



New: #141/Modernist Week 2020: Marilyn Monroe. Other than Frank Sinatra, there are few people who are so tightly woven into the spirit of mid-century culture than 1950s Hollywood star Marilyn Monroe. In her day, Marilyn was as big as any celebrity you could name. She was

involved with some of the most well-known men in the world: baseball great **Joe Dimaggio**, playwright **Arthur Miller**, and generally accepted nowadays, **John F. Kennedy**. And she has a connection to a very famous architect. Hosts **George Smart** and **Tom Guild** talk with three people who keep Marilyn's legacy alive for the 21st century. First, it's **Sunny Thompson**, who has been channeling Marilyn in her live shows and completely brings her back to life. Next, **Greg Schreiner**, who has one of the worlds largest collections of Marilyn's costumes and also leads the annual memorial service in Los Angeles, and finally, **Joshua Greene**, son of photographer Milton Greene, who took some of Marilyn's most memorable photos. 

From Architectural Digest: <u>Judith Gura</u>, a well-known editorial and educational expert within the design world, died earlier this month in New York at age 85. The valued <u>New York School of Interior Design</u> lecturer was perhaps most widely known thanks to the exhibitions, books, and articles she helped produce. Gura taught about a variety of topics, from what it takes for <u>an interior to earn landmark status</u>, to decorators' growing <u>interest in textile art</u>. From 1998 through 2005, she served as associate professor of design history at New York's <u>Pratt Institute</u>. It was during that time, and specifically in the year 2000, that Gura started working at the New York School of Interior Design. Serving as a coordinator for the school's design history program and a consultant for exhibitions and public programs, she ultimately lectured on a range of topics—from the Art Deco period to Scandinavian design to design theory to female designers—for roughly 20 years. She recently published a book on post-modernism.
