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## PROFILE EINHORN YAFFEE PRESCOTT

# **MIXED COMPANY**

Einhorn Yaffee Prescott Architecture & Engineering has developed specialized expertise and a preservation ethic across its mix of architects, engineers, and specialists.

ngineers and architects don't always sit happily at the same table when a building renovation is at stake. When Einhorn Yaffee Prescott Architecture & Engineering (EYP) was formed 30 years ago, the founding partners envisioned a culture integrating the two disciplines. This culture exists today in the firm and continues to yield not only friendly words across the table, but also extremely innovative, highly successful projects.

EYP now counts a staff of 420 in four offices: Albany, New York, Boston, and Washington, D.C. The architects, engineers, interior designers, and technical support staff are mixed throughout the offices. Mark Thaler, AIA, a principal in the Historic Preservation Group, believes that this vision of integration accounts for the firm's excellent reputation in historic preservation and building rehabilitation. "Early on, EYP recognized the importance of integrated architecture and engineering. If we simply restore the architectural finishes without putting in the infrastructure that people today count on being there, we're not doing our jobs; the buildings are not going to be successful."

In this article, four leaders of the firm's Historic Preservation Group discuss their current projects and how the culture of integration plays out in the field.

### Investigative Techniques for Buildings

Principal Marie Ennis, P.E., combines an engineering background with an historic preservation degree from Columbia University. Early in her career, she collaborated on a grant from the Army Corps of Engineers to implement various nondestructive techniques in the evaluation of historic building systems. Following this work, Ennis went on to chair the American Society for Testing Materials' subcommittee on nondestructive evaluation techniques. This interest in how nontraditional technologies used in building evaluation can be integrated into assessment and restoration work has kept Ennis and her colleagues on top of new tools.

In 1994, when EYP was working on the Jefferson Memorial, Ennis connected with a scientist who could do impact echo testing in order to investigate what appeared to be superficial cracks in the Memorial's marble columns. Without opening up the columns, the team was able to determine the depth of each crack. At the time, Ennis recalls, "We had to seek these people out. The technology came from the concrete industry, where it was used to check subsurface delaminations. It had not been applied to investigating historic structures." Similar borrowings have led to the use of infrared thermography, x-ray, electromagnetic detection, and ground-penetrating radar.

### Federal Hall

At Federal Hall in New York City, EYP is using ground-penetrating radar to map voids beneath the subbasement slabs and is installing a computerized monitoring system to track the building's movement. Ennis is in charge of the project, which began in the days after September 11th. The collapse of the World Trade Center created a seismic event at Federal Hall, which stands only blocks away. There was concern about new damage to the building, which has a history of foundation problems. Federal Hall was built in the 1840s on the site where once stood the building in which George Washington took his oath of office. Its history goes way back, as do its cracks. The building is constructed of massive load-bearing masonry making it very heavy for its size. "I've never seen anything quite like it," says Ennis. "There is no steel. The exterior is marble, the interior piers and bearing structure are brick. The roof is marble supported by brick arches. It was used as a subtreasury so it has vaults. It is one very, very massive little building." In 1910, when a taller neighbor was built directly to the east, Federal Hall's foundation was underpinned on the east side. In the 1930s, when the subway line was constructed along the west side, underpinning was again added on one side. This was followed by years of infrastructure upgrades to serve the Wall Street area — water mains, communication lines, and other subterranean mysteries. Water main breaks, constant subway rumblings: it's no wonder, says Ennis, that "this building has been sinking in the middle where they didn't do anything."

going in, before we do anything, to make sure the building doesn't move while we are working," says Ennis. She also adds that the system will be kept in place beyond the restoration work so that EYP engineers can monitor the building weekly from their desktop computers. After installing the monitoring system, focus moves to the subbasement where, working with an archeologist, EYP will dig several test pits to expose the old foundation. Ground-penetrating radar will be used over the entire subbasement to look for voids. Ennis says permanent repairs will probably be a combination of underpinning and soil grouting.

The National Park Service, which oversees this National Monument, hired EYP to investigate and remedy structural problems as well as overhaul the mechanical systems. Federal Hall was designed by Ithiel Town and Alexander Jackson Davis in 1842 with obvious references to the Parthenon. references to the Parthenon.

One of the questions Ennis hopes

to answer with the monitoring is whether sustained vibrations bother old buildings. The subway rumbles past Federal Hall's foundations every five to ten minutes, 24 hours a day. "Some people say no, not at all," says Ennis. "My experience is that it can be detrimental. We'll have the opportunity to monitor the building as the subway goes by. We have seismographic monitors and other gauges that measure factors like plumbness, temperature, humidity, and crack movement from the subbasement to the attic. The system will show us how the vibration travels through the building."

Once the foundation has been stabilized, renovation work will begin. The HVAC system, which dates from the early 1980s, will be replaced and the security systems will be completely redesigned.

## Preservation as a Design Discipline

David Fixler, AIA, has more than 20 years of experience in architectural design, the bulk of which has been applied to restoration and renovation projects. Coming from an M.Arch and art history background, rather than a program focused primarily on preservation, Fixler believes that preservation work should be viewed as a design discipline. "There has traditionally been a sort of adversarial relationship between the preservation and architectural community," he says. "We try to maximize the design opportunities in our preservation work. A preservation approach should not limit design or technical innovation. We simply have to formulate the most appropriate response to every unique problem."

The plan is to start at the bottom and work up. "A monitoring system is

## Iowa's Old State Capitol

One of Fixler's current projects is restoration of the University of Iowa's Old State Capitol following a devastating 2001 fire. It's called the Old Capitol because the capitol was ultimately moved from Iowa City to Des Moines. It then became the centerpiece of what has become the University of Iowa.

The Old Capitol was built in 1839-1840. The three-story Greek Revival structure is predominantly limestone bearing-wall construction. The 50-ft. cupola is a wooden superstructure with a gilded copper dome. EYP was retained in association with consulting architects OPN Architects, of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, after the superstructure was completely destroyed by fire a fire caused by an asbestos removal contractor using an open flame to remove a heavy coating that had been applied to the exterior woodwork in the 1970s.

Fixler notes that in addition to posing technical complexities, the capitol is an emotionally charged building. "Everyone in the state has something to say about it. When we have a major meeting it's on the nightly news."

The 25-ft. (diameter) dome is being constructed in one piece, off site. The sheathing is layers of steamed, tongue-and-groove oak boards over which metalwork and gilding will be laid. Once the assembly is complete it will be trucked to the site and put in place by crane.

Fixler compares the University of Iowa fire to the 1895 fire at the University of Virginia — a situation where disaster created opportunity. The rotunda fire at the University of Virginia spurred the McKim, Mead and White campus expansion. The University of Iowa is doing something similar on a smaller scale. It is revitalizing the exhibits and public spaces housed in the Capitol and doing restoration throughout the historic spaces. A polychromatic paint scheme, based on original period research conducted by EYP, will replace the monochromatic scheme from the 1970s. Interior plaster, millwork, and wood floors will also be restored or replaced.

### **Inescapable Info Tech**

The Iowa project exemplifies the EYP practice of providing the most targeted project team regardless of staff members' physical location. Fixler is coordinating the project in Boston, the structural work is being done in the New York office, and Chalifoux, in Washington, D.C., provides important details relating to his experience with sheet metal work.

Information technology (IT) is key to this mode of operation. At EYP it is also well integrated. A strong, innovative IT group gives EYP's project teams the flexibility to work efficiently across offices and across the nation. One of the factors that makes this reliance on ever-advancing technologies possible



This creates a design challenge: "We have to be careful about people's emotions and nostalgia; what they think the building should be versus what, based on historical research, it might actually have been." Fortunately, the building is well documented and EYP's plan to deliver as authentic a restoration as possible, even correcting some details that were misinterpreted during prior repairs in the 1920s and '70s, has been endorsed.

The team succeeded in finding a way to reconstruct the superstructure from locally grown oak, while meeting all current codes. "It's an economically and structurally sound solution. The functionality of the dome has been improved in small ways without sacrificing the authenticity," says Fixler. For example, EYP architect Matt Chalifoux, AIA, designed a shutter-like oculus incorporating a flag pole, thus eliminating the need to send someone out to stand on the top of the dome during construction, which was no longer considered acceptable from a safety standpoint.

### Integrating Design and Construction

Chalifoux holds degrees in architecture and historic preservation and has 20 years experience in the field. While his projects have ranged widely in type, almost all involved the sensitive insertion of modern systems and technologies into old buildings. Chalifoux can speak to an entirely different type of integration. His latest project, the rehabilitation of the U.S. Naval Academy's Luce Hall in Annapolis, Md., is a design/build project. This increasingly popular method of delivery, particularly for government and university projects, is fast, fixed price, and wholly dependent on coordination between not only architects and engineers, but also a prime contractor.

Naval Academy representatives prepared a detailed program document outlining everything that had to be delivered in the renovation. EYP's team of engineers, architects, and preservation specialists collaborated with Forrester Construction to submit a proposal that was ultimately chosen by the client. Luce Hall is a historic landmark, says Chalifoux, so "the contractor had to be comfortable with what we were anticipating having to do from a preservation standpoint. We had to be confident that the State Historic Preservation Office would sign off on the solutions proposed. We needed to be on the same side of the table; it's the only way the project was going to be successful."

Luce Hall needed to be brought into the 21st century of military training. Its primary tenant has always been the Department of Seamanship and Navigation. In 1920, the midshipmen needed the entire third floor open to practice signal flagging. Today, a Netcentric Operational and Warfighting Center will be the nucleus, along with technologically advanced teaching spaces and simulation rooms. Over the years, layers of renovations had created a jumble of less than fully functional spaces. With the exception of the historic stairwells, elevator, and planetarium, the EYP/Forrester project involves completely removing the old interior of the building, including mechanical systems. New technology going into the building creates its own complicated mechanical challenges, but it also throws significantly larger loads on the HVAC system. This, explains Chalifoux, is one of the biggest challenges of the project. "It's a balancing act between making the technology work for the client while at the same time recognizing that we can't go outside the footprint of the building."

Chalifoux notes that his role as preservation architect is to make sure the final solutions meet the preservation standards required of the project. More importantly, he says, he is there to help the team produce the best project it can, whether or not it is a preservation issue in question. "Luce Hall is a great example of how teams are put together and work together," he says.

## Architects and Engineers Under One Dome

Mark Thaler, AIA, is currently principal in charge of one of the firm's larger projects, the rehabilitation of the Washington State Capitol in Olympia, Wash. His degrees in both architecture and building science from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, as well as 20 years in the field, bode well for a project that combines fine historic fabric with engineering inventiveness. EYP is responsible for \$45 million of the \$54 million overhaul, which is being coordinated by NBBJ Architects.

Verstraeren*  The goal of the project is to upgrade all systems including life safety, without reducing usable space or losing any more of the historic character than absolutely required. This is definitely a job for preservation architects and engineers on good terms.

The team started with life safety. Computer modeling of fire situations quantified the movement of both smoke and occupants and led to a plan to forego punching new fire stairs in the wings of the building, which had previously been considered, and instead create firerated glass and metal partitions to enclose the rotunda's open stairwells. As part of the new mechanical systems, sprinklers will be added to the building.

Thaler stresses that from the start the team had to be "totally involved with how the building is put together." It was able to take into account the fact that the massive, closely spaced columns around the perimeter of the building reduced the cooling load by half. It found ways to use most of the original shafts and mechanical rooms as well as replace the old under-floor electrical system with a fully modern one set in a concrete floor. In places, EYP's team was able to trench out non-structural terracotta tile form work used to pour the concrete slab floors, opening additional space for systems routing and maintaining historical ceiling heights.

"In all of this," says Thaler, "we are meticulously working with the building, as opposed to imposing systems on it. We can't just route things intuitively, from an engineering standpoint. We look at how things might run behind a door casing or wainscot, and at the cost associated with repairing each finish. Whenever we have to take off marble panels it is certainly more expensive and potentially more damaging than replacing a plaster finish." This approach paid off. EYP developed a plan that not only made the State Historic Preservation Office and the admiring occupants of the building smile, it also saved the state \$18 million over previous estimates.

Thaler simplifies the EYP method, probably too far to be fair, but it makes perfect sense. "It's really about understanding what the building has to offer and about finding the efficiencies." If you have architects, engineers, technologists, and preservationists working together on those questions, you are more likely to get the best answers. ■

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## RECENT PROJECT: GOULD MEMORIAL LIBRARY AUDITORIUM

# STANFORD WHITE CHAPEL REINVENTED



The renovation of the Library Auditorium restored natural light to the room after 40 years by reopening the balcony, revealing the original windows that lined it.

verlooking Manhattan's Washington Heights neighborhood and the Palisades cliffs of New Jersey, the Bronx Community College's Gould Memorial Library stands surrounded by Stanford White's 630-ft. open-air Colonnade of the Hall of Fame for Great Americans. The library's auditorium was recently returned to its former grandeur after fire and an ill-conceived renovation in the 1960s. Restoration and renovation of the auditorium, once the chapel of White's 1900 Gould Memorial Library, was initiated by then-Bronx Borough President Fernando Ferrer. It was a 10-year effort by the Bronx Community College, the City University Construction Fund, and New York-based Platt Byard Dovell Architects. The central issue of the preservation was "how to get the building back into a form that's useful," says Paul Byard, a principal of Platt Byard Dovell. The architects wanted to recreate White's original vision of the room and update it to a contemporary venue for performers. Originally built for New York University, the Classical-style chapel was designed by White with the Pantheon in mind. The round structure was placed below the Library Rotunda reading room in order for natural light to make its way there from the top of the Library's dome through a central glass-floored librarian's desk. "Natural light is terribly important to the character of the building as a piece of architecture," says Byard. "This is an extraordinary building built into the side of a hill. One can enter on the first floor and be well above the chapel. But the slope is such that on three sides you can have windows, so the room is lit with wonderful light and shadow. This completely transforms the three-dimensional character of the building. The most interesting detail of all is the degree to which the light comes from the top of the oculus, but we couldn't reestablish that."

The chapel was turned into an auditorium when the Bronx Community College was established in the 1950s. A fire set by a disaffected student in the 1960s caused great damage to the 650-seat auditorium. In addition to the harm done by the fire itself, firemen broke the focal Tiffany Veritas stained-glass window behind the stage. This was followed by renovations on the building that began in the late '60s. Of this construction, Byard comments that "[it] was a well-intentioned effort to modernize the building in response to the general dislike of the world at the time."

In the process of that renovation, the balcony was converted into storage and mechanical space. Concrete and a wall that cut off the tops of the building's columns blocked most of the windows as well. They were plastered in, sealing off the balcony with a long plaster skirt. Decorative rails, fixtures, column capitals, and other plasterwork were also stripped away.

The current project began in 1997 and was completed in 2001. "We tried to find the appropriate restoration for that form," explains Byard. In addition to the restoration of key features such as the windows and wood doors, renovation was required. This included adding air conditioning to the auditorium via ductwork hidden in a new curved gypsum soffit that rings the balcony, providing cooling to the orchestra level through continuous diffusers.

In order to reopen the balcony, additional means of egress had to be added in accordance with modern building codes. "We wanted to reestablish the volume of the room by reopening the balcony, but we couldn't do that without adding exits and handicap access. So we did add them, in order to get the proportion of the room back and the ceiling back, with the same decorative system," says Byard.

Steel stairs were hidden behind the recreated side-stage walls, leading to

new exit doors at the rear of the building. The doors were cut out of blind openings in the building's facade that face the Hall of Fame. Steel stairs cantilever over the semi-circular light shaft and land on the walkway. Since the building is an historic landmark, the New York City Landmarks Preservation Commission reviewed the design of the exterior stairs and modifications to the facade. After some back and forth, the design was approved.

New dome panels were created to match the configuration of the originals as seen in historic photographs. Glass reinforced gypsum (GRG) was used for these panels and to recreate missing column capitals and moldings. "GRG is cheap and easy," Byard explains. "As a matter of fact, we had to redo our first attempt, because the proportions were all wrong. It wasn't a big deal, because we didn't have to carve the capitals — you mold GRG rather than carve it." The dome is surmounted by a new steel and glass oculus replicated to match the original, but outfitted as a light fixture to suggest the natural light from above that is now blocked.

The building's fame meant that period photographs were plentiful. As a result, Platt Byard Dovell was able to successfully recreate many of the origi-

nal decorations and architectural elements. The plaster surrounding the columns and the balcony was easy to get off, according to Byard, and what remained was a skeleton, which made it easy to remanufacture the column shafts, columns, and the detail of the capitals out of fiberglass.

Partitions added at the stage and balcony were removed and original side stage walls were recreated. The cast-iron balcony railings were replicated from pieces that were still left. A simple steel-and-glass window glazed with opaque glass was installed behind the stage at the location of the lost Tiffany window. "Nobody could afford to replace the Tiffany window," says Byard. "Instead, we reestablished the geometry of window, using opaque glass for light." Removing the partitions on the balcony revealed the windows, which were also restored. This allowed natural light into the auditorium for the first time in about 40 years. Finally, dozens of paint colors and finishes, including glazes and stenciling at several locations, were used to recreate the original design of the polychrome paint scheme, discovered through extensive paint analysis. "There was enough paint left, particularly on the ceiling, to make it easy to recreate the original paint scheme," says Byard. The restoration used a simpler scheme of six colors, and Greek key stenciling at the dome panels. "It's not an exact reproduction, but it's an appropriate accommodation of what used to be there - it works right for the room and its character," says Byard. The finished product brings together the elements of traditional style and up-to-date materials to form a replica that is mistakable for the original, yet relevant to its uses today.

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## **RECENT PROJECT: UNION STATION**

## RESTORED TRAIN DEPOT SERVES NORTHEAST CORRIDOR

Built in 1911 and listed on the National Register of Historic Places, Union Station in Worcester, Mass., was originally called "a poem in stone." As times changed and trains took a back seat to cars and highways, the 90,000-sq.ft. Beaux Arts building was altered and then abandoned. It sat empty for 25 years, until the Worcester Development Authority decided to restore it in 1996.

The architecture firm of Finegold Alexander + Associates (FA+A) was brought in to renovate the station into a centerpiece for a contemporary intermodal transportation center incorporating commuter rail and bus service, travel support facilities, and a 500-car parking facility. The redevelopment also called for bus ports, offices, restaurants, shops, and pedestrian, roadway, and landscaping improvements.

The Union Station "poem" is now renewed as a transportation center that serves the Northeast. The \$33-million, three-year project has not only updated the facility, but it has also restored the beauty of the original interior and exterior.

"This was a building with trees growing out of the floor and on the roof," says Design Principal James G. Alexander, FAIA. "Taking it through the restoration was one of the highlights of the work we have done in preservation."

The building has three historically significant spaces: the vestibule, the Great Hall, and the rotunda. Having been vacant for 25 years, neglect, vandalism, and the elements had taken their toll on the building. In addition, accurate, original plans were not available.



"The community supplied a lot of historic photos to support the renovation," says Alexander. "There were no drawings. We had to recreate everything from photos and from the fragments of the original plaster we found. We made molds to rebuild the original detail as much as possible and were also able to match finishes on other areas, such as the marble columns and wood doors."

In addition to the renovations in the rotunda, FA+A added an elegant, curved contemporary staircase to provide access to a new second-level train platform. "The addition of the stairs was a great challenge," Alexander states. "We worked hard to make it feel natural to the space even though it was a new staircase." The new platform replaced a much smaller one that had tracks on both sides.

In the Great Hall, vandalism and exposure to the elements had practically destroyed the elliptical, vaulted stained-glass ceiling and the marble, terra-cotta, granite, and mahogany details. The architect worked with

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After years of neglect and exposure to the elements, most of the detail in the Great Hall had either disappeared or had been destroyed when the restoration began in 1996.

conservators and the client to develop traditional and contemporary detailing for the restoration of the interior. DePaoli Mosaic Co. of Boston, Mass., supplied the terrazzo for the new flooring throughout the building, and Serpentino Stained Glass of Needham, Mass., recreated the stained-glass windows for the Great Hall. Other historical replacement windows were supplied by EFCO Corp. of Monett, Mo.

Nonhistorical spaces on the periphery of the Great Hall and rotunda were designed for various uses, such as offices, shops, and restaurants. New infrastructure services these areas as well as the rest of the building. The first major restaurant in this area is scheduled to open this spring.

On the exterior, three elegant arches flanked by huge Ionic columns greet visitors arriving at the station. The main entrance is also characterized by two 175ft. towers that had been removed in 1926, probably due to structural weakness. Originally clad in terra cotta, like the rest of the exterior of the building, these were rebuilt using lightweight structural steel and fiberglass. "It would have cost a lot more, about \$5 million, to recreate the towers using terra cotta," says Alexander. "Using the steel armature and the fiberglass panels, we were able to build them for less than \$2 million."

For the new towers, the architects kept the pediments that had been added when the original towers were taken down. "We left those, because we felt they worked quite well with the building and were part of the history of the building," Alexander states. "So the base has been changed somewhat. Other than that, the height and the original character of the towers are the same."

FA+A had the terra-cotta finish on the exterior of the rest of the building replaced and repaired. This work was done by NER Construction Management of Wilmington, Mass. "We weren't trying to make it look like it was just built,' says Alexander. "We left some of the imperfections in place and repaired them as needed." FA+A also made a slight change to the entrance to accommodate accessibility. The architects eliminated the original three granite steps leading into the building by raising the entrance driveway, providing accessibility. "It's a subtle change to the historic, entrance,"

says Alexander. Another part of the entrance, the steel and glass canopy which had been removed, was rebuilt to its original structure, using historic photos.

Worcester's Union Station has now been converted into a contemporary transportation center, revitalizing commuter train and bus transportation in the Worcester-Boston corridor. At the same time, the beauty of an almost-100-year-old historic building has been restored. Approximately 5,000 people came to tour the new station when it reopened in 1999. They traveled from across the country to witness the rebirth of an historic building that had played an important part in their personal histories. In addition, it is anticipated that the transportation center will serve as an engine for economic development in the area.

## RECENT PROJECT: RENOVATION OF BARTLETT HALL

# UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO Saves 100-year-old gym

I 1900, Adolphus Clay Bartlett gave \$125,000 to the University of Chicago to build a gymnasium in memory of his son, Frank Dickinson Bartlett, who died at the age of 20. When A.C. Bartlett became a trustee of the school, he gave \$25,000 more that, along with a \$60,000 donation from John Rockefeller, enabled the job to be completed. The University built the three-story Bartlett Gymnasium as a training venue for the U.S. men's Olympic team, and the building served as a sports center until the recent construction of the Gerald Ratner Athletics Center.

The University decided to adapt the 64,300-sq.ft. Bartlett Gymnasium for a new use and perform a restoration of its existing historical elements. In fall 2002, the architectural firm Bruner/Cott & Associates of Cambridge, Mass., completed the \$13.5 million transformation of the building into a 550-seat dining hall, multi-purpose event space, and 6,000-sq.ft. student lounge.

Boston-based Shepley, Rutan and Coolidge designed Bartlett Gymnasium in a Neo Gothic style. The Indiana limestone building featured a highly detailed veneer; leaded-glass steel-frame windows; a cast-iron, oak, and slate stairway; and a two-story stained-glass window designed by Edward C. Sperry (an associate of Louis Comfort Tiffany). The scope of the recent project included restoration work on all of these features as well as the design and construction of a 2,260-sq.ft. addition.

The challenge for Bruner/Cott was to introduce entirely new uses into the building, concealing the infrastructure that 21st-century codes require within the historic structure. The plan included a modern food service operation: dining rooms, an exhibition cooking area, production kitchen, and storage areas, together with 10,000 sq.ft. of new student activity areas for events, performances, offices, and informal lounge spaces. In terms of safety, changes had to be made to the surrounding streets, because the renovation was intended to intensify student activity. High quality paving materials were used to bridge 57th Street between Ellis and University Avenues and to emphasize the pedestrian crossings, which had to be made narrower. Landscape materials, furnishings, and other elements were used to create a consistent, classic street character, while restoring existing trees, lawns, walks, and shrubs. One of the modern codes that had to be met was that of the fire department. The original building had only one interior stairway serving the entire building. Two interior exit stairs had to be added to replace the obtrusive, dangerous exterior ones added after the original construction. In order to keep the inner stairway, which would have had to be replaced with three staircases to be up to code, Bruner/Cott had to enclose it on all floors. "We went through extraordinary measures to keep the openness of the original design intact, since that was one of the most important features," project architect Robert Simmons, AIA, says. The first floor wasn't a problem, he explains, because the firm just added three to four sets of fire doors, which didn't affect the wood paneling. It was the second floor, where the original gym had been and where the dining hall would be that created a challenge. To solve the problem, Bruner/Cott created a 25-ft. glass separation wall, mimicking an existing wooden screen wall, separating the gym from the stair hall. The glass was very expensive, about \$270 per sq.ft., but the architects felt that it was important enough to the design to use it. The glass, along with a two-hour rated glazing material, maintains openness to the dining hall and allows views back into the stained-glass stair hall. The wall was covered in fire-resistant treated white oak to match the intricately paneled staircase walls.

All the main entries to the building, as in many Turn of the Century buildings, had level changes within the ground-floor lobbies and on the exterior, which made adding accessibility, required by the Americans with Disabilities Act, difficult. The west entrance was modified for this purpose. Bruner/Cott relocated the exterior stair outboard of the facade 10 ft. out and inserted a curved-ramp walkway without disrupting a row of mature trees that complement the building and became part of the new green quadrangle located there. Due to the low slope of the ramp, handrails, viewed as obtrusive to the design, were not needed. Instead, seat walls on each side of the pathway were added.

New student dining facilities in the renovated

Bartlett Hall opened for the winter quarter of 2002 after two years of construction. Bartlett's second-floor gymnasium has been transformed into the dining facility. "We kept the gym almost as is," says Simmons. "The biggest change was from the blue glass in the large skylight to clear glass, allowing more light, and the replacement of the original gym's bare bulbs." The original riveted steel trusses of the gymnasium, a major architectural feature, were exposed and highlighted with paint.

The original steel- and wood-framed running track, scheduled for demolition (because it had previously been deemed structurally inadequate), has been retooled as a mezzanine-level student lounge. "The running track was an important part of the space, elegantly detailed with a curved mesh balustrade and oak rail," says Simmons. "It survived for 100 years basically unscathed." Bruner/Cott reduced the effective usable area of the track and fitted it with waist-high millwork, housing HVAC duct runs that reduce the live load. Kitchens have been installed on the ground floor and elevators have been blended into the back wall of the central exhibition cooking station and hidden behind the grill top and exhaust hood.

The restoration plan included adding a major food service function, so a large two-bay loading dock had to be added at the south end. The sympathetic

addition that resulted was made from tooled Bedford limestone cladding, to match the University palette. The Gothic bi-folding steel loading doors, clad in stained oak with bronze studs, fold up to protect the wood cladding from damage. "The doors open within three seconds," Simmons says. These features recall the entry gates of the Alonzo Stagg Field walls that once stood adjacent to the site. The dock itself was built to accommodate full-size semi-trailers so that they would not protrude onto the street, and the receiving areas were set back to hide them from view. The addition was designed to accommodate a future roof terrace off the dining space, Simmons adds, but that's a future project because of the expense.

Preservation work was needed on the three-story-tall original stairway,

Bartlett Hall's detailed Gothic limestone veneer also needed restoration and conservation. "Bartlett Hall looks like a Gothic cathedral from the outside," says Simmons. "It's very ornate, with a lot of castellation and rusticated detail around the windows, with fine tooling that was done by hand." When repairing the stone, all this had to be taken into account and replicated. To keep the correct look and feel of the original, much of the replacement stone was taken from areas of the building that would be covered by the new addition. The rest was selected from the original quarries to match the existing stone. The limestone was cleaned of carbon staining and ivy growth was removed. The original detail and aging patina was kept by careful cleaning.

"We did a full building survey from a cherry picker," Simmons explains. "We documented where problems were occurring, and created drawings to get a sense of where the spalling was the worst." Patterns emerged from the drawings in terms of the worst spalling, which, Simmons says, was generally below the roof, along the edges of the parapets, and where water had traveled down and settled. The problems were mainly due to the original steel strap hangers, which caused spalling due to oxidization and expansion. To avoid similar problems in the future, stainless-steel anchors replaced the iron straps. Repointing of all masonry joints was completed using specialty mortars, and new copper downspouts and flashings were installed. The parapets were rebuilt as well. Sustainable practices on the project included the use of daylight through a reglazed, energy-efficient, full-length skylight; the comprehensive salvage program of limestone from the original structure; and the wooden gymnasium floor, iron and oak doors, and period artifacts that were saved and reused. Citing the exacting work done on Bartlett Hall, the Boston Society of Architects awarded it the 2002 Honor Award Citation and Midwest Construction magazine named it Renovation Project of the Year for 2002. "They changed the function and still maintained the look and feel of the original structure, and added a loading dock and made it look contextual," said the Midwest Construction magazine jury.

block infill had been put in to solve the problem, but that kept out a lot of light. "Because the glass block infill was installed incorrectly, the surrounding stone was starting to crush it with expansion and retraction, so it was shattered around the edges," Simmons explains. Bruner/Cott studied original drawings and used remaining fragments to reproduce the diamond patterning of the original design in a thin-profile aluminum-framed window unit. Lead caming was applied by epoxy to both faces of insulated low-E glass units to produce low-maintenance, thermally efficient windows that retain the character of the originals. "It's one sheet of glass, not 1,000, so the refraction isn't exact, but it has essentially the same physical look," says Simmons.

from the activity in the gym. Glass

which was lighted by the Sperry stained-glass window. The stairway was detailed with delicate cast-iron balustrades, oak rails, and ribbon-slate treads. Original features, such as early 20th-century electric light fixtures, were restored and relamped with carbon-filament, Edison-period units. The lobby in which the stairway opened had a mural by Frederic Clay Bartlett in memory of his brother, which only required light cleaning. The lobby itself was generally intact.

The window, which depicts Rowena crowning Ivanhoe, had to be removed for restoration. Hand-rubbings of each panel were made; 3,000 photographs were taken; detail drawings were created, and museum-level crating and shipping using shock, temperature, and humidity gauges were employed in order to restore it. The window presently sits in a museum until the University can afford to have it put back in. Bruner/Cott replaced it with a temporary clear leaded glass piece with light detailing as a place holder. "We didn't want to put in anything too fancy, like faux stained glass, so that people would know it was only temporary," Simmons says.

The other windows in the building had to be replicated, because the original diamond leaded-glass windows were all but destroyed in the 1960s

# THE CALAMINE TREATMENT FOR TROUBLED WINDOWS

Roles evolve for windows clad in sheet metal.

void windows clad in sheet metal, so called calamine (a.k.a Kalamein, see box) windows, were historically intended as a defense against fire, but in this era of depleted woodlands and degraded lumber quality, this technique may continue to prove useful for the protection it provides against the damage done by time.

A well-made custom sheet-metal window is a more durable exterior element than any built with second-growth lumber, whatever its species. They are not cheap, however, so they will not be flooding the replacementwindow market. To find out where these windows are proving useful or necessary, I asked Cameron Forbes of Heather & Little, Ltd., in Toronto, Ont., to provide some insight. Heather & Little has built hundreds of these window for historic projects, mostly reproductions for important public buildings from the first part of the last century.

These fire-resistant windows were distributed widely among buildings both splendid and utilitarian with certain design benefits. In public buildings, they benefited designers by enabling them to incorporate windows into trim schemes of the same material, thus making them an indispensable part of the design as well as of the historic fabric. For the renovation of the 1924 Investment Building in Washington, D.C., Heather & Little furnished numerous missing elements necessary to complete the facade restoration, including more than 70 copper-clad calamine windows, fixed and casement. This Beaux Arts limestone structure featured deeply sculpted copper cornice detail and elaborately molded window surrounds. The windows and their surrounds appear as a unified design entity.

Similarly, the firm reproduced a 15x35-ft.-tall window for the 1914 Harris Theater on 42nd Street in New York City to replace an original destroyed by a misdirected demolition crew. This massive window dominated the narrow, sculpted brick facade and was an integral part of an elaborate copper trim scheme. Heather & Little worked from a dumpster full of debris and reused 70% of the original wood core as an armature.

The price of custom calamine windows will deter their use in many applications, but another historic Heather & Little project suggests a way to mitigate the cost. In 1991, the firm produced 80 double-hung windows in 26gauge zinc-coated steel for a post office in Collingwood, Ont. These were replacements for existing windows that had been originally produced without wood cores, since the weight of the glass itself did not require additional support. Much of the rigidity of these windows derives from the cumulative strength of the assembled tubular sheet metal and the fixing of the glass. Coreless windows can be made energy efficient by filling the cavity with foam and by installing a thermal break in the design.

By omitting the wood core, the cost of the millwork plus the labor of working the sheet metal around it is saved. Custom sheet-metal windows will never be cheap, but they offer a combination of looks, durability, and low maintenance that addresses specialized building issues, particularly for historical buildings.

Other recent projects suggest new replacement applications for this technique beyond reproduction. For the fire-damaged cupola of the 1880 Harbour Commission building in Montreal, Heather & Little furnished replacements in 20-oz. copper for moldings and trim. Four round windows, 7 ft. in diameter, were also replaced. Curved wood moldings of this size in exterior applications can be unstable unless fabricated from the most carefully selected grade of lumber available. While not historical, such a substitution can serve the building by reducing failures and maintenance. There are many exterior features that are no longer viable in wood in today's environment of uncertain lumber quality and aversion to maintenance. Red copper accepts finishes as reliably as wood, if properly prepared, and, like the original Kalamein windows, they are fire resistant.

With only anecdotal information, it is difficult to know the replacementcycle cost figures for calamine windows. The fate of 345 deteriorated historical double-hung calamine windows in the 1917 wing of the Massachusetts State House in Boston shows why. This building is part of an historic complex dating back to 1790 and it seemed at first that, as part of the original historical fabric, these windows were destined to be restored. Instead, they were replaced with mahogany at about, Forbes estimates, one quarter of the cost.

The price was one reason the windows were replaced, not restored: The history they contained couldn't justify the cost differential. The other problem was the past performance of the windows. At 80 years old, the windows' performance didn't seem much better than that of a good wood window. It was decided that restoration wasn't a wise use of the Commonwealth's money, in light of the windows' performance to date.

The window contractor for the entire project, Richard Muckle of Muckle & Associates of Lawrence, Mass., had the opportunity to deconstruct the windows and to analyze their failure. The cores were constructed of some

#### THE MEANING OF THE WORD

A century ago, wood windows were first clad in zinc-plated steel, with the object of making them fire resistant, and marketed under the trade name Kalamein. This name derives from the mineral calamine, which furnishes the ore from which zinc, the eighth metal known to humans, is produced. The reason it took humankind so long to get to zinc (India, c.1200 C.E.), is that it evaporates when smelted, instead of melting. For millennia before being discovered, however, calamine in its natural state was used in the production of brass and calamine lotion. While the trade name Kalamein seems no longer to be licensed, these terms persist with reference to the general practice of cladding architectural elements in sheet metal of any composition.

very casually joined American chestnut requiring extensive restoration. He observed that most of the sheet-metal joints were coped and then simply butted and filled with solder, offering little resistance to thermal movement or to the shocks and stresses of operation.



These samples show sheet metal installed over a range of wood profiles. While expensive, the process of drawing out these moldings does not require major up-front expenditures and is feasible for custom short runs. They are smooth finished and without brake creases.

The original artisans can't explain these choices, unfortunately, but the architectural materials consultant for the project, William Finch of Finch & Rose in Beverly, Mass., emphasizes that historically, metal-clad windows were not specified as a strategy for extending the life of an installation, but rather to reduce the amount of readily combustible material in building interiors (see box), a minimum goal that they achieved.

While these butted joints may conceivably have contributed to a flatter, cleaner look, Forbes notes that such a joint is not nearly as durable as the lapped and sweated joints Heather & Little installs today. They have benefited from the gift of hindsight and of today's standards for low maintenance and extended replacement cycles. The degradation of wood quality means that the bar for beating the performance of wood has been drastically lowered.

## SPECIFYING CAST STONE

A little knowledge can go a long way toward maximizing the appearance and performance of cast-stone building elements and can also help architects save thousands of dollars on their projects.

ast stone is a versatile masonry product that can be used for architectural trim, ornamentation, or functional features. The earliest known use of cast stone was in 1138. The product was first used extensively in London in 1900 and in America around 1920. Since then, cast stone has earned widespread acceptance in the architectural community as a suitable replacement for many masonry materials and for all types of natural-cut building stone.

Cast stone is made from fine and coarse aggregates such as limestone, marble, calcite, granite, quartz, natural sands, Portland cement, mineral



oxide pigments, chemical admixtures, and water. It is not surprising, then, that cast stone is available in any color and can look like limestone, brownstone, bluegranite, stone, slate, travertine, or marble. It can match terra cotta or brick and makes a perfect substitute for brick shapes. The use of a high percentage of durable fine aggregate in cast stone creates a very smooth, consistent

texture for building elements. Applications that use cast stone can range from the simplest window sill to the most complicated Classical architecture. The number of profiles and sizes required for any given project can vary from a single shape shown on a sketch to hundreds (or more), not necessarily obvious in a set of architectural contract documents.



an ASTM Standard Specification stipulates what the requirements of the test results must be, as well as the ingredients the product must contain. For example, according to ASTM C 1364 - Standard Specification for Architectural Cast Stone, cast stone is required to have a minimum compressive strength of 6,500 psi and maximum moisture absorption of six percent. It must have a fine-grained texture similar to natural stone, pass a rigorous freeze-thaw test, the dimensions of each unit may not deviate by more than 1/8 in. from approved dimensions, and it is reinforced with billet steel reinforcing bars, unless otherwise specified.

### A Special Type of Precast

Since cast stone is a type of architectural precast concrete, the question is often asked: "What is the difference between cast stone and architectural precast concrete?" The answer is that cast stone is used in place of natural stone. As a type of building stone, cast stone is specified under the masonry division 04720 and masonry contractors using standard building stone anchors usually set it. Perhaps most importantly, unless otherwise specified, cast stone looks like natural, dimensional, cut building stone. Upon close examination, the finish of cast stone looks like limestone; some call it a "sugar-cube finish" to distinguish its appearance from the "pebbly with voids" appearance that is normally associated with concrete.

The dense finish is more resistant to weather and dirt and the fine aggregates retain their granular texture through decades of exposure to the elements. Sandblast or chemical retardation finishing methods (normally used in finishing architectural precast concrete panels) are seldom used with cast stone, because they dull the aggregates and fine edges and similar details are lost.

#### **Degrees of Customization**

Improvements in the availability and economy of cast stone can almost uni-

versally be achieved when the number of special pieces is kept to a minimum. With that in mind, cast-stone projects will generally fit into one of the following categories: standard, semi-custom, or custom, with considerable cost differ-



### Other Types of Simulated Stone

Properly manufactured cast stone has the same or stronger physical properties as most natural dimensional building stone and should not be confused with other types of simulated stones. Several stone-like products are manufactured to be used primarily as veneers on other substrate materials such as concrete masonry units. These products are manufactured to meet Construction Specifications Institute (CSI) Division 04730 requirements for simulated stone, while cast stone is manufactured to meet Division 04720 requirements.

There are substantial differences between cast stone and simulated stone. Simulated stone is a lightweight product that is adhered to a structural wall. It can't be used to add to the load-bearing capacity of a masonry wall. Cast stone, however, can, and is usually integrated into the brickwork and becomes part of a composite wall system. In addition, while simulated stone products are light so they will work easily on the exterior of other wall material, cast stone weighs approximately the same as natural-cut limestone.

Cast stone has an ASTM Standard Specification that is substantially different than cultured- or simulated-stone products, which usually reference ASTM Test Methods. Test methods simply dictate how materials are tested;

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# **INSTALLING A LEAD-SHEET ROOF** THAT WILL LAST FOR CENTURIES

Lead-sheet roofs have been keeping the elements away for hundreds of years. Now recent improvements in installation and technical standards have made them even more durable.

ead sheet is the oldest and most durable metal roofing: when properly installed, it can last 200 years. A 1997 restoration project of a 15th-century church in England, for example, included the replacement of the lead-sheet roof and church documents indicate that the roof was last replaced in 1730. Much of the old lead removed was covered with graffiti left behind by the craftsmen who had worked on the roof over the years. They drew pictures or traced their hands and feet. The earliest date found on the lead was 1700 and the most recent was 1935.

Lead's resistance to atmospheric pollution and acid rain makes it ideally suited for roofing and for protecting stone cornices, copings, and other projections. Its extreme malleability also makes it an ideal material for dressing over complicated shapes and forms.

Lead is a non-ferrous metal, which makes it corrosion resistant. It will oxidize with exposure, developing a silver-gray patina that is insoluble in water. Because of this insolubility, rainwater runoff over a weathered lead surface carries little lead.

#### **Improved Technical Standards**

The Lead Sheet Association (LSA) in England has studied lead-roof failures over the years, and the result has been improved technical standards and installation procedures. As with any project, the key to a successful installation is proper planning, preparation, and design.

The LSA has found that most failures are due to using over-sized panels coupled with over-fixing. Lead roofing is usually fixed externally and is subject to changing temperatures. Lead has a high coefficient of linear expansion, and if thermal expansion and contraction cannot take place freely, there will be a risk of distortion and stress, which in time will cause the lead to buckle and crack.

It is important, as with all sheet metals, to limit the size of each piece so that the relatively small amount of thermal movement is accommodated within the jointing and fixing details. Recommendations on the maximum sizes of lead sheet are shown in the tables below. The general principle is the thinner the lead, the smaller the piece.

For identification purposes, codes have been assigned for each thickness of lead sheet based on the nominal weight per square feet. Code 4 lead is normally used for flashing, Codes 5 and 6 for roofing, parapets, and copings. Codes 7 and 8 are used for historic structures, valleys, gutters, and areas subject to extreme weather conditions.

The most common joints used are the solid-core wood roll and the welt. The wood core roll joint is used for flat and pitched roofing as well as lead cladding. The undercloak is nailed to the wood roll, equally spaced, for the

Installed around 1935, the East Jersey State Prison was an example of what happens when a lead roof is incorrectly installed. It was suffering from battens that didn't allow for any lateral movement of the lead, causing fatigue and increased elongation of the sheets. In addition, the battens were the wrong size and shape and the wrong code of lead was used.



Abernathy Co. removed the exist-ing lead, wood battens, and underlayment on the East Jersey State Prison roof before installing a new lead roof. It includes a non-woven geotextile fabric on top of an ice/water shield. The fabric acts as a slip sheet under the lead, allowing air circulation between the lead and the ice/water shield. This prevents a buildup of condensation on the underside of the lead.

The welt joint begins as a typical standing seam and is then flattened. As with other metal roofing, it is affixed to the substrate with copper clips equally spaced in the joint. The spacing is dependent on the code and size of the panel.

One of my firm's recent projects, the East Jersey State Prison in Rahway, N.J., is an example of an incorrect wood roll joint installation. The before photo (top) shows the existing lead roof installed around 1935, which replaced the original copper roof. It was most likely installed by a sheet metal contractor not fully experienced with lead. This resulted in poor design. The battens were the wrong shape and size, the fastening was inadequate and improperly installed, the wrong code lead was used, and the sheetsizes were much too large. The battens did not allow for any lateral movement of the lead, which caused fatigue and increased elongation of the sheets. The underlayment was incorrect, but most likely that was all that was available at the time.

We removed the existing lead, wood battens, and underlayment. An ice/water shield was installed as temporary waterproofing. A nonwoven geotextile fabric was installed on top of the ice/water shield. This material acts as a slip sheet under the lead and allows for air circulation between the lead and the ice/water shield. This helps prevent a buildup of condensation on the under-side of the lead.

The LSA has formulated the tables below to help select the correct sheet sizes for your project.

top one-third of the sheet. The over-cloak is dressed against the wood roll, but is not nailed.

Correctly sizing your sheets is only the first step. It is also important that the fastening be designed so it will not restrict thermal movement, but must be adequate to support the lead and, depending on the degree of exposure, retain it in position. Lead sheet should have the continuous support of a smooth decking or substrate material.

Roofing felts with a bituminous surface or organic fibers with a bonding agent can become sticky in hot weather and cause the lead to be bonded firmly to the substrate. Placing a non-woven geotextile or equal between the felt and the lead is essential. The use of a Class A building paper is acceptable, continued on page 118

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## HURRICANES AND HISTORICAL AESTHETICS

Regional building codes can have quite an impact on window design, particularly in historical retrofits and restoration projects, raising the question: Do historical accuracy and traditional aesthetics have to be compromised in the name of safety?

fter Hurricane Andrew hit South Florida in 1994, killing 48 people and leaving more than \$26.5 billion in damages in its wake, inspection by officials revealed that many of the buildings were not up to the building codes in place at the time. Since then, the Florida Building Code has been rewritten to establish strict requirements for fenestration. The Code now calls for window testing standards that include water resistance, air leakage, mandatory load deflection, and structural tests, as well as a number of other requirements.

The new building code was put into effect on March 1, 2002. Based in part on the South Florida Building Code, which has been in effect for eight years in Broward, Palm, and Miami-Dade counties, the new code replaces more than 400 local codes and is designed to make the local building process more efficient, increase accountability, bring new and safer products to the market, increase consumer confidence, and better protect residents. The Code requires that all window systems used in new construction or remodeling meet criteria of impact resistance to protect against property loss and potential injury during hurricanes and these systems must be tested by an approved independent testing laboratory and labeled as such.

#### **Regional Requirements**

In most of the country, energy efficiency is the chief concern. "We don't do anything special to bring our restoration work on windows up to code. We don't need a permit, the codes don't affect us," says Gail Wallace, President of Restoration Works, Inc., in Illinois. "The important thing is energy efficiency and aesthetics."

The focus is similar in California. "The most important issues in California are water and air infiltration, as well as energy efficiency," according to Jack Topalian, President of Brothers' Custom Windows & Doors. While there are window codes that have to be met in California, he adds, they aren't as stringent as Florida, since hurricanes aren't an issue. His products do not have to go through any testing or approval process.

In Florida, however, thermal performance and aesthetics take a back seat to impact resistance. The testing process involves submitting three samples with an engineered shop drawing and technical data to an approved independent testing lab. Tests conducted on the samples involve procedures such as shooting either a 4-1/2-lb. 2x4 or a 9-lb. 2x4, depending on where you are, out of an air cannon into the window. In Dade County the window is struck multiple times. "From an engineering standpoint," says Anthony Head, Regulatory Product Planner at Marvin Windows, "that relates to three times the trauma. This is very difficult from a window-making standpoint." The test result — pass or fail — includes a video and is passed on to Miami-Dade County for approval.

The Dade County code includes many ASTM codes; for windows, two

Another way to provide impact resistance is to incorporate laminated glass in the glazing system. "Multiple laminates of glass, polycarbonates, different types of plastic or vinyl inner layers are all acceptable types of glazing. You need five layers — the two on the inner and outer sides are glass, but the inner levels can be any of those materials," says Head.

#### Codes and Companies

Companies have differing opinions on whether getting a window up to code is easy. "It's very difficult," says Head. "It took us several years to make product lines that were up to code available. Not only do you need to have the type and amount of glass to take the trauma, but you also have to address the sash as well, because the sash can blow out completely. Along the same lines, you have to pay attention to the frame and the installation."

Marvin Windows no longer uses a sealant, for example, but a structural adhesive made for skyscrapers, which are constantly exposed to high winds. In addition, modifications need to be made to the window sash and frame. "We had to come up with a brand new sash to deal with wind pressures, with more fastenings holding the wood to the aluminum, and the adhesive," Head explains. "We had to strengthen our locking system as well, because the one we had wouldn't hold up under the pressure."

Code approval depends on the type of window. "Most outswing windows pass. Inswing systems are harder to pass, because the glass is outside. A multipoint window will pass, because there are so many lockpoints," Michael Zajac-Batell, president of Architectural Windows & Entries in Florida, maintains.

"It's a real scam," says Zajac-Batell. "Once the test is done, they charge a lot of money and take two months to approve it, although they have to approve it if it passed the test." In addition to the increased price of fabrication due to the thicker material used for the sash and the laminated glass, he objects to the price of the testing, which is prohibitive for a small company like his. If such a company gets a project upwards of a quarter million dollars, they can afford the testing and then can take on other projects that require certification. Head specifies that a "Dade County window is

specific ones are used: 1886 and 1996. ASTM code 1886 addresses the physical portion of setting up a window (how you set up the air cannon in the test so it's pushing the 2x4 at a certain speed, etc.), while 1996 addresses simulating hurricane force winds and missile requirements. This last is called the cyclic wind load test. Lasting four to five hours, it replicates the pushing and pulling forces of wind found in hurricanes.

In wind-borne debris regions, partially enclosed structures must be built to handle the increased internal pressures that could occur when a window blows out. In wind-speed zones of 120 miles per hour or more, the Florida Building Code also indicates that structures can either be designed to withstand internal pressures or windows can be protected by installing products such as plywood, impact-resistant glass, or storm shutters. Windows to be installed without benefit of an approved shutter system are required to pass the Large Missile Impact Test and receive certification for installation.

close to double the price of a window of comparable quality. The most expensive thing is the glass because it has to be custom built. It's very labor intensive, because there can be no air bubbles or dust or hairs."

Another problem is the installation of the impact-resistant windows. "Your installation method has to have a valid label," Zajac-Batell explains. "It has to be installed the way the manufacturer says since that's been approved." While a contractor doesn't need extra official training or skills, "You still have to beef up your installation," Head agrees. "When you submit a window for certification you have to have specific guidelines — how big the screws are, how much space is between each screw, for instance. Liliana Boswick, Architect Project Manager for Seaquay Architectural Millwork Corporation, points out, "You have to be especially concerned with caulking the window correctly, but it doesn't take special training."

#### Tradition, Safety, and Codes

The good news is that these windows can meet high performance standards and still look traditional for the most part. "If you want divided light you have to do a simulation, which is extremely convincing in terms of woodwork, but there isn't a different reflection in each pane of glass like an original would have," says Zajac-Batell. Boswick agrees. "Mostly these windows can still look 'traditional,'" she says, "but sometimes you have to increase the mounting size in order to accept the wind load, which slightly modifies the historical look."

As for the number of window manufacturers who have a product that passes the Dade County Code standards, there are "quite a few, but not many for traditional wood products," says Zajac-Batell. "Of all the major manufacturers, maybe around 10," agrees Head.

In 2002, the hurricane season lasted six months, beginning on June 1st and ending on November 30th. According to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's (NOAA) National Weather Service, 17 people were killed in the United States, and damage was estimated at \$1 billion. This seemingly low number (as compared to 1995) may be due to this year's El Niño, which caused only four hurricanes in the Atlantic basin and weakened other storms, according to a press release quoting Air Force Brig. Gen. Jack Kelly, Director of the NOAA National Weather Service.

In the same release, Max Mayfield, Director of the National Hurricane Center (NHC), said that the public used the Internet for access to information about the storms this season. "The explosive use of the Internet to convey vital information to the public in near real time has been astonishing," he said. "Between August and September, the NHC web site recorded almost 500-million hits. The peak day for the season was October 3 (Hurricane Lili) when the site recorded 35.9 million hits — doubling the previous record set in 1999 during Hurricane Floyd. We are saving lives thanks to the Internet."

Whether the reduced number of deaths and costs is due to the more stringent codes, Internet use, El Niño, or a combination of the three, the stricter codes are a new reality that must be followed if a window manufacturer wants a government-certified window in regions hit by hurricanes or tropical storms.

## WEIGHT-AND-PULLEY **DESIGN ISSUES**

#### As the weight-and-pulley balance system for wood windows becomes popular again, attention must be paid to proper design.

he weight-and-pulley balance system for double-hung windows was, for many years, the standard in wood-window construction. The inherent dependability of this system is once again bringing it into favor with quality-minded architects, builders, and window fabricators. This article will examine some of the factors affecting the specification and design of weight-and-pulley balance systems for today's windows.

The basic principle of a weight-and-pulley balance system is simple: A vertically sliding sash is attached to, and suspended by, lengths of cord or chain. Each cord or chain is passed over a pulley mortised into the jamb near the top of the opening. The opposite end of each cord or chain is attached to an iron, steel, or lead counterweight weighing one-half the weight of the sash it is balancing, which will be located within a concealed space or weight pocket. An accurate design will result in sash that require little or no effort to operate and that will remain open or closed as desired.

#### Components

There are four important components to a properly designed weight-andpulley window balance system.

#### Weight

• The combined weight of the counterweights must match the full weight of the glazed sash to which it is attached.

• The counterweights must fit side by side within the weight pocket, and must not strike each other during their vertical travel.

• The counterweight length must permit vertical travel within the sash pocket equal to the vertical travel required for the sash being balanced.

#### Sash Pulleys

 The diameter of the sash pulleys to be specified must be sufficient to suspend the counterweight free of contact with the window jamb.

 The sash pulley specified should be designed to carry one-half the weight of the glazed sash smoothly and dependably throughout the life of the window.

#### Sash Chain or Cord

 The specified sash chain or cord should fit the specified pulley and should have a load-carrying capacity that exceeds the weight of the counterweights to which it is attached. **Counterweight Access** 

 Access to the sash counterweights is essential for a well-designed system. Access pockets should be sized and located so as to permit removal

and reattachment of the counterweights should sash chain or cord ever fail.

The specifications of a weightand-pulley balance system are directly affected by the dimensions

and weight of the sash in the design. The manner in which these two criteria affect the specification of the other component parts is outlined below:

specification of the balance components. Any changes to the glazing specifications may require respecification of the other components. Note that insulating glass is made of two separate sheets of hermetically sealed glass. The thickness of each sheet must be specified so that the weight may be calculated. The overall thickness of the sealed unit does not materially affect its weight. Two other factors to consider in system design are the jamb thickness and

the location of the sash pulleys. The thickness of the window-frame side jamb in which the sash pulley is mounted, in conjunction with the sash pulley diameter, will determine how large the cross-section of a counterweight can be and still hang freely within the weight pocket.

Locating the sash pulleys as high as possible within the sash opening increases the vertical space available to the counterweight for its travel with-

in the weight pocket. Locating the pulleys' faceplates too close to the head jamb, however, may make installation difficult. A distance of 1-1/2 in. down from the head jamb is recommended.

In conclusion, it is useful to remember the reasons that contribute to making the weight-andpulley balance system a permanent and reliable mechanical system for the operation of double-hung wood windows.

 The inherent longevity of the components and the materials from which they are made. Weight-andpulley balance systems using sash chain are still functioning perfectly after nearly 100 years of use.

• The reparability of the system makes its functional life extendable. All components are accessible and replaceable.

• The dependable nature of gravity.

#### Selecting Sash Chain



Sectional sash weights have several advantages over one-piece weights. The size of access pockets can be reduced, and sash can be weighed and precisely balanced after fabrica-tion tion. Square weights are heavier in proportion to their length than round weights.

The higher initial cost of sash chain, compared to sash cord, is offset by the chain's longer useful life. Chain should be selected for material, load rating, and size. As for materials, sash chain is available in bronze and, to a limited extent, brass and stainless steel.

A sash weighing 30 lbs. will place a static load of 15 lbs. on each of the two sash chains that suspend it. Suddenly raising, lowering, or stopping the travel of the sash, however, will create an instantaneous load exceeding the normal static load by many times. For this reason, it is advisable to select chain with the highest load-rating capacity with a width that will fit the pulley wheel groove.

Sash chain is manufactured in trade sizes determined by width, links per foot, and gauge of material. As stated above, chain should be selected for the maximum load-carrying capacity that will fit the pulley groove.

For double-hung windows, the approximate total required amount of chain can be calculated by the following formula: (half the sash opening height + 2 ft.) x 4. ■

#### Sash Dimensions

• Width: Windows that are wide in proportion to their height will be heavy in proportion to their height; a counterweight for a short, wide window must be heavy in proportion to its length, because the vertical space available for the travel of the weight is limited.

• Thickness: Since the counterweights for the upper and lower sashes of a double-hung window operate side by side within the pocket, the sash thickness places a limitation on the cross-sectional dimensions of the counterweights. For example, a 1-3/8-in. sash will weigh only slightly less than a 1-3/4-in. sash with the same glazing, yet it will require a thinner, and therefore longer, counterweight.

#### Glazing

The largest percentage of the weight of a window sash is in the glazing. The type of glass specified will therefore have a direct effect not only on the weight of the sash, but also on its required counterweight. A sash glazed with sealed insulating glass will weigh nearly twice as much as the same sash with single glazing and, therefore, will require a counterweight twice as heavy. It is crucial to the system design that the thickness of the glass be specified at the outset and the finished sash weight calculated prior to the

#### **BOOK REVIEW**

## THE POETRY OF CLASSICAL ARCHITECTURE

With his design of the Queen's Gallery, Buckingham Palace, John Simpson brings Classicism into the new millennium.

ou don't have to look far these days to see acres of sprawling subdivisions seemingly dropped from the sky or miles of four-lane roads overrun with fast-food chains, strip malls, and office parks of steel and glass. In this country, we have been experiencing an epidemic of super-charged growth where history is continuously paved over and rebuilt. You don't have to look far, in other words, to find some kinship with the British architect John Simpson, who says of his love of Classical architecture: "Whereas function and circumstances change from generation to generation, people do not, for they have the same senses, the same appreciation for space, forms, and materials, and are proud of their cultural lineage and their link with the past."

In this comprehensive book, authors Richard John and David Watkin explore the history, influences, and current practice of the Classicism of Simpson. Critics say all forms of Neo-Classicism are at best imitative, at worst irrelevant kitsch. They warn that the strict tenets of the Classical order make us slaves to the past. Simpson, who is a member of the Institute of Classical Architecture, argues that the language of Classicism is not only timeless, but, partnered with vision and an understanding of modern technology and materials, can transcend its own vocabulary.

John Simpson was born in 1954, in what could be argued the heart of the modern age. By the time he was three, dogs were barreling through space,



teenagers were twisting to rock 'n' roll, and everyone was buying a television. So it is interesting to note that throughout his education, Simpson was drawn to the past. His first apprenticeship was under his father, also an architect, whose traditional buildings Simpson helped survey. In 1972, he enrolled in the Bartlett College of Architecture and Planning. Here, where most of his teachers were proponents of the Modern Movement, Simpson took his education into his own hands and spent a year cataloging and surveying the historic buildings of Covent Garden for the architectural firm Duffy, Lange, Giffone Worthington &

Erechtheion on the Acropolis, Simpson's entrance not only invites us in, but seems to do so from two directions at once. His interiors, in contrast to the stark, minimalist museums of the 20th century, are rich in color and ornament, complementing the art they contain. In this Soanean spirit, he also commissioned sculptures by Alexander Stoddart, whose friezes in the entrance hall reference The Iliad and The Odyssey.

John and Watkin, both scholars of architecture and prolific writers, are obviously inspired by Simpson's work, and their passion for their subject shines through. They explore every detail of the Stair Hall; the Pennethorne, Chambers, and Nash Galleries; and the Royal Kitchen with the excitement of children looking for a secret doorway. In fact, we do stumble upon a few points of intrigue - hollowed vaults hiding storage spaces or plaster rosettes concealing light sources and air conditioning vents.

In the Nash Gallery, Simpson tried to recapture John Nash's original design for the ceilings, which included hanging arches and domes. The massive ceiling beams can also be used as service walkways for the lighting above.

(DLGW). From this point through his post-graduate work, also at Bartlett, Simpson decided to simply study buildings he liked, most notably Sir John Soane's house and museum in London's Lincoln's Inn Fields in which Soane sought to unify architecture, painting, and sculpture.

Soane's vision influenced Simpson in his latest and most important work — the design of the Queen's Gallery, Buckingham Palace. Completed in 2002, Simpson's design is a Classical tour de force. The entrance portico alone is a testament to his mastery of space, light, and the principles of Greek construction. Borrowing from a range of influences such as the early Greek Doric columns of the 6th century B.C.E., the unique rosette and lotus capitals from the first Temple of Hera, and the interesting asymmetry of the

Simpson's earlier work, such as Ashfold House, designed for his parents; his interiors at Gonville and Caius College; and his influence on urban planning in Chelsea and Solihull are also showcased in the book. A full chapter is devoted to furniture design and interior details such as elevators,

which Simpson feels should be enjoyed as much as any room.

The book is beautifully illustrated with interior and exterior photographs, floor plans, and pencil sketches of ornate embellishments, while the prose is thoughtful and covers a wide breadth of historical and technical knowledge. What elevates the book beyond mere pedagogy is John's and Watkin's personal affiliations with Simpson, with whom they worked in their collective stints at the Prince of Wales's Institute of Architecture. There is a human hand, mind, and vision present in every room and facade, as well as a history to be considered — a reflection, no doubt, of Simpson's own philosophy: "Perhaps because buildings are created by human beings, like their creators they can be complex and often are not quite what they appear to

be on the surface."
