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


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
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

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ARTIST ARCHITECTS

The line between art and architecture is extremely fine in the work of Felhandler, Steeneken and Wilk, Architects, a bicoastal firm that carries the principles of the Arts & Crafts movement to all they do.

Beaux Arts, Tudor, Federal, Rococo, Deco, Stick. Unlike some architectural-style labels, Arts & Crafts is a user-friendly appellation that leaves little to chance. Even the most literal interpretation — a union of fine arts and decorative arts; of artists and craftspeople — is close enough to the mark. There are academic nuances to the term, such as the fact that the American Arts & Crafts movement grew out of 19th-century romanticism and naturalism here and in England; that it sought to narrow the gap between high art and popular decorative arts, and tangentially, raise the standard of mass production at the turn of the century. Today, architecture inspired by the Arts & Crafts movement emphasizes the collaborative efforts of artist and architect in crafting a building and the inherent qualities of the building materials in use. This calls for architects, artists, and craftspeople who believe that such an undertaking is still possible.

Felhandler, Steeneken and Wilk, Architects is three partners, Elaine Felhandler, Sue Steeneken and Diane Wilk, working in two offices, New York and South Pasadena, Calif. The firm's high-end residential work is clustered in the Northeast, where projects tend to be renovations and restorations of traditional residential estates, and California, where projects are more likely to be new residences. In either case, the partners bring to the project not only their skills as registered architects and field-tested construction managers, but an extremely strong base in the building arts. Creating a motif in clay for use as a

carving model, cartooning a mosaic floor, detailing a wood-inlay pattern, or designing a custom piece of furniture when the antique market comes up short are all in the line of client service. The partners' familiarity with the plastic arts is equally useful when commissioning and collaborating with the artists and building craftspeople they bring onboard their projects.

Three's Company

The partners are a well-matched trio even if the firm name does not glide off the tongue. This may not be easy either, but here it goes: Sue Steeneken and Diane Wilk met at the University of Southern California where they both received undergraduate architecture degrees. Elaine Felhandler grew up in Northern Florida, where she alleges "there was no architecture of note," earning her undergraduate degree at the University of Florida. She then came to New York for graduate school at Columbia University, where she met Steeneken as both worked on their M. Arch degrees. Meanwhile, Wilk was pursuing an M.Arch at Yale and then subsequently studied architectural history at Stanford University, followed by work with several California architectural firms. Steeneken graduated from Columbia in 1981 and Felhandler in 1982, after which they worked together at James Stewart Polshek & Partners and Charles T. Young, PC, in New York. In 1993 they launched Felhandler and Steeneken Architects. Meanwhile, Wilk had switched gears to academics in 1986 and was by 1995 a tenured member of the architecture faculty at the University of Colorado where her research focuses on "The American Home." In 1994 Wilk joined Steeneken and Felhandler as a third partner and is presently on leave from teaching to devote fulltime to the practice.

Felhandler and Steeneken's impetus for going out on their own is an all-too-common reality. Large corporate architecture firms tend promote women into management positions rather than lead design slots. Both







Felhandler and Steeneken considered themselves strong designers and did not want to forfeit the design side of architecture to advance their careers. Forming their own practice where they could be designers and managers was, in a way, a non-decision.

Two Offices, 3,000 Miles

The partners communicate daily by phone or e-mail and exchange drawings and images via their web site. In fact, it is easy to get the sense that they have forgotten the heartland lies between their offices. "With only three of us," Felhandler adds, "it's pretty easy to delegate." There is a rough breakdown of responsibilities regardless. Steeneken focuses on planning work along with being the firm's technology expert for computers and internet. Felhandler does the

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The Need for Documentation in Preservation

major topic of discussion among some of the members of PTN, has been documentation. As a subject based on the single word 'documentation' this seems fairly simple and straight forward. However, once you start to look into it, the complexity of the possible meanings and use from a preservation construction project point of view become evident. This subject, like cream in an old time bottle of milk, came to the top of our attention in considering the type of 'documentation' that would be asked of demonstrators at the 1998 International Preservation Trades Workshop.

In one way the physical act of completing a preservation trades process is a form of documentation. It is not normally realistic to peel back the layers of a completed project in the same way that can be done by flipping through a report or a set of plans. This means that the normal process of documentation by trades people is not easily accessible to a thorough review. This by its very nature means that sometimes in the physical process of the trades, both excellent quality and not such good quality may be concealed by the finished product making it difficult or others to see the difference. However, just like a report that is poorly researched or presented through a flawed path of logic, the crutiny that it receives over time will tear it apart, the poor quality trade process will not stand up well when challenged by the forces of time.

So what is the big deal about documentation, why is there even a need for documentation of the physical process. This question can be asked in a multiple number of ways and each question can get a multiple number of reasonable answers. Here are a few thoughts on documentation by the trades. Your response to these comments would go a long way to being able to produce a series documents of possible purposes and methods for documenting trade practices.

A. PROMOTION: Documentation of work that has been completed for the purpose of providing possible clients with a greater understanding of the services and level of quality being offered.

B. COMMUNICATION: Documentation of the before and after images of a project can be used not only for influencing possible clients but also to indicate to co-workers what is to be expected on an upcoming similar project or to provide people who will be responsible for future changes with what has previously occurred.

C. TRAINING: Documentation of the critical steps that are between the before and after pictures. This can be used for educating a possible client to the complexity of a condition, and/or showing a co-worker what to expect and/or teaching someone what to look for in diagnosing the reasons for a particular condition and the techniques to correct it.

D. PROOF: Documentation of the details of the steps that were taken during the process of a physical project. This would be for the purpose of educating a possible client to the complexity of a condition, and/or

showing a co-worker what to expect and/or teaching someone what to look for in diagnosing the reasons for a particular condition and the techniques to correct it and/or proving that the appropriate tasks were completed and done in an appropriate

E. THE WHOLE ENCHILADA: Documentation that is complete enough to service a multitude of needs such as all of the above plus the gathering of information to be able to tell a more complete story whether it is immediately useful and necessary or not.

What are the appropriate physical forms that can and should be used in documentation of a process or project? Photographs? Drawings? Videos? Notes? Sketches? Text? CAD?...

It is the intent of PTN to promote the voice of the preservation trades. In order to fulfill this mission PTN would like to build a library of documentation materials to be used for showing other members of PTN how they can meet the documentor's needs within the work process and budget of their projects. PTN is looking to encourage the trades people to use documentation to their benefit. Please respond with your thoughts and, when appropriate, send in samples of your documentation process. All items sent in will become property of PTN unless otherwise arranged. Documentation of one's work, PTN believes, is an essential aspect of responsible tradecraft.

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


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


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
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


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
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
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


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Rumford fireplaces were so common in the 19th and early-20th centuries that "Rumford" was synonymous with "fireplace" and Thoreau listed Rumfords along with plaster walls and venetian blinds as luxuries a civilized man could take for granted. Masonry heaters, a tradition even older than Rumford fireplaces, are culturally important features in the homes built by Scandinavians, Germans, and Russians. Both Rumfords and masonry heaters were not clearly permitted by the codes developed with the decorative — but ineffective - fireplace of the 1950s in mind. The IRC now specifically permits the construction and restoration of these efficient and clean-burning Rumford fireplaces and masonry

Fire-Safety Lessons

The late 1970s and early 1980s saw many chimney fires caused by air-tight wood stoves and inserts inappropriately installed or improperly used by many of us following the energy crisis a few years earlier. As one might expect,

The "2-in.-air-space rule" in the current building codes is quite ambiguous in construction where a chimney flue is incorporated into a masonry wall. The rule can be interpreted to mean that any wood in a door or window frame in the wall shown above has to be 2 in. away from all surrounding masonry. The new model IRC code clarifies this issue.

regulations followed the crisis and in the next few years various standards were developed to specify how these appliances should be installed and used. Now, after the dust has settled, the best of these standards — a positive connection to the flue and UL-listed relining systems - have been incorporated, either directly in the IRC or by reference. Built upon the knowledge gleaned from the rash of fires in the '70s and '80s, the new code will result in safer building

Seismic and Wind-Load Design Issues

The new model codes also make more sense out of seismic and wind-load design issues that were often unclear, self-contradictory, or at least varied widely from one model code to another.

In most of the country, for example, clay flues were installed with an air space around them for expansion, but in the earthquake-prone areas of the west that space was often filled with reinforcing bars and grouted solid. Then again, maybe not: In California, builders and inspectors worried about thermal expansion and the code didn't specifically say the steel had to be grouted. Lots of the chimneys that fell over in the recent California quakes were not grouted or attached to the house as (sort of) required by code.

The new IRC will fix all that. The new code preserves the air space for expansion and, at the same time, is clear about proper reinforcing and grout placement where required.

Codes Still Being Finalized

Final drafts of the IRC and IBC are currently still being written. Final proposals for code changes were due on October 12, 1998, for the IBC and November 16, 1998, for the IRC. Hearings will be held in March 1999 and then the IRC and the IBC will be published and adopted by the various state and local authorities, supposedly by 2000.

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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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WOOD CARVING: THE HAND VS. THE MACHINE WHEN TO CHOOSE WHAT

Wood carving, like stone carving, has been an abiding means for artistic and spiritual expression since the beginning of human civilization. We admire sensitive representations of the human face and form carved millennia ago by Egyptian artisans; the Hittites left behind delicate wood carvings of the antelopes that ran across the Anatolian plain. Master carvers from Benin to the totem makers of our Pacific northwest have expressed their religions in responsive wood. Decorative design reaches great heights in the wood carving by artisans of the Classical, Gothic, and Rococo periods.

We do not, alas, live in a Golden Age of wood carving. Ian Agrell, a British Master Carver now working in California, observed in his article "The Secrets of Classical Carving" (Traditional Building, September/October, 1997), that there are today only about 25 individuals in America who could be called Classical carvers, with the situation not much better in Europe. The tradition of the carvers who worked in the glorious houses built early in this century is gone, Agrell lamented, as are the architects who were knowledgeable in the use of Classical decoration — defeated by the Depression, the Second World War, and Modernism. After World War II, he notes, skilled carvers went off to the Detroit automobile design shops, and wood carving declined as an option for young would-be apprentices.

But all is not lost — there are still those few dozen skilled individuals, after all, and there are alternative ways to approximate the effect of fine wood decoration — machine carving and cast composites, for example.


For this article, we talked to a couple of those remaining Classical carvers, as well as to companies that offer machine-carved or cast products. Here's what they had to say:

Hand Carving

Ian Agrell himself, who is CEO of Agrell & Thorpe of Mill Valley, Calif., is not


quite as pessimistic as you might gather from last year's article. His hope, he says, is to see high carving standards maintained into the next century. He notes that the demise of fine carving has been predicted before, notably at the beginning of this century, yet today there is a revival of interest in Classical wood carving as a decorative technique. This revival is still more one of appreciation than of knowledge, he adds, but he does believe we are entering a new era of carving. Fine hand carving is expensive, of course, and Agrell finds that the demand is high in only a limited area — those who have money, who know about carving, and who want to have it. As his contribution to keeping the carving art alive, Agrell & Thorpe also operates a Classical Carving School that offers eight-week sessions for six students at a time. The students are typically furniture makers seeking to upgrade their craft, or retired professionals interested in carving as a creative pastime.

Agrell's firm produces a range of Classical carved pieces, all custom designed, for such applications as fireplaces, moldings, and other architectural decorations, as well as some furniture pieces. Right now, Agrell's shop is

The SourceList

In an era of mass-production and stock stylings, hand-carved wood should be about as common as dinosaur eggs. Yet the growth in popularity of traditional architectural elements — in both restoration and new construction — has reinvigorated this once-neglected skill. Today, the number of first-class woodcarvers has risen dramatically — from the 61 individuals and companies the editors contacted, 27 were selected for the *SourceList* on p. 38. From sculpture to stair parts, brackets and corbels to furniture, mantels, and ornament, the skills to create handsome, sturdily fashioned wood carvings have re-emerged to be handed down from artisan to artisan. Whatever the wood species desired, whatever the project imagined, you can find the craftsperson who can turn it into a reality.




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

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
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
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
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
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
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


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
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





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




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


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
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
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
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
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


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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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THE ARTS & CRAFTS TRADITION FOR A NEW MILLENNIUM

The Arts & Crafts philosophy, which was just taking hold when the calendar turned to 1900, is proving remarkably appropriate for the year 2000. To lead off this Special Report on the Arts & Crafts style today, the Editors asked one of the pioneers of the Arts & Crafts Revival to comment on the movement's amazing durability.

As we approach the millennium, we realize that the Arts & Crafts Revival is not only focused on the objects and the style, but on ideals and lifestyle, as well. Everything from women's issues, fitness, the environment, Native American designs and culture, proper nutrition, an aversion to political scandal, family values, better education, and personal responsibility for health are issues again on our minds, 100 years later, and are just as relevant to harmony, balance, job satisfaction, and personal fulfillment as they were in 1900.

Because of this popularity, prices for signed antique Arts & Crafts furniture, copper, and lighting are escalating out of site, making them more suitable for museums than private homes. At the same time, we find ourselves more comfortable with the furnishings of the period and longing to surround ourselves with the nurturing feeling they elicit. As a result of this growing market, there's been a remarkable revival of Arts & Crafts reproduction products . . . everything from lighting fixtures to dinnerware. And even though the high-quality reissues are not inexpensive, they appear to be a bargain compared to the price of original antiques.

The collecting urge is also being satisfied in several new ways: Arts & Crafts enthusiasts can still find original Roycroft and other private press books at a good price. New books on decorating and the history of the Arts & Crafts movement have come along in growing numbers these last few years and are a collection in themselves. Also, support for new artists working in the style (not reproductions) are being collected for their own beauty — providing support for a whole new generation of artisans. And when all else is out of reach, the philosophy and Arts & Crafts lifestyle experiences recorded in a journal make a fascinating memento and are a joy to collect. Symposiums, lectures, shows, sales, and museum exhibitions provide more information and happy learning experiences. For example, The Foundation at Roycroft has two Elderhostel programs each year; the next, May 16-21, 1999. And, of course, the internet is active with Arts & Crafts news. Among the sites to visit are ours, at

The SourceList

An original Stickley sold at Christie's for about \$75,000 recently. But perhaps more indicative of the popularity of the Mission and Arts & Crafts styles is the number of craftspeople whose hand-crafted work embodies some of the same principles of a movement from 100 years ago. To create the *SourceList* on the following pages, the editors contacted 186 firms that provide furniture, lighting, ceramics, textiles, and other architectural elements in the Arts & Crafts style. That there are almost 200 companies whose specialties have been influenced by this tradition is further proof of its power and influence. On this list you'll find reproductions, antiques, and modern reinterpretations of the style, many of them using the same natural materials — including mica, copper, and oak — and some of the same meticulous techniques used by nineteenth-century craftsmen.

RECENT PROJECTS IN THE ARTS & CRAFTS TRADITION

PROJECT: Restoration and expansion of an Arts & Crafts-style house PROJECT LOCATION: Liberty, Texas DESIGN FIRM: Chelsea Architects, Houston (Robert M. Taylor, AIA, P.E., and Leonard G. Lane, Jr., AIA)

■ This Arts & Crafts-style house in the heart of historic Liberty, Tex., recently underwent a complete restoration and expansion effort. Built in 1917, this 2,292-sq.ft. home was purchased in 1995 by local resident and attorney, Nixon Wheat. Wheat retained Chelsea Architects, an 18-year-old architectural and engineering firm based in Houston, to restore, update, and expand the house, which included the addition of a master bedroom suite, new kitchen, and casual living areas. At the project's completion in the Fall of 1996, total square footage of the home's living area increased to 3,390.

Chelsea's scope of work included stripping the existing building down to the framing, leveling the foundation, and applying new interior and exterior finishes. Cement-fiberboard siding was used as the exterior finish. Mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems were replaced throughout. The second floor was converted into an exercise room and guest room with a new adjoining bath. The first-floor addition included a new master suite with two bedrooms and adjoining baths, laundry room, new kitchen, breakfast room, screened-in porch, and a porte-cochere.





The kitchen was a new addition which allowed for an adjoining open, casual dining area.

■ Designed to complement the existing residence, which was designed by the architects three years earlier, the Guest Cottage echoes the Craftsman theme of the original residence by using cedar columns and beams, stonework, and mitered glass. The Cottage still retains its own identity on the lakefront site. The Cottage is freestanding, and relates to the Main House from a distance by lavish landscaping and water features: falls, streams, and a rocky, springlike pool.

Bold, pristine geometry generates a striking form when viewed from any angle. Interior spaces are flow-

ing at the entry level and cozy and intimate upstairs. Ground-floor common spaces are defined by their locations in the respective arms of the cruciform plan, separated and defined by a central spiral stair. Mitered-glass exterior corners provide sweeping views of the grounds and lake, while front and rear entry porches shelter the front and rear axial French doors from subtropical weather.

Upstairs, the sunset lakeview balcony has a sheltering roof which is low enough to be touched at its eaves. Each of the two bedrooms is nested in a gable, offering the atticlike charm of sloping ceilings and a large semicircular window at the ends. Each bedroom has a private bath of warm brown marble, with stained-glass doors. Above each tub, trapezoid windows follow the slope of the front-porch roof, providing a view of trees and sky while retaining privacy. The cottage is a winner of the 1996 Best in American Living National Grand Award for Best Custom Home Under 4,000 sq.ft.

■ Now home to the admissions department at Vassar College in Poughkeepsie, New York, this adaptive reuse of a 1908 Arts & Crafts structure included an 800-sq.ft. addition, extensive reconstruction and restoration of finishes, infrastructure, and furnishings, and alterations for handicap accessibility.

The building renovation completes the transformation of this part of the campus into a central hub, with the adaptive reuse of former service buildings for vital campus functions.

The design preserves the house-like quality of the building and the

openness of the first floor, while providing for the current and future program needs of Admissions. While most partitions were relocated and the infrastructure completely updated, the experience of the building is that of the polished original. An 800-sq.ft. addition gives the building a total of 5,000 sq.ft., while an ADA ramp, detailed to match the porch railing, provides greater access.

The 1908 architect's original elevation drawings for the house indicated a pattern of Arts & Crafts tiles intended to be set in stucco under the bracketed eaves. While these were not installed at the time, they were realized in the renovation, with tiles from the Pewabic Pottery Company.

On the interior, the living room puts students at ease before meeting for admissions interviews. The lower level was opened as a light, efficient place for the staff to process inquiries

and applications, while casement windows overlook the campus. Furniture for the public areas was selected from the Stickley Co. White art glass and patinated copper fixtures with compact fluorescents were manufactured for the project by Brass Light Gallery.


■ The owners approached designer/cabinetmaker Walter Jaeger in 1996 for assistance in redesigning and creating a kitchen and living room in the spirit of the Arts & Crafts movement in their just-purchased home. The project required two years to complete, but as depicted, was an effort well worth the wait. The house was designed by architect Kenneth Dahlin.

The owners desired a softer and more intimate setting for the kitchen, living and dining rooms, which opened onto one another. The kitchen was the first area to be completed. Basing the design on the Greene brothers' "ultimate bungalows," Jaeger's design wove elements of Dahlin's major themes within the kitchen's context. The Greenes were also fascinated and much influenced by Japanese architecture, making the interweaving of themes easy, given Dahlin's original design. By utilizing cherry with exposed joinery, surfaces were warmed and softened. Dark art glass allowed the receding of the plane of the upper kitchen cabinets, and complemented the ebony pegs positioned at key points. Keeping vertical elements consistent while playing and emphasizing the horizontal managed to bring the kitchen lightly into the dining and living areas while keeping the essential functions of a kitchen private.


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
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The open kitchen is graced with Arts & Crafts details, such as a hand-painted frieze, custom cabinetry and center table, and handmade wall tile in earthy greens.

kitchen. Painted wood paneling, built-in banquettes, and an arched opening grace the Breakfast Room. The oak tables in each room were designed and built exclusively for this home.

Each room has an original, hand-painted frieze interpreting motifs of the Arts & Crafts style — as well as a touch of family iconography. A butler's pantry behind the kitchen provides additional storage, while the closet hall acts as a transition space between the formal entry hall and the family-centered eating and cooking areas.

■ A 29-acre retreat in the Virginia Mountains includes three buildings totaling 3,200 sq.ft.: a main house, a garage/guest house, and a pool house. The open-plan design of the main house exhibits contemporary detailing, but maintains regional ties to a vernacular building style and form, and uses local materials. The use of vertical Western Red Cedar stained siding was chosen because its soft grayish-purple wood tone is found in many historic farm buildings in the area. Local stone was used on the exterior and on the fireplace surround in the main house. Exposed trusses inside provide a continuous harmony of structure.

The expression of art and craft are harmoniously linked in the architecture and interior design. The interior

elements are custom made, in over 17 species of wood, with special attention given to details and connections of materials. The hand-crafted kitchen cabinetry is made of cherry and maple, with ebony inlays. The handmade dining set is white ash and Brazilian mahogany. The tabletop is made of slabs of Honduran mahogany textured with a chainsaw. These carefully thought-out details provide an intriguing element of surprise throughout the house.



Author Randell L. Makinson has made a career of studying the work of architects Charles and Henry Greene. His two previous books, Greene & Greene: Architecture As A Fine Art and Greene & Greene: Furniture And Related Designs (both also from Gibbs Smith, Publisher) have become important sources, but this latest effort, Greene & Greene: The Passion And The Legacy may well eclipse them both. It's a coffee-table book in its size and wealth of superb photographs (150 full-color stills, and another 50 black-&-whites), but the text fully lives up to the authoritative standards Makinson set in his earlier efforts. From the Greene brothers' beginnings in 1890s California, through their classics of the early 1900s, to their independent

but cooperative work in the teens, Makinson has completed a firstrate history of their renowned architecture (and lighting and furniture designs); a work of expert scholarship which is also a visual delight.

With Arts and Crafts Gardens, British architectural historian Wendy Hitchmough has written a valuable history of Craftsman landscaping, tracing its origins from the 1859 garden designed by William Morris and Philip Webb for Red House, to such classics as Great Tangley Manor. The ideas and careers of key innovators like Gertrude Jekyll and Edwin Lutyens are of course highlighted, but Hitchmough's book also boasts the welcome inclusion of the American garden practices of Frank Lloyd Wright and Greene & Greene. Perhaps the best news of all is that Arts and Crafts Gardens



features scores of new, exquisite color photos by Martin Charles: the next best thing to strolling through an actual Arts & Crafts garden.



After decades of collecting and researching art tile in Europe and America, Norman Karlson has poured his expertise into American Art Tile, 1876-1941, a hefty volume that celebrates the seemingly endless range of color, texture, and imagistic possibilities in this fragile medium. Happily, Karlson has also poured a lot of his collection between these two covers, and filled out the rest of the story with other glimpses of imaginative tilework, exterior and interior: Over 2,000 tiles are represented, all shown in vibrant color. As both writer and photographer, Karlson's work is authoritative; as both collector and historian, his love and enthusiasm for the subject dominates every page. And he's bound to win over even the most casual reader of American Art Tile, 1876-1941.

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

WORKING WITH LIME PLASTER

In the age of gypsum board and plaster of paris, lime plaster is an exotic rarity. But this case history of replastering at Mount Vernon shows that the properties of the material make it suitable for some specialty applications.

Being summoned to look at the replastering project at George Washington's Mount Vernon was very interesting for two reasons: one was the type of material that was specified to replaster the interior and the other was the scale of this type of state-of-the-art preservation reproduction.

Working with lime plaster has been a mainstay in my work for over a decade. It started with rudimentary jobs. These projects consisted of stabilizing the existing plaster with acrylic adhesives and then in-filling with lime plasters. These plastering materials were made up of common plastering products used in historic formulations, instead of modern mixes.

Why go to all the work of formulating and using materials in a historic manner? The reason is that these materials have endured over time, and by virtue of having the appropriate chemical properties, they are compatible with the existing plasters and have the physical properties to survive the movement inherent in many historic buildings. These two aspects of lime plasters make them an ideal long-lasting repair material.

The Mount Vernon project involved state-of-the-art restoration, or more accurately, reproduction. The Mount Vernon Ladies Association (MLVA) was restoring the North Dependency, or Servant's Hall, to its 1790 configuration. This date was apparently chosen because the inventory done upon Washington's death most accurately describes the building's condition at that time. In the recent past, the building had been used as an administrator's office and had a variety of alterations over the years. The alterations were removed, and the space was restored to its original configuration. Much of the original riven lath was intact. This was renailed as needed, and where missing, sawn oak lath was used as a replacement. One of the second-floor rooms was left unplastered, to enable viewing of the various substrata for study.

An earlier analysis was done on plaster in the main mansion. It was decided that a lime plaster was appropriate for the North Dependency. The formulation required sifting the sand through two different screens, coarse for the base coat (coarse stuff), and a fine screen for the finish coat (setting stuff). The plaster in the Servant's Hall differed from the main mansion in that the Servant's Hall had only two coats of plaster (suitable enough for the common folk), whereas the mansion (where the gentry lived) had three, rendering straight and smooth walls and ceiling for this very special house.

For the lime, we used a commercially available autoclaved hydrated-finish lime. This lime differed from the original lime used for the plastering. The original lime was probably burned in a wood-fired kiln, resulting in lower temperatures, smaller batches, bigger lumps, and the incomplete burning of the lime. The modern lime came as a fine powder, which was completely burned, already hydrated (having its need for water satisfied), and ready to be made into putty. For this project the commercial lime worked quite well.


The first stage of the project was fabrication of the lime plaster, which began with slaking our lime into putty at the correct consistency for lime plaster. The putty should be firm enough to cling to the underside of a margin trowel, but slide off with little or no residue. The putty was sealed with a layer of water to prevent carbonization, and allowed to sit for a couple of days. In the interim, sand for the coarse stuff was run through a 1/4-in. screen.

The screened sand and the lime putty were then combined in an 8-cu.ft. mortar mixer at the ratio of 2.5 parts sand to 1 part lime putty, for the coarse stuff, or "render coat." Hair obtained by the MVLA was added while the plaster was in the mixer. It was watched to insure that the fibers did not clump, and that they dispersed evenly throughout the plaster mixture. The resulting plaster was stored in leakproof containers until used the following week.

The finish, or "setting," coat was then mixed and blended with sand that had been run through a 1/8-in. screen. The ratio for the finish coat was 1 part sand to 1 part lime putty; this coat had no hair added to it. The finish plaster was then stored for later use.

Applying Lime Plaster

The installation of the plaster followed the rules inherent to lime. In this particular case, the coarse stuff's job was to cover and to hang onto the riven lath. Unlike sawn lath, which is straight, riven lath follows the grain of the wood, which can be quite crooked; working on riven lath meant that the plaster layer was uneven in places. This layer had to be brushed down with a wet brush to provide a mechanical bond for the next surface and compacted with a wood

float. Lime shrinks as it cures, resulting in small surface cracking, despite the sand added as a filler. The plaster layer was compacted to provide a sound masonry substrate for the setting-coat application.

The setting coat, due to its smaller aggregate size and richer mixture, went on thinner and had to be watched for shrinkage. Because the coarse stuff cured for 4 or 5 days, the setting coat was being applied to an extremely hard surface with plenty of suction. The setting coat relies on this suction to stiffen, causing the setting coat to be applied in two thin layers, one immediately after the first. This provided moisture to hydrate the base coat for proper bonding; then the second layer provided the proper amount of moisture for both layers of the setting to cure correctly. As the finish cured, it was polished daily for three days to compensate for the shrinkage cracks that appeared in the surface. This resulted in a very hard and smooth surface.

The Virtues of Lime Plaster

Lime has been used as a plaster for many centuries, which provides a long track record. It can and should be used in both the repair of historic structures and as an in-kind replacement in conservation and preservation work, and as a replacement-value reproduction plaster in insurance-loss in historic buildings. It's great that the administrators of Mount Vernon take the long-range view towards preservation and building stewardship through the use of appropriate materials and techniques.

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

NEW ORNAMENTAL CEILINGS FOR A STATE HOUSE

Part of the recent restoration of the South Carolina State House called for repair and replication of the Turn-of-the-Century ornamental metal ceilings.

NIKO Contracting undertook the exacting project.

The South Carolina State House in Columbia, S.C., designed by John Rudolph Niernsee, has suffered various traumas since work was started on the building in 1855. Some damage occurred during the brief visit of the army of William Tecumseh Sherman in the spring of 1865. Other damage occurred in the 20th century, caused by insensitive maintenance and renovations.

Construction of the South Carolina State House actually proceeded in two phases. The first phase of work ran from 1855-1868 (with interruptions); the second phase spanned 1883 to 1902. Because the interior spaces weren't completed until the turn of the century, ceilings of many of the public rooms were adorned with one of the new finish materials of the day: Ornamental pressed metal.

When it was decided in the 1990s to restore the original majesty of the 19th-century design, part of the project involved the replication, installation, and repair of the original coffered metal ceilings in interior spaces, including the lobby, Senate chambers, anterooms, library, porticos, and mezzanines. NIKO Contracting Co., Pittsburgh, Pa., was called in to work on the pressed-metal ceilings and cornices in these spaces, under the direction of the restoration architects, Stevens & Wilkinson, Inc., of Columbia, S.C. The principal project architects supervising the ceiling project were Wayne Redfern and Mike Frick; the general contracting firm was Cadell Construction of Montgomery, Ala. The metal-ceiling portion of the job began in January 1997, about a year after restoration work began.

The major part of the work included replacement of two portico ceilings, the entire lobby ceiling, sections of cornicework, trim on two skylights in the Main Lobby, and two

sections of mezzanine ceiling — all to match the original. As the project proceeded, however, the scope of work grew to include inspection and repair of other interior ornamental metal that wasn't scheduled to be replaced. For example, part of the ongoing restoration work in the building had involved replacing various mechanical, electrical, and HVAC systems, which caused additional unanticipated damage. In another case, workers found metal ornament that had undergone a makeshift repair with cardboard. The architects and NIKO worked jointly to solve these problems as they arose.

According to NIKO president Nicholas D. Lardas, all the metal used on the project was custom fabricated.

The pressed-metal ornament being replicated for the project was manufactured by W.F. Norman, Nevada, Mo., in custom dies. All the break-forming of cornice work was executed by NIKO, with much additional hand work required. Lardas says that one of the biggest challenges was that close folds on some of the cornice work pushed the break-forming machines to their limits. "I suspect the original metalworkers had many of the same problems," observes Lardas. Another tricky task involved making removable panels for the ceilings in the Senate anteroom without changing their style, and creating two coffers for chandeliers in the Senate chambers to match the surrounding panels.


A variety of metals were used on the job: Mullions and trim around the skylights were fabricated in bronze, some stampings and ornament were in zinc, panels in tinplate, and cornices in galvanized steel.

Installation of the new ceilings was definitely more complex than the original construction, however. In the 19th century, the ornamental ceiling panels on the mezzanine levels were installed before the wood floors, which allowed the metalworkers access from above during installation. During the restoration, however, all work had to be done from below — yet the final result had to look as seamless as the original work. In addition, the project involved a great deal of interfacing with other trades on the project; mechanical and electrical work had been done already, so NIKO had to work around piping, ductwork, and other elements.

NIKO's responsibilities also involved inspecting existing ceilings and figuring out repairs, which was not part of the original scope of work. Re-leveling ceilings that had begun to sag during renovation work was one common, but

difficult, repair. The bulk of the ceiling work was completed in March of 1998, and the overall restoration project was in the punch-list stage as of this writing. Now, anyone visiting the South Carolina State House can enjoy the same majestic interiors as visitors did in 1898. ■

The SourceList

An interior decor may stop at the ceiling, but it doesn't have to end there. Manufacturers and distributors of ornamental-ceiling products offer a wealth of possibilities in plaster, wood, composites, and metal. But along with the medallions, moldings, rosettes, panels, and domes, there's also room overhead for something attractive and functional: ceiling fans. Antique or reproduction, belt- or motor-driven, long-bladed or -palm, ceiling fans can provide an interior with seasonal comfort and convenience, as well as year-around conversation.



MAGNIFICENT MANTELS

When it comes to finishing off a fireplace, there is an abundance of mantels currently in the marketplace. The first question to answer before specifying, however, is "Vintage or Reproduction?"

In many historic properties, upgraded heating systems have relegated fireplaces to occasional use. The firebox and chimney have to meet local fire codes, but the hearth's thermal efficiency does not matter unless the residents rely on wood for fuel. That leaves one burning question for architects, builders, and owners: Should the mantelpiece be a genuine antique or a period reproduction? "There are esthetic considerations," says David Calligeros, president of Remains, Inc., a Manhattan business that sells stone and wood antiques, primarily from the New York area. "The level of patina varies. An old piece looks old; a new one looks new."

Consequently, Calligeros explains, vintage mantels can help recreate a period interior, or lend instant character to a more modern setting. At Remains, plain wooden pieces may be available for as little as \$500; stone starts at about \$1,500 and peaks at \$12,000. But for all their intrinsic appeal, antiques have certain limitations.

One is selection. Your choice is restricted to what you can find within your budget and deadline. Call salvage companies and auction houses to see what they have on hand. Paul Yandle, president of Normandy Imports, Ltd., a South Carolina-based company specializing in antique French building materials of all types, describes the process as "a collaboration between client, supplier, architect, and contractor." He adds, "antique mantels and overmantels such as ours might require a bit more communication and problem-solving up front."

Yandle maintains a photo inventory of pieces available from his French suppliers. Prices, exclusive of shipping, begin around \$3,000. Listings may include extraordinary items, such as an enormous 15th-century carved-stone mantel fit for a palace, for a cool \$100,000. Eighteenth-century originals of more-standard scale carry much smaller price tags, often under \$10,000. "Cost is less of an isssue for those seeking original pieces," Yandle says. "Our clients want an authentic connection to the past incorporated into their everyday environments."

Another challenge associated with vintage mantels is installing them. Even within the continental United States, firebox dimensions tend to vary with the era, the locale, and the fuel. Take careful measurements and talk to experts before trying to fit an authentic Victorian framework around a viable 20th-century fireplace. "You usually need a mason and a chimney person to make the hearth first," says Leonard Schechter, a partner in Urban Archaeology, a New York City architectural antiques company where prices begin at \$2,500 for wood and \$5,500 for plain, unadorned marble.

After the firebox has been adjusted, putting up an old mantel can be a delicate operation, particularly if the artifact is made of stone. "It's a three-dimensional jigsaw puzzle with heavy, fragile pieces," notes Calligeros. The different elements have to be wired together on site; joints and seams are concealed with plaster. These extra assembly costs have to be figured into the budget.

Given the complications and expenses associated with antique pieces, it's not surprising that many people turn instead to reproductions. Numerous companies serve this market; their offerings range from carved wood and marble, to molded stone composites that age like natural materials. Most of these products can be installed with ease, not to mention mastick and thinset.

Hallidays America, Inc., in Sparta, N.J., imports hand-carved wooden mantels from England. The firm's specialty is authentic Georgian- and Regency-style pieces in pine, walnut, cherry, oak, or mahogany, priced from \$1,500 to \$7,000. "We can make it to fit the client's dimensions, instead of requiring firebox adjustments," promises the firm's managing director, Robert Brill. Custom-carved stone pieces are also available from Hallidays, starting at \$3,500.

Wohner's, Inc., a 90-year-old business in Englewood, N.J., sells a wide range of machine-crafted, traditional wooden mantelpieces. Wood choices here include maple, poplar, and oak; the simplest model is a bargain at \$400, but more elaborate styles may cost twice as much. For those who prefer the look of stone, the company carries hard-cast composites for \$1,500 to \$3,000. Similarly, hand-carved mantels are made to order in 20 wood species at Edmon's Unique Furniture and Stone Gallery in Los Angeles. Prices peak at \$5,500. The client won't pay for custom work? Edmon's molded stone composites, which come in 35 different colors and textures, are considerably cheaper, but all dimensions are fixed.

Marble-polymer composites from Heritage Mantels in Southport, Conn., mimic the color, grain, and finish of the real thing. Although this company uses molds copied directly from 18th- and 19th-century European originals, heights can be modified slightly. The current Heritage catalog features 16 styles, priced from \$1,000 to \$6,200. "Two new molds are in the works and should be ready next year," promises a spokesperson for the company.


In a similar vein, Haddonstone (USA), Ltd., in Bellmawr, N.J., retails pre-cast mantels in reconstituted limestone. The four designs range from a relatively unembellished Tudor at \$1,850 to an ornate William Kent-style piece for \$3,300. Customization costs extra. Haddonstone's most popular color is the gray-white "Portland," but the palette includes a light gold, a deeper gold, and a terra cotta.

The fifteen mantel designs crafted by Old World Stoneworks in Dallas, Tex.,

are inspired by English, French, and Italian designs of the 17th, 18th, and 19th centuries. "They aren't exact reproductions; rather, they're types of styles," observes president Faye Reese. Old World's faux-limestone composite of portland, sand, and aggregate assumes one of two off-white hues, depending on the type of sand used in the mixture. Prices run from \$1,000 to \$5,400, exclusive of any dimension changes. Old World isn't the first to cast stone in Dallas. Among its three divisions, Stone Magic Manufacturing offers more than two dozen standard designs, as well as custom orders.



Fireplaces are central to Arts & Crafts interiors, so it's no surprise that the the fireproof and sanitary qualities of ceramic tile — in addition to their aesthetic qualities — led to their use in Arts & Crafts fireplaces. A number of companies on the SourceList below (see also the Arts & Crafts SourceList on pp. 66-68) supply handmade Arts & Crafts and Mission tiles. 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FURNISHING THE PERIOD BATH

More than ever, today's designer has a vast array of antique and reproduction fixtures, traditional tile, historic faucets, hardware, and accessories to create a period-looking bath with all the modern conveniences.

With the growing interest in historic styles, designers are increasingly being asked to create period-inspired bathrooms that not only look to the past but also point to the future. Clients, of course, want their nostalgic wainscoting to come packaged with all the modern amenities.

To give them what they want requires a delicate balancing act that blends old and new materials seamlessly. "If you have a traditional house, you want to keep the traditional feeling without being a slave to it," says Manhattan interior designer Jamie Drake. Achieving the right balance requires a conservative approach. For best results, experts advise making use of elements that are already there. There was a brief period late in the 19th century, after bathrooms were introduced in the home, when they looked like stripped-down parlors with bedroom dresser-like sinks; but for most of the 20th century, baths were for the most part more utilitarian in design than the rest of the house — mainly for sanitary reasons. Even when they were simplified, however, they followed the style of the house and its furnishings. For a correct period look, "you want the bath to speak the vocabulary of the house and to blend with it," says Jean Dunbar, a historic-design consultant based in Lexington, Va.

While it is imperative to keep all the rooms in museum houses in the same style as the architecture, the rules are more liberal for private residences. "It is tempting for Americans to want to keep it all in one style," says Manhattan-based architect and historic preservationist Joseph Pell Lombardi. "But this is not the only approach. Houses evolved over the years; you should appreciate that. Look hard and carefully at what is there. If you find a 19th-century house with a terrific Art Deco bathroom, keep it. I wouldn't dream of changing it." Working on a tight budget can be an advantage not only because it saves the integrity of the elements in place but also because it saves money and time.

Indoor plumbing didn't arrive in America until the 1880s and '90s, and introducing bathrooms into homes that never had them is a particular challenge. In Europe, where there are many more bathless houses that are centuries older than those in the U.S., the trend is to do installations that showcase the latest contemporary 20th-century style, regardless of the age of the house. "The philosophy is to be as glaring as possible," says Lombardi. "If you have a 12th-century chateau and you use a 19th-century-style bathroom, you're not fooling anybody that it's original to the chateau."

Indeed, even finding a place to put a bathroom without drastically altering the original floor plan can be problematic. Utilitarian areas of the house, including servants' quarters and storage areas, are the most favored areas. Such alternatives are significantly cheaper than putting on an addition.

Finding space for a second or even a third bathroom also is tricky. Most 19th-century houses, for example, only had one; today, people expect a master bath, a powder room for guests, and a bathroom for every two bedrooms. "When wiggling a bathroom into an old house, they can serve a double function: The powder room can double as a guest bathroom," Dunbar says. "It doesn't cost much more to add a bath or a shower to the powder room."

While 19th-century houses have a lot of this "wiggle room," 18th-century homes are another story. "The typical saltbox has two rooms for storage on the upper level, and they can become bathrooms," Lombardi says. Simple design, accurate period-color schemes, and period-style treatments for walls, floors, and ceilings are keys to successful installations. "If you follow these principles, the room can be quite techie," Dunbar says. "Whirlpools and Jacuzzis can fit right in."

To further tie the bathroom to the period of the house, pared-down versions of hardware, doors, trim, and cabinetry can be used for this more-utilitarian space. For example, bath cabinetry that is related in design to the rest of the woodwork in the house can be created, Dunbar says.

There are many bath products, such as 19th-century art tiles and cast-iron tubs, that have been in continuous production since they were introduced. These new originals are considered the most desirable. "Use materials that are the best but not necessarily what was in the house," says Lombardi, who advocates upgrading materials whenever possible. "Choose something that was wonderful then and that is still wonderful!"

Old vs. New Fixtures

The greatest dilemma for the designer of the period-style bath is deciding whether to restore the old fixtures or to replace them with reproductions, which are available in a variety of styles from just about every time period that had plumbing. (Although numerous fine-quality Turn-of-the-Century fixtures are available in reproduction, many of the more ornate Victorian-era ones are too expensive to replicate.) So, if the original fixtures are there, use them.

Antique fixtures can be repaired, rebuilt, restored, and resurfaced, but they can be difficult to install and bring up to code. (Existing fixtures are grandfathered in and do not need to meet present building codes.) Resurfacing is not always an ideal solution because the treatment must be repeated every two to five years. The new surface — multiple layers of painted-on epoxy — does not hold up under high temperatures or in water. Even a wet washcloth regularly left on a sink for a couple of hours or a tub left filled with water overnight can cause a recoated surface to bubble. "Recoated pieces work well in powder rooms, but not master baths, where they get a lot of use," Dunbar says.

Antiques needn't be perfect, and bathroom fixtures are no exception. Nicks and chips can even add to their charm. Polymer coatings, available at marine supply stores, may be applied to protect the finish of sinks and tubs from further

wear and to make them look nicer. Re-enameling in porcelain, the only permanent solution to the resurfacing problem, is only done by one company, Vitco Corp., in Waterford, Pa. Each fixture is blasted with shot to clean off the old porcelain down to the white metal, and then is coated with three or more layers of porcelain. Between each coating of porcelain, the fixture is fired at 1,500 degrees until its porcelain is molten and goes into the pores of the metal. Sinks cost about \$300 and tubs are \$500-600, depending upon whether the inside and outside must be done. "There is one problem," says Vitco owner Tom Vicary, who does resurfacing nationwide. "The turnaround time is four to six weeks, plus the time to take the fixture out, ship, and reinstall it. Some people don't want to be without their bath that long."

It may be tempting to install colored fixtures, but historically, white is right. Although some companies did offer colored fixtures, they were never popular, probably because they were considerably more costly. "Never do an 1890s bath with a lilac toilet," Dunbar advises. It is more appropriate to save the colors for the wall and ceiling treatments, floor coverings, and accessories. "Instead of a bar of Dial in a Rubbermaid soap dish, use an old-fashioned soap and a ceramic or nickel-plated dish," says Jan Frutiger, co-owner of A-Ball Plumbing Supply in Portland, Ore.

Hardware

The same rule of thumb used for toilets, sinks, and tubs also applies to hardware: If it's original and in working order or can be fixed easily, keep it; if necessary, replate it. But remember that the "rebuilding of the original can be almost as expensive as a new reproduction," says Larry Jacobs, president of Sign of the Crab, a period-plumbing supplier in Rancho Cordova, Calif.

The obsolete technology of some antique faucets, however, makes it better to install a reproduction that has the same look but updated innards. In addition, "Some people don't like single faucets that have hot on one side and cold on the other," says Peter Jouchmans of Besco Plumbing Sales in Rockland, Mass., which sells the product line Baths From the Past. "They want the mixing faucets instead."

There is so much reproduction hardware available that finding the right style is not an issue. If historical accuracy is important, the search can be narrowed considerably by excluding brass hardware, which was not used in 19th-century baths. However, if brass is installed, Jacobs suggests choosing pieces that not only have a protective coating to prevent tarnish, but that also guarantee the coating will last.

Chrome- and nickel-plated fixtures were typical in period-style baths, and nearly all of the old styles are being reproduced. There are different qualities of metal, machining, and casting, which may or may not be reflected in the price. U.S. and European fixtures are considered the best; ones from Asia and India should be investigated carefully. But Tom Scheller, owner of Bathroom Machineries in Murphys, Calif., cautions that "the key to finding the right plumbing hardware is where the product is assembled, not necessarily where it is made. The washers, seats, and polishing are what make the difference. If the castings are made offshore and plated and coated and assembled here, that's fine. But nobody tells you this. This is something you have to ask."

Floors, Walls, and Ceilings

Although there are many options for floors, walls, and ceilings, tile is the most popular choice. It's also the most expensive component in the creation of the period-style bath. The first baths had wooden floors and wooden wainscoting (still viable options) or linoleum on their floors. Papers, including the durable Lincrusta, also continue to be popular in recreations.

Nearly every type of tile that was made in the 19th century is still being produced or reproduced; even ancient and antique tiles are readily available. Copies of tiles made by the 19th century's greatest designers, including William Morris, are not only available, but they are also available customized, with the design, size, and colors altered to fit each project. In addition, new custom tiles are being made that have the look of the antique. "We have tiles that look like the cobblestones of ancient Rome," says Judi LaPatin, vice president of Hastings Tile, whose main showroom is in New York City. "We also have tumbled stone, which is unpolished marble that is put into tumbling machines that soften it and round the edges so it looks old and rustic."


Because tile is costly and because it is a permanent element of the bath, designers are advising clients to work with the tile they have. If the decision is made to replace the old tile, designers are using the period style sparingly. "People are concerned about resale value and are afraid to go too far," LaPatin says. Instead of creating authentic treatments, in most cases they are choosing a trim or even a color that reflects the desired period. "The tile should look integrated," says Selene Seltzer, owner of Designs In Tile in Mt. Shasta, Calif. "Those who walk into the room should say, 'I like the room,' not 'I like the tile.'"

There is a renewed interest in Arts & Crafts tiles and in the colorful tiles of the 1940s. Although glazed and unglazed tiles are about the same price, glazed is the most popular because it is versatile enough to be used inside and outside. There is a trend to use more, not less, tile in bathrooms, with Europe leading the way by tiling not only the floors and walls but also the ceiling. Proper installation is paramount. "Don't skimp on this," Seltzer says. "There are lots of installations that have lasted 50 or 60 years."

Stained-Glass Windows

Although there is no historical precedent for placing stained-glass windows in bathrooms (they were used in other rooms of 19th- and early-20th-century houses), they are being used extensively today in baths to evoke earlier periods. They offer a more sanitary way than other window coverings, such as curtains, to provide privacy. They also let in light, provide ventilation, and add a significant architectural element to the room. Stained-glass artist Lyn Hovey, president of the Boston studio that bears his name, says designers are also ordering illuminated stained-glass skylights and illuminated stained-glass mirrors in period-style designs ranging from Art Nouveau to Arts & Crafts. "They give soft illumination at night," he says, "and have a reflective quality" that makes the image and the room look larger.

In some areas, building codes prohibit the use of glass within 6 feet of the tub, so to get around this rule, designers are installing safety glass over the stained glass. To protect the stained-glass windows from water damage, Hovey uses bronze sash or restores the existing steel sash. "Often people throw away beautiful old sash. I advocate reusing them because they add character. Even wood windows, if properly maintained and property painted, are fine in the bathroom."

The 1950s

The definition of the period-style bath is rapidly changing as aging baby boomers try to recreate their past and as the old century comes to a close. The latest new "old" style is the 1950s bathroom. "When we started in business in 1979," says designer Lora Creswick of In the Works Construction & Design, Inc., in Portland, Ore., "most people said, "'I want a modern bath in my old house.' Now they are saying that they want a 1950s bath in their 1950s house because that decade has become chic."

Although there is no widespread movement to recreate 1950s bathrooms instead of gutting them, many of those clients who do have them are commissioning updates

THE "OR APPROVED EQUAL" TRAP

On custom lighting jobs, when unqualified people determine what is "equal" to the original specification, the entire project may be severely compromised.

When God said, "Let there be light," and then saw that the light was good, a number of messages were conveyed. Among them was that artificial light, like natural light, is of utmost importance in our well-being and daily performance. Furthermore, in the design and/or restoration of building interiors, light is essential. Without it — or with the poor handling of it — attractive architectural details will lack definition or be lost entirely.

I have always found it interesting that when architectural designers initially put pencil to paper (B.C.: Before CADD), they seem to concentrate entirely on architectural design. They relegate illumination to secondary status, seemingly forgetting that without it much of their work is in jeopardy. Is it a budget constraint, or is lighting just not considered that important?

On the other hand, sophisticated architectural designers take pains to integrate lighting and architecture. They also recognize that they need to protect the design from unauthorized changes and substitutions. This is the step where many good intentions go awry.

May This Project Be Safe from Capricious Changes

The experienced designer is painfully aware of the dangers inherent in specifications with the seemingly sensible catch-all protective clause of "or approved equal." With respect to important architectural features, experience has taught us that even though the clause may be valid, many times the people who are judging what constitutes an "equal" may not have the expertise or sufficient interest to make an informed decision.

Years ago when the architectural design process was less complicated and architects had full control of their work, they made the judgment as to what was suitable and what was not. I suppose those were considered the good old days. As more and more consultants — both design as well as financial — entered into the process, the approval of suitable building components became the purview of others with interests that might often be at odds with the architect's. Over time, knowledgeable builders, building owners, and developers have realized the shortcomings of the dissipation of authority. Thankfully, the pendulum now seems to be swinging back to centralized responsibility when it concerns important architectural features.

Make Custom Lighting A Separate Contract

After many years spent as part of design teams working on a wide range of lighting projects, I'm often asked how best to protect the accepted final design. The answer lies in remembering that custom or special lighting is totally different from run-of-the-mill standard 2-by-4-fluorescent fixtures or recessed downlights. The most successful procedure is to remove the custom lighting portion of the contract from the responsibility of the contractor and stipulate that it be supplied by the owner.

Making the custom-lighting portion of the project the owner's responsibility does three things: (1) It provides the owner, who is financing the project, the opportunity to supply what he wants and what he approved at the outset; (2) By eliminating the various contractor and sub-contractor mark-ups which are an accepted procedure in the building industry, overall costs may be lowered; (3) It speeds up the review and approval process considerably. It also provides the owner and architect the ability to better supervise the fabrication and/or restoration of the lighting fixtures.

The SourceList


From restorations of original fixtures to "document" duplications of original fixtures, many of the companies listed (pp.150-158) have the capabilities to do custom work (as indicated by the "% Custom" column), and have been called upon to do projects — from the monumental to the highly specialized — around the country.

In addition, historic sites like Colonial Williamsburg or Frank Lloyd Wright's houses have had their fixtures duplicated, with catalogs available full of fixtures in styles from Colonial to Arts & Crafts. Many of the reproductions are much like the originals in their fabrication detailing.


Many companies still employ methods used a hundred years ago — casting, hand-forging, stamping, and turning — in some of the same materials, including brass, cast iron, hand-blown glass, and mica. The use of modern alloys and more durable finishes has helped improve the process, thus keeping historical fixtures an economical alternative to cookie-cutter lighting.

Items to be Protected

The custom lighting to be protected by a separate contract can take many forms. For example, custom lighting could cover the restoration of existing lighting equipment in order to maintain the historic integrity of the structure. This could include restoration of structural lighting-fixture components to return them to their original splendor, and replacement of outdated electrical components with current technology. The objective is a restored lantern or chandelier that looks like the original, yet performs in accordance with cur-

As part of Detroit's downtown revitalization, Capitol Lighting was called in to restore (there was a bird's nest inside one!) and fabricate (the head was missing entirely from the other) two sconces that flank the entrance to an office building. Restoration included stripping the fixture down to bare metal, which revealed its copper and bronze design; polishing the piece; and application of an exterior varnish. The only way to tell the newly fabricated fixture from its twin is that the former has weld marks inside.

rent codes and physical expectations.

Custom lighting could also be the replication of existing decorative fixtures. It entails the cleaning and disassembly of existing historical lighting elements and using those elements as patterns for making additional fixtures. Properly executed, the replications are indistinguishable from the originals.

Critical Step: The Working Drawings

Experience has taught us that verbal communication between the lighting specialist and architect is not enough. It is a good beginning, but leaves glaring gaps that can only lead to misunderstandings. The first step after verbal

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
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


discussions is producing simple sketches. This provides the design collaborators the opportunity to refine the verbal dialogue into something visual to agree on. The sketches then proceed through a revision and refinement process ending with a consensus design rendered as a detailed working drawing acceptable both architecturally and technically, from a lighting point of view.

The final working drawing has to identify materials, finishes, sizes, and components and is usually a full-size illustration of the final product. Indeed, the final full-size drawing can be ten and even fifteen feet long. The drawing can actually be suspended in the space it will ulti-

mately occupy to provide the design team the opportunity to make spatial determinations with respect to size and configuration. After all the approvals are received and the final design passes muster, the drawing can be used by the craftsmen involved in supplying various component parts, all working from the same full-size drawing, ideally resulting in all the pieces of the puzzle fitting into place and matching one another — providing a successful conclusion to the design process.

In the economic atmosphere of high construction costs and the desire to minimize unnecessary expenses, building owners have made every effort to review costs and institute guarantees in the design process to insure that they get the very best value for the money they spend. While this desire is commend-

able, the process of adding layers of consultants and additional review procedures are often more for the building owner's comfort level than the success of the final product. The dilution of the architect's authority and addition of one more step in the review process serves little purpose. However, the resolution of this situation is a difficult discussion for the architect and owner to undertake. In this area, the architect and owner seem to think they are at cross-purposes with one another — a mistaken conclusion because both want the final product to be economical, tasteful, and successful in the broadest terms.

I hope that by focusing on procedures for the custom-lighting package this short article can be used by the architect to help convince the owner to authorize more responsibility on the critical components of the lighting package; in this case, "less is not more." Giving the key designer more influence and more command — with appropriate accountability — is the best way to achieve a successful product.


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
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
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
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






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
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majority of the elevation studies and Wilk works on architectural development of the interiors. These lines are more often than not blurred, notes Wilk, "because we feed off each other a lot."

The three partners share common strengths both academic and practical. Each has a strong architectural-history background along with on-site experience managing large projects. They like the same kind of architecture, which makes everything a little easier. When pressed for a favorite style each offers Arts and Crafts, albeit loosely defined to include a diverse range of work roughly overlapping in time period Charles Rennie Mackintosh, early Frank Lloyd Wright, Eliel Saarinen, the Secessionists, Wiener Werkstette, and of course the American Arts & Crafts masters, Greene & Greene. A simpler explanation may be what Felhandler volunteers: "We like working on quirky buildings." Quirky, Steeneken swiftly adds, is not negative, merely shorthand for work executed or inspired by intuitive designers who were not overly rigorous



about a formula — designers who provide an element of surprise in their compositions.

Beyond Arts & Crafts

FSW Architects' projects reflect an extremely wide range of historical bases not exclusive to Arts & Crafts. Their inspiration comes from a group of late-19th- and early-20thcentury styles they place under the umbrella of the Aesthetic Movement. "Strictly speaking," says Steeneken, "the Aesthetic Movement refers to the English Arts & Crafts or Edwardian periods of architecture and decorative arts, such as the work of William Morris, Phillip Webb, and Edward Burne-Jones. We expanded the label to include an assortment of turn-of-the-century styles that incorporated decorative arts and were influenced by Morris or each other. We like the label because people don't have a preconception of what it includes like they do of the term Arts & Crafts." (The firm's web site, www.fswarchitects.com, includes a wonderful overview of Aesthetic Movement style periods.)

This short list of projects gives an idea of just how expanded the range is: a mountain house combining Scandinavian influences with western-lodge architecture; the overhaul of a 1980s contemporary house to evoke the architecture of the Viennese Secessionists; major additions to a Collegiate Gothic estate from the late 1920s, a new French manor house in Glendora, Calif., and an addition in Normanstyle brick and halftimbering. Of course the firm has projects drawing from Ameri-


can Arts & Craft precedent, too. Think not of quaint, Craftsman bungalows and little stone houses, however — titanic cottages may be more apropos of their

The partners' thorough understanding of traditional architectural styles is not a prescription for replication as much as it is an opportunity for synthesis and exploration. They view their work as derived from a collective memory of things they know and images they have seen, where capturing the spirit of a particular style or time is more important than accurately reproducing details. "You can build in any style and do it beautifully," explains Wilk, "because each style has its own rules. If you understand these, along with universal rules like proportion and balance — and have a good eye — you can work freely within the context of a style. You can make something new that still reminds people

of something old. This is fun.

Philosophies


Felhandler, Steeneken and Wilk take the concept of full service well beyond standard models. They seem to embody one of Gustav Stickley's nicest quotes: "The style of the house must suit the lie of the land and the happiness of the owner." (More Craftsman Homes, 1912). "Architecture is ultimately a service industry," notes Felhandler as she ticks off what they do to achieve client happiness: selecting books to help a client better understand an architectural style and its precedents; posting project drawings on the internet so a client can share the latest developments with far-flung family members; sourcing

and buying the perfect antique or a room full of furnishings; even unpacking and organizing. "I think some of our clients want us to organize their lives," jests Felhandler. Full service is saying yes and then figuring out what you might do. When a client asked FSW to design a high-end "pet lounge," they went to work on dog-operable doors and scientific litter boxes. They have a client who buys exquisite, but curious, artifacts and says, "Here, do something with it." Soon they are designing a piece of furniture or even a room to accommodate said artifact. This part of their philosophy, says Felhandler, "is not really anything bigger than trying to give the client more than they want."

FSW Architects' philosophy of full service dovetails nicely with their other philosophy: no detail is too small for scrupulous attention. In fact, this could be their hallmark. "People hire us because they want something different; something that is a little more detailed," says Steeneken. Sticking to their Arts & Crafts bearings, the partners are exacting in their choice of materials and finishes. Even in transitional, borderline modern styles, such as the firm's Viennese-inspired work where details appear slicker and machined — glossy wood-inlay panels and brushed aluminum — the natural qualities and beauty of each material is no less elegantly expressed. Paint is used on cabinets in, say, a Georgian-style kitchen, but natural finishes for woods and metals are more common to FSW's work. As Stickley's directive states, a material should be finished "in such a way that all its friendliness is revealed."

Detailing with Artists

Detail is where artists and craftspeople enter the architecture equation. FSW Architects' focus on architectural detail keeps them in close collaboration with the artists and specialty contractors they work with. Some of the companies they frequent include: Moorland Studios, Samuel Yellin Metalworkers, and Les Metalliers Champenois for metals; Pittsburgh Stained Glass and Judson Studios

for art glass; and ICI Industries and George Street Joinery for carpentry. Felhandler, Steeneken and Wilk are all grateful that this level of building craft is available and thriving. Such was not the case in the 1960s and 1970s. At least in the East they credit some of the old money — the Mel-Fricks, lons, Carnegies, et al. - for keeping traditional craftspeople at work on family estates through the lean years when quick and cheap ruled in residential construction, and restoring old houses was not so much in vogue.

The studios and workshops reciprocate the gratitude for architects like FSW and not only for the obvious reasons. "I'll work anywhere," says David Cann, of Moorland Studios; "I'll move heaven and earth for a really interesting project, and FSW finds the really interesting projects." Moorland gets the firm's "oddball metal projects," he explains, a range that includes replicating a German wrought-iron gate from the 1780s, and the cleaning and patination of bronze garden sculptures and custom stainless-steel pieces. Moorland Studios has been working with FSW since 1990. Cann heads the ornamental-metal-fabrications operations and his wife, Constance Bassett, oversees a preservation and restoration division specializing in copper-based metals.

Clare Yellin is president of Samuel Yellin Metalworkers and granddaughter of Samuel Yellin. Yellin was a master Philadelphia designer, craftsman, and teacher of metalwork in the early years of this century, whose work is visible and lauded across the country. Since its founding in 1909 by Samuel, operation of the Yellin metalworks has passed through the family grandfather, mother, mother, and now granddaughter. Yellin estimates that the studio, located in Bryn Mawr, Penn., has completed about 100 pieces for FSW and notes that "without artist-architects like Sue and Elaine, the crafts would simply die out." She is committed to seeing the craft of metalworking flourish and works with a foundation that preserves her grandfather's li-

brary, drawings, archive, and antique ironwork collection. Today, the five-person shop fabricates in iron and non-ferrous metals and can work from original drawings in the Samuel Yellin archive or custom designs.

Artists at Heart

Felhandler, Steeneken and Wilk work closely with the carpenters, stone masons, metalworkers, and other building artisans they commission. Why? They genuinely love the arts. They want the work they commission to be perfect and they are not afraid to reject it when it is not. They enjoy watching someone perfecting his craft through FSW's ever-more-challenging projects. The partners' affinity with artists and craftspeople, as well as their fondness for architecture and decorative arts of the Arts and Crafts movement, may well result from their being artists themselves. Wilk is a painter and cellist, Steeneken an accomplished painter and sculptor, and Felhandler particularly talented in furniture design and photography.

Wrong Century?

While Arts and Crafts describes a well-known and well-loved style of house, interior, and furniture from nearly a century past, it holds even more contemporary relevance as a transferable set of principles — a working philosophy, you might say. Creating buildings and spaces that replicate or derive closely from the Arts and Crafts architecture of the original movement is certainly a good thing. What the work of Felhandler, Steeneken and Wilk, Architects shows is that the principles that started it all can also successfully be adapted to most architecture. Why should a 19th-century idea work so well at the edge of the 21st? Because it's a good one. And that should never change.


