

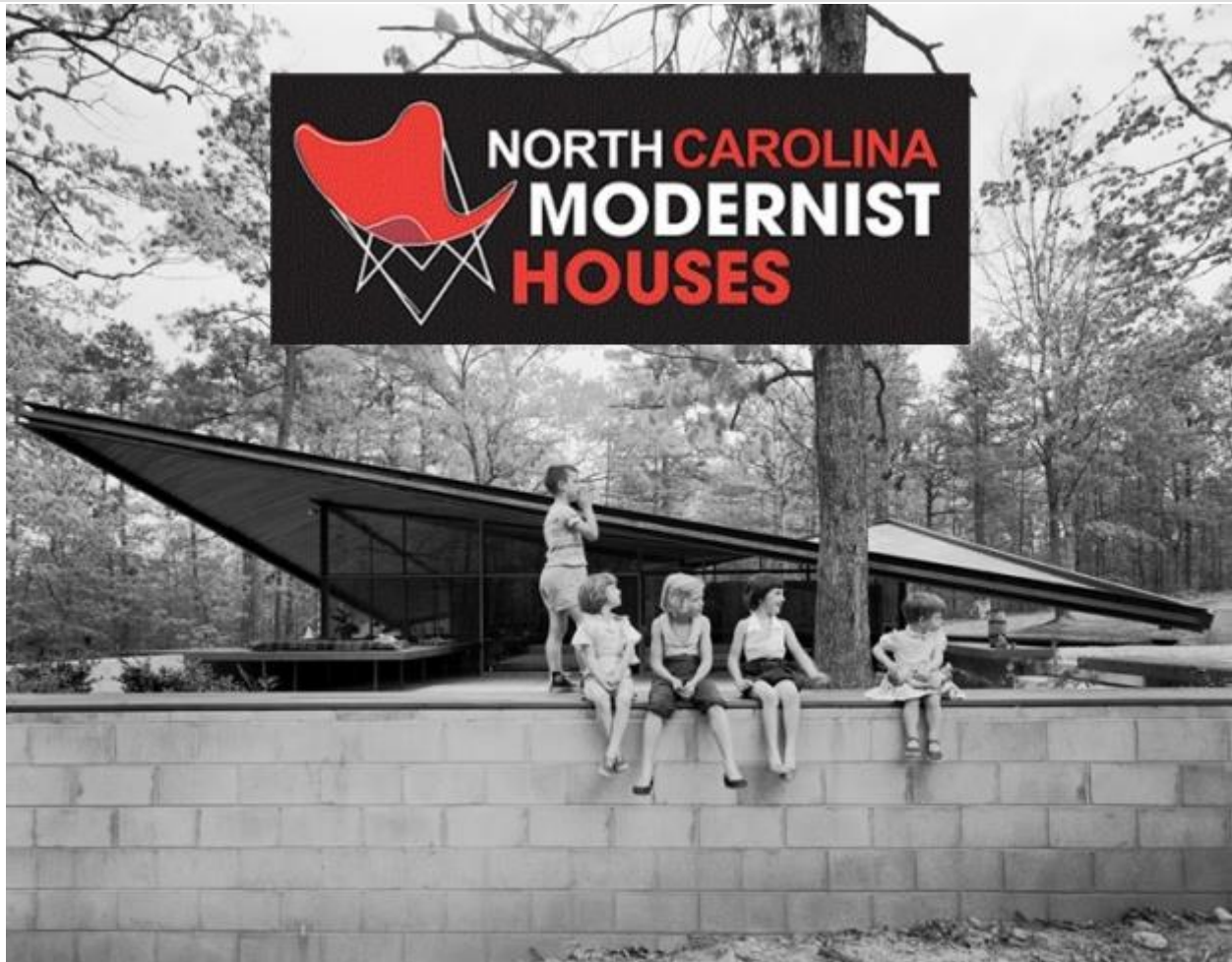

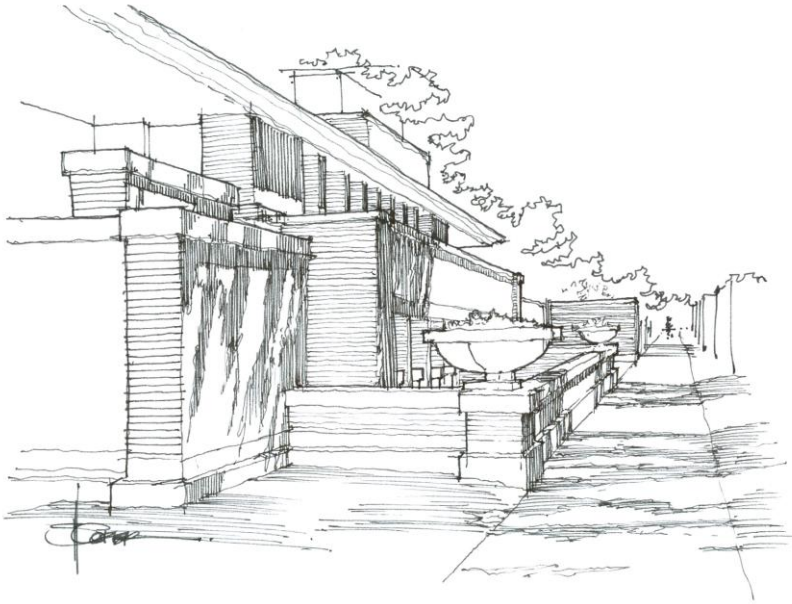

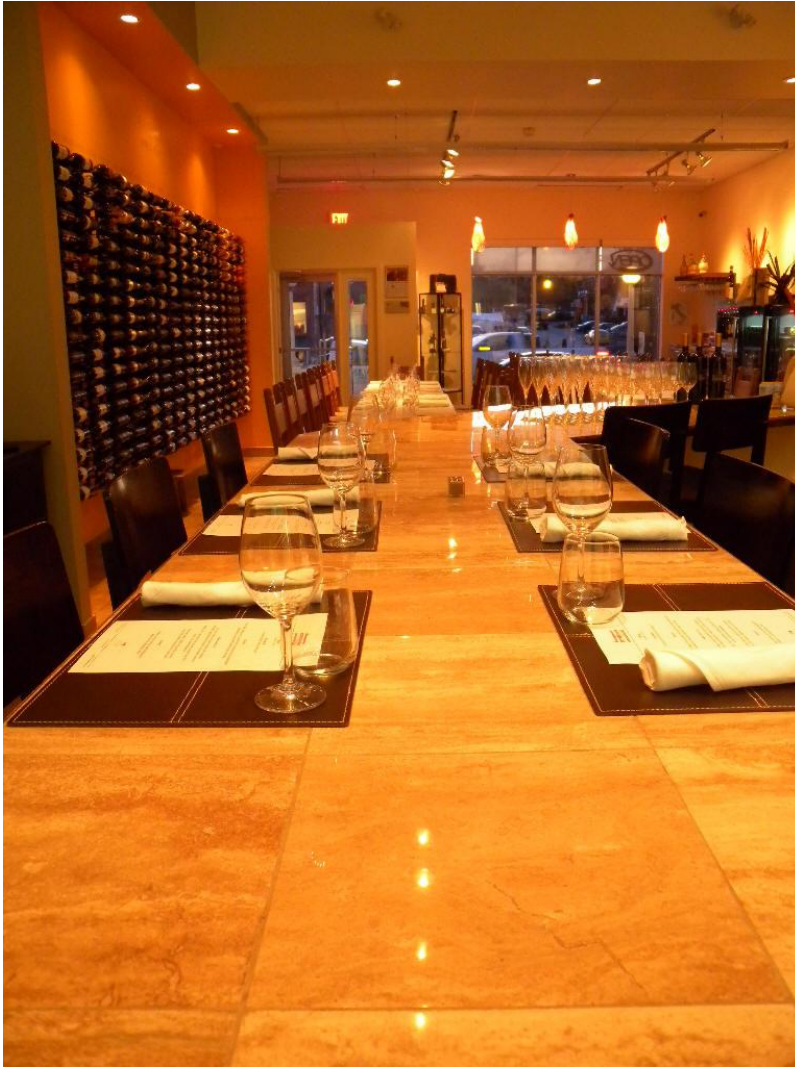

National Alert: Edward Durell Stone's
Johnson House

The 1954 Walter and Edith Johnson House in Darien CT, aka the Dogtrot House, was designed by [Edward Durell Stone](#) and has been lovingly maintained over the decades by just two owners. This was Stone's final work to outwardly emulate Wrightian detailing, a practice that began with Stone's visit to [Taliesin](#) in 1940. The owner needs our help. National Alert: Richard Neutra's Pariser House in Uniontown PA

NCMH visited the Pariser House at 27 Judith Street in Uniontown PA during the [2012 Fallingwater trip](#). At the time, the house was vacant and not in the greatest shape, but in 2013 the family renovated the interior and installed new water, gas, and GFI service and a total re-stain for the beautiful exterior.
