestone floor, light-toned fir walls, slate fire-place, large windows and rhythmic march of beams across the ceiling. The first floor is not only more visually appealing than the upper floors, which are sheathed

consistently in Douglas fir, but it's also more tactilely compelling. That fireplace, the house's linchpin, is so dark against the light walls that it draws us near; we need to touch it to discern its material—horizontally stacked strips of slate forming a four-inch-thick veneer. The floor, too, has a tactile quality: we can feel its rough-surface texture drag against the soles of our shoes.

Outside, the house's exterior copper coat will change over time. It's an "ideal exterior material because it appears organ-


ic," the owners explain. "Rain, snow and airborne impurities all leave their marks on the surface. The copper is a reminder of how ephemeral things are."

The copper panels will turn as brown as tree trunks before assuming a familiar green patina. In time, passersby may find the house less of a curiosity, as well. Time and age will weather the house a bit, lending it character and familiarity as it slowly becomes a part of the North Woods.

RIVER LIGHT

Demure and unassuming, this cottage-size house puts its best face forward

There's a look to a Kelly Davis-designed house: Prairie-style detailing often marked by low-slung massing, minimal but effective use of materials, and attention to natural light and exterior views. One of Kelly Davis's latest houses is the Strom residence, a petite 1,600-square-foot stone and wood-trimmed structure overlooking the St. Croix River.

Built on the footprint of the family's former weekend cabin, this new year-round house had some pretty tight restrictions to overcome; the house couldn't extend toward the river beyond the original footprint or extend laterally, and roof heights could not exceed neighboring roof heights.

The site also is some 100 feet below a stone bluff.

With a stone bluff blocking the sun and limiting natural views on the house's west side, natural light was a chief design consideration. To bring in light, Davis opened the house on the east side that faces the river by adding expansive windows, and created a sloping ceiling lined with clerestories that are angled skyward on the house's bluff-facing, west side. The living, dining and kitchen areas—anchored on opposite sides by two fireplaces—are essentially a single, open space, defined by such built-in pieces as the living-room sofa, buffet in the dining area and high counters encircling the kitchen.


From the river perspective, the house is unobtrusive: a stone and wood façade, and cedar-shake roof are comfortably at home on the wooded, river-front lot.



Most of Davis's houses are quite small and modest, nothing over-scaled or overbearing—and that's one of their charms. As with the Strom house, quality materials and a strong sense of scale and spatial proportions go a long way.

ne of the charms of living in our contemporary, computer-age world is that our professional offices are not restricted to particular locations. More and more people are setting up home offices, linked to their clients and associates via faxes and the Internet. With a house in Excelsior, an office in downtown Minneapolis, and clients scattered throughout the country, graphic designer Brent Marmo realized there was no reason to commute everyday when he could stay home and get the job done.

One problem: his house was hardly suited for a home office. And while most people will opt for converting a spare bedroom or back porch into a work station, Marmo enlisted architect and across-the-street neighbor Mark Nesset to design a separate graphic-design studio and office in back of the main house. The resulting studio




stands in striking contrast to the original shingle-style house, an 1880s frame structure with a 1980s addition that more than doubles the size of its predecessor.

Nesset designed the studio, as well as an adjoining garage and screened porch, as "a collection of forms, pieces of sculpture in the backyard," he says. The screened porch, modeled on a traditional rural chicken coop, leads to the cube-shaped, 2-story studio, which then leads to the A-frame garage. To get around zoning restrictions, Nesset linked the studio and screened porch to the main house via breezeways, so that the backyard addition would offically qualify as a duplex.

Of course, is the studio, its pristine cubic form The architect conceived of this residential addition as a collection of distinctive architectural forms, from the blue-stucco, cube-shaped home studio (opposite), to the rural-inspired, screened porch (above left), and the Aframe garage (above).



The interior of the graphic-design studio is distinctively homelike, with a kitchen to the left of the stairs (right) and conference room to the right of the stairs, and a fireplace anchoring the reception lounge (below). The working studio is on the second level (opposite), which includes built-in work stations and bookcases. The screened porch and studio connect with the main house (plan below), while the garage is separate.



sheathed in watery-blue stucco with white trim around the square windows.

Marmo says he made no attempt to relate the studio to the house; it was to be a separate visual element. "I wanted

a box, a pure cube to work in," he says. If graphic design employs many images and elements to create a whole, then the box provides a simple and pure setting in which to create new images.

Throughout the studio, Nesset and Marmo chose "simple forms and strong materials." An open staircase at the center of the cube connects a lower-level storage area, the first-floor conference and client-reception area, and the second-floor work studio. The first floor has a pleasingly residential feel, and is a comfortably uncluttered space in which to receive clients and hold conferences. Materials are of the no-fuss variety, applied with a modernist's eve for making the most out of the minimum. The brushed, stainless-steel fireplace is the first floor's visual focus, which contrasts with the pine plywood cabinetry. A fullservice kitchenette off to one side and a Murphy bed hidden in a full-wall cabinet allow the studio to double as a guest house. Upstairs, the second-floor work studio, with built-in work stations and cabinets receive daylight through large windows and a skylight.

Modernism's the Modernism the Modern

David Salmela's northern Minnesota house follows the principles of modernism—but with a classical sensibility

t's no secret that modern architecture, so beloved within the architectural profession, left the American public cold. Harsh lines, abstract forms and chilly materials alienated a public weaned on the human scale and highly textured materials of classical architecture.

It is only now, as modernism matures, that American architects are developing an aesthetic that, while true to the rigorous modernist focus with space, function and structure, also captures the public imagination. This



"modernism with a human touch" ironically finds inspiration in modernism's classical roots.

Modernism and classicism are not as diametrically opposed as they might seem. Alvar Aalto, Frank Lloyd Wright, Mies van der Rohe, Walter Gropius, Eliel Saarinen and other modern pioneers were steeped in classicism's design principles while students and apprentices. Later they consciously rebelled against what they denounced as classicism's atrophied formal language, but their work is marked with the classical qualities of balance, restraint, moderation, self-control and clarity.





An example of this classical modernism in Minnesota is the Emerson residence, a 3,500-square-foot house on Cook Lake outside Duluth, designed by Duluth architect David Salmela for the Peter and Cindy Emerson family.

There is no questioning the Emerson residence's modernist pedigree. Its long, low, horizontal proportions draw direct inspiration from the work of Danish architect Arne Jacobsen. But more important than specific precedents, the Emerson residence feels modern.

Foremost is the house's free-flowing space. The entry, living room, kitchen and eating area flow into each other with minimal interruption or definition. Even more powerful is the flow of interior space to the outside. The house is nestled in a grove of ancient white pine, whose totemic trunks feel as integrated into the house's design as its windows and doors.

The single quality that most marks modernist architecture is its airy openness. ern masterpieces as Louis Sullivan's Wainwright Building in St. Louis (1890) was stretched to extremes by less talented followers. The curtain wall and the glass cube, the enduring images of modern architecture, often result in cool and alienating buildings. Who wants to live in a glass cube?

The Emerson residence is no glass cube. Salmela achieves modernism's light and airy ideal without cliched walls of glass. Instead, he reaches back to the classical ideal of balance. Light pours into the living space through a row of dormers, and a bank of French doors opens an otherwise solid wall toward Cook Lake.





The bright and airy kitchen (top right) leads to a barrel-vaulted, skylit breakfast nook (top). The kitchen overlooks the main living space (above).

A row of massive wooden trusses, each painted white, bears on this wall, but is so washed by light as to appear almost weightless. The space, while airy and open, is also enclosed enough to be cozy during a January blizzard. Classical balance gives the space a comforting quality.

Another modernist mark is Salmela's minimal material choices. Salmela uses the same green slate on the floor for countertops in the kitchen and on bathroom vanities. Windows, walls, doors and ceilings are white-painted wood. Natural-colored wood is used only for the occasional accent. Materials, in general, are subservient to the space.


Yet the material choices also speak of a classical rather than modernist approach, in which materials of classical architecture are detailed to allow for the ravages of time. The living-room ceiling, for instance, is covered with whitepainted boards. The modernist architect, striving to make these boards geometrically perfect, would specify kiln-



dried, tongue-and-groove boards and nail them rigidly into place before painting. Salmela, in contrast, specified lumber that was still green. As the boards dry, they crack and check, creating a startling spiderwork of lines on an otherwise all-white ceiling. Instead of mechanical perfection, the ceiling has the character that can grow only from imperfection.


Multiply this approach by the hundreds of little material decisions that compose even a single-family residence, and you get a feel for how a classical handling of materials brings character and warmth to an otherwise modernist design. The Emerson residence is modernism with a human touch.

Straw-bale houses
are proving a
sustainable and
affordable alternative
to traditional house
construction

n a bright, crisp day last October, the North Branch construction site of Minnesota's first code-approved, straw-

bale house was anything but chilly. Having weathered the inevitable round of three-little-pig jokes, owners Laura Corbin and Ken Geisen were warm, and the degree of conviviality was high as friends and relatives pitched and stacked hundreds of 40-pound bales into the wall cavities of the house's wood frame. When completed, this post-and-beam, strawbale insulated, stucco-clad, 2-story home will not only be warm in winter and cool in summer, the house will be aesthetically inviting, as well.

"The bales create a wall that's completely different," Geisen says, "not perfectly straight, but an undulating, thick mass you can really feel—with thick window ledges and sills." Adds Corbin, "The walls just feel warm. I think it will be a wonderful house to live in, in terms of aesthetics and functionality."


For designer Jonathan Query, principal and partner of the Minneapolis firm IIIAD, working with straw bales "afforded a material, surface and textural quality that we can't achieve through the palette of materials normally available through standard-issue housing stock."

The idea of building with bales intrigued Query for its social aspect, as well.

"Construction sites are usually dominated by the professional trades and don't offer much opportunity for homeowners and nonskilled labor to get involved in the building process," Query says. "Straw bale, however, gives homeowners, family, friends and volunteers the chance to get involved. Installation of the bales, and the application of plaster inside and stucco outside are skills that can be learned in a very short period of time."

"It's neat to be able to do so much of the work yourself, and to have people help makes this house an even more special place to live," Corbin says. Her husband agrees, adding that "it's tremendously exciting to be part of the beginning of something. Because we're pioneering straw-bale construction in Minnesota, our house has created a lot of interest. Part of the appeal, I think, is that building with bales is such a low-tech construction method. Anyone at any skill level can come out and partake in it, and they certainly have."

As long as humans have constructed shelter, grass, reed and straw have been used in conjunction with a variety of building methods to provide safe, dependable, comfortable housing. On the treeless Great Plains, homesteaders began to build load-bearing, straw-bale houses after the invention of the steam-



powered baler in the 1890s, which compressed straw into string- or wire-tied rectangular blocks. Straw-bale buildings were especially prevalent in the Sandhills area of Nebraska. Here, bale construction was used for homes, farm buildings, churches, schools, offices and grocery stores.

In House of Straw: Straw Bale Construction Comes of Age (U.S. Department of Energy, 1995), Nebraska historian Roger Welsch offers this description of "Nebraska-style" or load-bearing bale construction: "The bales, about three to four feet long and one and one-half to two square feet, were stacked like bricks. one bale deep, with the joints staggered. About half [of the builders] used mortar between the bales: the others simply rested one bale directly on the other. Four to five wooden rods (in a few cases iron rods) were driven down through the bales to hold them firmly together. The roof plate and roof were also fastened to the top bales of the wall with rods or stakes. The most common roof configuration was some sort of hipped roof....Window and door frames were set as the walls rose around them....Walls were left to settle a few months before they were plastered and the windows installed."

The oldest existing bale building is the Burke homestead, constructed in 1903, outside Alliance, Neb. Although abandoned in 1956, the building continues to withstand wide temperature ranges, blizzards and tornadoes. The headquarters and bunk house at Fawn Lake Ranch near Hyannis, Neb., built between 1900

and 1914, are still in use. According to The Straw Bale House by Athena Steen, Bill Steen and David Bainbridge with David Eisenberg (Chelsea Green Publishing Company, 1994), the first non-load-bearing, straw-bale structure was built in 1936 in Huntsville, Ala.; a 2-story mansion with a post-and-beam support structure and straw-bale-insulated walls. In 1948, a general store was built in Glendo, Wyo., using bales mortared like bricks. After visiting that store, a couple from Douglas, Wyo., used the same method to build, in 1949, a house they still occupy.

Straw-bale construction was largely "dormant from 1952 to the early 1980s," writes Richard Hofmeister II. an apprentice of the Frank Lloyd Wright School of Architecture, in his 1994 paper "Plastered Straw-bale Construction: A Renewable Resource for Energy-efficient. Self-help Housing." He writes, "During this dormancy, a chapel was built in Alberta, Canada (1960) and became the second straw-bale church in the world." With the growth of the environmental movement, however, came increased public curiosity about how to incorporate more energy-efficient, nontoxic, less-expensive and "natural" materials in daily life—including in home building.

Straw, it became known, is frequently burned as "crop residue," producing smoke documented as a cause of pollution, Hofmeister writes. When stacked as bales into walls, however, this waste product insulates against heat, cold and sound. Straw bales cause minimal environmental impact on a construction site, except for vehicular access and the occasional need for dry storage, Hofmeister writes. "If viewed in perspective of the life-cycle criteria listed in the AIA's *Environmental Resource Guide*," he adds, "straw-bale construction bypasses much of the 'cradle-to-grave' energy and waste inherent in industrial materials."

Bale building began in earnest with the publication of Welsch's article "Baled Hay" in the book *Shelter* (1974), according to Steen. In 1982, California architect Jon Hammond built a straw-bale, postand-beam cottage that was featured in the magazine *Fine Homebuilding*. That article, in turn, inspired Steve and Nena MacDonald to build their Nebraska-style straw-bale home in Gila, N.M., Hofmeister writes.

In 1989, visitors to the MacDonald's home included Matts Myhrman and Judy Knox of Tuscon, Ariz. Subsequently, the couple began researching and experimenting with straw-bale construction; they founded Out On Bale (un)Ltd., a resource for plastered, straw-bale construction; and they began conducting workshops on straw-bale construction and publishing the newsletter, *The Last Straw*. In 1991, the first permitted, insured, bank-financed straw-bale house was built in Tesuque, N.M. Ten experimental permits for non-load-bearing straw-bale structures followed.

Today, building codes in Arizona and New Mexico accommodate straw-bale construction, with California in the

Reviving a classic craft, timber framing is regaining popularity in residential design

It seems true, as they say, that everything old becomes new again. And in architecture, there's no better example than the recent return to favor of the timber-frame structure. Indeed, discussion of this ancient building style has of late filled house-design magazines, television programs and newspapers. Even though it's been around for thousands of years, timber framing, it seems, is all the rage again.

So why the rekindled interest in these labor-intensive, highly crafted structures? The answer seems as closely tied to our current explorations of culture, spirituality and sense of place as to the pragmatic considerations of sustainability and durability of construction.

"Timber framing is a very honest way to build, and it is very celebratory of wood," says timber framer Phil Bjork, who has completed more than 100 frames in the past 15 years through his company Great Northern Woodworks in Cambridge, Minn. "The super structure, which is totally exposed on the inside, is pleasing to the eye-and we do, after all, live on the inside of our homes."

Architect Katherine Cartrette. a partner based in the new Stillwater office of Mulfinger, Susanka, Mahady & Partners, elaborates on Bjork's views as to why

> more and more people are turning to timberframe houses as an alternative to traditional stick-built homes. "We are maturing as a

country and, I think, we're less afraid of the European traditions that we once rebelled against so strongly-one of which was timber-frame housing," she says. Like Bjork, Cartrette believes people are drawn to the visible strength of the exposed timber frame. "Most of our building methods in this country hide what's happening inside the house," she says. "You look at a building today and you don't necessarily trust it; you can't see what's happening. A timber-frame structure is very ordered. Its structure, its strength and its security are totally revealed"

In Minnesota, our timberframe heritage is slight. While these point-loaded, rigid-frame networks of posts and beams have long been a building choice in the western and eastern parts of the country, the Scandinavian settlers of the Upper Midwest more often turned to log building-hence, the romance with log cabins common among Minnesotans. But as Cartrette says, "Many of my clients have started out insisting that they want a log cabin. Then, when they add that they'd also like lots of space and lots of windows-two things that are not really compatible with log building-I suggest they consider a timber-frame design."

For a recent client, Cartrette had an opportunity to bring both styles together. "While they had a really wonderful log cabin built in the 1920s." Cartrette says of the client, "they didn't just want to tack on a bigger log cabin when they decided to expand." Cartrette's solution was a timber-frame addition where the frame, built of round rather than planed and squared-off logs, is on the outside of the house. Visually, the resulting home, with its large overhangs and exposed timbers, has the same rustic quality of the existing cabin. Functionally, it allows for the space, the light and the conveniences the owners wanted.

When properly constructed and well-maintained, timberframe houses are known to stand for centuries. As a result, more and more architects and crafts people interested in issues of sustainability are looking at timber framing as an option. Timber frames use fewer trees than log buildings, and the timbers themselves can be hand-picked from the forest (rather than clear cut), or even recycled from old warehouse buildings.

"There is a phenomenal amount of timber out there," says Bjork, who estimates that a typical timber-frame home uses about 10,000 to 12,000 board feet of timber. "By reclaiming

timbers from old buildings, by using trees that are thinned from state forests by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR), or by choosing trees still standing that are already dead we can build these timber frames responsibly."

Still, the topic of environmental responsibility is always at hand when timber framers meet to discuss the craft. "Yes, timber frames require old-growth wood," Cartrette says, "and I think there is a keen awareness in the community of timber framers that they are dependent on an increasingly rare source when they build timber frames. But that awareness only strengthens the commitment to build something of value, something long-lasting."

A timber frame does not evolve quickly-and that's appealing to an architect like Cartrette, who designed her first timber-frame house more than 12 years ago. "The whole process is thoughtful and interactive," she says. "It's a highly collaborative way of working, both with the timber framer and the client. The clients tend to be very involved; perhaps, because they are building something that will outlast their grandchildren, they have a longer vision, and they tend to be more passionate about their houses."

es are generally designed and cut in the framer's shop. In Bjork's shop, for instance, the frames are designed and blueprinted, and the joinery is thoroughly documented before the workers begin cutting the joints with hand tools. While timber frame "kits" are becoming more available, Bjork and his framers actually construct every timber-frame home they design. "There is still a lot of fine-tuning to do on site," Bjork says, "and I'm not comfortable with the idea of turning the pieces over to someone else to assemble."

With the timbers cut and ready, the crew arrives on site with hundreds of pieces of wood. ready to assemble the frame. The frame is laid out and joined together on the ground and then, in the tradition of old-fashioned barn-raisings, the sections of the frame are lifted into place in a single day. One key difference from the old ways, of course, is today the framers use a crane.

"It's exciting and it's dangerous," acknowledges Bjork, "but seeing that completed frame standing alone, before the stress skin panels enclose it, is an incredible thing." Tradition calls for the framer to place a tree branch on top of the completed frame to pay homage to the forest-and, then, the celebration begins.

Stress skin panels made of The actual frames of the hous- rigid foam sandwiched between

two pieces of strand board have done much to reinvigorate the interest in timber framing. Hung from the frame and screwed into place from the outside, these panels create a skin so tight that fuel costs can be dramatically decreased. And, by using heat and steam methods to create the panels, stress-skin manufacturers have virtually eliminated the problem of outgassing, which troubled many in the industry. With the panels in place, exterior finishes of a timber-frame home can run the gamut from brick to wood siding. "You can't tell it's a timber frame until you're inside," Biork says.

While most timber frames today are designed not by architects but by the timber framers who build them, more architects are starting to look at timber framing with interest. "I think architects are always looking back to see which parts of our past culture should not be thrown away," says Dale Mulfinger, a partner in the Minneapolis office of Mulfinger, Susanka, Mahady & Partners. Mulfinger has designed single timber-frame rooms within larger projects. He believes architects are continually drawn to reexamine building styles. "We did it with earth-sheltered houses and geodesic domes before that and plywood-paneled homes before that," he says. "Now we're looking again at timber framing, freshened up and recycled through contemporary culture, and that's great. That's part of the nature of American architecture."

Biork sees a definite role for architects in the creation of timber-frame houses, and hopes the reemerging interest in the building style grows within the architectural community. "Architects are trained in line and proportion," he says, "but they are not really trained in super structures. They won't know how much tension a joint can take. They don't have a strong working knowledge of wood like a timber framer does. But, ideally, we can come together with our separate skills and create beautiful houses that will last for generations."





Midcentury memorial

alph Rapson long has been considered one of Minnesota's most important modernist architects. When he arrived to head the architecture program at the University of Minnesota in 1954, he more or less introduced the state and a generation of young architects to the guiding principles of modernism.

His influence is seen in his built work. in his beautifully rendered drawings and watercolors, and in the success of his many students over the years. Yet time is slowly chiseling away at the Rapson legacy. At 82, he has outlived two of his

most renowned projects from the early 1960s: The Guthrie Theater in Minneapolis and the Philip Pillsbury residence on Lake Minnetonka in Wayzata.

True, the Guthrie is still standing. but a 1992 remodeling drastically altered the original façade—which itself was altered some years earlier when deteriorating sun screens were removed. Unfortunately, Rapson was not hired to undertake the Guthrie's remodeling, and the reconceived façade and expanded lobby hardly can be considered signature Rapson.

The new owner's interest was in the highly valuable lakefront land; he thus demolished the house this winter to make way for a new residence.

function and site. The challenge for the Pillsbury heirs was to find a new owner who expressed similar needs and aesthetic sensibility. But finding that new owner was difficult.

While the Pillsbury house had many admirers, few could afford to buy it. And those who could afford the house did not necessarily have the aesthetic

The demise of the Pillsbury house illustrates a preservation problem facing many midcentury buildings, particularly such client-specific houses as the Pillsbury's. The house was very much of its time, a modernist exercise in form,

predilection for a modernist trophy. After all, you don't live in a Frank Lloyd Wright house, you live with it. The same might be said about a Ralph Rapson house.

When the Pillsburys enlisted Rapson



to design their house, their two sons were already grown and on their own. The couple wanted a house just for themselves.

They were fairly open to stylistic direction, although they asked for something contemporary—without being radical. Beyond that, "They had only a few specific requests," Rapson says. They wanted the house designed for interior privacy, in which public and private spaces are separate; they wanted generous wall space for display of their extensive painting and sculpture collection; they wanted a connected guest house and servants' quarters; and they wanted to maximize views of Lake Minnetonka. Finally, family sentiment playing a role, they asked that the new house be built on the exact spot where the family's Victorian house had burned down a few years

Rapson says that Mrs. Pillsbury became "the engine behind the house." She made most of the design decisions with Rapson; Philip more or less stayed on the sidelines and simply requested that the cost not exceed a specific limit. For Rapson, Mrs. Pillsbury

was an ideal client: she was rich and sophisticated; she had good taste and good judgment. She also gave him a lot of freedom and didn't breathe down his neck every step of the way, Rapson relates. The architect did a number of design studies, and Mrs. Pillsbury liked his idea of a "separate, fragmented plan." Rapson says.

This fragmented plan became a series of five separate pavilions linked by glassenclosed corridors. Rapson designed the five boxes to reveal plenty of wall space for art, and to offer a variety of window and light openings. "At the time, I enjoyed playing with fracturing the cube, taking a box and tearing it apart and having light come in at different angles," Rapson says. One of the house's distinguishing exterior characteristics was a series of floating roof projections—or skylights—over glass and brick walls.

Entering the house for the first time, one was struck by how small the place felt, despite its 11,000 square feet. The pavilions achieved the goal of providing private spaces within a large-house format. The central pavilion, or main liv-

ing area, felt intimate because Rapson tamed it with partitions and droppedceiling modules.

During a visit about two months before demolition, Rapson says he was particularly struck by the quality of light in the house. Indeed, the house was infused with light from large windows overlooking the lake, and through skylights and clerestories.

When completed, the house won Honor Awards through AIA Minnesota and the national AIA. In 1990, it won an AIA Minnesota 25 Year Award, which recognizes buildings that have withstood

the test of time. Seven years after being cited for its long-standing architectural innovations, the Philip Pillsbury house is rubble.

Was the Pillsbury house a great piece of architecture? Perhaps. It certainly was a prime example of architectural experimentation from our recent

past. Did the new property owner have the right to tear it down? Absolutely. It's his property and he can do with it as he pleases.


The tragedy of the Pillsbury house is that the design and preservation communities are often powerless to save significant architecture. Important residential design often works its way into a collective sense of ownership, even if an individual holds the deed to the property. All those Frank Lloyd Wright houses in Oak Park, Ill., are private property; yet we've seen and read enough about them to

consider them part of the larger community of design enthusiasts.

Most people will continue to know the Pillsbury house in photos and memory only.

one house has inspired Enestvedt's awe, as well. In 1992, he saw an old farmhouse in western Minnesota that had been lifted by a tornado and turned upside down, yet it was structurally intact. "I was struck by the remarkable quality of construction," he says. "The house had stayed in one piece, like a rubic's cube rolled down a hill. There was an obvious reason why the tornado picked it up-there were no anchor bolts on one end of the building. With complete structural integrity, that house may have made it. But it was still a reminder that when you build things right, they endure."

Since that house, Enestvedt has inspected many others damaged by tornadoes and wrote in a recent report that, "Generally speaking, older structures perform better than newer ones." The reasons are clear, he adds: "If you have a construction background, you can readily tell why one home is still sitting where it was built and another is in the corn field."


Turn-of-the-century balloon framing, for instance, gave homes more vertical continuity and stability than platform framing does today, he explains. Older homes have a labyrinth of small rooms, closets and halls with interior partitions that act as shear walls; the open spaces and great rooms of today's homes lack this internal type of support. Most older homes also have an attic with floors that create a horizontal shear plane at the top of the house; in contrast, contemporary houses only have Sheetrock™ ceilings, which provide no comparable shear resistance.


More important, Enestvedt says, is that the quality of construction and attention to detail were better in the earlier part of this century. "Very simply, people today don't take the time to do a thorough job. For example, if a joist isn't properly connected to a rim because only 40 percent of the hanger nails were used, and a tornado comes along, of course the joist fails. Building standards and codes aren't at fault; in fact they have become more strict. It's adherence to standards that most often has gone down."

Enestvedt's experience with FEMA has shown him that the building industry can't "beat Mother Nature," he says, "but we could compete with her a little bit more."

Architects, engineers and contractors need to put aside their differences and "design better and build better, respect each others' expertise and work toward a collective best," Enestvedt says. Then, if a house is flattened by a tornado, shaken by an earthquake, blown to bits in a hurricane or engulfed by flood waters, he adds, "we could all take satisfaction in knowing, at the very least, that we'd done our best."

faced with the facts, the farmer was grateful it was only cows that had died.

Okay, so don't burn treated wood, you say. What then do we do with it? According to a recent article in Environmental Building News, a monthly newsletter on environmentally responsible design and construction, roughly 5.1 billion board feet of lumber were treated with CCA in 1995. Since 1985, approximately 48 billion board feet of CCAtreated wood products have gone out into the marketplace. And even though treatments like CCA are designed to increase the longevity of wood, they don't make the wood last forever. Two-andone-half billion board feet of treated wood are coming back at us every year and, unless dutifully separated out of the trash heap and taken to a lined landfill for disposal, will pose an ever greater environmental hazard.

There is not a dead-cows-in-the-field anecdote to illustrate every aspect of the torrent of trash that flows out of the construction process. Still, every time an architect specifies a product for a residence, he or she might consider the ultimate fate of that carpet, those roofing shingles, that hot-water heater, that decking material. They're all headed, some sooner than later, for the trash pile.

Carpet only lasts from seven to 10 years in a residential application. And in the U.S., we like our carpet. Last year we liked it to the tune of 1.5 billion square vards (enough to carpet all 485 square miles of Houston, Texas), which is the annual production figure for the carpet industry. And, each year, 3.5 billion pounds of old stuff goes into the trash, accounting for nearly two percent by volume of all municipal solid waste. That number, by the way, does not include the 125,000 tons of carpet-pad waste generated annually when the old carpet is thrown away and the new carpet is brought in.

Asphalt roofing shingles, the most common type of roofing material, might last as long as 20 years. Even at that, asphalt roofing goes into the dumpster at an annual rate of about 6.8 million

tons—accounting for almost another three percent of municipal solid waste.

Interior treatments like paint and wallpaper generally have a life span of less than 10 years, and frequently only half as many years. (They also tend to produce the most hazardous-waste products.) Exterior aluminum shutters can be expected to last a mere three vears, and wooden decks only 15. The list goes on and on. In fact, the NAHB Research Center has produced an actual list that documents just how long things last. Itemizing everything from HVAC system elements to appliances to windows and walls, the report provides stark illustration of Brand's contention that most buildings will not last as long as the people who make them.

There are architects, engineers and builders out there dedicated to designing and building homes with durable materials, and that use highly energy-efficient systems for heating and cooling. But, like anything else, the process is evolving slowly, and generally well out of the mainstream of residential construction.

"Buildings are systems," says Marc Rosenbaum, a consultant who owns the Meriden, N.H.-based firm Energysmiths, and has long focused his work on creating super-insulated, energy-efficient homes with durable construction. "It's difficult to change one little thing without changing the whole, so consequently, most people don't change the system."

Rosenbaum believes that too many people look to his kind of solutions—his use of energy-efficient systems in particular-as solutions that are too complex and too costly. But, as he explains about a recently completed Hanover, N.H., home, which won a Northeast Sustainable Energy Association Award last year, "we just spent our money differently." There, the extra cost of superinsulation, for instance, is paid for by energy savings; site-glazing techniques used to achieve high-performance glazing were comparable to buying windows from such manufacturers as Marvin or Anderson. He specified hardwoods, tile and granite instead of carpet, laminates or vinyls: the porch floor is concrete instead of pressure-treated wood.

"We build our buildings too cheaply," says Rosenbaum. "Affordability involves both the cost of construction and the cost of financing. Our mistake is trying to finance resource-efficient, durable construction over a small fraction of what should be the life of the building. This makes good construction practice look expensive."

Brand dedicates a chapter to maintenance of buildings in *How Buildings Learn*, and near the end relates a story he first heard from anthropologist Gregory Bateson in the 1970s. It could stand a retelling here:

"New College, Oxford, is of rather late foundation, hence the name. It was founded around the late-14th century. It has, like other colleges, a great dining hall with big oak beams across the top, yes? These might be two feet square, 45 feet long.

A century ago, so I am told, some busy entomologist went up into the roof of the dining hall with a penknife and poked at the beams and found they were full of beetles. This was reported to the College Council, who met in some dismay because where would they get beams of that caliber nowadays?

One of the Junior Fellows stuck his neck out and suggested that there might be on College lands some oak. So they called in the College Forrester, who of course had not been near the College itself for some years, and asked him about oaks. And he pulled his forelock and said, 'Well sirs, we was wonderin' when you'd be askin'.'


Upon further inquiry it was discovered that when the College was founded, a grove of oaks had been planted to replace the beams in the dining hall when they became beetly, because oak beams always become beetly in the end. This plan had been passed down from one Forester to the next for 600 years. 'You don't cut them oaks. Them's for the College Hall.'"


A nice story. That's the way to run a culture.

Alas, when Brand decided to find out if a new grove of trees had been planted to provide for the next set of beams, he queried the College Archivist and the Clerk of Works at New College. They had no idea.

process of changing its codes. The strawbale revival took hold in the Southwest because of the area's hot, arid climate (in which super-insulating straw bales aren't in danger of rotting) and adobe-style vernacular (bales are easily stacked and plastered to create this effect). In the Southwest, straw bale is also promoted by a dynamic coterie of individuals interested in alternative ways of home building.

In northern climates like Minnesota's, straw bale's insulating properties are attractive. In addition to the Corbin/ Geisen code-approved house and barn, about a dozen nonresidential straw-bale structures-sheds, studios, garages and barns-have been built recently in the state. The major concern with bales in Minnesota, however, is moisture. "There are raging debates on the Internet regarding moisture in this climate and whether straw-bale construction is workable here," Geisen says. "The problem is how to deal with moisture created in the house that wants to move to the outside and condense." While a bale of straw has a "wonderful ability to transpire moisture in both directions," Query explains, "we don't know how much moisture a bale can take on before it reaches a saturation point and begins to rot and decompose."

To deal with this uncertainty, Query and his clients adopted a "let-it-breath strategy" instead of lining the house with a continuous vapor barrier. They sleeved all plumbing perforations in kitchen and bath, detailed all electrical and exhaust perforations, and detailed the bales where they met ceiling, floor, and window and door openings. "If appropriately detailed," Query says, "the bales should be able to handle the transfer of moisture through the wall." They also chose an exterior plaster more porous than the interior lime-plaster skin, "the idea being that whatever moisture does get into the wall will have an easier time getting out through the exterior," Geisen says.

Other concerns about building with bales are easily addressed. Are they a fire hazard? When the National Research Council of Canada tested plastered straw bales for fire safety, it found the plaster



surface withstood temperatures of about 1,850 degrees Fahrenheit for two hours before cracks developed. In addition, bales are so compacted that they may char during a fire, but don't hold enough air to combust, according to *House of Straw*. What about pests? Unlike hay, today's straw contains few nutrients and does not attract pests. Termites may eat a house's wood frame and windowsills, but will leave the straw alone. Allergies? Clean, dry bales—contained in walls designed to prevent moisture buildup—will harbor few molds or pests.

he major concern with bale construction in Minnesota is moisture, and there are debates on the Internet about whether bale can work in this climate.

The cost of constructing a house with bales, however, is an area in which misunderstandings can occur. "It's not necessarily an inexpensive way to build," Query says. "Currently the most common way you save money in straw-bale houses is through homeowner or sweat equity." A more complex design contributes to the cost. The 2,000-squarefoot Geisen/Corbin house, for example, incorporates three different wall systems (traditional 2-by-6 framing, straw bale and a 4-by-4 cedar-framing system with rigid insulation on the outside); several roof styles (lift, flat, shallowpitch steel and steeper-pitch steel); and four load-bearing systems.

Architect Rick Peterson, co-founder of the Minneapolis-based Community Eco-Design Network, says he has a way of cutting both design costs and the amount of sweat equity straw-bale-insulated houses have required. In May, he hopes to launch the first hybrid, straw-bale-insulated, prefabricated housing system for northern climates. He predicts the system will cost less than market-rate housing—between \$40 to \$50 per square foot. "We're eliminating entirely the whole idea of stuccoing straw," he says, "with precast panel systems."

"I've taken the discipline of the bale module—a 3-foot by 18-inch dimension—and applied it to prefabrication construction," Peterson explains. "Every house in my plan book is based on an 18-by-18-inch grid, so the approach is flexible but brings a discipline to building construction." Peterson's approach will be used in a 1,050-square-foot, code-approved house near Dilworth, scheduled to be built this summer.

The Network also will begin training people in Peterson's construction technique this summer, with an eye toward creating a guild of contractors who can competitively bid such jobs. "The way to make this building system successful in Minnesota is to make it profitable for people and have an industry standard," Peterson says. "The Community Eco-Design Network wants to take a populist approach and mainstream this as quickly as possible."

Whether constructed with prefab panels or sweat equity, straw-bale housing remains a sustainable, affordable alternative to more traditional housing. That's its niche, says Query, who doubts that straw-bale housing will ever "turn the building industry on its ear." For now, the build-it-with-bales movement is a small but growing social phenomena that still needs infrastructure, materials, supervision, financing, design attention and code recognition to receive main-stream acceptance.

Anyone still huffing and puffing in disbelief over straw bale's advantages as a building material, however, is likely to be rebuffed with this oft-quoted remark from Out On Bale's Matts Myhrman: Any building material can be used badly. The moral of the straw-bale story is "Don't let a pig build your house." AM





The Pillsbury Mansion, 2200 Stevens Ave., Minneapolis, 1887-1937

t the end of April 1937, the Cleveland Wrecking Company began dismantling a large, yellow limestone mansion at the corner of East 22nd Street and Stevens Avenue in Minneapolis, across the street from Fair Oaks Park. But before the wrecking was completed, salvagers held a huge sale inside the house. Buyers could pick from heavy doors, complete fireplaces, kitchen cabinets, windows, heating plants, old light fixtures, pipes, bathtubs—even from bricks and stones. Within a week, everything was gone.

This house began its existence 50 years earlier as a home for businessman J.W. Johnson on a site that was then at the edge of the city. Johnson owned the house for only a short time before selling it to Charles A. Pillsbury, a founder of The Pillsbury Company. From then on, the house remained a Pillsbury domicile, as several different family members lived in it as the decades passed.

The first family transfer occurred when the property passed to the company founder's son, Charles S. Pillsbury. It wasn't the home of his dreams, however, and he eventually built another house, which still stands at 100 E. 22nd St. Around 1909, Charles S. sold the house to his twin brother, John S. Pillsbury, who lived there with his family until the early 1930s. By this time a third Pillsbury family home, which also still survives, was close at hand kitty-corner from 2200 Stevens.

After the John S. Pillsbury family left Minneapolis for a new home west of the city, the grand old 3-story house remained empty for several years. Today, with its demolition a 60-year-old memory, the house remains alive only through the bathtubs, light fixtures, sinks and bricks that may still be at work in unknown scattered dwellings. *Jack El-Hai*
