




New on USModernist Radio - Modernism's Three Amigos: Tom Kundig, Frank Harmon, and Marlon Blackwell. Not only are these architects the best of friends but they are also award-winning rockstars of US Modernist residential architecture.

Tom Kundig is principal with Olson Kundig Architects and came to national attention with 1998's Studio House and in 2002, the Chicken Point Cabin. Tom's honors include the Cooper Hewitt 2008 National Design Award, eleven national AIA design awards, too many Washington State AIA awards to count, and over 450 feature articles worldwide. He is the author of Tom Kundig Houses, Tom Kundig Houses 2, and Tom Kundig Works.

<u>Frank Harmon</u> worked for North Carolina's <u>Ed Loewenstein</u> and New York's <u>Richard Meier</u>, teaching at Auburn University and NC State University's College of Design. He's received over 60 design awards, the most ever for a North Carolina firm. Frank is the author of the book **Native Places: Drawing as a Way to See** and writes the Native Places blog.

Marlon Blackwell is the author of An Architecture of the Ozarks: The Works of Marlon Blackwell and has taught at the University of Arkansas in Fayetteville since 1992, serving as head of the architecture department for six years. His firm won more than 120 design awards and he received the 2012 Architecture Prize from the American Academy of Arts and Letters.




Opening in August TBA at the NC Museum of Art in conjunction with NC State's multi-site exhibit Art's Work in the Age of Biotechnology: Shaping Our Genetic Futures. From Teosinte to Tomorrow will be a 100 x 100' stand of tropical field corn cut into a maze with an interior room where visitors will encounter a raised bed of teosinte, the wild grass thought to be the ancestor of modern corn (there is still debate!). The NC State University Libraries' exhibit designer Molly Renda, is collaborating with William H. Dodge and Hanbury on the maze design and basing the pattern on photographs and drawings made by Josef Albers during the years he and Anni Albers traveled extensively in Mexico (1930s–60s). The Albers' deep connection to Mesoamerican art, together with their importance to the growth of art and design in North Carolina, made these reflective works an apt foundation from which to build.
