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
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


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
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As, however, lime expands and cement contracts during hydration, two opposing stresses are set up in the mortar during the drying out and hardening processes and this is very largely the basic cause of the quite common crazing and movements of joints away from the brickwork. The development of mortar plasticisers now makes it possible to adopt lean cement and sand mixes without resorting to the addition of lime.

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The air entrainment is obtained by a physical and not a chemical action and there is, therefore, no deleterious effect on the mortar. Tretol Morta-Mix removes surface tension from the gauging water and to a certain extent, acts as a lubricant for the sand.

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Mortars for brickwork.

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Mixes of 1:6 as indicated for brickwork, using really coarse sharp sands, can well be employed with the aid of this plasticiser without the slightest objection being raised by plasterers. The renderings hang extremely well in their wet state and can be brought to a good finish without necessity for over-trowelling; thus avoiding bringing the "fat" to the surface with resultant crazing. The plastic nature of the mix provided enables very easy working of surfaces to obtain texturing where necessary, also, by improved wetting, better adhesion between thrown or embedded aggregate on to the surface of the final coat of rendering is obtained.

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The advantages gained by the use of lean mixes are particularly apparent on breeze blocks and other internal surfaces not possessing high physical strength. Renderings consisting of cement, sand and Tretol Morta-Mix only, eliminating completely the need for lime, will provide excellent backing coats for plaster finishes and will not cause any chemical reaction resulting in blowing, or other physical damage to the setting coats. This will apply to all typical plasters used for work of this nature, including Hemihydrates, Anhydrous, Anhydrites, Keenes, etc.

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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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

In seeking a theme for a series of features on flooring as an integral element of interior design, the manufacturers of Semastic Tiles commissioned Sir Hugh Casson to make his recommendations.

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THE PROBLEM AS SET TO LAURENCE SCARFE


As will be seen from the plan alongside, the reception room and waiting area of this suburban clinic presents a large and irregularly shaped floor space. Architecturally, the essential needs for this floor are simple—namely a design that permits easy and orderly circulation, whilst suggesting an atmosphere of serenity, cleanliness and cheerfulness. To some extent these needs have been met by the generous use of glass overlooking the garden, the simple direct arrangement of doors, and the mixing of formal and informal furniture and furnishings. The success of this interior will depend largely upon the subtlety of the decorative treatment applied to the floor.

SUBURBAN CLINIC



Probably all patients attending hospital or clinic do so with som feeling of apprehension. All the more reason, therefore, why the treatment of such places, particularly in the reception area should be both cheerful and m assuring. We have all attended those melancholy gatherings i silent waiting rooms where the visitor looks dumbly through tired magazines spread, like some stale meal, on a central table; we have all spent discouraging hour shuffling, a place at a time, from one hardwood chair to the next of the slow approach to the surgery

Medical attention is based upon faith in a cure. This process should start as soon as the patient enters the building; his surroundings should be such as will instireassurance and optimism within him. It is here that the designecam be of greatest help to the architect.

The reception area of a medica clinic is, by its nature, a place of constant movement, yet it is at area in which the patient perfore lingers long enough to be affected by more than first impressions. The feeling of welcome should be obtained by a careful use of form, texture and colour that is interesting without being over-stimulating. I have suggested, therefore, a cool and restful colour scheme dominated by white, blue and pale grey, but accented by the cheerful ceiling colour and pattern of the floor.



The Design


The Semastic floor tiles used in the plan are based on a nine-inch square grid and are inlaid with simple decorative motifs that are capable of many permutations. Different coloured backgrounds to these motifs offset each other throughout the floor area. Sections of the design cut from various colours are interchangeable to avoid wastage and the larger areas are in positive colours. The overall texture is a pleasing marbled texture with a soft matt finish.

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
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
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
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
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




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


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Re-erection of Wallspan solves future extension problem of new factory bays

Adhesive Tapes Ltd. are building big new extensions to their Boreham Wood factory. The first of these, illustrated here, will be extended still further in a few years' time. With this in mind, Architect J. E. Collins, A.R.I.B.A., chose Wallspan for the end walls of this bay. The installation is permanently up now. But it will be a relatively simple job to take down and re-erect when the bay is lengthened. There will be no waste of materials, a minimum of labour cost.

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Wallspan answered a lot of problems in these extensions. Architects are finding this so on other buildings all over the world.

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MODERN FOR THE CLASSICS

The Radio Show, like the Motor Show, is one of those centres of mass pilgrimage by which the temper of the nation is judged; whatever one's trade or racket one can learn a great deal about the customers' likely frame of mind over the next twelve months. ASTRAGAL, looking back over his comments in previous years, finds that he has tended to use the Radio Show as a barometer of the public's attitude to good design, but ooking over this year's exhibits, he is inclined to use the Radio Show as the indicator of a continuing split in the acceptance of standards of design.

One might have gone this year anticipating a squalid purge of flashiness

stirred up by the imminence of commercial TV, only to find that, inexplicably it hadn't happened. The crux of this year's show was super-charged steam-radio, VHF/FM, and ASTRAGAL found the results very instructive. Who will buy FM? The answer, from the look and price of the sets, will be lowermiddle-class intellectuals who have heard about good design. Practically every stand shows an FM set at about 25 gns., but unlike AM* sets in this price range which tend to be plastic, bulgy and Borax, the FM sets are restrained and dignified wooden boxes with a few well-placed knobs. People who don't care all that much about quality of reproduction, it appears, like 'em flashy, confirmed classical-music users (who are interested in "woof" and "tweet") like something that themasters of modern design would not point a finger of scorn at. Moral, good design still only belongs to a limited section of the public.

TV set design, of course, is still dominated by the problem of everbigger screens. The enormous Twenty-One-Inchers and the now relatively smaller Seventeen-Inchers take up so much of the facade of the set that they leave little room for fancy trimmings, and design in this field isn't probably as Borax as market-researchers might advise. Tuning knobs have to fight to make themselves seen against this vistavision competition, and are developing chrome or gold hub-caps in order to attract attention, and ASTRAGAL was delighted to observe that on one stand they boasted the trade mark of the vear's most successful automobile-the three-pointed star of Mercedes. Is there

a doctor of Social Symbolism in the house?

QUIET, PLEASE

And while on the subject of TV, ASTRAGAL learns that new regulations by the Postmaster-General make it an offence to use electrical equipment such as vacuum cleaners or fans which will interfere with radio or TV reception, and if you start to annoy the neighbours you will be asked to fit some sort of suppressor. This seems fair enough, but ASTRAGAL feels rather strongly that it should be a two-way arrangement and that any radio set about which two or more neighbours complain should have to have its maximum volume cut to half. You think that existing laws and the police provide enough control? Just try to use the existing machinery and see where it gets you.


SWEDISH NEW TOWN

ASTRAGAL understands that pictures of Vällingby, the new town that is being built about ten miles from Stockholm. appear elsewhere in this issue. He was there himself earlier this summer and two things about it struck him particularly. One very much in its favour; the other somewhat the reverse. The first was the way the high point-blocks, instead of being surrounded by open space in the outlying parts of the town, are grouped closely round the central square with the specific purpose of ensuring that in the evenings, when the shops are closed, the square is still enlivened by bright lights from the windows of the flats, avoiding the danger of the centre of the town becoming dead and gloomy after dark.

The other point was that, in spite of the very intelligent planning in evidence
