Endangered Alert: **Edgar Tafel** was one of the last and most prominent members of <u>Frank Lloyd Wright's Fellowship</u>. Tafel's 1950 Alpern House at 8 Overlook Drive in Scarsdale NY was completely restored in 1997 by architect Linda Yowell. Although still in good shape (see photos), the house sold May 18 and the new owners applied immediately for demolition. The Town Board of Trustees can, at most, delay demolition by ten months. **That's important time to**

explore other options such as moving, modifying, or keeping the house intact. What can you do? Write the Mayor of Scarsdale, <u>Dan Hochvert</u>, who sits on the Board of Trustees.

Black and Sanderson were not only among the first to introduce modern design to southern consumers, but they were also major artists in their own right.
