One was President Harry Truman, who said in 1957, two years before Wright died: "You can tell a lot about a country by the kind of building it has. ... I don't understand fellows like Lloyd Wright. I don't understand what gets into people like that. He started this whole business of chicken-coop and hen-house architecture, and I don't know why in the world he did it. I think that the building people do show what they are thinking for that period, and that's why I hope that one of these days we'll get back to some real architecture." 
