





Missed Opportunities: In yesterday's News and Observer, **Mike Welton** wrote about important Raleigh buildings we've lost plus one that never got out of the ground: Jim Fitzgibbon's <u>Paschal House</u>, Eduardo Catalano's <u>Catalano House</u>, Milton Small's <u>3515 Glenwood</u> -- and the unbuilt City of Raleigh Lightner Public Safety Center, above, designed by <u>Louis Cherry</u> and <u>Michael Stevenson</u>. You'll also learn about <u>**Harwell Hamilton Harris**</u>, Raleigh's unheralded genius.



Speaking of Catalano, he didn't design many houses, so it's rare to find one on the market. The 1954 B. Richard Jackson House, aka the





Carrier Weathermaker National Prize Winning House, designed with **Horacio Caminos**, <u>1317 Westfield</u>, Raleigh. This was a showcase home to demonstrate the value of air conditioning in the moderate price range as AC was new to most houses at that time. 




