

# Worth a **Thousand** Words?

For Christmas circa 1983 my sister and I were both given Kodak Disc cameras as gifts. For some years after that (as long as Disc film was available, most likely) it would accompany me on our travels, but to this day I remember most the camera itself—so sleek and futuristic, like some Star Wars prop—better than any photos I took with it. For my next foray into photography, fast forward almost 20 years, when I inherited an early digital pocket camera.

I made up for lost time by taking hundreds if not thousands of pictures every week. The camera went with me everywhere, and I documented just about everything. Before, I had been hesitant to pull out a camera in public and felt out of my league dealing with aperture, f-stop, and exposure time. The digital camera freed my photographic inhibitions and allowed me to experiment endlessly. If the picture was bad, no harm done; I'd just delete it and try again. Unexpectedly, my comfort with this new digital toy led me backward to film. On an average day, my shoulder bag contained no fewer than three cameras-the digital handheld, a salvaged Polaroid Land camera, and a funny, large-format plastic camera called Sawyer's Nomad, made by the company better known for the View-Master. Such enthusiasm garnered me an assignment from Dwell's then-creative director to shoot a Washington, DC, travel story while I was visiting family ("A Capital Idea," March/April 2003). I was thrilled. Would I call myself a photographer? Well, sort of.

Like most hobbyists, I like to use my camera as a journal or sketchbook—a record of the places I have been, things I have eaten, and sights seen. I'm always

fascinated by details, odd juxtapositions, textures, patterns, and particularly, variations on a theme—like the Italian doorways pictured here. For me, the camera is a handy tool for visual note taking. True photographers, on the other hand, possess not only the technical toolkit that allows them to achieve desired results, but they have also the ability to capture a moment, a gesture or look, or a particular play of shadow or color of light that communicates something beyond words. We strive for the images in Dwell to possess that quality.

Photography has always been a crucial element of the storytelling process at Dwell. Our "Fruit Bowl Manifesto" is largely a declaration of visual intentwe'll show you spaces as they are actually lived in, without styling or enhancements. We'll even show you the people themselves! Less obvious, perhaps, is that the manifesto also informs our technical approach from the equipment we use (no wide-angle lenses), to our shot setups (we use level lenses that don't distort walls and angles), and even the layout system in the book itself (our page grid allows the aspect ratio of the images to remain as they were photographed, with little cropping). The photos that you see in each issue are the result of a great deal of behind-the-scenes work—we choose a photographer whose style is sympathetic to the initial assignment content; we spend a day or two or three on set or in the field shooting; we edit down a small selection of photographs from hundreds of potential options; and we spend hours in the color booth preparing the images for press. One-hour photoprocessing this is not.

In our constantly updated, media-saturated culture, putting this kind of time and effort into photography is a luxury—one that I feel is crucial to making Dwell a worthwhile experience and expense for our readers. Over the last decade, our relationship to taking and sharing pictures has changed immeasurably: Anyone with a cell phone is a photographer, and, with access to the Internet, a publisher. The upshot of this? Our responsibility to deliver incredible, indelible imagery is even more heightened, and our dedication to the craft of picture-making necessarily sharpened and renewed. Consider this issue, in which we lead each story with photography, giving our talented stable of shooters the imperative to tell a complete story, as an acknowledgment and extension of that promise.



I really enjoyed the Rethink Recycling (February 2011) issue. It gave me bittersweet pride to see that my province is at the forefront of recycling in North America. I forget that not everyone has the opportunity to recycle as much as we do in British Columbia. It makes me upset to know that more places are not doing the same. I grew up in a world where it was second nature to separate paper, tins, and glass. I've taken bottles back to the store for a refund since I was seven or eight years old (I am now 35). Our regional district has recently started a curbside compost collection program, which is estimated to divert 800 truckloads a year from our local landfill. I know that if we can instill these practices in our youth, we can change the world. I would like to thank Dwell and countless others for putting the good word of sustainability into all of our vocabularies.



Designer: Omer Arbel Office Inc. (OAO) Location: Wood Rock, British Columbia Surrounded on all sides by a sweeping Canadian hayfield, the 23.2 House is an angular ode to rural life.



Out of "respect for the beams and their history," Arbel insisted that not a single reclaimed plank—still marked by nailheads and chipped paint—be cut nor altered during construction, which gave the home its striking geometric motif. It's what he refers to as the "alchemy between material and process," which also inspired the textured concrete walls and crisply milled walnut furniture.

Arbel's projects—both products and architectural commissions—follow a chronological numbering system. The house itself is his 23rd design, while the one-of-a-kind glass pendants that accent nearly every room like a starscape are called "28." III-

"The computer is a tool; I can't do without it. 


#### WE'RE NOT IN KANSAS ANYMORE

On May 4,2007, Greensburg, Kansas, was wiped off the map. An EF5 tornado ravished the small town of 1,400 residents, destroying or severely damaging 95 percent of the city. Less than a week later, however, the survivors did the incredible: At a meeting under a tent, they rallied to rebuild as a sustainable city.


Some community members at first were skeptical, but they later embraced the idea of following in the footsteps of their ancestors, who had lived off the land. With the backing of the city, state, and federal governments and the nonprofit Greensburg Green-Town, founded by nearby Stafford County residents Daniel Wallach and Catherine Hart, the town has become a sustainable mecca—boasting more than 25 green projects so far and attracting thousands of eco-tourists.




Considering his cache of bold-faced employers, the Swiss-born graphic designer and photographer Herbert Matter (1907-1984) should loom larger in the mid-century design canon than he does. His clients included Knoll (he was a design consultant on their ads, logos, and catalogs from 1946 to 1966) the Eames Office, Le Corbusier, and Yale University, where he taught photography and graphic design. His friends-luminaries of the art worldoften became subjects of his work: He photographed Jackson Pollock on Long Island weekends, shot a film for MoMA about Alexander Calder, and made a decades-long pictoral study of fellow Swiss artist Alberto Giacometti.

In the mid-1930s Matter made a quick name for himself as a graphic designer with a set of bold, avant-gardeinspired travel posters for the Swiss National Tourist Office. His deft use of angular photography and collage presaged what would become a lifelong fascination with the camera. His interdisciplinary 50-year career included magazine covers for Condé Nast, communication design for the U.S. government, and the graphic identity for the New Haven Railroad. Herbert Matter warrants a second look—here's ours.





## Less Is Amore

With its architectural history reaching back to the ancient Greeks, Syracuse, on the island of Sicily, has plenty of old bones. In 2001, while still students, native sons Francesco (now an architect) and Alberto (a photographer) bought a crumbling building that dates from the 18th century. Seven years—three of them spent on construction—and one UNESCO permitting process later, the Moncada brothers moved in: Francesco on the top two floors and Alberto on the first. Now the two globetrotting brothers, as well as Francesco's girlfriend, architect Mafalda Rangel, use the place whenever they're in Sicily. The modern interior, replete with furniture of Francesco's design as well as a few Italian classics bought on eBay, serves as the perfect counterpoint to the weight of the town's considerable history. The trio gives us a tour of their home and hometown, showing that where they live extends beyond the front door.




Setsumasa and Mami Kobayashi's weekend retreat, two and a half hours northwest of Tokyo, is "an arresting concept," photographer Dean Kaufman says, who documented the singular refuge in the Chichibu mountain range. "It's finely balanced between rustic camping and feeling like the Farnsworth House."

Designed by Shin Ohori of General Design Co., the structure—Setsumasa bristles at the word "house," since his desire was for something that "was not a residence"—and its wooded surroundings serve as a testing ground for the Kobayashis, who design outdoor clothing and gear (as well as many other products) for their company,......Research. The shelter is constructed from locally harvested larch wood and removable fiberplastic walls and is crowned with two yellow dome tents used as year-round bedrooms.

Still, this is no primitive lean-to. There's electricity, hot water, and a kitchen—not to mention iPads, Internet, and a clawfoot tub. By day, the couple trims trees and chops firewood. At night, they sit around a campfire and eat Japanese curry, listen to Phish, and balance their laptops on their knees. This is what a modern back-to-the-land effort looks like.

One North Face tent sits atop a deck; another caps the main building, which contains a kitchen and dining area (opposite right). Below is a view of the mountains from the village of Kawakami, en route to the Kobayashis' property.














The long, lean Kobayashi complex (opposite, top) includes a bathroom and storage room in the structure on the far right. The couple stockpiles wood under the deck (opposite, bottom right). The rooftop tent can be accessed from the interior (opposite, bottom left) via a wooden ladder or—for the more athletic—via a series of wall-mounted climbing holds, made by Vock and carved from persimmontinted hardwood. Translucent fiberglass panel walls form a permeable, fiber-reinforced plastic membrane between indoors and out (this page, top). The Kobayashis (this page, bottom) are ready for adventure.







Mami and Ishii Hideaki (a friend and ......Research employee) prepare lunch in the cozy main building. The room is rustic and utilitarian, with a double-decker wood-burning stove, tons of open storage, and a sink fashioned from galvanized buckets. But there's an underlying high-design ethos: The wire baskets are handmade classics from Korbo, a Swedish company, and what looks like a paper-wrapped box in front of the stove is actually a leather cushion by Japanese artist Nakano.









# 20th-Century Fox

In 1952, the late industrialist J. Irwin Miller and his wife, Xenia, commissioned a remarkable modernist triumvirate to create their home in Columbus, Indiana: Eero Saarinen designed the building, Alexander Girard masterminded the interiors, and Dan Kiley handled the landscape architecture. Luckily, the Miller heirs knew they had grown up in a gem, and when their parents passed away, they generously donated the house, along with many of its original furnishings, to the Indianapolis Museum of Art.

I have visited my fair share of iconic modern homes, but the moment I walked in, this one felt

unique. In part, it's the mix of Saarinen and Girard—a Finnish austerity combined with the warmth of Girard's colors and folk art-influenced design. But what quickly absorbed my attention were the details of the Millers' lives, which are woven inextricably into the interiors. The Girard-designed rug in the TV room, for example, is decorated with symbols for the family: a Y for Yale (Irwin's alma mater), the Miller children's initials, and even the floor plan of the house. The needlepoint cushions on the dining room chairs bear a custom-designed monogram for each family member.


Eero Saarinen's legendary Miller House opens to the public this May for the first time. Leslie Williamson gives us an intimate tour of this Columbus, Indiana, treasure.



As I photographed the house over two days, I peppered Carolyn, the Millers' longtime house-keeper who still cares for the house, with question after question. Her stories—about illustrious dinner guests, such as Lady Bird Johnson, and about how Xenia wouldn't let anyone touch the white curtains separating the dining and living areas—together with the intimate design details really brought the place to life. And that is the beauty of the Miller House. Saarinen, Girard, and Kiley may have designed a mid-century masterpiece, but the Millers made the house a home.

The pathway from the pool to the house (opposite) is paved with the same slate that clads the exterior walls. In the main living room (above), the pillows in the sunken seating area changed colors with the seasons: reds for the winter and lighter pastels for the warmer months.











The dining room (left) centers around a custom Saarinen-designed marble-and-terrazzo table ringed by Tulip chairs.
Overhead is a Venini chandelier. A mosaic tile wall (above) softens the laboratory-like effect of the glossy kitchen cabinets. In the winter, the cylindrical fireplace in the central living area (right) was always ready for a fire. In spring and summer, the base was filled with plants.






Alexander Girard continued to work with the Millers on their house for more than 15 years, adapting the interiors of the house as the family's needs changed.



Xenia's dressing room (opposite) was much larger than Irwin's and had a custom stool covered in Girard's Mogul 081 fabric. A few pieces of Xenia's extensive blue opaline glass collection sit on her dressing table.


Almost every window in the house was covered in a Girard-designed fabric. The Miller girls' bedrooms (bottom left and right) each had a different color variation on the Quatrefoil pattern.















The playroom (above) later became Xenia's office. The front entrance of the Miller House (right) is flanked by a series of glass screens, designed by either Dan Kiley or Girard.

Girard's touch is visible in almost every detail in the house, from the gate to the pool (opposite top right) to the needlepoint seating pads on the Tulip chairs (with pattern instructions for Xenia above them) (opposite top left). His original textile master plan for the house (opposite bottom left) was recently unearthed in the property's barn. Girard even integrated the floor plan of the house into the TV room rug design (opposite bottom right).


