Sadly, the Cherry/Gordon case lives on in Raleigh. Neighbor **Gail Wiesner**, having lost her case in Wake County

Superior Court, having lost again at the North Carolina Court of Appeals, filed yet another appeal, this time to the North Carolina Supreme Court.
