Futura celebrates the outrageous in Italian design: An antique chandelier made of Campari bottles swings above a '30s buffet; 79 Rivington St., 212/475-0846. Meanwhile in SoHo: At Dumb Box, Dakota Jackson's elegant gallery, people can't buy anything but they can learn about design; on one wall, a bank of computer screens displays articles on ecology and social issues as well as the portfolios of top designers; 43 Mercer St., 212/925-4995. And >

further west: Imagine a funkier version of IKEA and you have Australia's Room Interior Products, which sells everything from mini washing machines (ideal for Manhattan's tiny apartments) to tents, tablewares, electronics and furniture; 435 Hudson St., 646/638-3333.

■ As for food, the streets around Park Avenue South are home to downtown's most grown-up new restaurants. At Tamarind (41–43 E. 22nd St., 212/674-7400), chef Raji Jallepalli-Reiss excels at del-

icately aromatic Indian fusion food. Next door at Beppe (45 E. 22nd St. 212/982-8422), Michelin-starred chef Cesare Casella dishes up rustic Tuscan fare in a sunny terra-cotta colored restaurant. A real bargain in SoHo is Hampton Chutney (68 Prince St., 212/228-9996), where the house specialties are delicately flavored dosas and uttapas—and everything is under \$10. In NoLiTa (that's North of Little Italy), Bot (231 Mott St., 646/613-1312) by Thomas Leeser has a decidedly futuristic look, with its electric-pink and orange Perspex tables. Surprisingly, the cooking is down-to-earth Italian fare such as tuna and flageolet beans. At Inside (9 Jones St., 212/229-9999), Anne Rosenzweig and

co-founder Charleen Badman (formerly of the Lobster Club) offer a small seasonal menu and relaxed neighborhood atmosphere. Bar grazing on Welsh rarebit, fried oysters and a soft-shell crab sandwich is encouraged. In the West Village, Mary's Fish Camp (64 Charles St., 646/486-2185) doesn't take reservations, but New Yorkers gladly line up for the seafood staples and melt-in-your-mouth lobster pot pie. In TriBeCa, Le Zinc (139 Duane St., 212/513-0001) stays open until 4 a.m. and looks like a transplant from Paris's Left Bank. The food is first rate, thanks to owners Karen and David Waltuck of Chanterelle fame. >






- It has been a bumper year for Manhattan hotels, with over 30 openings in the past 12 months. Applying downtown style to a midtown location has paid off at Chambers (15 W. 56th St., 212/974-5656), a Fendi baguette's throw from Fifth Avenue. The interior by David Rockwell is intended to feel like an eccentric art collector's townhouse. The 77 rooms start at \$425; the hotel's glitzy basement restaurant, Town (212/582-4445), is packed nightly, thanks to the cleverly nuanced cuisine of top chef Geoffrey Zakarian. - The hot shows: Vital Forms: American Art in the Atomic Age, 1940-1960, at the Brooklyn Museum of Art, is a celebration of the period's curvaceous organic forms in art, architecture, interiors and fashions, from Alexander Calder sculptures to the TWA terminal at JFK Airport; 200 Eastern Pkwy, Brooklyn, 718/638-5000 (October 12 to January 6, 2002). Glass fans shouldn't miss the Cooper-Hewitt's Glass of the Avant-Garde, which features 186 exquisite designs from art nouveau to Bauhaus; 2 E. 91st St., 212/849-8400 (August 21 to February 24, 2002). Britain isn't all Masterpiece Theatre, the royal family and people speaking with cut-glass accents. At least that's what the organizers of UK in NY, a mammoth jamboree of more than 100 cultural events, want you to think. Among the hottest picks in the festival, which runs from October 14 to 28, is Great Expectations, a feast of British design innovation held at Grand Central Station's Vanderbilt Hall. Two huge banqueting tables will be laden with examples of the country's most cutting-edge work. At the Municipal Art Society (457 Madison Ave., 212/935-3960), Jubilee Line Extension looks at the 11 elaborate new London Underground stations designed by Britain's foremost architects. 




hen k.d. lang remodeled her 1940s home in the Hollywood Hills (MH, Mar/Apr '01), she asked her designers—the French team of Constance Delorme and Valerie Pasquiou of KenLi Interiors in Los Angeles—to create a comfortable seating area in her master bath.

The collaborative result, which at 30 inches wide and 13 inches high is a bit lower than standard seating (and perfect for pedicures), is notched into a single unit of integrally colored Italian plaster fitted with custom cabinetry. The same effect can be achieved less expensively by installing a wooden box between standard bathroom cabinets. The beige pillows are made from a waterproof Sunbrella fabric (usually used on beach umbrellas).

Installed facing the tub, the window seat offers "elegance and intimacy," says Delorme. Lang finds it to be a soothing retreat and says it has made the room easier to share. "It turned the bathroom from a functional space," she says, "into a place you'd want to hang in."



he act of organizing a home office often amounts to hoisting the flag of a significant life change. For editor Chee Pearlman that change was her departure from I.D., the design magazine she had been with since the mid-1980s and where she was editor in chief from 1993. Pearlman, whose Rolodex is a comprehensive digest of the brilliant and influential in design and architecture, found that setting up her own office at home was more of a challenge than she had anticipated. "A number of fabulous people came through here with their suggestions," she notes proudly, although her pride seems to be about her gem


of a well-lit one-bedroom apartment in a converted light-industrial building near Manhattan's Union Square. "This is a home," she says, "and there are always too many options. It wouldn't take much to ruin things in a 1,000-square-foot living space."

It took Pearlman longer than she expected to nail things down. She discovered immediately that simple decisions about her workspace could not be separated from the more complicated task of figuring out what her next life move would be. "Imagine the pressure of setting up a home office on your own after you've been in the design world for nearly two decades. Everyone is expecting a bold statement, and I just wanted someone to come in and say things like, 'You need Benjamin Moore 905 white for the walls.'" Architect Emanuela Frattini Magnusson did considerably more than that in executing Pearlman's admittedly cloudy vision. "One of the first things Chee made clear to me was that she didn't want to live in a statement," she says. As she stands smiling

slyly in her trim workspace, Pearlman is the statement here. Only her head, shoulders and distinctive black hair clear the blond wood-trimmed half-walls that surround and fully conceal her desk and chair. The effect of being in her office and not in it at the same time is deliberate. >

Work's a niche: The low half-wall allows natural light into the work space and establishes a psychological sense of separation between home and office.

The office itself turns out to be a classic cubicle set midway between the kitchen and the living area. It's paired with a simple floor-to-ceiling shelf directly across from it that works equally well for the office and living area. Surprisingly, the much-hated open cubicle of the corporate

world seems perfect here. In a small space, the mistake would be to sacrifice a room to a home office. "We found that openness floods the office with a feeling of home and keeps it in check," Pearlman says. The wide threesided desk and liberal storage options underneath are two weapons in the battle against what Magnusson calls "home office overspill." With her architect nowhere in sight, Pearlman chuckles playfully at a couple of misshapen piles of work papers sitting on the top of the half-wall. "Overspill happens to the best of us," she says.

Having the office in the center of things rather than off in a corner seems like an odd choice until you are in this apartment for a while. The height of the half-walls serves to completely conceal the office, even to someone just a few steps away. But when she's at her desk, Pearlman finds the same walls mask distractions without the feeling of being sequestered into a makeshift closet. The low walls also allow in light from the single window exposure. The layout gives the workspace an informality that would be clutter in the corner of a bedroom or a room of its own. "Because it's between the kitchen and living room, this is a place I walk by more than I walk into," Pearlman says, possibly confessing a slight ambivalence about the whole idea of working at home.

Much of the investment here is in lighting. This is a classic narrow loft space, tall but with only a single southern exposure. Sun highlights high ceilings and open brick, but in low light and after dark the space abruptly shrinks. "The challenge," Magnusson recalls, "was to open the inner spaces and give them the same highlight and drama as the living room." A vertically layered lighting scheme sets off the kitchen, office and living area into distinct zones, reserving the most dramatic effects for the tiny kitchen, which was opened up by the >

removal of a wall. In this strategy, lots of light is available for the office, but the high-intensity desk lamp is contained within the workspace and does not interrupt the overall scheme.

Pearlman's solution to working in may not be revolutionary, but she has struck a livable balance in this home of hers that now has to work to pay its own mortgage. Pearlman clearly likes what has been achieved here and often feels her new office is as productive as the one that had the sign EDITOR IN CHIEF on the door. Still, she has a ways to go. "I don't use the word 'freelancer,' " she says, twisting her face into an expression of mild terror. "That still feels like it means I've dropped off the edge." She needn't worry. With plenty of work right now, a regular design column for the New York Times and big plans (such as being a design and editorial consultant to a number of publications and design institutions), Pearlman's future, like her workspace, seems nicely grounded.







A WRITER TRADES URBAN LIFE FOR A FARM IN THE PLAINS AND GAINS HIGH HOPES FOR THE HOUSE OF HER DREAMS. By Meghan Daum

his house is only the beginning. There will be others, and as much as I love this house—a 100-year-old bungalow on a small farm in southeastern Nebraska—the future houses are what I see when I close my eyes. They are fantasies that consume me, dwellings so real that I can actually spend hours solving minute hypothetical problems: What if the house can't sustain additional phone lines? What if the bed doesn't fit through the door? What if there's a body in the attic?

I imagine a plantation-style house reminiscent of Isak Dinesen's farm in Africa. I imagine a stick-style house with a wraparound verandah or a late Queen Anne with a

molded brick chimney and polygonal turrets. It's as if my little bungalow created a monster, turning me from a humble apartment dweller into a person who will not rest until she finds Villa Exactly-What-I-Want. After exhausting all these


other styles, this will be a High Victorian Italianate with bay windows and a cupola that looks out over the vast prairie (of which I will own no less than 20 acres).

The cupola, with its widow's walk and towering windows on all sides, is where I will write. I will be able to see miles in every direction. I will have nothing in that room but a simple desk and a laptop computer. When I'm working late at night, the desk lamp and the light from the computer screen will make the cupola glow like a low harvest moon over the prairie. Coyotes will howl at it. Biplanes bringing visitors will use it as a beacon. I will wear a crepe de chine robe and velvet mules and drink gin sours from an

old-fashioned glass. Everything I write in this room will win a Pulitzer Prize.

But back to my bungalow. It's one story, about 800 square feet, has two bedrooms, a sagging porch and old telephone cables that won't support >

more than two phone lines. The oven, which is circa 1967, has broken down in the middle of cooking Thanksgiving turkey. Plywood has been glued over the crumbling plaster walls in the dining room, and some idiot painted over the woodwork.

All things considered, my house is a showplace. Before moving in, I painted the dining room Barrister White and then Cool Sausalito before settling on Riverboat Cruise, a washed-out turquoise that when covering the plywood creates a sort of rococo effect. A long-horned cow's skull (found, not bought) is mounted above the archway in the living room. Long, white cotton sheers hang from the windows. Large sections of stained glass cover the tops of two windows. On the front porch, there's a rocking chair and a porch swing, where you can sit and drink coffee and watch the cows moseying in the pasture across the road.

My house is kind of like an average-looking woman in a spectacular designer outfit. It is upstaged by its scenery. With miles of rolling hills to the north, seven acres of horse pasture to the east, five acres of natural grassland to the west and the indescribably huge, frequently Biblical-looking sky that looms above it, the bungalow doesn't have a prayer. In the designer outfit that is this homestead, the house is an undergarment, barely visible beneath the fine fabrics of nature surrounding it. Which is as it should be. To live on this farm is to live in the sky and the grass as well as in the house itself.

It is also to live in the barn, which is home to the horses, the dog, the cat, the pig and the barn swallows. When it's cold, the barn is where I go three times a day to break the ice that has formed in the water bowls and stock tanks. This activity, which is performed only after putting on four layers of clothing, is exactly the kind of thing that makes you not care about your sagging porch, because you are so glad that you have heat. And being glad for things like heat is exactly what living on a farm is all about.

This house is the first place I've ever lived in with another person (not including the revolving door of actors and graduate students that shared my apartment in New York). I live here with my boyfriend. And the fact that the house is the result of a joint effort, a comingling of tastes and chores and foods in the refrigerator, elevates it from mere house status to being a real home. He is responsible for the cow's skull and the stained glass. He is the one who found the pig at the humane society (she was a stray—a stray pig!). He is the one who goes outside before dawn to feed the animals, which leaves me no right to complain about the midday ice-breaking sessions.

I am responsible for the room that serves as my office, which is the low point of the entire spread. At least three quarters of the entire contents of my New York apartment are crammed into this 10-by-12-foot room. My office is where the ugly things are keptthe computer and the stereo, stacks of bills and used FedEx envelopes, and old sweatshirts for which there is no room in the bedroom closet. My office is where I spend 75 percent of my time, the other 25 being evenly divided between outdoor chores and the preparation of meals. >

We eat at the dining room table in front of the huge picture window that looks out onto miles of prairie grass and cattle pasture. Since my chair faces away from the window, I have a habit during dinner of turning my head around and looking outside, as if the view were a member of the family. I don't want to miss anything it has to say.

That's why I want my cupola. I want to be able to see in every direction, all the time, and not have to wear four layers of clothing while I'm doing it. That's why this house is just step one, the gateway to what is sure to be a lifelong addiction to old farmhouses in need of paint jobs and new support beams for the porch.

Although every drive in the country serves as a secret mission to find my next house—it could be around any curve, huge and dilapidated and crying out for renovation—I'm not in any hurry to leave this one. I never understood what it meant to come home until I experienced the particular joy of driving down my gravel road at night and seeing the gleam of my little house in the distance. No matter where I move, this will always be my first home.

When I'm old and sitting in that cupola, I'll close my eyes and see the sagging porch, the turquoise-painted plywood, the barn swallows dipping in and out of the rafters. No fantasy, no matter how splendidly realized, can take the place of your first love. No Victorian mansion will be like this place, the first place, the house that made me fall in love with houses.

FOR JOHN LORING, DINNER PARTIES ARE A SNAP, ESPECIALLY WITH THE REPERTOIRE OF SIMPLE YET SOPHISTICATED DISHES HE COOKS UP AT A MOMENT'S NOTICE. By Cara Greenberg

sitting in John Loring's tranquil bluestone-paved garden, you'd never know you were two blocks from Times Square. Loring, the design director of Tiffany & Co., bought his 1852 brick row house in 1996 and renovated it from the ground up. Today, the tidy courtyard, tucked away from the bustle of Hell's Kitchen, is also the setting for Loring's weekly dinner parties. He prepares for them by trolling the ethnically diverse butcher shops, fishmongers, greengrocers and bakers along Ninth Avenue, which he regards as his local farmer's market.


Loring's menus are an inspired mix of ad-libbed home cooking, accomplished in his tiny galley kitchen, and assemblage, which the wealth of nearby markets makes possible. "I know a little Cuban-Chinese man who makes the best flan in New York City," he says. "And why bake, when Amy's across the street makes wonderful breads with olives, rosemary and prosciutto?" His uniquely eclectic culinary style is the result of a peripatetic life spent in some of the world's great food regions: the American Southwest, where he watched the Mexican cooks in the kitchen of his


parents' Arizona ranch; Venice, Italy, and Santorini in the Greek islands, where his mother had homes ("I had to do all the cooking; the housekeeper was hopeless"); and not least, Paris, where he kept an apartment for 33 years.

After graduating from Yale, Loring decamped to Paris, where he learned to cook as a way to meet people. "There wasn't anyone in Paris I didn't ask to dinner, including Françoise Sagan," he recalls. Soon he had gained a reputation for English dishes such as crown roast pork with oyster stuffing, Southern fried chicken and tamale pie, a meat dish with a cornbread crust. "After a while the Parisians were saying, 'If the American boy invites you to dinner—go!'"

Today he cooks somewhat lighter fare and cooks it more quickly. He has to. He recently returned from a business trip that took him from New York to Paris, London, Singapore, Kuala Lumpur, Hong Kong, San Francisco and back to New York. "The day before I left, I had 70 people for dinner," Loring says (though sit-downs for six to 12 are the norm).

Loring typically gets home at 6:00. Guests come at 8:30, which leaves two-and-a-half hours for shopping, cooking, >

setting the table and arranging flowers, all of which he does himself. "I don't spend a lot of time thinking ahead," he says, "I go to the market and see what looks good." He is not averse to trying something new, but "if you hit on something people like," he advises, "repeat it." His repertoire of favorites includes chicken with lemon peel and black olives, an oldfashioned Moroccan dish that "takes about five minutes and cannot go wrong"; corn pudding with Parmesan Romano cheese; fricassee of mixed mushrooms with thyme; Thai shrimp curry; French country-style leg of lamb; and a fish stew with celery, olives, capers and green peppercorns. Desserts are usually store-bought, except for a simple French raspberry cake assembled from frozen raspberries, lady fingers and whipped cream. Loring eschews cookbooks (except the one he wrote with Jackie O) and simply wings it. "I've been doing it for 40 years," he says. "I should know how."

Informal weeknight dinners for friends and houseguests are usually served in the cozy dining room. For even the smallest gatherings, he hires one or two people to help serve. "I don't think it's graceful to keep jumping up all the time." As befits the design director of Tiffany, the cupboards



between Loring's dining room and a sitting room at the front of the house are bursting with dishes and flatware. The most often used dinnerware is a blue-and-white Portuguese-tile pattern (rendered on china by the Venetian ceramic company Este) that Loring designed for Tiffany. More formal occasions call for handpainted porcelain in Tiffany's classic Black Shoulder pattern, which dates from the 1790s. Flatware options include Danish art deco, Elsa Peretti's modern silver for Tiffany and Loring's great-grandmother's Victorian service. Serving dishes range in provenance from Nymphenberg porcelain to cobalt bowls from a Chinese hardware store.

Over the years, Loring has cooked for Lillian Gish, Bette Davis, Lee Penrose Miller (the photographer Man Ray's muse), members of the French royal family and a host of other notables. "I wouldn't have known any of those people," he says, "if I hadn't known how to cook." See Resources, last pages.

Moroccan Chicken with Lemon Peel and Black Olives

Two 3½-lb, chickens
6 lemons
3 cups pitted small black olives
½ cup olive oil
¼ cup fresh rosemary leaves
1 tbsp, fresh thyme leaves
1 tbsp, freshly ground black pepper
1 tbsp, coarse salt
3 lbs, red skin potatoes
1 bunch fresh Italian (flat leaf) parsley

1. Preheat oven to 400°F. Using kitchen shears or a heavy sharp knife, cut out and remove the back bones from the chickens. Flatten chickens with the heel of the hand, breaking the breast bones.



- 2. Remove zest from lemons and cut into $^{1}/_{2}$ -inch strips. Squeeze the juice from 4 of the lemons. In a large shallow non-aluminum baking pan, combine the lemon juice, olives and olive oil. Put chickens in pan, skin-side down. Set aside 10 minutes.
- 3. Turn, skin-side up, and sprinkle with rosemary, thyme, pepper and lemon zest. Cook for 20 minutes. Sprinkle with salt and cook 10 minutes more, or until an instant-read thermometer registers 170°F inserted in the breast.
- 4. While the chicken cooks, scrub the potatoes and cut into quarters if large. Put in a medium saucepan and cover with lightly salted water. Heat to boiling. Reduce heat to low; cover and cook 18 to 20 minutes, or until they are fork-tender. Drain.
- 5. Serve the chicken with pan juices and potatoes. Garnish with parsley. Serves 8.

Carrots with Fennel

2 lbs. baby carrots
Coarse salt
4 tbsp. unsalted butter
1/3 cup sugar
2 tbsp. fennel seed

1. Combine carrots and enough lightly salted water to cover in a medium saucepan. Heat to boiling. Reduce heat to low; cover and simmer 10 to 12 minutes, or until tender-crisp.

2. Drain carrots and return to pot. Add butter, sugar, fennel seed and salt to taste. Cover and set aside 10 minutes. Stir before serving. Serves 8.

Raspberry Summer Cake

One 7-oz. package Italian lady fingers
Three 10-oz. packages frozen raspberries
2 cups whipping cream

1/4 cup sugar
1 tsp. vanilla extract

- Line a 9-by-5-inch bread pan with plastic wrap. Arrange the lady fingers to cover the bottom of the pan, then line the sides by standing the lady fingers up like a picket fence.
- 2. Thaw raspberries and pour off most of the juice. Spoon $1\frac{1}{2}$ packages onto the lady fingers, then top with another layer of lady fingers. Repeat. Cover with plastic wrap and top with several heavy cans to weigh down and compress the mixture. Refrigerate at least 8 hours or overnight.
- Whip cream with sugar and vanilla. Turn cake onto a serving dish. Remove plastic. Slice and serve with whipped cream. Serves 8.





< SIGNS OF INTELLIGENT LIFE >

A that recent Consumer Electronics Show, an annual industry event, Bill Gates envisioned the home of the future with an "intelligent" refrigerator capable of tracking its contents by scanning bar codes. This way, he explained, from time to reorder, the unit could send the market a greatery list via the Internet. Do we really need this?

Closer to reality, several manufacturers—Bosch, GE, Electrolux, Maytag, Whirlpool—are working with high-tech firms such as Microsoft and Sun Microsystems to develop Webeenahled appliances that can be diagnosed, serviced or upgraded online, thus cutting down on service calls (a most excellent idea). However, most industry experts agree we'll have to wait until a common protocol, or language, for these so-called "smart appliances" is agreed upon. Until then, get a teste of the future with a number of cutting-edge products available today or in the near future.

In the kitchen, rapid-cook evens—microwave, halogen, forced-air, convection and combinations—are all intuitive. Press a button, the process begins and ends when the food's ready. Sharp's new Smart and Easy Touch Screen microwaves even have a cache of recipes built in. Of course, if you want to override the system and cook something differently, you'll have to do the math!

Electronic bathroom lancets, like those in airports and malls, are moving into homes. From the likes of Delta, Dornbracht, Grobe and KWC, these smart taps sense when hands are undermeath, signaling the water flow. This saves H₂O, especially with kids. They're also safe, because the temperature is preset. Dornbracht's eMote wall-mount in

matte platinum complements the trendiest powder room.

In the laundry, the front-loading Asko EasyControl, Kenmore HE3t. Maying Neptune and Whirlpool Duet (shown below) are preprogrammed electronically for optimum results. Internal water heaters guarantee the right water temperature. Water amount is determined by the load—no waste. And the dryers know just when to turn off.

Looking ahead, LG Electronics is introducing a Webembled refrigerator, microwave oven and washing machine in 2002. The 26-cubic-foot refrigerator doesn't dial for groceries, but it does sport a 15.1-inch LCD display for Websurfing, e-mail, videophone calls, watching TV and listening to music. It also has a calendar and message center, electronic pen included. The only complaint: For \$10,000, it should look as high-tech as it is!



Yes, it's the year 2001, but the environment pictured above is not an upstart computer's rec room from Stanley Kubrick's classic film. It's the here-and-now result of an odyssey toward inner, rather than outer space, and it's in San Francisco, not on Mars. Those who dislike spare, all-white environments may have already turned the page; even though this room is wired for totally sensual listening (and can sleep eight), it's doubtlessly not everyone's cup of terrestrial tea. The house did not land on Earth without local roots: It used to be a "normal" hill-hugging house from the distant 1970s. Among the lessons of the late 20th century are that reuse (renovation rather than building new) is better for the planet. Another is that when it comes to personal style, the sky's the limit—or maybe the limits are up there beyond the stars. The following pages feature a little galaxy of living environments remade in their owners' images. We hope they'll inspire you to explore the possibilities of your own home, and we may even have provided some hints as to just how your vision could look when you're finished. Goggles and jackhammers ready? Then...three, two, one...blast off!—The Editors











S ONE OF THE FOUNDERS of Razorfish.

the hip Web design company, Shane Ginsberg was used to seeing colleagues sink their newfound fortunes into trophy houses-places, he says, "where you don't feel you can really kick back and chill." Shane and his wife, Kate (a Silicon Valley veteran), wanted a house that reflected their love of modern architecture and would lend itself to frequent entertaining. Unfortunately, the house they were starting with was "a dump," says Shane. "Airless and dark, it was so cheaply built that it shook in the wind."

But the couple knew what a makeover could accomplish. They had taken a liking to the home architect Nilus de Matran created for his own family (MH, Sept/Oct '99) using sheets of concrete siding and large gridded windows to foster a sense of wide-open enclosure. Plus, Shane had already hired de Matran for two Razorfish projects. He trusted the London-trained architect to turn the creaky house into a stylish aerie. Indeed, Shane and Kate, then newlyweds, were counting on it. Says Shane, "The house was meant to be an expression of our love for each other."

In that case, their love is strong, open and uncomplicated. The 900-square-foot entry level typifies de Matran's approach. White walls and floors are interrupted only for essentials, such as the 14-foot kitchen island. "I'm not a minimalist," says the architect, "because minimalists hide things away. I use what's there, but work to simplify each object in the space."

HEN THEY BEGAN HOUSE-HUNTING, the Ginsbergs saw plenty of Victorians, including a few they considered renovating. But, Kate says, they preferred not to "betray the intent of a house" to get the openness they wanted. Then they came upon this flimsy, '70s hill-hugger with the potential to become, essentially, a stack of three lofts with panoramic views. There would be obstacles—the entry was on the top floor (a large rectangle interrupted by an ugly light well and a makeshift kitchen), and the roof sloped down until it reached a wide, low wall of windows. The effect, says Kate, was like letter-boxing the view.

Weeks after the couple bought the house, they tore off that sloping roof. "Standing there," says Kate, "with the views and the wind and the fog, it all made sense." Then de Matran installed a single large beam (connecting the load-bearing side walls), which allowed him to level the roof at 15 feet.

The architect had planned to use terrazzo tiles underfoot, but when the company he preferred went out of business, he switched to poured-in-place terrazzo, which hasn't been used in homes much for decades (see box). Says Shane, who was born in South Africa, "I associate it with a particular era, the late '50s and early '60s, when the line between indoors and outdoors was blurred." And if people think of terrazzo as a flooring for public spaces such as airports, that's fine with him. "Our top floor is like an airport with people coming and going," he says. "Except this is one airport where people don't mind delays." Says Kate, "We throw dinner parties here, and no one leaves."




WHAT THE PROS KNOW ABOUT TERRAZZO

Nilus de Matran opened the back of the house to sunlight by nearly doubling the amount of glass. But he knew that to create a house that felt completely open to the elements, it would help to let light reflect off a seamless white floor. The best solution was to use terrazzo, poured and polished in place. Terrazzo (which consists of bits of stone suspended in an adhesive) has been improved upon since its mod-era heydey. Now it's only ¹/₄ inch thick, and the adhesive, which was once concrete, is acrylic. That means there's less likelihood of the floor cracking as the house settles. Although it was expensive (\$24/sq. ft.), the floor requires no maintenance and should last for decades. And even though it's white, the floor chosen by de Matran is speckled with chips of black marble, so "it looks good," says Shane, "and it never shows dirt."












S NEWLYWEDS REBUILDING a house from top to bottom, the Ginsbergs had reason to be apprehensive. "Renovations can end relationships," says Kate. It was Shane's idea to give himself, his wife and their architect three "silver bullets," that is, three absolute vetoes each. "The idea," Kate explains, "was to force you to decide what you just didn't like a little and what you really couldn't live with. Something you really couldn't live with, you could overrule." As things turned out, not one bullet was fired, Says Shane, "We were able to meld our three visions."

The architecture turned out to be as peaceful as the process. Take the master bedroom: White and ethereal, it's like "sleeping in a cloud," says Kate. Side walls are devoted to closets—one hers, the other his (shown). The sliding doors are made of sandblasted glass.

The couple worked with de Matran on choosing key pieces of furniture even before construction began. "You need to think about your big pieces as part of the architecture," explains Shane. De Matran created computer simulations of the rooms, including mock-ups of tables, chairs and sofas; the couple then searched for pieces that matched the best on-screen configurations. What they couldn't find, the architect designed.

Remembering back to the days when the house existed only in pixels, Shane says: "What most enchanted me about Nilus's vision were the shadows. The house is really just a set of squares, but the shadows are diagonal, with the angles changing throughout the day. They add tremendous dynamism."



DETAILS

- 1 Tucked under the garage (see section, above) is a small viewless room. (Its only window overlooks the light well.) When he bought the house, Shane Ginsberg recalls, the room had brown shag carpeting, "very Greg Brady's bedroom." The workers dubbed it the "shag room." Shane had architect Nilus de Matran turn it into a soundproof vinylpadded lair for listening to music (a guest bed hidden under the platform can sleep up to eight people).
- 2 A longtime lover of terrazzo, de Matran has begun experimenting with terrazzo furniture. This bench, which is hollow (the terrazzo was poured onto a wooden frame), is studded with marbles.
- 3 The architect rescued the existing light well from aesthetic irrelevance. Eternit, a type of concrete siding screwed into place like plywood, is used in both the light well and the adjacent interiors, creating a unified composition.

- 4 At 14 feet long, the Carrara-marble-over-stained-walnut kitchen island "allows me to use every pot in the house, which I do anyway," says Kate. "I could perform surgery on it if I had to."
- 5 From a tiny patio at the bottom of the light well, the Ginsbergs can look straight up to see the sun—or fog.
- 6 The front of the house gives no clue of what's to come: The house steps down three flights from the street. Zoning ordinances in Ashbury Heights, this hilltop neighborhood in the geographic center of San Francisco, prevented the homeowners from building any higher. The metal gate leads to a small entry courtyard.
- 7 De Matran designed the interior stairway using metal grates instead of solid surfaces to permit the maximum connection between levels.

HE FIRST TIME I SAW this house, I thought, 'I could never live here,'" says homeowner Shirley Weese Young of the Chicago home she now shares with her husband, Donald, one of their four children (Blake, 17), a large brown dog, three cats and the occasional visiting relative or resident artist. "It was just too dark."

The 1880 Victorian on a tree-shaded Lincoln Park street "was something between a three-flat and a boarding house," says architect John Vinci, a longtime friend of the Youngs', who scouted the house for the couple's return from a sojourn in Seattle.

But Shirley is a graphic designer and the daughter of eminent architect Harry Weese, and Donald is an art dealer. They could see through the gloom, the grime and generations of bad paint jobs and "improvements" to the modern living potential of the handsome building. "I wanted every corner of the house to be used," says Shirley of her early instructions to Vinci, "and I wanted more light."

The trio never considered anything but a gut and rebuild. Vinci had the dark hallways and tiny rooms removed (preserving the doors, which Shirley, a self-described "rabid recycler," wanted to strip, repaint and reuse). Down came the traditional closed-in staircase. Off the back of the house came a two-story wooden add-on, leaving space for a deck in the back garden. Bricked-up windows were reopened and new ones cut beside delicate fireplaces that had long been boarded over. Doorways stretched as wide as those at Versailles; a new glass-brick tower in the back of the house was fitted with a new spiral staircase down to a separate guest apartment and up to rooms for living and working.

HEN MOST PEOPLE furnish a room, they think about where things should go-permanently. The Youngs wanted no such thing. They wanted flexibility. Donald rotates the art on the walls frequently, and the house functions alternately as family retreat, entertainment center and business space, so the byword here was, and is, "random." Says Shirley: "I wanted to be able to move the furniture around. I like a lot of change in my life, but I wanted pieces to sit in, not just to look at."

Shirley had met artist/designer Roy McMakin in Seattle shortly before the Youngs moved back to Chicago. She knew that his aesthetic, his palette and his green consciousness made him a perfect fit for her family's new home. McMakin's solution for the main floor was to create a few large anchoring pieces (the living room sofa and two side chairs), numerous smaller upholstered chairs and ottomans as well as tables (large and small), all of which are meant to be moved around freely. "The Youngs opened the space up," says McMakin. "But they kept the original envelope, so we still had the odd-shaped spaces of a Victorian house." And that suggested clusters of furniture rather than one overall arrangement.


The sofas, chairs and tables occupy the home with the same authority as Victorian furniture and the same sensuality-fabrics tend to mohairs, velvets, lush wools-but with none of its fussiness. "I hope that the pieces work on two levels," says McMakin. "On first blush, they seem to be just minimalist shapes. But after you spend some time, you realize that the differences in each chair-the colors, the fabrics, the shapes-are themselves the decoration."





WHAT THE PROS KNOW ABOUT STAIRS

Architect John Vinci replaced the original Victorian staircase, a typical closed and narrow wooden staircase that kept folding back on itself, with a new steel one that has beech treads. "I'd always wanted to do an open staircase like that," says Vinci of the sculptural beauty that provides light to three floors of the house and works almost as another room. It was homeowner Donald Young's notion to float the stairs off the walls, so the entire structure is anchored to steel columns embedded in the walls. Vinci wanted the staircase to be "more palatial" than normal, so the risers are 61/2 and the treads 131/2 (the normal formula is, "riser plus tread equals 18 inches"). The new steel structure is strong enough to take almost any material as treads, including stone. Thin steel balusters were left unpolished for lower maintenance.



OLOR WAS ANOTHER major issue in designing the furniture. McMakin had Shirley and Donald pick favorite colors on their own from the swatches he keeps in his showroom. He picked a palette that was brighter than usual for him and crossed the Young's aesthetic only once, presenting them with an elegant all-black chair. It was summarily vetoed. It came back gray ("I just had to have some kind of neutral baseline with all those colors," says McMakin) and was accepted by the clients.


The kitchen was another group project. The Youngs, who both cook, devised the layout. McMakin did the cabinetry and finish work. The tile backsplash was his way of making the kitchen "more exuberant than the space itself." He installed a variety of cabinets (with seeded-glass panels in the doors) and two counters, one of cherry and another of Avonite, a solid surface product that's made entirely of recycled materials and looks like stone. Shirley is refinishing the floors herself with Ardvos, a German sealing oil that promises no fumes, toxins or artificial ingredients.

The outside of the house was also renovated. The red paint that once covered the two kinds of brick was stripped. The chimney was replaced, later architectural embellishments simplified, soft green paint applied to the trim. And Shirley has been painstakingly restoring the gardens.


This once-abused rental building has again become an inviting one-family home, thanks to an artful collaboration. "This house proves what I've always believed," says Roy McMakin, "that there's plenty of room for me to be happy and for the clients to be happy."

tremendous blessing. In 1998, when Christine Miele bought an 1,100-square-foot loft in New York's financial district, she warned Brian Messana and Toby O'Rorke (longtime friends of hers as well as architects) that she had only \$40,000 to spend on the renovation—about half of what a project of this size usually requires.


"In a strange way," says Messana, "that actually made our job much easier. When you have lots to spend, every decision goes back and forth a hundred times. But with a budget this small, you really have to focus and keep your eye on what matters."

What mattered most to Miele was opening up the space and letting in some much-needed light. "The apartment had been on the market for over a year before Chris's broker took her to see it," says O'Rorke, "No one else could see past the dark maze of walls the previous owners had built in." Messana and O'Rorke assured Miele that her goals were attainable.

Before the transformation, the front door led visitors straight to the kitchen, with no sense of welcome or drama, so the architects repositioned a wall to create a small entryway from which the rest of the loft opens up invitingly. They used an existing structural column to guide traffic into the apartment; the bathroom and kitchen were left in place. "We knew we'd have to work around them," says Messana. "That suggested a lot of the layout." After knocking out the previous owners' crude sleep lofts and awkward built-ins, the architects created sleeping and dining alcoves on either side of the main living space.

NCE THE DEMOLITION WAS completed, the architects bleached and patched the oak floors and painted the walls white. They designed and installed sliding frosted-Plexiglas partitions for the bedroom and guest area to maximize what little light sneaks in through the apartment's two narrow windows.

Miele, who co-owns reGeneration, a vintage furniture store in lower Manhattan, raided her inventory for some old DuraLab cabinets and stainless steel laboratory lights, which were installed in the open kitchen. She covered the island counter and back wall in green glass mosaic tile. When construction was complete, she started hauling home furniture and trying different configurations.


Less than four months after the project was started, Christine Miele's loft looked exactly as she had envisioned it, and she loved the style-on-a-shoestring job Messana and O'Rorke had done for her.

"But," she says, "I found I didn't enjoy living down near Wall Street. It was too crowded, and I wanted more of a sense of neighborhood." So in a move that would have made her financial district neighbors beam with pride, Miele took advantage of last year's hot real estate market and sold the loft for a tidy profit. She'll live in a city rental further uptown and use her well-gotten gains to buy and renovate a country home. Again she'll collaborate with Toby O'Rorke and Brian Messana, and again the budget will be minimal.

"The project in the loft was so successful," she says, "that I think I'm brave enough to go through the whole renovation process again."

A CONTEMPORARY SPIRIT AND SHARED MEMORIES OF HOME CAME INTO PLAY WHEN TWO SISTERS TEAMED UP ON A CALIFORNIA RENOVATION.

bought their house in the Pacific Palisades of Los Angeles, they consulted their interior designer—Lauren's New York—based sister, Tori Golub. "I sent her photos, and we talked about what we'd do with it," recalls Lauren. Built in 1951, the glassy post-and-beam structure recalled L.A.'s influential Case Study houses. But it had been renovated in the '70s and '80s and "felt dated," says Lauren. "There were too many divisions, indoors and out," adds Bobby. "We decided to make it more streamlined and spacious."

"We played up some elements in the house and simplified what was around them," Golub explains. To make the main living area one free-flowing space, two non-bearing walls were removed. (Taking the ceremonial first swing with a sledgehammer, Bobby hit a structural column, "which hurt me more than the wall," he remembers with a wince.) Oatmeal-colored Berber carpeting was replaced with ebony-stained oak flooring.

"We liked the exposed beams and the way they extend outside," notes Bobby, "but the wood ceiling competed with them and the new floor." They installed drywall between the beams, "which set them off while lightening the ceiling," says Golub. "The beam brackets were repainted a steely black, because we liked the way they expressed how the house was put together."

Replacing the existing stone fireplace, with its copper flashing and flanking mirrored walls, Golub's elegantly austere concrete one has a built-in wood bin and doubles as a display shelf for the Turners' photography collection.



HE SISTERS SOON REALIZED that the house was becoming more like the contemporary ranch houses all three had grown up in on the East Coast. "Maybe that's what attracted us to it in the first place," muses Lauren. "The house Tori and I grew up in also had beams and big rooms and modern furniture. But it had an all-white living room that was off-limits to kids—and we didn't want that." Golub's design, for all its urbanity, embraces the Turners' two preschool-age children. "It's a clean, fairly minimal environment, so there's not a lot of stuff to knock over and break," Aunt Tori notes. "They have a lot of room to run around. And the flooring, rugs and fabrics are durable and easy to clean."

Tori and Lauren canvassed L.A. showrooms together, "which was a lot of fun," says Golub. "At first it was a little

frightening to think about finding resources in a city I didn't know, but it worked out very well. I was surprised to discover so many great L.A. sources and fabricators, people I'd like to work with again."

Taking out a wet bar and closing the kitchen passthrough created space in the dining area for an Edward Wormley sideboard—one of several vintage modern pieces (among them a George Nelson "flying saucer" light and a biomorphic Paul Frankl table) that mingle easily with Arne Jacobsen chairs, Alvar Aalto vases and monochromatic ceramics. Reinforcing the spare modernist aesthetic, Golub designed a versatile living-area storage wall containing a bar, books and audio gear. A Christopher Farr rug adds a splash of color, but overall the scheme is "neutral-toned with a mix of textures—leather, linen, chenille," she says. DBBY TURNER WAS MAINLY CONCERNED with the overall layout (the fireside reading area was one of his few requirements). At work, he's a hedge-fund manager; at home, he managed the removal of hedges and brick pathways that chopped up the yard. "We wanted to make it an outdoor living room," he explains, "with more privacy and space for the kids to play."

The Turners raised the wall facing the street and planted a ficus hedge behind it like those that enclose the rest of the property. They installed a lawn and a lap pool, resurfaced two patios with slate and added a poolside patio with a vine-bearing arbor. The patios were furnished with a mix of teak furniture and Richard Shultz's classic-modern lounge chairs. "The garden became more modern, like the house," observes Golub.


With the addition of more French doors (and UV-filtering window film to cut interior fading), the house is more open than ever to the outside. "I call it a SoHo loft with the best outdoor terrace you could imagine," says Bobby.

"Tori and I have similar tastes, but she pushed me to be a bit more unconventional in some of the things we chose, which was good," adds Lauren. "And she made us more patient with the inevitable delays." The result is a house that's both a reflection of the homes of their youth and an ideal environment for the way the Turners want to live today. "I loved this project because it allowed me to spend a lot of time with my sister and her family," Golub says. "It wasn't what I'd call a major renovation, but it made a big difference—the benefits were enormous."

FIRE CUITIRY-MODER

A PAIR OF DOTING OWNERS GAVE THEIR MID-CENTURY-MODERN KIT BUNGALOW A NEW LEASE ON FIRE ISLAND LIFE.



HEN EDWARD LEWIS and Glen Wielgus came across an abandoned Joseph Eichler—style kit house in New York's Fire Island Pines, they discovered a shadowy, dilapidated structure stuffed to the rafters with junk. But the men found it "well thought out and graceful," recalls Lewis, who owns a commercial contracting business. He and Wielgus, proprietor of an ad agency, hired the architecture firm Ashkar and Paul Associates, which had designed the pair's Manhattan apartment, to polish their tarnished gem.

Principal Rodman Paul knew immediately how to steer the renovation. "We weren't going to do Cozy Colonial or Tutu Tudor," he jokes. "The house spoke to what it needed to be—more spacious and open." He and project architect Matthew Bremer gutted the single-story post-and-beam house. They hauled out furniture left behind by its previous owners, replaced murky linoleum with hardwood flooring and painted the wooden structure a crisp white. They brought in much-needed daylight by replacing solid wall panels with clear and translucent glass.

The architects transformed the whole footprint of the original house into an open living/dining room and kitchen, and they gained enough space for an additional pair of bedrooms and baths by enclosing a covered deck and commandeering an old shed. Because the deck and shed were sheltered beneath an extension of the long gabled roof, the addition is completely seamless.

NSIDE, ASHKAR AND PAUL'S renovation keeps alive the spirit of Eichler's bright but affordable modernism. The dominant material is inexpensive colorfully stained plywood, which is used in the kitchen cupboards, shelves and headboards in the bedrooms and in the long wall of the living/dining area. The details are always no-nonsense, because as Paul explains, "tricky detailing gets you nowhere on Fire Island. You need simple details you can trust the contractors with." The plywood wall panels, for instance, are attached to the substructure with ordinary bolts that were left exposed. The owners figured out a clever, impromptu system for displaying Wielgus's own paintings on the living room wall: They wedged aluminum pegs into the reveals between the plywood panels and propped canvases up on the pegs.


The owners selected all of the furniture, a mostly low-cost mix of IKEA pieces but with some Bertoias thrown in. "We only spoke once or twice about the furniture," recalls Paul, "but I knew Edward and Glen were clever."

Everything about the house is open. The only doors are pocket doors leading to the bedrooms, which can slide open and disappear into the walls. There are no proper closets, just wall-to-wall grids of storage cubbies. "Who needs a closet at the beach?" asks Paul. Indeed, you just need a comfortable house full of light and free of clutter. mh See Resources, last pages.






















IGH POIN**T** NORTH CAROLINA, A

small city in the state's Piedmont region, has a population of 85,839. But for ten days every April and October, 75,000 buyers and 2,600 manufacturers descend here for the biggest furniture show in the world, the International Home Furnishings Market. The demand for hotel rooms grossly exceeds the supply, so civic-minded citizens play innkeeper, often renting out entire houses. Forget the luxuries and privacy of hotels. Togetherness reigns.

"I've been coming to this furniture market for over 25 years," says one of its key players, Mitchell Gold, "and I've always stayed in someone else's home with someone else's tchotchkes. I wanted a comfortable place to sleep and be with my own tchotchkes."

Gold and his partner, Bob Williams, founded Mitchell Gold, a multimillion-dollar furniture company whose

stylish sofas and chairs are mainstays at stores such as Crate and Barrel, Pottery Barn and Restoration Hardware. As a major manufacturer, Gold must maintain a major presence in High Point. He also needs to entertain his customers, which, given a dearth of large enough local restaurants, can be difficult. Williams, the company's creative director, spends two to three weeks here before each market to set up the showroom. So it made good business sense for the couple to buy a house.

They hunted for nine months. "The traditional houses had small rooms and no great backyard—with six different neighbors looking at you," Williams explains. When they were shown this 1950s ranch house surrounded by four-and-a-half wooded acres, Williams saw the possibilities.




"HE COUPLE'S REQUIREMENTS were very specific. They needed a place that would allow them to entertain large groups of people and could also provide comfortable housing not only for Gold and Williams and their beloved bulldog, Lulu, but for as much of their staff as possible during market weeks. And while it required a major renovation to accomplish this ("We spent more on the makeover than we did on the house," sighs Gold), no exterior walls were torn down. The 3,500square-foot house's footprint remained the same, but its flow was totally transformed. Williams devised a plan in which rooms traded functions as if in a huge game of musical chairs-the original kitchen became the dining room, what had been the family room became the kitchen and sitting room, and the screened-in back porch became a second dining room.

The biggest structural change involved knocking down one living room wall and replacing it with commercial storefront glass that opens onto a newly installed patio, dramatically brightening that room as well as the dark front entry hall. Williams used the same storefront glass to enclose the screened-in porch.

Williams also removed the old skylights, which had brought much-needed light into the dark and dreary dwelling. "They leaked," he explains. "It was easier to remove them than to replace them." But he was able to achieve greater brightness simply by using white paint on the worn dark brown paneling that covered all the walls. And it's not too plain. "The tongue-in-groove paneling gives it texture and interest," he says.





WHAT THE PROS KNOW ABOUT **ENTERTAINING KITCHENS**


"You shouldn't have to walk more than two or three steps to reach anything," counsels Sean Robinson, the corporate chef for Mitchell Gold. Along with fabric manager Alice Steagall, Robinson had a big hand in designing this kitchen, where getting out meals for 30 people is the norm. He urges having some sort of garbage disposal at every turn: by the island, sink, refrigerator and stove. He believes that two of the same appliance are better than one: Two refrigerators provide food storage backup while two stoves allow for more than one cook. Double dishwashers keep the party flowing and multiple sinks, strategically placed on the island and by the stove and refrigerator, help save precious steps. Other essentials: An adequate staging area; Robinson insists on lots of counter space and hardworking surfaces (these are Avonite). He also recommends a separate pantry.



THE COUPLE WANTED THE DWELLING to be a show-case for Mitchell Gold furniture, but Gold doesn't make what the trade calls "case goods"—tables, bureaus and bookcases. So Williams had six glass-topped steel dining tables fabricated to his design along with the dining room sideboard and the kitchen cabinetry. He then added pieces from companies such as Copeland, Baronet and Crate and Barrel. When selecting art, the men fell in love with photographs of southeastern rural life; these are used throughout the residence.


The house originally had four bedrooms with two enormous, if ugly, bathrooms. But Gold decreed that every bedroom should have a private bath. Williams's solution was to split the two baths in half, which saved some plumbing costs and also left four decent-size baths. While the rest of the house is white, Williams let loose with color here. "A part of me wants more and more color," he says. (He anticipates using lots of bright hues for the fall collections.) They had ordered imported Italian tile for the front bath (right, above) but discovered that delivery would take months. So they chose simple tiles from a home improvement center and used color to create excitement.

For the master bath (right, below), Williams selected swimming pool tile because "we wanted a soft blue." Here, the mirrors (found at a Loewe's center) are hanging on a nail with double-faced tape. Gold swells with pride when he talks about the transformation Williams has wrought. The house is stylish, comfortable, and it works. But most important, he says with true feeling, "Lulu likes it." mh See Resources, last pages.









EOPLE WITH some renovation experience know that the key to retaining sanity during an indoor or

outdoor overhaul is to create one small, perfect spot as a retreat. Garden designer Louis Raymond followed this golden rule of restoration while redoing his clients' 15-acre property in

Matunuck, Rhode Island. "There was a very small space tucked away around the corner of their house that I couldn't get off my mind," he says.


"It was just outside the sunporch and had walls on three sides," he continues. "The entire space was only 20 feet square and was oddly empty. But it was so evocative and so focused that I knew that there must have been something there at some time." It was this spot where he decided to create a secret walled garden as an intimate hideaway for his clients.

When he first began clearing away the weeds, Raymond discovered that the three points of access to the space created a "big intersection" dilemma. An area that small with perpendicular paths would never be restful. His design solution was to change the problematic crossroads into a more graceful "traffic circle."

Raymond commissioned local stonemason Kevin Baker to create a round stone table for the secret garden. This was set on a circle of pale paving in the center of the square space. To soften the edges, 12 pots bursting with Heuchera 'Purple Palace' were set around the base. Now at night the underside of the piece softly glows with small lights. And although only a few steps are needed to walk around the reconstructed garden, the formerly abrupt intersecting paths curve around the center and allow a better view of the planting beds.

Although small, the garden is packed with plants. Trees that usually grow huge—a purple-leaved beech (Fagus sylvatica 'Purple Fountain') and an evergreen magnolia (M. grandiflora 'Bracken's Brown Beauty')—are pruned

rigorously to keep them in scale with the space. To add more height to the garden, climbing roses are allowed to scamper up pillars onto the roof of the sunporch. One of them, 'Paul's Himalayan Musk Rambler,' creates hundreds of pale pink blossoms that hug the roof like a fragrant, low-

hanging cloud every June.

Clematis (*C. macropetala* 'Jan Lindmark') and boxwood (*Buxus sempervirens* 'Suffruticosa') provide further framework for a surprising number of flowers. Spring begins with snowdrops and summer features such classics as catmint, lilies, foxgloves and balloon flowers. Autumn's Japanese anemones and colchicums glow against the barberry hedge that protects one wall of the hideaway. Although herds of deer roam the hillside next to the garden, Raymond has carefully planned to discourage their foraging (see below). The only plants that receive protection are four standard euonymus that are draped in net during the winter months.


After he finished with this garden, Raymond realized that whether it's being renovated or not, every property should have an outdoor hideaway. Everyone deserves a chance to step away from the hubbub once in a while, and as Raymond says, "there is nothing sweeter than a small, perfect garden."

SELECTING DEER-RESISTANT PLANTS

Garden designer Louis Raymond says: "Face it, deer are almost everywhere these days, so you just have to look at their presence as an opportunity to search for unsung plants. For shrubs, I use American holly, boxwood, leucothoe and pieris and have no problems at all. Flowering plants like verbascums, thick-stemmed hardy geraniums, Japanese anemones, daturas and colchicums are never eaten. My rule is, 'Try it, and if the deer do eat it, don't replant it.'"









ON'T GO LOOKING FOR ANY Tex in the Mex at Ciudad. This Dallas restaurant, specializing in

modern Mexican food, is drawing national attention for the riot of flavors that comprise its sophisticated yet earthy cuisine. Ciudad is the vision of owner Monica Greene, who was raised across the border, and she chose chef Joanne Bondy to develop dishes that reflect the women's mutual love for the food and people of Mexico.

In fact, before Ciudad opened, Greene, who was determined to serve authentic food, took her chef on a hands-on learning and tasting trip. Traveling, eating and cooking in Mexico opened Bondy's eyes, her heart and her mind more than she believed possible. "I felt the passion of the people," she says, "the endurance of their cuisine through all that's happened in their history."

During the trip, the curious chef and restaurateur prowled local markets and stuck their heads into home kitchens. They visited taquerias and cantinas as well as restaurants in Mexico City, known colloquially as "Ciudad" (city), for which the Dallas restaurant was named.

Bondy also turned her determination and eye for detail to rigorous academic research, digging through books on Mayan and Aztec food, Mexican cooking and ingredients, and the influence of Spanish and French colonizers.

What emerged at Ciudad was a cuisine that is as exciting and varied as the country from which it comes. Don't expect any fusion or any gimmicks. No nori tacos. No wasabi-frosted avocados. The dishes are as honest and down-to-earth as the chef who cooks them.


Chilled sweet potato soup, for example, requires the most familiar of ingredients (sweet potatoes, onions, bananas and peanut butter), but the soup is transformed with a splash of dark, raisiny Madeira wine. Simple sea bass is enhanced by salty and pungent manzanilla olives and capers as well as the grassy, peppery flavors of fresh bay leaves. Beef tenderloin is served with a blistered tomato sauce that has a smoky hit of cascabel chilies. And although the house salad features mesclun greens, it also includes *nopales* (cactus petals) and gets its kick from a tart chili-lime-mango vinaigrette.

Desserts are equally intriguing. *Piloncillo* corn cake has a moist texture and light starchy sweetness that comes from a coconut-and-fresh-corn purée. Its richness is intensified by its partnering with caramel-like *cajeta* sauce.

Joanne Bondy is a chef's chef, a hands-on practitioner who lives and breathes her craft. After her initial trip to Mexico, she says, "I knew I had found a cuisine I could cook for the rest of my life." She has definitely made a delicious—and extremely promising—start.

RECIPESciudad

Vegetable Escabeche

2½ cups apple cider vinegar
2 cups water
½ cup sugar
½ cup honey
1 tbsp. salt
1 cup cauliflower florets
1 cup carrot spears
1 cup fresh jalapeño halves
(no seeds or veins)
1 cup small radishes
1 cup jicama spears
¼ cup ancho chili rings, seeds removed
2 sprigs fresh Mexican oregano
¼ cup garlic cloves

Bring vinegar, water, sugar, honey and salt to boiling. Put remaining ingredients in a large bowl. Pour boiling marinade over them; cool. Cover and refrigerate up to one week. Serve in small bowls as appetizers or as hors d'oeuvres with cocktails. Serves 6 to 8.

Ciudad Salad

1 lb. mesclun greens

1/2 cup julienne nopales (cactus petals),
thorns removed

1/2 cup sliced radishes
1/2 cup baby tomatoes

1/2 cup peeled, sliced cucumbers
Chili-Lime-Mango Vinaigrette
(recipe follows)

1/2 lb. queso fresco, grated (fresh
Mexican cheese)
Edible flower petals for garnish

Combine greens and the nopales, radishes, tomatoes and cucumbers in a large bowl, and toss with vinaigrette. Garnish with cheese and flower petals. Serves 6.

Chili-Lime-Mango Vinaigrette

1/2 mango, peeled
2 garlic cloves
1/4 cup light olive oil
1/2 cup Champagne vinegar
1/2 cup fresh orange juice
2 tbsp. fresh lime juice
1 tbsp. whole grain mustard
2 tsp. freshly ground, seeded and deveined ancho chilies
Pinch of salt

Purée the mango in a food processor. With motor running, drop in garlic. Add olive oil, then remaining ingredients. Makes about $1^{1/3}$ cups.

Chilled Sweet Potato Soup

3 cups peeled and quartered sweet potatoes
(about 1 lb.)

1/2 cup sliced white onion
1 banana, sliced
1 tsp. salt
2 cups water

1/4 cup smooth peanut butter
1/4 cup whole milk
2 tbsp. Madeira wine

1/3 cup Mexican crema (or crème fraîche)
2 tbsp. chopped salted peanuts

- Combine sweet potatoes, onion, banana, salt and the water in a large saucepan. Heat to simmer.
- Cover and cook 15 minutes, or until potatoes are fork-tender. Cool slightly, then purée in a food processor or blender.
- 3. Whisk in peanut butter, milk and Madeira. Cover and chill.
- 4. Pour into six 8-ounce cups and garnish with crema and peanuts. Serves 6.

Sea Bass Veracruz

2 tbsp. canola oil
2 lbs. sea bass
1 jalapeño, sliced
4 cloves garlic, chopped
1 small leek, trimmed, washed and sliced

1/2 cup pimento-stuffed olives
1/4 cup capers
2 fresh bay leaves
1 tsp. chopped fresh oregano
1/2 tsp. freshly ground black pepper
1/4 cup dry white wine
1 large plum tomato, julienned

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F. Heat canola oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat. When oil shimmers, brown fish skinside up until golden, about 5 minutes. Remove and put on baking sheet.
- 2. Top fish with jalapeño slices. Put in the oven and cook for 10 minutes.
- 3. In oil remaining in skillet, sauté garlic over medium-high heat until golden. Add leek, olives, capers, bay leaves, oregano, pepper and wine, and simmer for 5 minutes. Add tomatoes, and cook 5 minutes more until thickened. Top fish with sauce and serve with rice. Serves 6.



8 garlic cloves
4 cascabel, chipotles or jalepeño chilies
1 cup cilantro
2 tbsp. salt
2 tsp. freshly ground back pepper
4 tsp. fresh lime juice

Heat oven to 400°F. Arrange tomatoes cutside down on a baking sheet with red onion, garlic and chilies. Roast until tomatoes start to blister, about 10 minutes. Cool, then transfer to a food processor or blender, and purée with cilantro, salt, pepper and lime juice. *Makes 3 cups*.

Carne Adobo Rub

1 cup canola oil
1 cup crushed, seeded and deveined ancho chilies
1 tsp. salt
1 tsp. dried oregano
1 tsp. ground allspice
1 tsp. freshly ground black pepper
1 cup Cascabel Salsa (recipe above)

Fry chilies and spices in oil in a hot skillet for about 15 seconds. Reduce heat to low, add salsa, and simmer until chilies are softened, about 15 minutes. Cool slightly and purée in a food processor. Refrigerate for up to 3 weeks. $Makes\ about\ 1^{1}/2\ cups$.

Piloncillo Corn Cake

1 ear sweet corn, raw
12 oz. unsalted butter, at room temperature

1/2 cup sugar

1/4 cup sweetened coconut

2 eggs

1 tsp. vanilla extract

1/2 cup milk

1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour

2 tsp. baking powder

1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon

1/2 tsp. salt

Pinch allspice

Rum raisin ice cream

Cajeta Sauce, warm

(recipe follows)

- 1. Heat oven to 350°F.
- Cut kernels from ear of corn, and purée in a food processor. Lightly butter six mini Bundt pans.
- 3. Cream together butter, sugar and coconut with an electric mixer. Add eggs, vanilla, milk and puréed corn, and beat until fluffy.
- 4. Combine flour, baking powder, cinnamon, salt and allspice, and fold into batter.
- 5. Pour into pans. Bake 30 minutes, or until cakes are light brown. Cool on a wire rack, unmold and serve with rum raisin ice cream, drizzled with Cajeta Sauce. Serves 6.

Cajeta Sauce

2 cups granulated sugar
2 cups goat milk (or whole milk)
1 tsp. Mexican vanilla extract
1 cinnamon stick
2 tbsp. dark rum

- Combine all ingredients except rum in a heavy medium saucepan. Heat to boiling over medium-high heat.
- 2. Reduce heat to medium low and boil slowly, stirring occasionally, about 30 minutes or until sauce is thick, caramel colored and reduced to about $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups.
- 3. Stir in the rum and remove from heat. $Makes\ about\ 1^{1/2}\ cups.$
