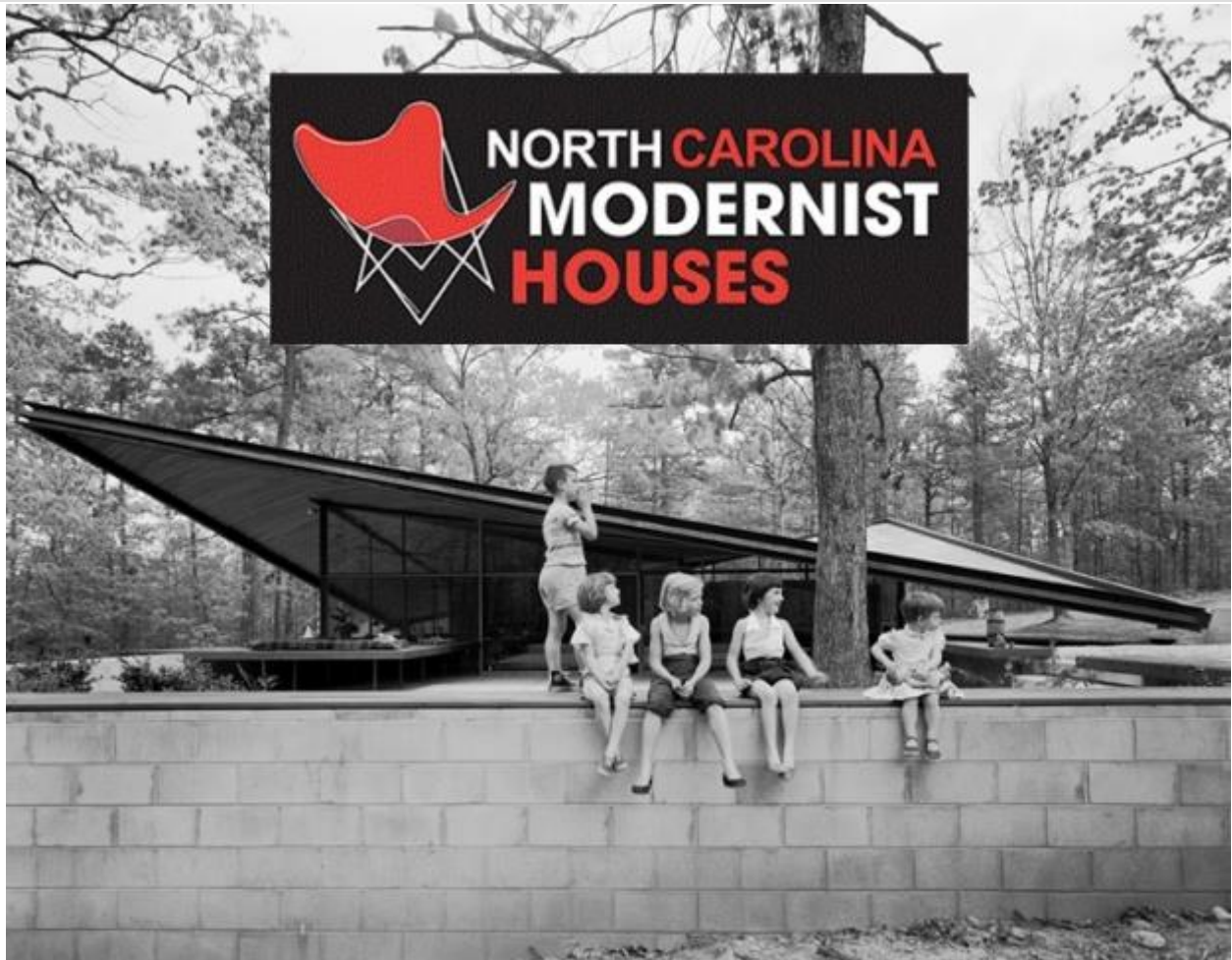

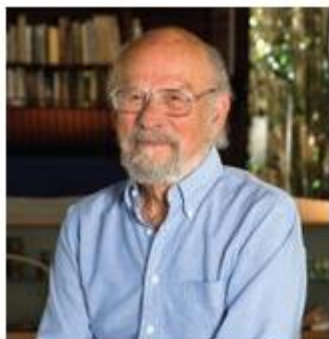

The concrete screen is similar to one on Yadkin Drive. **A \$25 Starbucks card** goes to the first person who can provide an accurate current or past address.



One of North Carolina's endangered Modernist houses is back on the market after nearly being rescued. The 1951 A. M. and Ruth Fleishman Residence, 2614 Morganton Road, Fayetteville NC. Designed by Greensboro's Edward Loewenstein. Jim Brandt was the draftsman. Built by Ed Rynick. It has been vacant for several years but appears recoverable.
