Robert (Bob) George Miller of Charlotte died January 1 at the age of 88. With a Bachelor of Architecture

degree from North Carolina State University in 1953 he became a licensed architect in 1956. Following graduation, he worked for <u>Odell Associates</u> and helped design Charlottetown Mall, the first enclosed shopping mall in the South. In 1962, he left Odell and joined Ferebee Walters & Associates. After retiring from there, Bob worked at Camas Associates Architects actively right up until his death. <u>NCMH interviewed him in 2017</u>.
