New to the <u>USModernist Magazine Library</u>: <u>The Architectural Index</u>. Created by **Ervin (Erv) J**. **Bell** (1925-2015), the Architectural Index was a unique and invaluable resource in a time when the internet did not exist. The yearly publication was one of the only ways to easily search for articles across major US architectural publications. After stopping the print edition in 2001, Bell took the publication online. By 2012, Google and other search engines made the Index obsolete. Many thanks to Erv's partner **Jerry Moore** for making the collection available.
