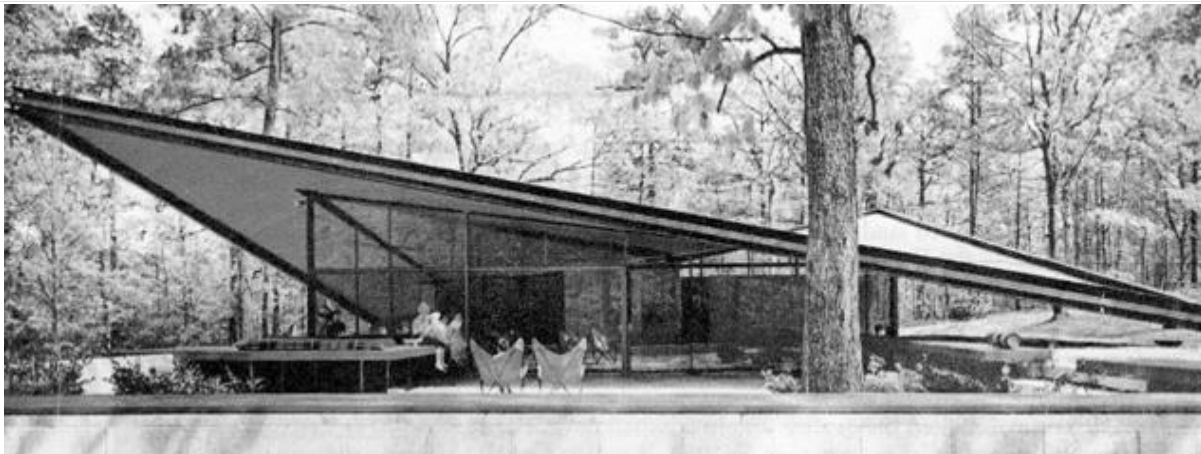

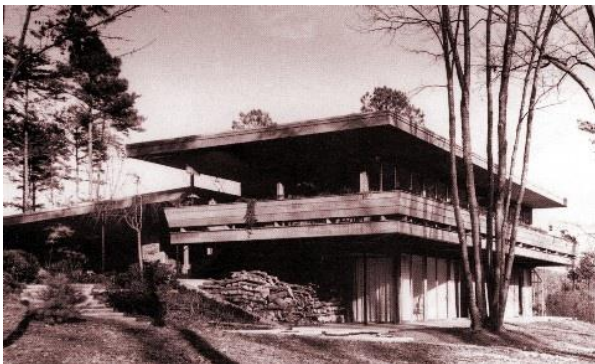

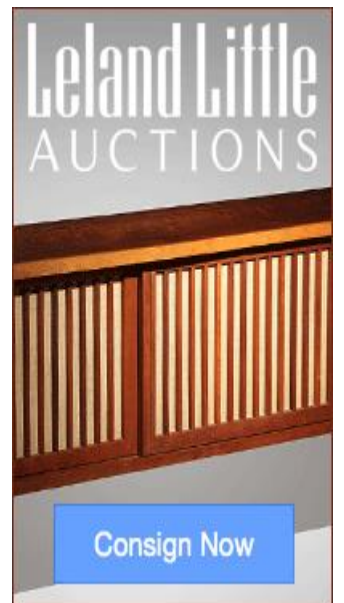
in support of the Tallywood Sign would be welcome backup.

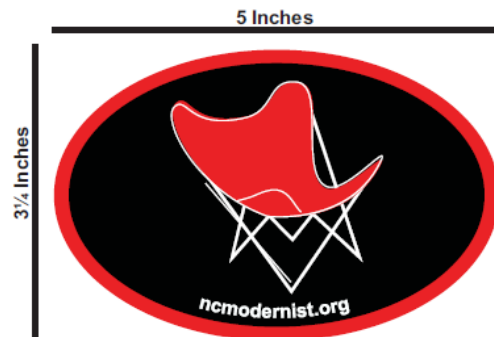
