

But they say they'll be back next year, so we'll keep you posted. * Christie's New York is offering an opportunity to explore the development of 19th and 20th century art through a course which consists of three nine-week terms. A regular series of lectures by distinguished art historians, critics and writers will be presented three mornings a week, along with guided visits to museums, exhibitions, galleries, etc... The winter term covers Fauvism to Surrealism and runs from Jan. 10 - Mar. 9. The spring term follows Abstract Expressionism to the Art of the Present Day, and runs from Apr. 4 - June 1. First introduced in the late 1940s by paint company owner Max Klein and artist Dan Robbins under the brand Craft Master, the kits were an instant success. By 1954 over 12 million had been sold, occupying both children and adults across America with the disciplined task of painting within the lines. Today, the results of these diligent painters are sought after by a group of admirers, and private collections are even being displayed in galleries - such as Michael O'Donoghue's cache of over 200 being shown at the Bridgewater/Lustberg Gallery in SoHo. 

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
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
